material, nerhana in some cases too much.

The visitations of Wales, P, Gen, early generations may tend toward the fabulous.

Betham: Baronetage, D. Gen. Much ancestral root material.

Banks: Baronia Anglica Concentrata.

Baker: History and Antiquities of the County of Hertford, F, Gen, an extensive history of the county interspersed vith many pedigree charts, including the heraldry of the families.

Douglas: Peerage of Soutland, F, Gen, two thick quarto volumes.

Paul: Souts Peerage, P, Gen, nine thick outsvo volumes, said to stand better than Douglas.

Adams and Weis: Magna Charta Sureties, 1215, B, Gen, on the whole very good, but has some errors.

Foster: Pedigress of Yorkshire Families, F, Gen, two large volumes of fold-out line charts.

Burke: Landed Centry of Great Britain, various editions, B, Gen,
P has more editions. A good starting point, but not considered authoritative.

Burke: Landed Gentry of Great Britain and Ireland, two Volumes, 1886. F. Gen.

Burke: Landed Gentry of Ireland, 1958, B, Gen.

Collins: Peerage, 1868, seven Volumes, P, Gen, like Burke, not authoritative, although later generations are usually sound.

Cocayne: Complete Peerage, F, Gen, now somewhat superseded by the Revised Edition.

Clutterbuck: History and Antiquitties of the County of Hertford, F, Gen, MF, a history of the County, with many family pedigrees.

Lipsomb: History and Antiquitties of the County of Buckingham, simi-

lar to above.

Foster: Noble and Centle Panilies of Royal Descent, D, Cen.

de Neufville: History of the House of Neufville, D, Gen, discusses the French branches of the family only. French language.

Stephen and Lee: Dictionary of National Biography, B, Gen, F, GR, D, LH, a very highly regarded work.

Ashburton: Royal house of France, D. Gen.

Sanford and Townsend: Great Governing Families of England, D. Gen.

Chronological, Historical and Heraldic Charts of the Royal House of England, D, Gen, Covers from reign of Eogberht to that of Edward VII.

Owen: Old Pembroke Families.

Guppy:

Gregson: Duchy and County Palatine of Lancaster, B, Gen. A history with some genealogical charts.

Taylor: Historical Families of Scotland, D, Gen.

Brown: History of the Heighlands, D, Gen.

Homes of Family Names, B, Gen, an aid in locating where, in what county or counties, a family is most likely to be found. English only. Paring-Gould: Family Names and Their Stories, B, Gen, contains much interesting and useful information.

Black: Surnames of Scotland, B, Gen, beside information on actual history of the names gives some genealogical material as well.

The multi-volume Ancient, Medieval and Modern Histories published by Cambridge University, D. LH. F. GR.

Various smaller histories of time and places.

Henry: The Plantagenets, D. LH, a new book that looks good at a

glance.

Costain: The Pageant of England, D, LH, F, GR, the three published volumes span the years from the Conquest to the close of

the reign of Edward III.

Duggan: The Devil's Brood, D, IH, F, GR, an interesting picture of Henry II of England and his four sons.

Encyclopaedia Britanica, D, GR, F, GR, Gen.

Tipping: English Homes, D. FA, a fine set of folio size, about equally text and illustration.

Royal Castles, D, LH, the castles are not all royal, text

MacDonald: Castles of England and Wales, F. FA, has to do with a belt from London up the Thames Valley and on westward to Penbroke, much genealogical material interspersed in the text, unfortunately this particular coop has been relieved of

some of its illustrations.

Oman: Castles, F, FA, covers most of Great Britain, Sketchily.

F, FA, written more from the technical than the historical standpoint, well illustrated with photographs and sketches and plans drawn by the author.

Singleton, Ed.: Romantic Castles and Palaces, F, FA, touches on all of Europe.

Lemaitre: Chateaux en France, F. FA.

Holden and Dutton: French Chateaux open to the Public, F, FA.

Secret: Castles in Perigord, F, FA.

: Prench Chateaux, D, FA, a set of some half-dozen large portfolios of beautiful engravings of vista and detail, divided up according to time and place, covering the whole of France, alight text, in French.

Articles in various historical magazines, such as the new England Register and the Virginia Magazine, to name only a couple of great number which are available.

The Yows of the Peacock, while the story centers around Elizabeth de Beauchamp, wife of Thomas de Astley, it is almost equally a story of the life of Isabel, "the shewolf of France," wife of Edward II and mother of Edward III, from ca. 1300-1358, the time of Isabel's death.

- Killed: at Hagerstown, Md., Monday, July 7, 1863 Wilson M. Hardy, son of Mr. Cephas and Jane Hardy of Mecklenburg County, Va. Co. C, 9th Reg. Va. Cavalry.
- Gettysburg casualties: Col. L. B. Williams, killed Col. Tascevell Patton, killed Rdward Valentine of Lynchburg Home Guard, killed Jas. Valentine, wounds.
- Killed: at Gettysburg Capt. Austin Brockenbrough Co. D. 55% Va. Reg. 21 years old.

- Died: of injuries received at Kelly's Ford at home of his father in Powtan County Alex B. Crowder, 23 years old member of Powhatan Troop 48 We. Cavalry.
- Died: of pneumonia Henry L. Skinner, Co. I, 41st Reg. Va. Vol. 24 years left widow and child.
- Killed: in action Lt. Col. Wm. F. Niemeyer 61st Va. Reg. 24 years old. Formerly of Portsmouth, Va.
- Killed: in battle June 9, 1869 Captain Wm. Downs Parley, born at leavens Village, Dec. 19, 1859. His father was of a fine old Virginia family who came to this State when 21 years of age. He was a lawyer. Captain Parley's maternal grandfather was Col. Villiam P. Downs who served in the War of 1812. His father was Major Jonathan Downs, a Revolutionary patrol. His wife was daughter of Captain Louis Gason, Revolutionary patrol. Captain Parley was descendent in tiols—seemingly from ones other state paser. - Killed: at Gettysburg Lt. John W. Rolling, Co. E. 47M Va. Reg.
- Died: of wounds at Gettysburg Srg't. J. C. Hollowell of Parker's Battery.

 - Died: of erysipelas-D.D.T.Thompson of Topographical Engineers. Native of Maryland and descendent from two of the oldest families in the state being a grandson of Judge Smith Thompson of the U.S.Supreme Court and of Hon. D.D.Tempklas. Vice President under Monros.
 - Died: Charles Shelton, son of David R. of Louisa County, Va. = 21 years
 - Killed: Oct. 17, 1863 at Manassas Philip Lewis, Co. F. 9th Va. Cavalry, 22 years of age
 - Killed: at Rapidan Capt. W. B. Newton, 4th Va. Cavalry

The esgle, especially the double-headed one of Austria and the early Germanic peoples, dates to the "Citise of the Plant" of Sumer (meaning "The Land"), one of which (namely Erech) is dedicated to the "O'reat God of Wisdon and Light" (enlightment or knowledge) carrying in the patterns in mosaics..in the floors of the temple, the double headed eagle, the symbolics meferring to all forms of duality, mentalsuperiority, and more than a hint of the extraordinary Powers of the Spirit in the implied character of the bird, namely "sours higher, wingspread is greater, swoops like lightening, chooses high places to mest (i. e. to 'place' that which is dearest and most cherished by him), and show all has infinitely greater freedom than has any other".

Incidentally, in the floors of the rivel "City of the Plain" - in that temple dedicated to the "Odo of Anger and Rebellion" - the chief described pictured is the sweatice. Of this it is claimed the more angular the arms the shorter the period of supremay attained may be enjoyed. Studied in this light it is familiating to trace the usage through the almost seven thousand years of history, as we know it.

So much for ancient usage and "interpretations" (for it is imperative to be aware of the underlying meanings of each device, as well as the manner of its portrayal, the symbolism of the color used, and the direction the device "faces" - each having distinct bearing on correct understanding of any "coat-of-arms" shield, anothing helpst, and creat

Unless one has some degree of knowledge of symbolism, much of history remains a "closed book".
