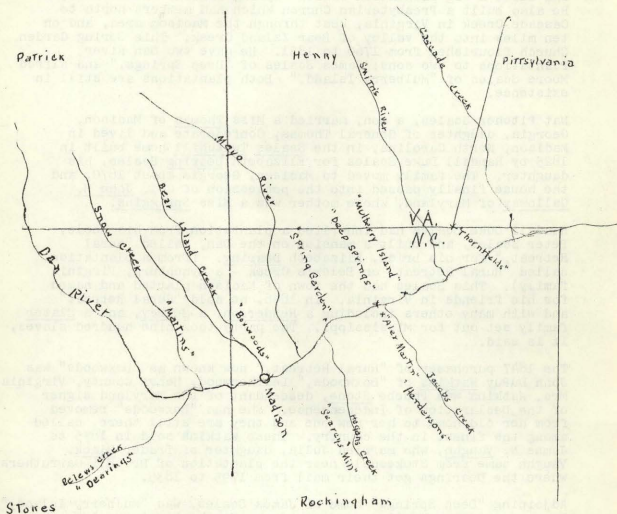

FAMILIES AND HOMES OF ROCKINGHAM COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

Rockingham County notes compiled from letters written by Miss Nancy Woodburn Watkins of Madison, North Carolina, and submitted by Mrs. W. Graeme Dixon.

SKETCH MAP OF THE AREA



The Loyal Land Company was formed in Williamsburg, Virginia about 1740 to deal in Western Virginia and North Carolina lands. It was composed of forty-two gentlemen, with James Madison Senior (father of the President) and Samuel Dalton (1699-1802) as members. The Scalles family seem also to have been of this group. Joseph Scalles, who had eight sons and seven daughters, took up great

acreage, and the area between the Dan and Mayo Rivers contains many old Scales homesteads as well as that of Samuel Dalton, who had left Virginia for residence in South Carolina, found he was sick there all the time and finally settled at Mayo, North Carolina to be near his Henderson, Martin, and Hughes kin. Some of the Daltons and Scaleses also intermarried.

Nathaniel Scales, one of Joseph's many sons, married Miss Pitcher and built a big plantation called "Spring Garden," about 1800. He also built a Presbyterian Church which had members north to Cascade Creek in Virginia, west through the Madison area, and on ten miles into the valley of Bear Island Creek. This Spring Garden Church flourished from 1760 to 1851. He gave two Dan River Plantations to two sons; James Scales of "Deep Springs," and Alfred Moore Scales of "Mulberry Island." Both plantations are still in existence.

Nat Pitcher Scales, a son, married a Miss Thomas of Madison, Georgia, daughter of General Thomas, Confederate and lived in Madison, North Carolina, in the Scales Twitchill home built in 1825 by Randall Duke Scales for Elizabeth Dearing Scales, his daughter. The family moved to Madison, Georgia about 1870, and the house finally passed into the possession of Col. John M. Galloway of Maryland, whose mother was a Miss Spraggins.

Randall Duke Scales had inherited a plantation from his uncle, Peter Scales, and built a mansion on the Dan, called "Rural Retreat," for his bride, Elizabeth Dearing. (from a plantation called "Rural Retreat" on Belew's Creek - a Lynchburg, Virginia family). This Scales had the town of Madison platted and named for his friends in Virginia. In 1846, he sold "Rural Retreat" and with many others including a Henderson, a Searcy, and a Slater family set out for Mississippi. The party took nine hundred slaves, it is said.

The 1847 purchaser of "Rural Retreat," now known as "Boxwoods" was John DuPuy Watkins of "Boxwoods," Leatherwood, Henry County, Virginia. Mrs. Watkins was Phoebe Stone, descendant of the Maryland signer of the Declaration of Independence. She had "Boxwoods" removed from her old home to her new one and they are still there, called among the finest in the country. These Watkins sold in 1875 to James N. Vaughn, who married Julia, daughter of Trader Black. Vaughn came from Stokesdale near the plantation of Dr. Eli Carruthers, where the Dearings got their mail from 1795 to 1835.

Adjoining "Deep Springs" home of James Scales, was "Mulberry Island," home of Governor Martin's great niece, Martha Martin Scales, who married Alfred Moore Scales.

"Mulberry Island" was sold to Judge Thomas Settle from Halifax County, Virginia, and Alfred Moore Scales moved about five miles east of Madison where he remained until his removal with all his family to Texas about 1855. Judge Settle had a big mansion built on "Mulberry Island" which was Republican headquarters for many years before it was sold to another family.

"Spring Garden" was inherited by Dr. Richard Scales. One of his daughters married Jerry Field (see Colonial Dames records of John Fields, father of Nathaniel, father of Jerry). Jane Watkins (Fields) Harris married Thomas McCuiston Woodburn in 1856. The Fields emigrated to Missouri before 1830.

The first white settler in the Snow Creek area was Col. James Martin from Hunterdon County, New Jersey. His father was Rev. Hugh Martin, a Presbyterian minister who married Miss Jane Hunter, whose plantation adjoined that of the Martin's near Philadelphia. Col. Martin was sent by the Colonial Government to protect the Saura Tribe of the Cherokee Indians. He married three times and had fifteen children. He opened the Snow Creek Lime Works, and his lime was sold over a wide area. His home was a lodging house for many travelers and adventurers.

Alexander Martin, brother of Col. James, was a graduate of Princeton. He came to Salisbury to clerk in a store, and as Revolutionary War troubles grew, took an active part in them. He rose to the rank of Colonel in Washington's Army, and received his pay in land. One tract lay on Jacob's Creek. His home there is still standing since before 1807 when Martin, and is just across the Dan from "Deep Springs." The legend grew that with all his thousands of acres, he coveted "Deep Springs," and requested that he be buried upright in a stone vault overlooking the Dan River and across it.

One Martin girl married a Connecticut lawyer, Nathaniel Boyden, and settled in Salisbury. A descendant of this marriage was Gordon Gray, who was president of the University of North Carolina until his death at thirty-nine.

One of Col. James Martin's marriages was to a Mrs. Jones (who was a Miss Loftin) who had a son, Hamilton C. Jones, Jr., There are descendants of this family in Salisbury.

Col. James Martin's mother who was Jane Hunter, was aunt of Col. James Hunter, whose plantation was "Valley Home." Edmund Loftin Martin, younger son of Col. Martin, married the widow Foy.

Many of the Martin family moved to Mecklenburg County, Virginia. Jacob's Creek at Wentworth, North Carolina, was the home of Governor Alex Martin.

Judge Richard Henderson with his partners formed the Transylvania Company to settle Kentucky, but many "dropouts" settled in western North Carolina. Judge Henderson's sister, Susannah H. married Reuben Searcy, and their son, Thomas, married Anne, daughter of Col. James Martin. Their daughter married a Slater, and a granddaughter, Sarah Martin Searcy Slater married Charles Rice Smith who emigrated to Mississippi with R. D. Scales. This family later settled in Hill County, Texas, and renewed kinship ties with the Martins and Scaleses who settled in Corsicana when they left North Carolina in the 1850's. They were intimate with Martha Martin Scales, wife of A. M. Scales of "Mulberry Island," who

named a son Martin Scales.

A son of Charles Rice Smith, Thomas Burwell Smith, was attorney-General of Texas in the 1850's.

Mrs. Ann Martin Searcy's sister married Pleasant Henderson (1756-1842) who was on the pension roll of Carroll County, Tennessee in 1831, for his service as Major in the North Carolina Line. He was born in Hanover County, Virginia, and died at Huntington, Tennessee. His Rockingham County home on Jacob's Creek burned and all the family left the area except Richard Henderson, who moved up near the Searcy Mill place into an old Whitworth-Bradfield home.

Miss Watkin's letters mentioned many other families, but those discussed in this article seem to have more descendants in Texas than the others.

\*\*\*\*\*

The North Carolina Historical Commission employed Miss Watkins from 1934 to 1937 to collect genealogies in western Rockingham County and verify them as much as she could from cemeteries, old letters, and memories of the older people. She also collected church records of the area and studied their beginnings. She is the author of a book "Academy Street, Madison, A Hundred Years of Culture," which may be found in the County Library in Madison.

CARELTON BIBLE RECORD

In 1956, the Bible had no binding. The name of the publisher (M. Carey, Philadelphia) and the date of publication (1815) were taken from the New Testament. From a photostatic copy, Mrs. V.N. Burgess submits a transcript of the family record of Thomas Carleton.

Martha Carleton daughter of Thomas & Martha was married to Edward Butler the 19th of November 1815.

Devoreux Jarrott who married Rebecca F. Carleton daughter of Tho & Martha died the 20th April 1816.

John Allin who married Elizabeth Carleton daughter of Thomas & Martha Carleton was born the 9th of March 1773 in York Town, County and State of Virginia.

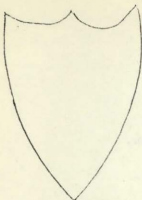

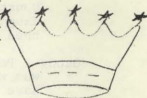

HERALDRY - What does it mean, aside from a certain glamour and fascination?

In the Days of Chivalry - that Golden Age when all that was noble in the estimation of man was valued, cherished, and every attempt made to encourage and uphold - various duties and titles were created, thereby attaching significance and importance to the administrative details of a system which became thru extreme popularity cumbersome and unwieldy - and finally "crumpled of its own weight" altho was never abandoned.

King Edward III's reign in Great Britain probably was the height of Chivalry, for he was Founder of the Order of the Garter and, it is said, the College of Arms. The hierarchy of titles in the College of Arms includes Kings-of-Arms; the Earl Marshall with the Chester, Lancaster, Richmond, Somerset, Windsor, and York HERALDS, and their Four Pursivants (originally Squires whose numerous duties included carrying messages and in all details attending their lords). These Pursivants-at-arms derived their specific titles usually from some part of their Lord's arms. Today they include "Rouge Croix" (St. George); "Blue Mantle"; Rouge Dragon"; and "Portcullis."

The six HERALDS today (as formerly) are entrusted with the genealogies of those families who reside in the specific areas assigned each HERALD, in general the name being a town or shire of the area.

In the past (as well as today) the Herald was chosen for his inviolable character. Some synonyms for inviolable include incapable of being overcome, invincible, unconquerable, indomitable - all summed up render him trust-worthy to the nth degree.

Whenever there is any pageantry-type of entertainment, of course, the Heralds announce messages of importance and formerly were charged with proclaiming war or peace, especially in the days of limited communication. They even bore messages from and to rulers, and officially issued challenges, etc. Their office has always been one of great importance and honor.

Heraldry, therefore, consists of the art or office (duties et al) of a herald. Today heraldry has been largely associated with armorial bearings. Record of details concerning these, together with the genealogies (which really were titles to property, especially lands) and such special privileges, honors etc. as were granted individuals, families, clans, etc. render the office of HERALD still one of dignity, importance, and honor.
