Program: "TEXAS COUNTY RECORDS INVENTORY PROJECT"

James E. Riney, Field Director

The County Records Inventory Project is a statewide survey of courthouse records conducted in cooperation with the Archives Division, Texas State Library. Mr. Riney has been with the Project, headquartered at NTSU in Denton since its inception in 1973. A graduate of NTSU, he is presently completing his Master's thesis in history there. As Field Director, he has trained hundreds of volunteers to compile these inventories. Forty-four counties have been completed & published; forty-five are in progress. County-by-county this inventory project is organizing a primary research tool for genealogists. The printed results are available to us in a comprehensive listing with descriptions of every type of record in the particular ounty in which our ancestor married, died, multiplied, divorced, bought, sold, broke the Law, wrangled in court, or whatever. Mr. Riney will illustrate with a short colored movie the Record Project's goal of helping county officials to set up a record system that will "preserve and make available for researchers much material that is at the present time inaccessible to them in the basements and attics of county courthouses,' Guests Welcome.

BOOK AWARD: Dallas Genealogical Society's Annual Book Award will be presented at our Annual Workshop on April 28, 1979. Books or manuscripts to be considered for that Award should be sent to Mrs. Lucile Boykin, Genealogy Librarian, Dallas Public Library, 1954 Commerce Street, Dallas, TX 75201, by the deadline of April 1, 1979. Contest Rules:

1. Qualifications for entry shall be membership in DGS in good standing.

2. The book contest shall be an annual affair with entries submitted by the first of April, and winners announced at the DGS Annual Workshop.

3. Recognition of winners or prizes shall be in the form of an Award to be approved by the Executive Board, and presented at the Annual Workshop Banquet or Luncheon.

4. There shall be the following categories:

a. Books with a minimum of 50 pages on the subject of a family history or genealogy.

b. Books with a minimum of 50 pages on some subject of local historical or genealogical interest. This would include such subjects as: how to go about genealogical research; a history of a city, county, or community; or a group genealogical study.

c. Manuscripts, containing a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on the subject of a

family history or genealogy.

d. Manuscripts, containing a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on some subject of local historical or genealogical interest (see "b" above).

5. There shall be one winner in each category. If in the opinion of the judges, no entries

are deserving of a prize in a particular category, then no prize shall be given that year. If in the opinion of the judges, entries other than the winner deserve special praise, then the judges shall give these entries "Honorable Mention."

6. Each book submitted shall become the property of the Dallas Public Library with the author retaining all publication rights. All manuscripts submitted shall be available for publication in the Dallas Genealogical Society's publication, THE QUARTERLY, with the author

retaining publication rights in the same or revised form.

7. Judges shall be three in number, annually appointed by the President, and ratified by the Executive Board; the chairman being the head of the Genealogy Department of the Dallas Public Library, and the other two judges being selected from outside the Society's membership, but being persons qualified to judge books and manuscripts.
