JAMES ANDERSON SMITH MEMORIAL

Marker placed in Pioneer Cemetery, Dallas, Texas, on September 21, 1961, by his great grand daughter, Ann Johnston Ford (Mrs. Gus L.)

Inscription on back of marker:

James Anderson Smith, patrict and patriot, member of Peters Colony, came to Dallas County from Chester District, South Carolina, in 1845, and lived a faithful Texas in peace and war; First President of the Agricultural and Mechanical Association, parent society of the State Fair of Texas; Captain of the Davis Home Guards of Dallas County in 1861; Ordained Methodist minister, early circuit rider and one of the organizers of the First Methodist Church of this city; He served his generation with fidelity and wisdom and preathed to local congregations with affection; Worshipful Master and Life Chaplain of the Tannehill Masonic Lodge and patron of the James A. Smith Lodge of Farers Branch Masonic Lodge.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PATRIOTIC SOCIETIES

MAYFLOWER SOCIETY. "Every direct descendant of any passenger on the Mayflower on the voyage which terminated at Plymouth, New England, in December, 1620, shall be eligible for membership in this Society".

SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION. "Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over and a citizen in good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unfailing in loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, solder, seaman, marine, militiaman or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States; or as a Signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain".

DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION. "Any woman is eligible for membership in this Society who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor or a civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided she is personally acceptable to the Society".

SONS AND DAUGHTERS OF THE PILGRIMS. "Any white person over twenty-one years of age, in lineal descent from Pilgrim ancestry prior to 1700 is eligible to membership, providing they are acceptable to the Branch they wish to join and to the National Court".

DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN COLONISTS. "Any American white woman of good moral character who has attained her 18% birthday is eligible to membership provided she is acceptable to the members of the Chapter and is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who rendered civil or military service in any of the colonies prior to July 4%, 1776".

NATIONAL SOCIETY MAGNA CHAFFA DAMES. "An hereditary Order composed of women who are lineal descendants of one or more of the Barons of England who in or before the year 1215 rendered actual service toward securing the articles of constitutional liberty, properly called the Magna Charta, from John, King of England, which he ratified and delivered to them in the meadow which is called Runnemede between Windsor and Staines on the Thames, above London, on Trainty Monday, the 150 day of June, A. D. 1215.

SOCIETY, DAUGHTER OF COLONIAL WARS. "Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society, Daughter of Colonial Wars who is not less than eighteen years of age, who is of good moral character and reputation, who is personally acceptable to the Society and who is lineally descended in the male or female line from an ancestor who, from the time of the settlement of Jamestown, May 13, 1607, to the battle of Lexington, April 19, 1776, served as a military or naval officer or as a soldier, sailor, marine, or privateersman, under the authority of the Colonies which afterward formed the United States, or in the forces of Great Britain which participated with those of the said Colonies in any wars in which the said Colonies were engaged, or in which their men were enrolled.

COLONIAL DAMES OF THE XVII® CENTURY. "Eligibility consists in lineal descent from one or more ancestors, who resided in an American Colony prior to 1701, and who during his lifetime shall have performed services to the country, either civil or military".

NATIONAL SOCIETY OF DAUGHTERS OF FOUNDERS AND PATRIOTS OF AMERICA.
"Eligibility for membership is founded upon descent from patriotic ancestry in unbroken line through the Colonial times and the Revolutionary War. Any woman above the age of 18 years and of good moral character and reputation is eligible for membership provided she is descended in direct Paternal line of either father or mother from an ancestor who settled in any of the colonies and who aided materially in the founding of the Colonies now included in the United States of America, from the settlement of Jamestown, Va., May 13, 1607, to May 13, 1687; provided that during the Revolutionary War en ancestor in said direct line by services in a civil or military capacity assisted in establishing American independence."

U. S. DAUGHTERS OF 1812. "Any white woman may be eligible to membership in this Society who is above the age of 18 years and whose lineal ancestors served in the Army or Navy or Civil Government of the United States during the 31 years which followed the close of the War of the American Revolution, or gave material aid to their country, provided such applicant be acceptable to the Chapter".

UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE CONFEDERACY. "Those eligible to membership are the wives, mothers, sisters, nieces, grand-nieces, and lineal descendants of such men who served honorably in the Confederate Army, Navy, or Civil Service."

DAUGHTERS OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS. "Any white woman, provided she is personally acceptable to the Association, is eligible for membership who is of the age of 18, whose ancestors were of the Old Three Hundred, or served the Colonies and the Republic of Texas in a civil or military capacity or were loyal to the Republic of Texas during her struggle for independence or received grants of land as settlers before the annexation of Texas to the United States, February 19, 1846.

HUGUENOT SOCIETY. "The membership of the Society shall be descendants of the Huguenot families which emigrated to America prior to the Promulgation of the Edict of Tleration, November 28, 1787; representatives of French families, whose profession of the Protestant faith antedates the Edict of Toleration, November 28, 1787". COLONIAL DAMES. "The Societies shall be composed entirely of women who are descended in their own right from some ancestor of worthy life who came to reside in an American colony prior to 1750, which ancestor or someone of his descendants, being a lineal sacendant of the applicant, shall have rendered efficient service to his country during the Colonial period, either in the founding of a commonwealth, or of an institution which has survived and developed into importance, or who shall have held an important position in a Colonial government, or who, by distinguished services, shall have contributed to the founding of this great and powerful nation. All services which constitute a claim to membership must have been rendered before July 5, 1776, but this date shall be held to include all the signers of the Declaration of Indecedence".

NATIONAL SOCIETY OF WOMEN DESCENDANTS OF ANCIENT AND HONORABLE ARTILLERY COMPANY. "Any white woman of 18 years and over who is lineally descended from a member of the Ancient and Horrable Artillery Company of Massachusetts between the years of 1637 and 1724, is eligible to membership in this Society provided she is acceptable to the National Board of Management".

MATIONAL SOCIETY OF NEW ENGLAND WOMEN. "Any somen over 18 years of age who descends from one or more ancestors born in New England prior to the signing of the Constitution in 1789, is eligible to membership in the Society, provided she is acceptable to the Colony she wishes to join and to the National Board".

DAUGHTERS OF COLONIAL WARS. "Members must be descendants from an ancestor who rendered military service or was a member of a war-declaring body in one of the American Colonies prior to 1774".

DAUGHERS OF THE CINCINNATI. "Members must descend from an officer of the line who joined the Society of the Cincinnati in his own right, or from an officer of the line who died prior to the adjournment of the first meeting of the Society of the Cincinnati held in Philadelphia in 1784. Of in default of any direct issue from an original member, with the consent of the Society, the Board may accept to membership the descendant of an officer who was eligible according to the Institution of the Cincinnati who did not join, but whose claim has been acknowledged by one of the State Societies".

DESCENDANTS OF THE COLONIAL CLERGY. "Members must descend from an ancestor who was a clergyman regularly ordained, installed or settled over any Christian church within the limits of the thirteen colonies prior to July 4, 1776."

DESCENDANTS OF THE SIGNERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE. "Members must be lineal descendants of a Signer of the Declaration of Independence".

Knowing that it is apointed for all men once to die, and to prepare our house in times, principally and first of all I give and ye soul in to the hand of Almighty God, that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial, Nothing Goubting but at the general I shall the same agen by the mighty power of God, and touching such worldy estate I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First I give and bequeath to my son Henry, one hundred acreas of land between Mile Branch and Coffeetown laying on James Heffels Land, to hold for his own property forever, with this condition, that the said Henry Mark shall be oblidge to pay to me if I should be in need of it, or else to the heirs? hereof Five Pounds Sterling Money.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth wife of Nicholas Brisky One hundred acres of land, between Herman Gabel and her sister Philipine for ever, But that she or her husband , so fare as I or myn wifes life time shall be obleget to keep in Good order, But when ever that land Under my Plow, should be worked or planted by a Cropper, than shall the said Nicolas Briske be clear of it for suche time, it is plowed by a Cropper, a convergence of the contract of the

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Philipona one hundred acreas of land where upon I now live for ever, with this condition, that she shall be obliged to pay to me, or there with heirs ten pounds sterling money,

Fourthly I give and bequest to my daughter Elizabeth Margaratha one hundred acres of land between her sister Philipina and Mr. James Stefel land, forever but that she shall be obliged to pay to me or her with heirs seven pounds Sterling,

Fifthly Cattles, Horses, Hogs, House furniture etc shall be after my and my wifes death, equally divided among my chn peaceably it is my will and desire that as long as it please God to spare me, or my wifes life, that we may live and stay upon the land unmolested or in our life time in peace and Quiet. Seventhly, I desire that the aforementioned money which is to be paid out of the land, shall be paid to these children that did get no land if I or my wife should not be in nect (need) of it, and as my son Conrad did not behave himself as a child to his father out to doe, I give one Shilling Sterling to him, and of all the heirtage, and Lastly I constitute make and ordain the Sole executor of this my last Will and testament names Charles Frederick Frolick and Philip Zimmerman as likewife evedence of this my last weill ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and test.


