Anderson: Royal Genealogies, B, Gen, early generations run to the fabulous.

Anselm: Genealogical and Chronological History of the Kings of France, F,
Gen, does not go far back of Charlemagne; very good on the whole,
despite some omissions; French language.

The Earl Marshal, General Chairman:
The Complete Peerage, Revised, D, Gen, probably the highest
authority on material covered.

Weis: Ancestral Roots of Sixty New England Colonists, B, Gen, gener-
ally good, but a few rather glaring errors.

Wurts: Magna Charta, B, Gen (all), follows Dr. Anderson too closely
in early generations; a good source of ideas, but check
closely.

Betham: Genealogical Tables of the Sovereigns, D, Gen, similar to, and
nearly contemporary with Anderson.

Hartland: Chart of Royal and Distinguished Families of Europe, D, Gen,
these last two on same roll of Micro-film.

Burke: History of the Commoners, F, Gen, forerunner of Landed Gentry.

The Visitations are all very good on nearly contemporary generations, but
beware of too extravagant claims of high office at Hastings, etc., on which
see Pine: They came with the Conqueror, B, Gen. The Visitations are a
good source of heraldry.

Burke: Extinct and dormant Baronetcies, B, Gen, much ancestral root
material, perhaps in some cases too much.

The visitations of Wales, F, Gen, early generations may tend toward the
fabulous.

- Betham: Baronetage, D, Gen, Much ancestral root material.
- Banks: Baronia Anglica Concentrata.
- Baker: History and Antiquities of the County of Hertford, F, Gen, an extensive history of the county interspersed with many pedigree charts, including the heraldry of the families.
- Douglas: Peerage of Scotland, F, Gen, two thick quarto volumes.
- Paul: Scots Peerage, F, Gen, nine thick octavo volumes, said to stand better than Douglas.
- Adams and Weis: Magna Charta Sureties, 1215, B, Gen, on the whole very good, but has some errors.
- Foster: Pedigress of Yorkshire Families, F, Gen, two large volumes of fold-out line charts.
- Burke: Landed Gentry of Great Britain, various editions, B, Gen, F has more editions. A good starting point, but not considered authoritative.
- Burke: Landed Gentry of Great Britain and Ireland, two Volumes, 1886, F, Gen.
- Burke: Landed Gentry of Ireland, 1958, B, Gen.
- Collins: Peerage, 1868, seven Volumes, F, Gen, like Burke, not authoritative, although later generations are usually sound.
- Cocayne: Complete Peerage, F, Gen, now somewhat superseded by the Revised Edition.
- Clutterbuck: History and Antiquities of the County of Hertford, F, Gen, MF, a history of the County, with many family pedigrees.
- Lipscomb: History and Antiquities of the County of Buckingham, similar to above.
- Foster: Noble and Gentle Families of Royal Descent, D, Gen.
- de Neufville: History of the House of Neufville, D, Gen, discusses the French branches of the family only. French language.
- Stephen and Lee: Dictionary of National Biography, B, Gen, F, GR, D, LH, a very highly regarded work.
- Ashburton: Royal house of France, D, Gen.
- Sanford and Townsend: Great Governing Families of England, D, Gen.
- Timmis: Chronological, Historical and Heraldic Charts of the Royal House of England, D, Gen, Covers from reign of Egberht to that of Edward VII.
- Owen: Old Pembroke Families.
- Gregson: Duchy and County Palatine of Lancaster, B, Gen. A history with some genealogical charts.
- Taylor: Historical Families of Scotland, D, Gen.
- Brown: History of the Heighlands, D, Gen.
- Guppy: Homes of Family Names, B, Gen, an aid in locating where, in what county or counties, a family is most likely to be found. English only.

- Paring-Gould: Family Names and Their Stories, B, Gen, contains much interesting and useful information.
- Black: Surnames of Scotland, B, Gen, beside information on actual history of the names gives some genealogical material as well.
- The multi-volume Ancient, Medieval and Modern Histories published by Cambridge University, D, LH, F, GR.
- Various smaller histories of time and places.
- Henry: The Plantagenets, D, LH, a new book that looks good at a glance.
- Costain: The Pageant of England, D, LH, F, GR, the three published volumes span the years from the Conquest to the close of the reign of Edward III.
- Duggan: The Devil's Brood, D, IH, F, GR, an interesting picture of Henry II of England and his four sons.
- Catholic Encyclopaedia, D, CL, F, GR.
- Encyclopaedia Britanica, D, GR, F, GR, Gen.
- Tipping: English Homes, D, FA, a fine set of folio size, about equally text and illustration.
- _____ : Royal Castles, D, LH, the castles are not all royal, text profusely illustrated.
- MacDonald: Castles of England and Wales, F, FA, has to do with a belt from London up the Thames Valley and on westward to Penbroke, much genealogical material interspersed in the text, unfortunately this particular copy has been relieved of some of its illustrations.
- Oman: Castles, F, FA, covers most of Great Britain, sketchily.
- Toy: F, FA, written more from the technical than the historical standpoint, well illustrated with photographs and sketches and plans drawn by the author.
- Singleton, Ed.: Romantic Castles and Palaces, F, FA, touches on all of Europe.
- Lemaitre: Chateaux en France, F, FA.
- Holden and Dutton: French Chateaux open to the Public, F, FA.
- Secret: Castles in Perigord, F, FA.
- _____ : French Chateaux, D, FA, a set of some half-dozen large portfolios of beautiful engravings of vista and detail, divided up according to time and place, covering the whole of France, slight text, in French.
- Articles in various historical magazines, such as the new England Register and the Virginia Magazine, to name only a couple of great number which are available.
- There are also several good novels on historical themes; but of course these are not to be taken as history. For instance, Anya

Seton, in her most interesting and largely reliable novel, Katherine, says, almost in the same penful of ink that Sir Robert de Ferrers, of Wem and Oversley, first husband of Joan de Beaufort, was OLD and that Ralph de Neville, future first Earl of Westmoreland, her second husband was YOUNG, when actually Ferrers was younger than Neville; and also omits the fact that Joan, by her first husband had a daughter who afterward married a son of Neville, by his first Wife. Despite their shortcomings the novels are well worth looking into. To name a few of the great many available:

- Seton: Katherine, which covers the period from 1366 - 1396.
 Oliver: Sing, Morning Star, a story of the life of St. Margaret of Scotland.
 Oliver: The Lion is Come, a story of the life of King Robert, the Bruce.
 Maughan: Harry of Monmouth, covers from the last of Richard II's reign to the death of Henry V.
 Graham: The Vows of the Peacock, while the story centers around Elizabeth de Beauchamp, wife of Thomas de Astley, it is almost equally a story of the life of Isabel, "the she-wolf of France," wife of Edward II and mother of Edward III, from ca. 1300-1358, the time of Isabel's death.

DEATH NOTICES FROM VIRGINIA NEWSPAPERS
1861 - 1865

From an old scrapbook compiled by the mother of
Miss Mattie and Peter Hairston, Henry County, Virginia.

- Died: at Deabrook Hospital of wounds received at Drewry's Bluff - Lt. Robert M. Taft of Charleston, S. C. He was in Washington's Light Infantry.
- Killed: at Drewry's Bluff - Lt. Jas. Milville Willis, son of William, 26 years old. Company B, 15th Virginia Regiment.
- Died: in Officers Hospital of wounds received in battle - Capt. Geo. Newkiak Hammond of Berkeley. Company B, 1st Virginia Cavalry - 80 years, 11 months.
- Died: William Baxter, son of S. S. and Anna B. Baxter and grandson of Rev. Dr. G. A. Baxter - 27 years.
- Died: Oct. 13, 1863 - Wm. H. Wagner - Capt. in the Provisional Army of the Confederate States and Aide de Camp to Brig. General Ripley. 34 years old.
- Died: In Columbia, Georgia, of diptheria - Capt. Geo. E. Walker, Engineer Corps P.A.C.S. 36 years old - native of Charleston, S.C.
- Killed: Jan. 8, 1863 - Channing Moore Bulkley, second son of Rev. Olcott Bulkley, formerly of Cumberland County, Va. 18 years old.

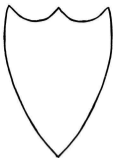
Jacob Warren b-1782 in Virginia, m Betsey Elkins 3 of Oct. 1810. M-Mary Cathey Osborne, daughter of George Cathey of Haywood Co. N.C. Jacob and Mary Cathey Osborne had two children, Jacob Cathey Warren b-25 Dec. 1842 and a daughter Mary M. b-1846.

Jacob Warren Sr. had 17 children all together. I have the names of a few: John b-1815, Panama b-17 May 1826, Demira b 18 Feb. 1832, Sophia Rachel b Feb. 1836, Emily, Edward, Michael b 1834, Isaac, Catherine b 1838, Jacob b Dec. 25, 1842, Mary M. b-1846.

John Warren, oldest son of Jacob Warren, b-1815 in Tenn., m Mary Harrison of Virginia in 1834 or 35. They had nine children as follows: James Harrison (my Grandfather), Eliza, Elizabeth, Elvira, Clementine, Margaret, William, Penelope and John. John Warren, Sr. moved to Smith County, Texas, around Bowie in 1865.

James Harrison Warren b Dec. 28, 1835 in Roan Co. Tenn. m. Sept. 21, 1865, in Hickory Co. Mo. Anna Starkey b-Dec. 28, 1840. They had the following children: Sam b June 8, 1866, Sarah Penelpa b Aug. 17, 1867 (both died in infancy and buried in Mo.) Mary A. b-Sept. 7, 1868, Humansville, Mo., Tennessee Jane b-July 22, 1870, Poke Co., Mo. Ida Bell, b-Feb. 2, 1872, Humansville, Mo., Martha Emma, b-May 17, 1873, Harriet Josephine b-May 6, 1875, Karen Estelle b-Sept. 13, 1878, and James Franklin, b-Jan. 27, 1880, all in Humansville, Mo.

Since coats-of-arms have been used for untold centuries prior to their prominence during the "Days of Chivalry" in Europe, it might be interesting to inquire about the antiquity of their usage, as well as some of the customs that have grown up around them.

Comparison of the types of shields that have varied through the ages in shape and contours as well as the multitude of devices that have been used to ornament - rather, to differentiate - them, indicates to the student, especially the student of armour and weapons of defense and combat, that even in the so-called "Bronze Age" the round (and shaped) chief defense-article had embossed emblems, usually, instead of painted ones. These vary from strictly ornamentation in more or less geometric patterns to definitely personal devices such as eagles, lions, tigers, even beavers and conventionalized flowers.

Perhaps the outstandingly famous animal-device is the "Lion of Judah" son of Israel (Jacob), today incorporated in the arms of Britain, their royal house being of direct lineal descent according to the ancient bards and keepers of the records of title-and-land descent.

The chrysanthemum of Japan; and the "Fleur-de-lis" (conventionalized iris) originally the arms of Damas (Damascus) since and prior-to 1000 B. C. and now a part of the arms of France, being said to have been brought back by the Crusaders, whose leaders and promoters were most of them, if not all, the progeny of Charlemagne the Great, King of France and Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire - are certainly among the best-known of the armorial flowers.

The eagle, especially the double-headed one of Austria and the early Germanic peoples, dates to the "Cities of the Plain" of Sumer (meaning "The Land"), one of which (namely Erech) is dedicated to the "Great God of Wisdom and Light" (enlightenment or knowledge) carrying in the patterns in mosaics...in the floors of the temple, the double-headed eagle, the symbolism referring to all forms of duality, mental

superiority, and more than a hint of the extraordinary Powers of the Spirit in the implied character of the bird, namely "soars higher, wing-spread is greater, swoops like lightening, chooses high places to nest (i. e. to 'place' that which is dearest and most cherished by him), and above all has infinitely greater freedom than has any other".

Incidentally, in the floors of the rival "City of the Plain" - in that temple dedicated to the "God of Anger and Rebellion" - the chief device pictured is the swastika. Of this it is claimed the more angular the arms the shorter the period of supremacy attained may be enjoyed. Studied in this light it is fascinating to trace the usage through the almost seven thousand years of history, as we know it.

So much for ancient usage and "interpretations" (for it is imperative to be aware of the underlying meanings of each device, as well as the manner of its portrayal, the symbolism of the color used, and the direction the device "faces" - each having distinct bearing on correct understanding of any "coat-of-arms" shield, mantling helmet, and crest.)

Unless one has some degree of knowledge of symbolism, much of history remains a "closed book".
