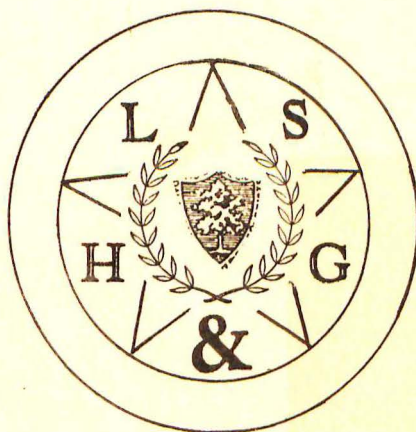

FEDERAL LAND RECORDS: Miss Jane Smith, National Archives

STATE DEPARTMENT RECORDS OF THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES: Mrs. Julia Carroll, Diplomatic,  
Legal and Fiscal Branch, National Archives

Mrs. Carroll in her talk stressed the necessity for full information when making  
request. Their records are those of the consul offices, passport registers, and  
applications and recommendations of State Department and Foreign service personnel,  
1797-1901. This department does not answer requests regularly because of the nature  
of their materials.

RESEARCH IN MIDDLE ATLANTIC STATES: Mr. Milton Rubincam, Past President,  
National Genealogical Society

In his lecture, Mr. Rubincam, reiterated comments by others that Americans do  
not complete, nor do their research in America thoroughly, before attempting to search  
for ancestors in Europe.

He called to our attention, in an aside, that Philadelphia is the only city in  
the U.S. which has a City Archivist.

It may be well here to state that he as well as other lecturers, referred to  
articles in the various magazines. All too often all of us forget to use these back  
issues which aid us in research. Indexes on the Index Table in our Genealogy depart-  
ment are for that purpose. If, for some reason, a magazine does not have an index a  
check of the volumes on the shelf will reveal often "just" what is needed to complete  
a search for that illusive ancestor or his dates.

Mr. Rubincam reviewed certain bibliography in research of the states of New York  
New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware and the Delaware Valley. He pointed out the in-  
accuracies of some works and the excellent points of others. This participant in the  
Institute must express admiration for the critical analysis of printed materials by  
Mr. Rubincam. He and others do not accept family histories which do not show evi-  
dence of thorough and complete documentation. Historians have come to be "gun-shy"  
of genealogists who do not prove their statements. Mr. Rubincam closes his bibliog-  
raphy with these words of caution, "Too much emphasis cannot be placed on the care  
with which the genealogist must treat the books included in the foregoing bibli-  
ography. All such works, whether of secondary nature or transcripts of source  
materials, are subject to error. Whenever possible, the genealogist should con-  
sult the original record".

RESEARCH IN SOUTHERN STATES: John Frederick Dorman, Editor, Virginia Genealogist

Mr. Dorman, a former librarian, is an enthusiastic young genealogist. His talk  
concerned personal research experiences in Maryland and Virginia, as applied to our  
course. One can see the careful documentation and recording of records he has done  
in each issue of his magazine. He called attention to the Maryland Historical So-  
ciety where one can find newspaper obituaries on 4x6 index cards. This society also  
has some records which antedate the Maryland Hall of Records. Research in other  
states of the South also were discussed in Mr. Dorman's lecture.

RESEARCH IN NEW ENGLAND; CHURCH RECORDS AND THEIR VALUE; PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SOURCE  
MATERIALS: Dr. John I. Coddington, former history professor, Harvard University,  
Contributing Editor, National Genealogical Society Quarterly

Dr. Coddington reminded us that historians know recapturing all about a period  
of history is not possible. In his discussion of presenting genealogical material

for publication Dr. Coddington recommended that new writers follow a style as used in the magazines American Genealogist and New England Historical and Genealogical Register and National Genealogical Society Quarterly. Books by Donald Lines Jacobus also were recommended for style. One whose handwriting is illegible should type materials before he finds he himself cannot transcribe his own note. Materials should be collected and formulated so that anyone can decipher or translate notes and publish material. Dr. Coddington strongly recommended that each person make some legal provision for safe guarding materials should anything happen to the collector. Indexing one's material goes without saying. Much material loses its real value with no index.

Mr. Coddington sketched the growth and development of church record keeping and the importance of the layman aiding in the search to collect and deposit records in the major genealogical research libraries of the nation. Important is the need for a major indexing project for certain collections now in existence. Dr. Coddington described the facilities of the various genealogical historical and public library collections in the New England States where one can do research. Genealogical and historical magazines to use also were fully described.

GENEALOGICAL SOURCE MATERIALS, METHODOLOGY, EVIDENCE: Dr. Jean Stephenson, Former Editor, National Genealogical Society, Chairman, Genealogical Records Committee, N. S. D. A. R.

At the last of her lectures, Dr. Jean Stephenson stressed the need to go back through old notes and letters to determine where a clue to the answer of a problem might be. She emphasized the need to forget the family or family member for the moment. One should think out the problem, study the historical period and locality and analyze other evidence. Look to the wife's family for further clues. Re-read the census records. One can always assume he missed an important clue or record there. Look up land records in an area and examine all owners around to see if there were inter-marriages. Watch for land movements in summer and in winter. Did the couples go down the frozen river to be married, or up the river in summer to register a deed? A deed may appear as much as 50 years later. Where were children in school at census time? Does the information you have suggest other avenues to search? No issue is too simple or unimportant to check.

HERALDRY: Dr. Jean Stephenson

The Heraldry lecture given by Dr. Stephenson was brief and, in the interest of time, only outlined. Having spent her life since 1906 in genealogical research and also being a learned lawyer, Dr. Stephenson emphasized again the point that U. S. families have no right to family arms unless one knows the ancestor who used it. One should be cautious about using arms found on tombstones with inscriptions. In the clan system only the head of the clan and direct descendants have a right to a coat of arms.

Recommended for reading by those interested in heraldry were "Visitation Pedigrees and the Genealogist", by G. D. Squibb, "Genealogists' Magazine", Vol. 13, No.8, Dec. 1960, p. 227 and Vol. 13, pt. 2, March, 1961, p. 266, "The Gentry and the Genealogist", March, 1963, Vol. 14, no. 5, p. 129.

Last, but not least, in the course was the submission of one's project for grading and suggestions by Dr. Stephenson, for further research references. A 3 hour test was taken the last day which caused each person to cudgel his or her mind of the maze of lecture sources from the 3 weeks extensive study.

Suffice it to say, despite the long days 'til 10 p.m. and the midnight oil spent going through each day's notes this member of the class feels well repaid for the brief time. Would that each of you could go to absorb these lectures from the scholarly, leading genealogists and archivists of today. Being able to represent the

 KRUM, DENTON COUNTY, TEXAS

On March 13, 1857, Bounty Warrant #782, was issued by F. P. Brewister, acting Attorney-General, granting for the State of Texas, 1920 acres to the heirs of Charles Despallier. This grant was made to these heirs of Despallier for his services in the Battle of the Alamo. Charles Despallier was killed defending the Alamo in the year 1836. A part of this 1920 acre plot later became the town of Krum, Texas.

Despallier, Charles, Private, 24 (aide to Travis). On Feb. 25, 1836, Travis cited him for bravery; and John W. Smith and Albert Martin were sent out with him as messengers.

His younger brother, Blaz Philip Despallier, participated in the storming of Bexar, December, 1835. He was Captain in York's company.

Their home was Rapides Parrish, La. Charles had also another younger brother who came to Texas in February 1836. Their mother was Madame Candida Despallier who died in 1837 of cholera with her other son, Victor, before they received their bounty.
