THE MEMORIAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL HISTORY OF DALLAS COUNTY, TEXAS. The Local History and Genealogical Society is sponsoring the reprint of THE MEMORIAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL HISTORY OF DALLAS COUNTY, TEXAS. It has over 1,000 pages and contains such features as: a list of first settlers, original members of the Pioneer Society, description of Indians in Dallas County, an index of biographical sketches, first boundaries, the county during the Civil War, Trinity River navigation, and 10,000 names that are mentioned and indexed. This limited edition is bound in a hard cover and can be ordered from LH&GS Books, 9411 Hunters Creek, Dallas, Texas 75243 for the price of \$26.00.

SEMINAR TO BE HELD BY TEXAS STATE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY. The Texas State Genealogical Society's two-day seminar will be held on Friday and Saturday, November 5-6, 1976, at the Baker Hotel. Friday's program starts with the registration at 8:00 a.m. and Saturday's at 7:00 a.m. A reception will be held Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m., November 4th. The detailed agenda is shown on page 117 of the September QUARTERLY. The program will offer some of the most reknown lecturers in the field of genealogy, to include: John I. Coddington, Milton Rubincam and Winston De Ville. They are Fellows of the American Society of Genealogist, the most elite corps of genealogists in the country. They have each lectured at the National Archives and at the Institute at Samford University, as well as at state and local societies.
