## NEWS FROM THE BOARD

On another page you will find an announcement of our coming Workshop. The Board is justly proud of our guest speakers, Mrs. Inez Waldenmeir and Mrs. Mary Warren. Those of you who were at the Workshop last year will understand why the Board unanimously asked Mary Warren to return, and we think you will find in Inez Waldenmeir the same combination of knowledge and charm that made Mary Warren's visit last year so memorable.

For many years the members' dues were enough to underwrite the cost of the Workshop. Then for the past two years we were able to manage with only a minor charge of \$1.00. Now increasing costs for printing and postage have forced us to make the Workshop self-supporting. The cost for Members will be \$5.00, for non-members, \$7.50. Another change is to a one day meeting. We are following other societies who are charging \$7.50 for a one day meeting. Ft. Worth will have Virginia Pope Livingston, speaking on Virginia, on March 29th for \$7.50. Mr. Milton Rubicam will speak in Shreveport for \$7.50. The Georgia Historical Society will charge \$10.00 for a one-day Workshop on Tories on May 22nd. None of these groups will offer their programs at a lower price to their members as we are doing.

The problems of finance for the Society are very real. The Board wrestles with them every month. Last year we went \$300 in the red and obviously this can not continue. An increase of fifty members would do wonders. If we could adopt the very successful program of a Kentucky society in which each member was encouraged to find one new additional member, we would succeed beyond our wildest dreams.

Do not feel disgruntled at the rise in price for the Workshop. The information of experienced genealogists is well worth the cost involved. Plan to come and support your Society and its Workshop.

The results of the Questionnaire, which about 90 of you filled out, were interesting. Conflicts were the primary reason for persons not coming to the luncheon meetings and not driving or going out at night the primary reasons for not attendance at the night meetings. There was, however, practically no enthusiasm for changing the meeting dates to the weekend. There were some suggestions for speakers and subjects and we are grateful. May seemed to suit as a date for the Workshop and the number of suggestions that Mary Warren again be a speaker was a help to the Board. There was limited interest in a trip to Austin to the Archives and this will be pursued at a later date. Over 90% of those answering read the Quarterly from "cover to cover" a high compliment to our previous editor, Mrs. R. E. (Nelle) Dishman.

The Quarterly has a member in a new position. Mrs. Edward (Joan) Hughston is the Assistant Editor. She has many ideas, one of which would be printing pictures of early Texas settlers. If you have such a picture call her, 368-8713, or write her, 5314 Palomar Lane, Dallas, Texas 75229.

THE BROACH FAMILY  
OF  
VIRGINIA, NORTH CAROLINA, GEORGIA AND TEXAS

I. Early BROACH FAMILY in Virginia

Broach is a relatively rare family name which is found spelled variously Broche, Broch, Broach, Brough, etc. Early family records are found in Virginia in Essex, York, King and Queen, and King William Counties, but the very first records are those of JOHN BROACH, believed to have been the immigrant ancestor, who was a frequent litigant in early York County, Virginia court records. And in these records his name is often followed by the word "chirur, chyrugion, or currurgion", all variations of the word "chirurgion", the archaic spelling of "surgeon".

He was in the Colony of Virginia as early as 1636-1638, having transported other persons to the Colony, as shown by York County, Virginia, deed records such as one dated 26 Sept., 1636, - 6 Dec., 1638, "land granted to Stephen Gill and later to John Broach".

It is believed that this John Broach was the father of NICHOLAS BROACH who is mentioned in another deed dated Sept. 1664..northwest on the land of Mr. Nicholas Broach as granted to Mr. John Broach, died as Alien, 9 July, 1664". (Nugent, Cavaliers and Pioneers) A century later the name Nicholas Broach will be found in several Broach wills in Halifax Co., North Carolina.

The Broach family stuck close to the eastern shore of Virginia in counties previously mentioned and at least three of them were to become soldiers in the Revolutionary War from King and Queen County: - CHARLES BROACH, ABDNOR BROACH and BENONI BROACH - with Charles and his wife Martha to receive Bounty Land in Ohio; while a fourth, GEORGE BROACH, was to become listed as "Patriot" from the same county of the other three men.

II. BROACH FAMILY IN NORTH CAROLINA AND GEORGIA

When members of the Broach family emigrated into North Carolina from Virginia, some of them settled in Caswell Co. and others in Person Co. (Ed. note: Person Co. was formed from Caswell Co. in 1791. These counties are in far north central N. Car. on the state border, with Pittsylvania and Halifax Counties, Virginia, just across the state line.)

During the last quarter of the 1700's and in the early 1800's we find a George Broach and Jones Broach living in Caswell Co., while James Broach and Richard Broach are found in the early 1800's in Person Co., N. Carolina; of these the following:

GEORGE BROACH (1768-1842) was born in Virginia 14 Sept., 1768. He married on 19 March, 1803, in Caswell Co., N.C., JANE BROACH or BIRCH (b. in N.C. 18 March, 1782; d. in N.C. 5 Nov., 1855) with witness being JAMES BROACH who lived in Person Co., N.C. George Broach died 24 Oct., 1842, in N.C.

At the time of his death, George had a son, RICHARD BROACH, in Middlesex Co. Va., who relinquished his share in his father's estate in favor of his brother, JAMES BROACH, who was living in Henry Co., Tenn.

RICHARD BROACH (ca. 1787- ) was born in Virginia about 1787 and is believed to have been the son of JAMES BROACH (1761-1845). Richard lived in Persons Co., N.C., where we find James Broach on the 1800-1810 Census of that county. Richard married LUCY ANN WHITEFIELD about 1810 in N.C. Pertinent records from Wheelers Church in Person Co., N.C. were sent to us by Mrs. Ann Whitfield, descendant of James Broach and his son, Richard Broach:

JONES BROACH (ca. 1755-1809) was born in Virginia about 1755 and came to Caswell Co., N.C. sometime during the Revolutionary war. About this time he married Elizabeth \_\_\_\_\_.

His Revolutionary War Record shows that he fought under the command of Lt. Col. Archibald Lytle and was paid 1 Dec., 1778 as one of the new Levies of Caswell Co., N.C., for a period of service of six months and five days. His name also appears on a list of men enrolled for Captain Robert Moore from Caswell Co. under Col. Lytle's command.

Sometime before 1789 Jones and Elizabeth Broach moved to Wilkes County, Ga. An old deed record dated 20 May, 1789, shows they owned land there along Cedar Creek at that time:

"Abel Pennington and wife, Sarah, to Jacob Burton, 240 acres on both sides of Cedar Creek whereon Pennington now lives adjoining JONES BROACH, Peter Oliver and Benjamin Hamtrack."

Court records show him still in Georgia in 1807..."Bridger Haynie shows returns for 1807 paid to Thomas Going, William Haynie, Richard Saunders and JONES BROACH as per Receipt."

Jones Broach's will, dated 3 January, 1809, was filed in Clarke County, Ga., on 13 March, 1809. His wife Elizabeth and his son Charles were named co-executors; however, Elizabeth soon died because in September, 1813, the court records mention that Charles Broach is the sole remaining executor. The returns made by Charles as Executor of his father's estate and as Guardian of his sister Averilla until she came of age in 1816, are found in the Clarke Co., Ga. Minute Book 1803-1816. There was a sale of the estate of Jones Broach and his sons and sons-in-law bought various items.

Of these children:

CHARLES BROACH (1.) and his wife Polly settled after 1820 in Walton Co., Ga. But later, during the time of the California Gold Rush, he and his family left Walton Co. and headed for California in a train of 42 wagons. After six months travel they reached Arkansas where they decided to stop and settle at a spot near the present day towns of Fordyce and Kinsland, Arkansas.

Several years later their son James and little grandson both died of typhoid fever, and the widow, Mrs. James Broach, took a surviving son and three daughters back to live in Walton Co., Ga. She lived there with her father who was GEORGE BROACH (3.), brother of Charles.

WILLIAM BROACH (2.) settled in Greene County, Ga., and stayed in that area. Many of his descendants are listed in the Census for Greene Co.

GEORGE BROACH (3.) was born in Virginia 2 September, 1780. His wife, Lucy Glenn, was born in Va. or Ga. 17 March, 1783. It is possible that George was the oldest son of Jones and Elizabeth Broach, but that since George lived away from home, Jones appointed a younger son Charles (1) as the co-executor of his estate.

George died in Oglethorpe Co., Ga., 24 June, 1862. His wife Lucy died in Oglethorpe Co., 17 August, 1875. They had a son Charles W. B. Broach, a daughter Adeline J. Broach who married James H. Patten; and two daughters Lucy G. Broach and Martha E. Broach, neither of whom ever married.

LITTLEBERRY BROACH (4) was the youngest son of Jones Broach who instructed executors of his will (1809) to give Littleberry a year of schooling, a suit of clothing, a horse, a saddle, etc. And, no doubt, Littleberry Broach also received his share of land.

In 1815 Littleberry Broach married Sarah McElroy in Madison County, Ga., and they are found living there in the 1820 Census. Sarah is believed to have been the daughter of John McElroy who died in 1804, Oglethorpe, Co. Ga.

By 1820, Littleberry Broach and his wife Sarah are found in the 1820 Census to be living in Madison Co., Ga. He petitioned for land in the Land Lottery in 1827.

He died within the next three years as shown by the 1830 Census of Madison Co. which lists the widow Sarah McElroy Broach and 4 males and 4 females. The 1840 Census shows Sarah, age between 40-50, and her children, living in Madison Co. with her unmarried son, Jones Broach. Another son, Charles M. was listed as a male between 10-15 years of age. Her other two sons were Thomas A. and William Henry Broach.

By 1843 Sarah McElroy Broach was living in Stewart County, Ga. as proved by a land title recorded in Madison County, Georgia, and dated 3 Jan., 1843

"..between Jones Broach of Madison Co. and Jones Broach, attny. in fact for SARAH BROACH of Stewart Co., Ga., \$425.00 from John Griffith, 200 acres of land on Fork Creek...."

Sarah apparently died between 1850-1860 in Stewart Co. as she does not appear on the 1860 census.

HOW TO PUBLISH  
GENEALOGICAL AND HISTORICAL RECORDS,  
FAMILY HISTORIES AND SOURCE RECORDS  
By Mitzi Barnett

(Given before the Local History and Genealogical Society, January 28, 1970.)

Printing is one of the oldest means of communication for disseminating information and recording historical happenings and information. With the many reproduction processes available today, everyone who has collected records should publish.

There are several reasons for publishing your documents and research. Here are a few of the most important:

1. PUBLICATION OF YOUR MATERIAL WILL PRESERVE RECORDS FOR USE OF FUTURE GENERATIONS. Too often a person spends his lifetime gathering information only to have it carelessly thrown away, stored in an attic until it disintegrates, or lost in a move by his descendants who might not realize the value of the information. By publishing, this material is in a form which will become a family heirloom to be handed down generation to generation instead of being referred to "as that bunch of junk."

2. OTHERS WILL BENEFIT FROM YOUR EFFORTS AND RESEARCH. Publication of your material and marketing through a company such as ours on a nation-wide scale will enable others to obtain the information they seek without duplication of effort, and perhaps that bit of information you discovered about "Uncle John" might be the needed link to complete their own family lineage.

3. MONETARY BENEFITS FROM SALE OF YOUR PUBLICATION. Although the time spent in compiling and the expense involved in publication of a family history is not always recovered, one CAN recover the cost of printing and make a profit on such a publication if it is well documented, well written, and interesting, by marketing it through a company such as ours with a mailing list large enough to reach a volume of people interested in such a history.

4. PERSONAL SATISFACTION. This, above all, I believe is the greatest reason for publishing -- the immense satisfaction in having produced a record of one's VERY OWN FAMILY in permanent form.

Start making plans now for publication of your material. You will be surprised at how much of the work you can do yourself if you wish. The more work you do, the less your publication costs.

To make your work easier, I have devised a simple, seven step procedure. This is not the only procedure for compiling that may be used, but I have found it the easiest.

Step No. 1: COMPILE YOUR FAMILY HISTORY

We are assuming that you have collected the information needed for your family history and are ready to assemble this information into workable form. Begin by sorting all information pertaining to each family head into a separate folder. In this folder include all photography, marriage records, letters, biographical information, etc. If another member of the tree is mentioned in these documents, place a note indicating this in this particular member's folder. Label each folder.

After these folders are organized, clear a large area (preferably the floor). Now begin by placing the folder of the first immigrant top and center. Beneath his folder place the folder of each of his children. Below each child, place the folders of his children. (Lay aside for the time being the folders concerning origin, name, coats of arms, and in-law families.)

With the folders arranged, number the folders, beginning with No. 1 for the original immigrant, No. 2 for his oldest son, No. 3 for his next child, etc. Go across each row; numbering from left to right, until all folders have been numbered. (Any numbering system may be used, but this is the simplest and the easiest to follow in research).

Transfer this layout to a large sheet of paper. This layout forms the basis of your family history.

After you have made your chart, you are ready to decide what kind of a family history you wish to write:

1. DIRECT DESCENDANTS OF THE ORIGINAL IMMIGRANTS.

If you wish to only pick up the direct descendants of the original immigrants, you will only give information on the sons and unmarried daughters of the male lines, since all married daughters take up another surname through marriage.

2. FAMILY HISTORY.

All names are picked up in a family history and are carried out. The married daughters, however, are simply given a number, their birth date, marriage date, to whom married, and death date in the main part of the book. Children and in-law lines are carried in separate chapters at the end of the book.

3. GENEALOGICAL FACTS OR REAL FAMILY HISTORY.

One must decide whether or not he wishes to simply state the facts, such as birth, marriage, death, children; or whether he wants to make it a real family history by including photographs, old letters, anecdotes, cultural background, family traditions, etc. The latter makes much more interesting reading and the person who is not interested in genealogy will enjoy reading such a family history.

4. NOTES ON YOUR LINE OF FAMILY ONLY.

Be sure to indicate in the title that this is the case. In a history of this type, only your direct line is carried out -- perhaps other children are mentioned, but only birth, marriage, and date of death is given. This type of book has limited sale value, but entails fewer pages.

5. RANDOM NOTES ON FAMILIES.

This type of publication does not try to tie information together, but simply gives source and information collected on all persons of particular names. This type of publication is valuable to others working on these names, and sells very well.

Step. No. 2: WRITING THE FAMILY HISTORY

When you have compiled your information in workable form and determined the type of history you wish to write, begin putting your notes into manuscript form.

1. Direct Descendants of Original Immigrant or Family History Format.

The most important figure in your family history is going to be the original immigrant, for he had the most to do in shaping this history. You should begin Chapter 1 with this gentleman. Give all information gleaned, such as cultural background, reasons for his emigrating to America, conditions in the old country that could have caused his emigration, etc. Be sure to give source of information, such as title of book, author, page no., publisher and date published; where will is registered; of if information were given by a member of the family, give name and address. A book without documentation is worthless as proof of lineage. After you have given the background of the original immigrant, end his story with "his children were:" and list them, with the number on your chart. (See example below.) If you have additional information other than name, date of birth, marriage date, to whom married, and death date, put an asterisk in front of the number. From this point forward, simply pick up the next number on

which you have additional information, until you have completed your family group chart. As you pick up a new number, list this person's name first in capital letters, then his father's name with his number, his grandfather's name and his number back to the original immigrant, then begin your story.

Example:

1. John Jones, the emigrant. His children were:
    - \*2. James Jones - b. , m. (name of person, date), date of death
    3. Tom Jones
  2. JAMES JONES, John Jones (1)  
James Jones, s. of John and (wife) Jones was b. -- (give all known information ending with his children were:)
    4. Andy Jones
    - \*5. Cecil Jones
  5. CECIL JONES, James Jones (2), John Jones (1)
- Note: Since there was no biographical material on Tom Jones (3) and Andy Jones (4), the names were not picked up.

When you have completed all folders on the family, take out the folders on in-law families. These go in separate chapters for each family, and are placed directly following the family lines. Begin a new chapter for each in-law family if there is enough information. Be sure to cross-reference to the number given the daughter marrying into this family in the main part of the book.

Immediately following the in-law chapters should be a miscellaneous section in which is placed information picked up on persons of the same name but who cannot be connected with the direct line. This increases sale of the book and also will give someone valuable information --this information may also enable you to "connect up" with these miscellaneous lines at a later date.

The folders on origin, name, coats of arms, and information on European ancestors are included in the preface.

Format for Book Containing Only Genealogical Facts: Format is basically the same as that for a family history if written in essay form. However, this type of book can be simply a reproduction of family group sheets and pedigree charts. This type of book makes for dry reading, however.

Format for Book Containing Random Notes: Give source of information, including title, author, publisher, date published and page number if taken from a book; give name and address of individual and date information given if received in this manner. If taken from family Bible, give publisher, date, and owner of Bible at present time. Classify your information according to areas, giving separate section to each area.

Example:

#### BARNETTS IN TENNESSEE

1850 Census, Davidson County, Tennessee, compiled by Deane Porch, pub. 1970, American Reference Publishers, Fort Worth, Texas.  
Family No., page No.

The rough draft manuscript should be typed double-spaced with 1" margins on all sides to allow last minute corrections, and for easier reading for the typesetter. Be sure you have indicated and allowed space for pictures, photostats, etc.

### Step No. 3: DETERMINE METHOD OF PUBLICATION

The type of publication you intend to produce will determine the method of printing and expense and requirements for each. Here are our recommendations for methods of publication, based on number of copies you intend to produce:

- (1) 1 to 5 copies - Type with carbon copies.
- (2) 5 to 25 copies - Use Xerox or similar type copier
- (3) 25 to 100 copies - Mimeograph
- (4) More than 100 copies - Offset or letter press printing

In order to decide upon the method of printing, one must first determine the total number of copies he wishes to produce. In order to do this, it is a good idea to send a rough draft of the manuscript to various relatives outlining your plans and asking that they contribute any additional information concerning the family which they may have. Ask them also to indicate their desire for a copy of the finished book. Send only the manuscript referring to their particular branch. If you do not wish to go to this much expense, make up a small announcement and send to these same people outlining the forthcoming book and requesting the same information as above.

Should you determine the number of copies you need would be less than 100 copies, one of the first three methods of printing named above would suffice and you are ready for step number four.

However, if you need more than 100 copies, you must determine whether you wish to use the offset or letterpress printing method. In order to help you decide, both methods are explained in the following paragraphs.

Offset Printing. This method is the least expensive method of reproduction in volume. Typewritten copy is photographed and transferred to a printing plate. On books of no more than 500 copies, the copy is photographed directly upon a paper printing plate. For more than 500 copies, a negative and metal printing plate are required. Reproduction of pictures also requires a negative and metal printing plate. Negatives and metal plates are more expensive than paper plates.

To reduce the cost on offset printing, the most economical size book is the 6x9. (It is also the most popular size with libraries). The page is typed on 8 1/2 x 11 forms in 10 point type (standard size for most typewriters) and reduced down 20% to fit the 6x9 page size. Your printed page is then 8 point type (standard size for many books). This requires fewer pages and saves on printing and binding costs. Below are samples of typewriter type reduced to 6x9 size.

There are two formats for offset printing. One may choose either offset, relaxed format typesetting or offset, rigid format typesetting. The most economical format is offset, relaxed format, and may be done by the individual should he desire. Offset, rigid format typesetting must be done by a professional on special machines, and is three times as expensive as the relaxed format. The basic difference in the two formats is under relaxed format, the right hand margin is not even. Since most family histories contain many short lines, an uneven right hand margin does not detract from the book.

Letter Press Printing. Printing by letterpress gives very high quality, but is also very expensive. Type is set on a linotype machine in metal, assembled into pages, and the book is printed directly from the type instead of plates. The greatest advantage of letter press printing is that type may be set any size one desires, varied as to type face, spacing, etc. Hot type composition makes a beautiful book, but in my opinion, the difference in appearance is not great enough to warrant the expense. Also, books printed by letter press usually require more time to complete than those printed by offset. (TO BE CONTINUED)
