KENTUCKY TAX LIST AIDS.....Pat Law Hatcher

The genealogy section has the Kentucky tax lists through approximately 1850. With the tendency of Kentuckians to migrate and new counties to form during the early years, it sometimes can be difficult to follow an ancestor around. Recently I used a service (something I rarely do) that I found useful. TLC Genealogy (P. O. Box 403369, Miami Beach, Fla. 33140-1369) has a computerized index for 1785-1799. For \$4 per surname with all variations (plus SASE) they promptly sent a list that allowed me to follow an ancestor through four counties and five surname spellings in an evening at the library.

If you missed Lloyd Bockstruck's talk on tax lists, you might be interested in Elizabeth Shown Mills talk on "Using Tax Rolls to Document Births, Marriages, Deaths, Migrations and Relationships" at the NGS Conference in Biloxi, which is available on tape from Triad (P. O. Box 120, Toulon, Il 61483).

BLUEBONNET UPDATE

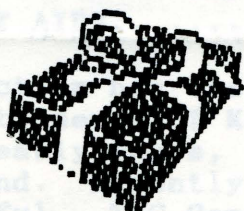
The State Flower, the Bluebonnet, was adopted in 1901 at the request of the Society of Colonial Dames in Texas. Least known is that "cactus" Jack Garner who was a Texas State Representative at this time was pushing for the cactus to be named the State Flower. The colonial Dames Society brought to the Capitol an oil painting of Bluebonnets and won the day for the BLUEBONNET.
