"The Short History Of Our Family" written by Milner Echols was brought to Texas after the Civil War, probably by Thomas Jefferson Echols, son of Robert Milner Echols of Walton Co., Georgia, and Grandson of Milner Echols who signed the history in 1850. The original is in the possession of Mrs. Eva Echols Kelley of Breckenridge Texas. The copy of this history which follows has been kept as nearly exact to the original as is possible in transposing from script into type.

From this vague beginning, with no dates given, a surprisingly authentic family record has been developed as indicated by the outline which follows the history.

The proof compiled in the outline has been found in the Census Records of 1782, 1785 and 1790 of Virginia, Public Service Claims of Halifax Co., Va., County and State Records of Georgia (obtained from the County Ordinary), History of Pittsylvania Co., Va., by Maud Clement, Early Records of Georgia by Grace Davidson, Men of Mark of Georgia, Our Quaker Ancestry by Rusha Wesley, History of Arkansas, and from family Bible records.

Allied families have been brought into the record; the most complete being the lines of SCOTT, PAXSON, SIMCOCK, MARIS, WALN, WEBSTER, SHOTWELL, ADAMS, COWPERTHWAIT - this data principally from "Our Quaker Ancestry" by Rusha Wesley. Mrs. Ima Lou Echols Chandler of Dryden Texas contributed the data on MORRIS, HESTER, KING, JONES and WHITESIDE lines.

The name ECHOLS has had various spelling; Eckles, Eckols and Eckels.

A Short History of our family - from the first that landed in America till the present time, as far as I Can ascertain -

John Echols an Englishman Came to America about the end of the 16th or the beginning of the 17th Century and Settled in Caroline County Virginia and married a tall Redheaded woman named Mary Cave-& by her had 5 Sons & 3 Daughters I Shall begin with his Sons first, and Carry out their family as far as my knowledge extends,-

John was his first Son who left Virginia a young man and Settled in the lower part of N. Carolina & Raised his family - of whom I know nothing----

Abraham was (old Johns) 2nd Son married Sarah Tamer and by her had 2 Sons & several Daughters- his Sons was Joseph and Joshua- Joseph married a Miss King, had by her 2 Sons and 5 or 6 Daughters----his Sons Abraham and Jeremiah who left Virginia in time of the Revolution War and went to Pennsylvania of their offspring I know nothing----Joshua married Hannah Brown had a number of children, of whom I know but little he had one Son named Darius a Conspicuous man in habersham County Georgia the Rest of his family lives Chiefly in the upper part of Georgia Old Abraham had one Daughter married James Hodges a very worthy man, his family moovd to Tennessee he had one Son named Jesse & he had a Son named James who was a Commanding officer in Tennessee & got Drowned in Cumberland River near Cairo Jesse had one Daughter named Tabitha that is all I know of the family----- Old Abraham had another Daughter named Sarah who married John Rowden and by her had 4 Sons and one Daughter his Sons was Abraham Laban Josee and John - Abraham married a woman named Chick moovd to Tennessee I know nothing of his family--

Laban married Milly Adams Raised a large family I know nothing of them only 2 of his Sons (to wit) Hubard and Lot, who lives in Guinnett County Georgia Josee married Susanah Adams moovd to Tennessee of his family I know nothing--John married Milly Brewer a widow the Daughter of old Jeremiah Reeves sister to Revd. Mallachi Reeves & Revd. Jeremiah Reeves he also moovd to Tennessee and was drowned in Tennessee Rive of his family I know nothing--Old John Rowdens Daughter was Tabitha She Married Glover Crane had Several Children by her and thenDied, he had one Son named Joshua Crane who married a Miss Hood--they had Several Children, one Son named John Glover Crane who was a whole Sale Mercht. in Charleston S-Carrolia, Joshua Crane had a daughter married a Mr. Whitman a Baptist preacher - and a teacher in the Penfield Accademy Green City Georgia---

James Hodges Daughter married John Lacy Wm. Glass & Hally Shaw, Lacy had one Son namd -Elijah and he and wife parted Glass had 5 Sons & 3 daughters - his Sons were Hubbard--Mason, Frederick who married Betsy Strother (a Cousin to your Mother) and he was killd by the Indians in Ala--the other 3 David Elish and Elijah,--Mason married a Miss Wyatt and lives in Payett County Georgia--the Rest of his sons I know nothing His Daughters was namd Tabitha Patsy & Sally --Tabitha married Richard Wood -& by him had 3 Sons & 1 Daughter, her sons was Wm Winston & Willis--her Son Wm Represented-3 Different Counties in the State of Georgia & was Colo. of the Same Counties he then moovd to Randolph County Ala--and Represented that County, he is a wealthy man--Winston her 2nd Son lives in Herd County--has represented that Cty-& is Colo. and Judge of the Court--

Willis her 3rd Son married a Miss Cochran & Died young, Richd-Woods Daughter was namd Elizabeth & married Saml. D. Echols---Hally Shaw Raised- a large family in Jackson County Georgia I know nothing of his family only E.B.Shaw his grand Son lives in Guynett County- and is a very eminent Baptist preacher---

P S If I mistake not old Abraham Echols had a Daughter Who married a man by the name of Hubbard in Virginia I know nothing further of them.

the 3rd Son of Old (English) Bohn Echols was namd - William I dont know who he marrid, he several Sons & Daughters, his Sons was John and Wm- John was one of the largest men ever Raised - in Virginia he was a quaker preacher that all I know of him or his family as I never Saw him but once--Wm- was also a Very large man married a widow Spradlen by her had 3 Sons & 3 Daughters--his Sons was Joel Eleanah and Wm.- Joel and Eleanah moovd-to Tennessee Settled on Cumberland River near Caro--I was once at Eleanahs house after his death- he had a large family, I know the names of none of them only his youngest Son-namd-Richard--they are a Very wealthy family-- Joel I think they Told me had no Child--William the 3rd Son married a Girl by the name of Elizabeth Farmer (a Schoolmate of mine in Virginia)- he moovd- to Ala--Settled in Madison County Near Huntsville, and was a Very great whole Sale Mercht-in that Town, I know but little of his family he has a Daughter married Richd-Holden also a whole Sale Mercht-in Huntsville, and also had 2 Sons who moovd-to Mississippi-one of them was Killed-by a man & the other wrote to me about it I think the one that wrote was by the name of Larkin--the one that was Killd- I think was by the name of Joseph that all that I know of that Family

Old William Echols Daughters married Wm-Wynne Vardre McBee & Daniel Williams & Richard Anderson of Wynnes family I know nothing as they moovd- to Tennessee in an Early Date old Vardre McBee moovd- from Virginia to S-Carolina before the Revolution war--and was a Capt- in that army and he was said to have Done as much Damage to the british and Tories in that part of Country as any Capt-in that Country he had 2 Sons (to wit) Silas & Vardre--Silas was a Very large man went to Mississippi and Died there I know nothing of his family- Vardre Still livesin S. Carolina Greenville District he has 6 Children only one married that a

Daughter married a Mr Carson--he has one Daughter Malenda single one Son Luther--the Rest I Dont Know their names he is said to be the Richest man in that part of the State- his property is estimated at one Million Dollars-- Old Vardres- had Several Daughters-I dont know their names one married- a man by name of Ross-- how many Children she had I know not, I only know one of her Sons who is by name of Rice F. Ross--one married a man by name of Asher they have one Son in Dade County Georgia by name of Wm-Asher a Very Smart man---that is all I know of that family Daniel Williams who married the 3rd-Daughter of old Wm-Echols--went to Tennessee Raisd-his family there of his daughters I know nothing- his Sons was Sampson and Oliver, Sampson was said to be an uncommon Smart man Represented his County many years--there is a Very fine Town in Tennessee namd-in honor of his name(Williamsburg) Sampson Williams was a Very large man Rather Cross Eyed,- Richard Anderson married old Wm-Echols 4th Daughter had 5 Children by her and she Died- I know the name of 2 of their Sons--which was Medy- and John-- Medy became Very rich own the first Merchant Mill I ever saw, on banister River Virginia-where was a Considerable town built Named Medsville in honor of Medy Andersons name they both had families of which I know but little---

Joseph Echols was the 4th-Son of old English John Echols he never married Consequently had no family he was an afflicted man had what was Called the asphma which prevented him from lying Down, he never lay Down for 40 years--had an instrument made that fitted his forehead and sat a slept, his common vocation was hunting & trapping on the River- at whcih business he made Considerable property as he lvd in the Frontier Country where game was plenty--

Richard Echols was the 5th-Son of English John Echols who married Caty Evans-(he was my Grand father) and by her had 14 Children 3 Died in Infancy--the Rest all livd- to Raise families--their lat- Son was Moses who married Betsy Wynne they Raisd- a Considerable family- their first Son was John whomarried fanev Fromby-- and moovd- from Virginia to Tennessee I know but little ofhis family he was a one Eyed man--he was a Very Smart man and had great property, their 2nd Son was Obadiah he married Betsy Ferry he died at about 65 years of age I know but little of his family, onle one Son who lives in the Western District of Tennessee by name of Champness Ferry Echols a Baptist Preacher-- Moses 3rd Son was by name of Moses-who married a Miss Ferry(Cousin to his Bro-Obadiahs wife) Iknow nothing of his family-- their 4th Son was by the of Evans who married AnnaFerry Sister to his Bro-Moses wife- they live in Virginia I know no more of their family--Old Moses Echols- Daughters was by names of Rebeca Pricilla Tabitha Betsy lucy & francis--Rebeca married Edward Akin I have no knowledge of their family- Pricilla married David Bates in Hallifax County- a very large man who offered for Legislature in the County that he was born & raised -in whin he was about 25 years old, he got every vote that was given in and the county was very large- he continued to go to the Legislature as Stayd-in Virginia, he then moovd- to Georgia Wilks County-- he became a Representative of Wilks County in Senate and was once appointed President Sinate pro tem--you See his name in the Digests of the laws of Georgia- he became sofat that it was Supposed- by the Doctors that his fat melted in him killd -him before he was 60 years old he weighed -nearly 400 pounds he Raisd - his family in Wilks Cty Georgia-but after his Death theymoovd- to Tennessee I have but little account of them since--he had one Son named Randolph & one namd Anderson of the Rest I have no account only one Daughter namd- Susanah who married Jas-Johnson of Oglethorpe County---

Old Moses 3rd- Daughter Tabitha married Nathan Formby he moovd- from Virginia to Georgia and Died in Walton County he Raisd- 4 Sons and Several Daughters, his Sons was namd- Moses Obadiah & Nathan, the other I dont know the name of he married aMiss Harvie in Newton County and Died there--Moses & Obadiah lives in Newton County they both have families-but I Dont know the name of either of their wives Nathan lives in Ala -I know not of his family--one of old Nathans Daughters married John Whitaker and one married Henry Nichols one Israel Moore & one Israel Moore & one married a Mr.Park I know nothing further of the family. Old John 3rd- Son was named Saml- he married Jane Holloway of Elton Putnam County Georgia he moovd- To Ala-also So I know nothing more of them---Old Johns Daughters was prudence who married Christopher Irwin they Raisd- a largefamily of Sons & one Daughter who Died young---I know nothing more of them only Christopher and David---Christopher lives in Walton County Raisd- Several Sons and one Daughter, I dont know the names of his Sons tho I am told they are Smart young men his Daughter was Sophrony She married Raman Ray- they live in Cobb Cty-, David Irwin lives in Marietta and is a Very Eminent lawer and a Very welthy man he has a family that I know but little about--- Old Johns 2nd- Daughter was by name of Temperance. She married Jno- Rodgers-they Raisd- several Sons- I know of only 2 of them Doctor James Rodgers who married Wm-G. Springers Daughter and lives in Carroll County & has Represented that Cty- in the Legislature of Georgia---David Rodgers lives in Stewart County-& has also Represented that Cty- in the State Legislature Old Hohns 3rd Daughter Namd-Caty Never married- Died young his 4th Daughter Patsy Married Capt- William Ellis they live in Pike County Near Griffin they have Raisd- Several Sons & Daughters - I know only 2 of his Sons-Richd- & Thos- one of them is a Doctor both very large men- they had one Daughter married a man named- Wilson who also lives near Griffin Old Johns 5th- Daughter named Liddy Married Skelton Standifer moovd to Ala I know no more of them--- his 6th Daughter Lucy married Nathan Williams- & Raisd- their family in Jasper County- I know nothing further of them only one Son a Doctor who lives in Merrithther County Georgia---

Old Richard Echols 3rd- Son was namd James Echols a very large man had a Very Singular mark in his feturs ---he had one black eye & one blue eye-, he married Elizabeth Palmer widow of John Palmer of -Richmond County Virginia--her maden name was Elizabeth Milner---by her he had 5 Sons 3 Daughters his oldest Son was Milner who married Susanah Sanson had 10 Children their first son was Samuel Dorril Echols who married Betsy Wood by her he had 4 Sons & 4 Daughters--his first Son was namd- Alfred he married a Girl namd- Thirston they one Child and then they parted---his 2nd-Son was namd - Wood Echols he married a girl by name of Patrick had 3 Children moovd to Ala- and Died Shortly after he went there I know nothing of his family--- 3rd Son namd - Winston M. Echols married a Miss Summer Cain had one Child and she Died--he married again but I know not to whom--his 4th Son is namd -John a young man not yet married--his oldest Daughter was namd -Maryan She married Colo-Thos- J. Johnson who lives in Herd County near Franklin they have Children but I know not their names or how many, his 2nd-Daughter was namd Mahaley married Mercer Babb had one Child and She Died her Child is a Daughter namd- Antonett SmL- 3rd Daughter Betsy Ann married a Mr. Hollandworth lives in Heard County-- the have one Child I know nothing of them--- his 4th Daughter Susanah not yet married;-- Milners 2nd Son was named-James Died an infant by a fall out at the Door-- his 3rd Son was named-Richard Died an infant also, his complaint was the flux- his 4th Son was namd- Robert, Milner, Echols---he married Mary Melton and by had 12 Children--his 1st, Son was namd- Jonathan Milner Echols Died at the age of 17-years- his death was Causd- by an over hard march in the army- in Very hot wether---his 2nd- Son was namd Dorrel Sampson Echols--Died an Infant-- his 3rd- Son was namd- Thomas Jefferson Echols married Lusinda A. James Echols 2nd Daughter namd-Mary Echols--She married Jeremiah Reeves--they had 5 Sons & 4 Daughters one of the Daughters Died Young and another- fell into the Spring and Drowned--their 1st Son Absalom Echols Reeves who lives at Rome he married Elisa Tyas by her had one Daughter who Died about the time She was 20 years old while She was attending Association in Chattooga County --John N.
