Milton RUBINCAM of West Hyattsville, Maryland, a former Editor of the Quarterly, has served as Book Review Editor since 1962. He was born at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 26 March 1909. Mr. RUBINCAM first became interested in genealogy at the age of 15 after years of exposure to an uncle's stories about their family history. Mr. RUBIN-CAM has written over 150 genealogical articles in over 35 different periodicals. He is a Board Certified Genealogist and serves as consulting genealogist for the Order of the Crown in America. In 1957 he was elected a Fellow of the National Genealogical Society (of which he has been a member since 1938 and served as President 1945-1948 and 1953-1954). He was elected a Fellow of the American Society of Genealogists in 1942 and was President 1961-1964. He is also a Fellow of the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania. Mr. RUBINCAM is frequently a speaker or lecturer at various genealogical institutes, seminars and conferences, and has lectured at the Institute of Genealogical Research in Washington since 1950. Since his retirement in 1972, he is devoting full time to his avocational interests and is available for speaking engagements and research commissions, specializing in Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, southern New Jersey, and determination of British and European backgrounds of American colonists.

No matter where your ancestors came from--you will want to hear Mr. Milton RUBINCAM. Many of your Southern ancestors whom you have found in Virginia, the Carolinas, Georgia, etc., came from Pennsylvania. Many went North from Pennsylvania also. Believe it or Not, many New Englanders came South through Maryland and Pennsylvania. Without a good background in these two states, research is much more difficult than it needs to be. Some of you may find that your ancestors spent much of their time going from Virginia to Maryland and back again. Those ancestors of ours were a very mobile people. Those of you who have ancestors in the Western territories of Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, Illinois, etc., will be interested in hearing Mr. RUBINCAM because many of your ancestors probably came out of Pennsylvania and Maryland also.

BOOK AWARD: Dallas Genealogical Society's Annual Book Award will be presented at our Annual Workshop on May 23, 1981. Books or manuscripts to be considered for that Award should be sent to Lloyd Bockstruck, Head, Genealogy Section, Dallas Public Library, 1954 Commerce Street, Dallas, TX 75201, by the deadline of April 1, 1981. Contest Rules

Qualifications for entry shall be membership in DGS in good standing.

The book contest shall be an annual affair with entries submitted by the first of April, and winners announced at the DGS Annual Workshop.

Recognition of winners or prizes shall be in the form of an Award to be approved by the Executive Board, and presented at the Annual Workshop Banquet or Luncheon.

There shall be the following categories:

a. Books with a minimum of 50 pages on the subject of a family history or genealogy.

Books with a minimum of 50 pages on some subject of local historical or genealogical interest. This would include such subjects as: how to go about genealogical research; a history of a city, county, or community; or a group genealogical study.

Manuscripts, containing a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on the subject

of a family history or genealogy.

Manuscripts, containing a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on some subject

of local historical or genealogical interest (see "B" above).

There shall be one winner in each category. If in the opinion of the judges, no entries are deserving of a prize in a particular category, then no prize shall be given that year. If in the opinion of the judges, entries other than the winner deserve special praise, then the judges shall give these entries "Honorable Mention."

Each book submitted shall become the property of the Dallas Public Library with the author retaining all publication rights. All manuscripts submitted shall be available for publication in the Dallas Genealogical Society's publication, The Quarterly, with the author retaining publication rights in the same or revised form.

Judges shall be three in number, annually appointed by the President, and ratified by the Executive Board; the chairman being the head of the Genealogy Department of the Dallas Public Library, and the other two judges being selected from outside the Society's membership, but being persons qualified to judge books and manuscripts.
