THE BATTLE OF YORKTO'N will be depicted on slides for our October DGS meeting. The presentation of the re-enactment will be given by Clovis H. Brakebill, President of the Texas Society, Sons of the American Revolution. On the 200th anniversary, thousands of "soldiers" from twenty-seven states marched to the site where the British troops under Lord Cornwallis surrendered to the Colonists and the French on October 19, 1781. The largest of the scores of outdoor exhibits at the ceremonial battle of Yorktown was the reconstructed military encampment housing more than 4,000 soldiers in 1,200 tents, in a re-creation of the camp life of colonial military units. Come and see this re-enactment of those memorable days, -- it will bring reality to what may have been just a printed page!

For those who want to spend the day at the Dallas Public Library on Thursday, October 28th, bring a sack lunch if you would like to. Coffee will be available.
