REPORT FOR YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1964  
of

MRS. HARRY JOSEPH MORRIS, VICE PRESIDENT-EDITOR-PRESS-ARCHIVIST, 1963-1964

During the year ending December 31st, 1964, I have compiled and edited the four issues of "The Quarterly" for the year of 1964. "The Quarterly", whose present covers and format I designed, received excellent reviews nationally for the year 1964, just as it did for the year 1963.

I compiled and edited "The Local History and Genealogical Society Handbook of Seminars in Genealogical Research", and have personally handled all the publicity, sales and delivery of it. A total to date (November 22, 1964), exclusive of tax and postage, has been 254 "Handbooks" sold, total sales - \$766.00 with 252 sales figured @ \$3.00, and 2 sales figured @ \$5.00.

In addition to the "Handbook", I secured books donated for sale, and sold all of them, with the total proceeds going to the Local History and Genealogy Society. I also sold many of the back issues of "The Quarterly".

I assisted with the planning and details of the work of the Tenth Annual Genealogical Institute and Work Shop, and handled the mailing of all the announcements, invitations, and notices of it.

I served as Press Relations Chairman, for all events during the year, and secured excellent publicity for the Society.

I sent out the notices for all meetings and events, with the exception of one regular meeting, which was handled by the Vice President in charge of communications.

I assisted in a perpetual membership drive, and attended to the printing of the "Membership Invitations".

I attended all sessions of both series of the Genealogical Seminars, with one exception, and conducted two of the Seminar Sessions, giving the lectures for which I wrote special material.

I attended all Executive Board Meetings, and all regular Meetings of the Society, with one exception, when I was out of the State.

It was my honor and privilege to represent the Society at numerous local, state, and out of state, genealogical society meetings, as well as at other patriotic and genealogical societies.

I served as liaison officer with The Dallas Public Library for the Society, and worked with Mrs. Lucile A. Boykin, Head of the Texas History and Genealogy Department, in activating and making current the Exchange List to receive "The Quarterly", and handled a terrific correspondence in so doing.

It has required endless time, much thought and effort, to efficiently and creditably handle all of the many details which all of the above required. The work load and amount of correspondence required was staggering, but I have faithfully performed all the duties of my several offices of Vice President-Editor-Press-Archivist, and have responded to the many requests above the call of duty, made of me, in my constant effort to help build our Local History and Genealogical Society, of which I have been a member for nine years, previously serving as a Vice President, Recording Secretary, and Director.

Hoping my sincere efforts have met with the approval of all, and with best wishes for a brilliant future for the Local History and Genealogical Society, I am

REPORT OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE  
LOCAL HISTORY & GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY - DALLAS, TEXAS

The Nominating Committee for the 1965 officers was appointed by Judge Walker and met on November 12th, immediately following the Board Meeting. The committee consisted of:

Porter Lindsley Jr.,	Chairman

Mrs. Tomlin was unable to accept and attend the meeting.

After a general discussion, the committee realized that there were several other problems far more important to solve before prospective officers could be canvassed. We have received the approval of each individual listed in the proposed slate below, but first, let us high-light a few of the problems because several of the proposed Board members have accepted only under specific qualifications. It is hoped, that because of these problems which I will list more in detail shortly, that the Nominating Committee to be appointed late in 1965 can be announced at least thirty days before its report is due, or at the October Board Meeting.

We would suggest to the 1965 Board that they establish the specific duties of each Vice President. We would suggest that when a Vice President resigns, the person filling the vacancy be given specific instructions as to the extent of his duties. We suggest that a budget be adopted for the basic functions of the Society. We would propose that \$200.00 be set aside for monthly program expenses and speakers. We strongly recommend that money be appropriated and promised to the Vice President of Publications at least one quarter ahead of the Quarterly that is to be printed. Since we received about \$1300.00 in dues in 1964 and would expect, in the following years, to have additional publications similar to the Hand Book which might bring in additional monies, it would seem possible that we could budget the above two activities and probably an original low budget for the annual Workshop, which could be increased as the Board felt more confident of the outcome. It is suggested that a By-Laws Committee be appointed to implement the above proposals. It is recommended that the Vice President in charge of Programs have at least three (3) members selected as a basic committee, with the thought that one of these three would be the chairman for the annual Work Shop. It appears to be important to have the Work Shop on a date other than final exam week, as has been true in the past two years. It is suggested that all checks for monies due the Society, regardless of the fund to be credited, will be made out to "Local History and Genealogical Society". These checks could be mailed to the Vice President of Membership, who would solicit new members and/or could be given to anyone at meetings, but in all cases would then flow to the Treasurer for deposit and verification of the correct account to credit. If a 1965 Hand Book is published, these checks could be mailed to the Editor, but should be in the name of the Society.

It is strongly recommended that some action be taken by the Board to establish a permanent list of the officers that have served this Society in past years, and that the new Board review the officers' activities on a quarterly basis. The two books, consisting of the membership records dating back into the 1950's, should have personal information brought up to date through the Board's action. This does not seem to be a function of the Treasurer, since it calls for research in the Minutes of the Society. It could be a separate committee's activity, taking place at the time of the annual Work Shop.

Your Nominating Committee Chairman humbly apologizes for taking the liberties of an Objectives Committee as a part of this report, but we were unable to secure some members acceptance on the new Board because the duties were not entirely clear. We urge the re-reading of the Constitution and By-Laws and present herewith the proposed slate with the exception of the Treasurer's position. Since the retiring Treasurer generally must function for 30 or 60 days with a new Treasurer, and since accounts must be transferred and audits made, etc., we propose that the new Board select their

Treasurer prior to their January Board Meeting and re-establish this job's duties, so that the Society's activities will be in full swing by February 1965.

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LOCAL HISTORY & GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY ANNOUNCES RULES FOR ANNUAL BOOK AWARD, THE FIRST OF WHICH WILL BE PRESENTED MAY 22, 1965

The Local History & Genealogical Society announces the following rules for the Annual Book Award:

1. Qualifications for entry shall be membership in the Local History & Genealogy Society, in good standing.
2. The book contest shall be an annual affair with entries submitted by the first of April, and winners announced at the Local History & Genealogical Society's annual Genealogical Institute and Work Shop, which is held in May.
3. Recognition of winners or prizes shall be in the form of an Award, to be approved by the Executive Board, and presented at the annual Genealogical Institute and Work Shop Banquet or Luncheon.
4. There shall be the following categories:
  - a. Books with a minimum of 50 pages on the subject of a family history or genealogy.
  - b. Books with a minimum of 50 pages on some subject of local historical or genealogical interest. This would include such subjects as: How to go about genealogical research; a history of a city, county, or community; or a group genealogical study.
  - c. Manuscripts, containing a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on the subject of a family history or genealogy.
  - d. Manuscripts, containing a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on some subject of local historical or genealogical interest (see b. above).
5. There shall be one winner in each category. If in the opinion of the judges, no entries are deserving of a prize in a particular category, then no prize shall be given that year. If in the opinion of the judges, entries other than the winner deserve special praise, then the judges shall give these entries "Honorable Mention."
6. Each book submitted shall become the property of the Dallas Public Library with the author retaining all publication rights. All manuscripts submitted

shall be available for publication in the Local History & Genealogy Society's Quarterly, with the author retaining publication rights in the same or revised form.

7. Judges shall be three in number, annually appointed by the President, and ratified by the Executive Board; the chairman being the head of the Local, Texas History & Genealogy Department of the Dallas Public Library, and the other two judges being selected from outside the Society's membership, but being persons qualified to judge books and manuscripts.

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THE LOS ADAIS AREA OF NATCHITOCHE PARISH LOUISIANA  
BY Mr. Louis R. Nardini, Sr., Natchitoches, Louisiana

The Mission San Miguel Cuellar de Los Adais (San Miguel de Linares de Los Adais) was established September 29, 1717 by the Padres, Francois Hidalgo and Margil de Jesus and was situated just fifteen miles west of the French Outpost, St. Jean Baptiste de Natchitoches (established May 1714).

The Spanish of Mexico had laid claim to all land west of the Red River (They listed the Red River as Rio Caddox) because of the expedition of Don Domingo Teran Del Rios 1690-1691 who had mapped the area and classified the Caddo Nation of Indians as Tejas Indians and all of the Region from the west bank of the Red River (included that in Present Louisiana) was considered under Spanish Claim as the Texas Region of Mexico.

When the Spanish Padres established the Mission San Miguel Cuellar de Los Adais, they by this action, stopped the encroachment of the French to the west in Louisiana.

When war broke out between France and Spain in the year 1719 Lieutenant Philippe Blondell, Commandant of the Post St. Jean Baptiste de Natchitoches, raided the Spanish Mission at Los Adais. This resulted in a withdrawal of the Spanish in the San Augustine-Nacogdoches area westward to the San Antonio area of Texas. Thus resulted the Marquis Jose de Aguayo Expedition of 1721-1722 into the Texas Region to re-establish the Missions and Presidios in the East Texas Region and on and by November the 16th 1722 he had accomplished this task. The most eastern Presidio being Nuestra Senora Del Pilar de Los Adais. This Presidio was proclaimed as the Capital of the Texas Region of Mexico, and was to maintain this distinction until the year 1771.

In the year 1767 Fra. Jose de Solice acting upon orders from the College of the Holy Cross of Queretaro Mexico to make an inspection tour of the Missions along El Camino Real, in his diary he noted that the Mission San Miguel Cuellar de Los Adais had recorded 256 baptisims, 64 marriages and 116 burials. "It is to be noted here that all of the baptisims, marriages and burials were not all Spanish people. The French Post at Natchitoches was quite often without the services of a French Priest and the Spanish Padres at Los Adais provided the Catholic Services for the French Post.

In the year 1779 there was an order to withdraw all of the Spanish settlers of the Los Adais Area to the vicinity of San Antonio. A number of these Spanish Families who had French ties fled to the French area of what is now Natchitoches Parish. The other families being led by Antonio Gil Flores and Antonio Gil Y Barbo began the long journey westward to San Antonio, many perished along the way.

The following list of names are those who were Heads of Families who had journeyed to San Antonio and were now demanding to return to the East Texas Area. This List of Signatures was sent to the Vicery of Mexico City and presented by Gil Y Barbo and Gil Flores, bearing the date October 4, 1773. Many of these families later settled in the Nacogdoches Area of Texas after establishing the Town of Nacogdoches.

By the end of the year, October 1779 Antonio Gil Flores had established the Pueblo de Nacogdoches and the Presidio Nuestra Senora Del Pilar de Nacogdoches, and was appointed Captain of the militia and civil affairs at Nacogdoches.

Y'Barbo issued many verbal Land Grants to those who had assisted in the re-establishment of Nacogdoches. Many of these verbal grants were later disputed in 1793. The following persons however, had so effectively settled the land and marked their boundaries, that they were issued conclusive grants to their land. FLORES

At Los Adais as early as 1735 there were two Flores, Muguel and Manuel residing at the Presidio Nuestra Senora Del Pilar de Los Adais. In 1738 "Natchitoches Historical Documents" Antoine Gil Cesar Flores was reprimanded for trading with the French at Natchitoches.

Again in 1758 "Pointe Coupe Historical Records" Document concerning The French Trader, Nicholas De La Malathie had suit against him by the Council of Commerce of Louisiana for trading for Horses and Cattle with Antoine Gil Y Barbo and his brother-in-law, Gil Cesar Flores.

If one reads carefully the early history of Texas and especially that which pertains to the road known as El Camino Real (that which is now Texas Highway 21 and extending on into Louisiana as Highway 6) one will find that the name "Flores" as soldiers as early as 1691. I am hoping that through this writing the fact may be established that the Flores Family is one of the oldest in the Texas area.

In Natchitoches Parish concerning its early history, only skimpy records exist concerning the Spanish at Los Adais. One must understand that on this remote frontier and just fifteen miles apart existed settlements of two separate Foreign Nations. And from the year 1717 to 1772 the records of this area were kept separately. After 1772 the records of the area are found in the Natchitoches Records. It was not until 1772 that the Natchitoches area accepted Spanish Domination, even though the Natchitoches Post was transferred to the Spanish in 1767. Thus the early documents concerning Los Adais are found at San Antonio and at Nacogdoches.

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HISTORICAL SKETCH OF FIRST GENERATION OF WHITE FAMILY

By Mr. M. H. White, Chester, South Carolina

On December 22, 1767, there arrived at Charleston, South Carolina, a ship called "Earl of Donegal" in charge of Duncan Ferguson, Master. On board that ship were two hundred and sixty-five souls who had left their Motherland and braved the dangers of

the Atlantic Ocean in order that they might come to America to enjoy a land of Liberty and Freedom. Little did they know then of the experiences of adventure which were to be theirs in years to come.

Among those passengers, who that day set foot on Carolina soil, were John White and his wife, Ann Garner White, formerly of County Antrim, Ireland. Nothing is known definitely of the exact place from which they came, but tradition has it that they came from Broughshane, or some place nearby. Dr. G. B. White of Chester, South Carolina, while visiting in Ireland during the year 1903, found a number of tombstones in the cemetery at Broughshane bearing the family name of White, but he was not able to trace authentically any direct connection between those Whites and John and Ann White.

John and Ann White were the progenitors of that large connection of Whites, who, since the earliest settlement of what is now Chester County, South Carolina, have lived in the neighborhood of Old Purity Presbyterian Church and cemetery, about two and a half miles south-east of the town of Chester on the Chester-Great Falls Highway.

From the ship's passenger list and other sources we get the following information concerning John White and family:

John White and his family settled about three miles south-east of Chester on the Chester-Great Falls Highway, one third mile west of the highway, and two hundred yards north of a large spring which is still in use on J.G.L. White's Farm.

There is no accurate information available concerning the time of John White's death and place of burial. However through Daniel Stinson, a historian, who accumulated considerable knowledge concerning early events, which took place in Chester County, we learn that, according to tradition, John White was killed near what was then Youngsville but now called Woodward in Fairfield County, S.C., in a skirmish with Cherokee Indians. Since that was before the day of vehicles, his friends were not able to bring his body home to Chester County for burial, and so his remains were buried in the Old Concord Cemetery, which is near what was then Youngsville, but now Woodward. The Cherokee Indians frequently came across the North Carolina border, and made raids on the Catawba Indians in the vicinity of Chester, S.C. During the least some of these encounters, the white settlers joined forces with the Indians of the Catawba Tribe, and as a result of such cooperation of the part of the settlers, the Indians became fast friends of their white neighbors. It is interesting to note just here that a remnant of the Catawba Indians still exists near Rock Hill, S. C., where the South Carolina Government has set apart a reservation for these Indians, and given them permission to draw a pension from the state.

Ann Garner White died January 25, 1818, in the ninety third year of her age and was buried in Old Purity Cemetery, where a head stone marks her grave. During the year 1930, some of the descendants of John White had a marker erected to his memory, alongside the

marker of his wife, Ann Garner White. The time of his death and place of his burial is altogether unknown.

Doubtless it will be of interest to some to know that the land on which John and Ann White settled was a grant from King George the Third of England, and this land during all these years has never been owned by anyone except members of the White Family. Part of the old grant of land is now owned by J.G.L. White, and the remainder is in the possession of M. E. White.

Par. 5 Jannet White-Miller, 2 (D/O John White, 1) was born in County Antrim, Ireland, in 1762. After coming to America she was married to Robert Miller, who was a soldier of the American Revolution. He died August 12, 1831 in 72nd year. His name appears on the list of those who were wounded at Kings Mountain, S. C., and whose names have been inscribed on the Monument erected to their memory on Kings Mountain Battle Field. Jannet White died February 22, 1815. Both she and her husband lie buried in Old Purity Cemetery.
