The Search Fee at the North Carolina Archives has gone up to \$5.00. Any letter to them asking for a copy of a record or other information must be accompanied by a \$5.00 check. You are billed separately for copies.

The Virginia State Library doesn't charge a search fee. But, only two items can be ordered at one time (such as two deeds or two wills). After about seven weeks you receive an order form listing your items and then you return the order form with your check. After returning the form it takes another six weeks to get your copies. Even though you are limited to two items their mimimum charge for the copies is \$5.00 and every order is charged an additional \$3.00 handling fee. So, no order of two items can cost less then \$8.00 or take less than thirteen weeks from the time of your original request for copies.
