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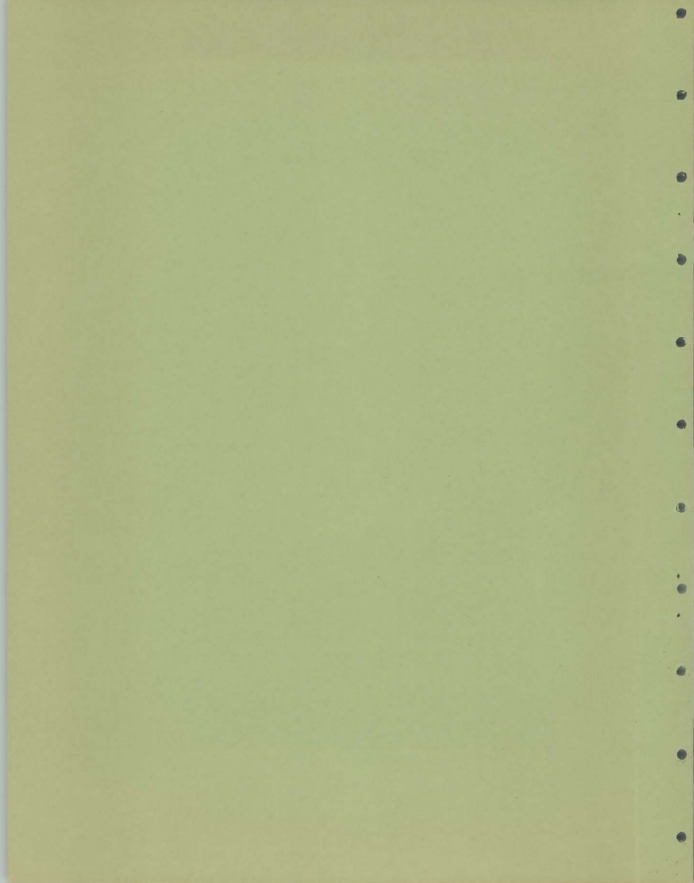

Earliest Extant Malone Will - Nathaniel Malone
of Southwicke Parish, Surry County, Virginia, 1732.

Marion Nugent in Cavaliers and Pioneers says wife was Marg. or Mary:

Signature is Natt. or Nath Mallone

Abstract: To son Nathaniel all my houses and lands on south side of Sappony Creek in Parish aforesaid, except 1 A at the hog-pen ford just below my dwelling house, and 1 negro woman Judy, and 1 cow.

To son Drury Malone the 1 A. before excepted and plantation where I now live, and land adjoining with following bounds: beginning at the Cart Ford of Sappony Creek; then N to ye Reed Branch, then down branch to my old line, then to a pond called ye Great Pond, then turning to Pig Quarter on Stony Creek; then down said Creek to the mouth of Sappony Creek, then up Creek to beginning... to son Drury and lawfully begotten heirs, and in default of such issue, said lands to remain to son THOMAS MALONE and lawful heirs, and in default of such, to be equally divided between sons: WILLIAM MALONE, NATHANIEL MALONE and their heirs.

To son Drury 1 negro man named Simbrick, 3 cows and 5 pounds.

To son Thomas & heirs, all lands from head line of land of land I have before devised to son Drury, turning up Sappony Creek and Reedy Branch to William Harper's line; and 10 pounds and 1 negro man Sam.

To son DANIELL MALONE etc., my house and 200 acres on ye North side of Nottaway River beginning at mouth of Tommahelon Swamp in Parish George County, running up Tommahelon Swamp and Nottaway River for 200 acres; and 1 negro woman Carlo and 5 pounds.

To son-in-law (stepson?) JOSEPH HARPER etc. my house and 200 acres in upper part of a tract called Tommahelon Land and 20 pounds and 2 Cows & calves, 11 hogs at Tommahelon and called ye Joseph's, hogs, 5 pewter plates, 3 pewter dishes and 10 pewter spoons and 1 iron pot of 5 or 6 gallons.

(Last item is almost entirely obliterated; daughters named)

Amey 1 mulatto man named _____: Amey to also keep my dau _____, and dau _____, until they marry or come of age; my daughter _____ Courtenay (she married a Courtenay); remainder to be equally divided. (The William & Mary Quarterly Vol.9) Series 2, Page 321, in 1929 printed the names as Amey, Mary, Phebe). Extrs. list is part blotted but names Drury & Nathaniel are shown. Dates very dim but looks like 1732, Proved 20 June 1733.:

NOTE: Dinwiddie Tax lists 1783-92 William Malone lists names in his household as William Malone, Jr.; & Harper Malone. Son William is ancestor of Mrs. L. G. Pleasants of Los Angeles, California (who worked out of the Wynne-Malone-Chappell-Randolph lines.)

Daniell and heirs, on Nottaway River would have listed later in Brunswick & Mecklenburg Counties, following the course of the River.

The Will was made in the year of William Byrd's running of the "Dividing Line", between Virginia and North Carolina.

MALONE-MARCUS

William Marcus was born 10 October 1805 in South Carolina he died 12 March 1873, he was married in Lawrence County, Mississippi on 11 November 1830 to Zillica (Zilika) Rankin Margis born 19 April 1812 in Tenn the daughter of Aaron and Elizabeth (McKee) Hargis. Zillica (argis Marcus died 11 Nov 1886 Junction City, Union County, Ark and is buried in Scotland Cemetery. Children of William & Zillica (Hargis) Marcus:

Rebecca Ann Malone born 2 December 1852 in Jasper County, Ga the dau of Jephtha & Eliza (Moultrie) Malone of Jasper Co. Ga. who moved to Union Co., Ark and later to Claiborne Parish, La. Jephtha Malone was the son of Francis & Martha (Patsy) (Chaffin) Malone of Georgia.
11. Eliza Moultrie was born 16 Oct 1832 Troup Co, Ga. the dau of Joel & Elizabeth (Carr) Moultrie. Jephtha Malone was a brother to John A. Malone that married Nancy Hammock who were the parents of James Madison Malone, Sr. in Claiborne Parish, La. that married Lenor Willis. James Madison Malone, Sr. was killed in C. W. buried Corinth, Miss.
12. Adaline Elvira Marcus born 28 Sept 1852 Union Co., Ark died 13 April 1893 married in 1870 to ROBERT HARRIS.
13. Hugh Joshua Marcus born 12 July 1852 Union Co., Ark., died 17 Nov 1897 married to Keturah Malone - she was born Monticello, Georgia the dau of Jephtha & Eliza (Moultrie) Malone.

For the benefit of my step-children these records were prepared at my request by my father, Victor B. Gilman of Dallas, who has an outstanding record of several years in professional genealogy. Although most of the information was obtained from The Danas and the Dana Farm, by Florence Dale Burrage, and my wife's family records, my father conducted a considerable amount of research in lineage books of the Daughters of the American Revolution, in the American Compendium of Genealogy, and other publications mentioned as follows:

Memorandum by Victor B. Gilman

European ancestry of the Nyes (7th-12th great-grandparents of Anne and John Dana) is taken from The Genealogy of the Nyes, by Benjamin Nye.

European ancestry through the Field line on the maternal side is taken from William and Mary Quarterly (v.9, series 2); Ancestral Roots of Sixty New England Colonists, by Frederic Weis; and Magna Charta Sureties, by Adams and Weis.

Because there is not sufficient space for much biographical detail on charts like these, a few specific details follow:

Compendium (v.2, p.407): "Thomas Mayhew, 1592-1681, England to Mass. with his son Thomas, settled at Edgartown, 1642, governor and crd. (commander?) of Martha's Vineyard, Province of New York under Governors Lovelace and Nichols."

Compendium (v.2, p.247): "Captain Daniel Fisher, 1619-83, England to Boston 1637, settled at Dedham, Mass., speaker of the General Court three times; m Abigail Marriott."

Virginia Magazines of History and Biography (v.8, p.213), data on the Adams family-- Francis I and II, Samuel and Tabitha: "Francis Adams. . .large landowner in Charles County, Maryland, was one of the signers of a petition to the monarchs, William and Mary, in 1689."

The same item shows William Russell, husband of Tabitha, as a colonel, 13th Virginia Regiment on the line in the Revolution, also sheriff and justice of the peace of Culpepper County. DAR v.121, p.16, shows his serving as a brigadier general in 1780.

DAR v. 137, p.284, shows William Bowen, captain, commanding a company of mounted rangers in Col. Wm. Campbell's Regiment in the Virginia line.

DAR v.128, No. 127944: "Thomas Henderson, 1783-1821, rendered signal service piloting General Greene's army across the Dan River."

Compendium (v.3, p.103) shows Abraham Field II as a vestryman at St. Mark's Church, Great Forks Parish, from 1744 until his death in 1774.

Note: This Abraham is shown in several records as having married a sister of Col. Wm. Byrd, presumably a sister of Col. Wm. Byrd II, not Col. Wm. Byrd I, who

died in 1704 at the age of 52; it is unlikely that he would have had a sister of an age to marry Abraham, who died in 1774. This is mentioned here because the daughter, or any later descendant of William I, is also the daughter of Maria Horsmanden, descendant of John Fitz Robert, Magna Charta Surety, of King Edward III, and of many of the leading houses of the British Isles and the Continent. This should be an interesting line for future research.

Compendium (v.7,p.249) shows John Field of Field Manor, St. Mark's Parish, Culpepper County, sent to England for his education. This was an unusual practice in those early days.

(Editorial Comment: Only an excerpt of the entire Dana Ancestry is herein published, starting with the grandparents of the subjects and omitting the paternal ancestry prior to 1631 and the maternal prior to 1828.

Your attention is invited to the excellent manner developed by Mr. Victor B. Gilman for the inclusion of all the necessary vital statistics into a limited space while maintaining clarity and continuity of lines.)

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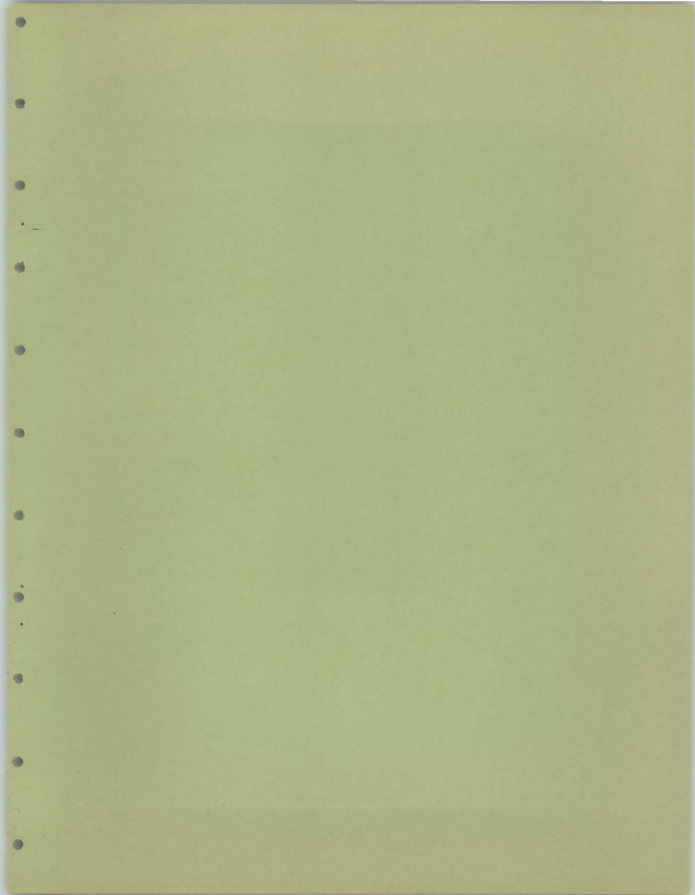
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
