ABANDONED CEMETERY LOCATIONS Submitted by Mrs. Bessie Sheppard

The HORTON Cemetery is out in a pasture, south of Elm Grove Cemetery, near Westminister in Collin County, Texas - abandoned and neglected.

OLD GROUNDS Cemetery is north from Blue Ridge, Collin County, almost impossible to reach, overgrown with vines, weeds, briars and etc. Many prominent pioneers are buried there.

THROCKMORTON Cemetery is located two miles northeast of Melissa in Collin Countv. It is overgrown with weeds, poison by and the like. It is believed that Gov.

CARROLL CREEK Cemetery is located about eight miles southeast of Jacksboro, Jack County. The fence is down, it is overgrown with weeds, some stones are broken and pushed aside and many stones unmarked. It is on a hillside and may be observed from the highway. Cedars are scattered throughout the lovely setting.

KILBY Cemetery is one mile south of Vineyard, Jack County on a Hillside, fenced but overgrown with weeds. It is east of the road and almost impassable. Large Granite markers and quite a few graves with tombstones are in a setting of live oak trees.

GREEN BRIAR Cemetery is about six miles northeast of Nacona, Montague County. It is in a pasture but is fenced. It is unattended.

OLDE WILLOW POINT Cemetery is in the Willow Point Community is Wise, County. It is northeast of the Baptist Church in Doyle Sheppard pasture, a short distance from the road - 200 or 300 yards. The fence is down and cattle graze over the area. Some stones have been knocked down and some are piled in heaps.

One grave contains the remains of Tommy D. Bloodworth who was killed while driving a buggy when the horses ran away as he was carrying the mail from Willow Point to Springtown. He was born in 1865 and died 22 March 1885 at the age of twenty years. Some of the graves are marked by sand stones and bear no inscriptions.

(Editor's note: Here is an opportunity for Boy Scout Troups to earn merits for their troups by cleaning up these abandomed cemeteries and making it possible for some one to go in and copy the inscriptions before they are lost forever. Any received will be published in our quarterlies. Mrs. Sheppard has so kindly furnished us with the locations, will someone living nearby help by copying the inscriptions? Does anyone know of other abandomed Texas cemeteries? The smaller ones, those with two, three or more graves are just as important as the larger ones.)

MEMOIRS OF GEORGIA

Taylor County Sketches Pages 867 - 868

James J. Ruffin, farmer, Reynolds, Taylor Co., Ga., son of James and Margaret (Veal) Ruffin, was born in Bertie Co., N. C. in 1814. His grandfather was a native of North Carolina and was a soldier in the patriot army during the Revolutionary Mar. Mr. Ruffin's father was born in North Carolina and migrated thence to Georgia and settled in Jones Co. in 1814 for life. He was a carpenter by trade and also a large slave owner. He was much respected.

Mr. Ruffin's grandfather on his mother's side, Thomas and Margaret Veal, were natives of North Carolina, and spent their lives there. He was a soldier during the Revolutionary War.

Mr. Ruffin was reared on the farm and received a fairly good education for the time at the old familar log school house. In 1836 he enlisted in Capt. Russell's company, Col. Hardeman's regiment, for the Seminole War and served three months. In 1864 he enlisted in the state militia under Capt. Beal and was principally assigned to port duty. After the war, without capital, he began merchandising in Butler, and succeeded beyong his most sanguine anticipations. Wr. Ruffin has been twice married.

In 1837 he was married to Miss Sarah Everett, born in Hancock Co. in 1816, daughter of Drury and Elizabeth (Smith) Everett. He was born in Washington Co., Ga. and when a young man moved to Taylor Co., Ga. where he farmed all his life. Of the children which blessed this union four are living: Henry J.; Margaret, Sarah and Goerge T. Nrs. Ruffin who was a member of the Wethodist Church died in 1888.

In 1889 Mr. Ruffin was married to Mrs. Carrie Lucas, born in Georgia in 1839, daughter of Thomas and Martha E. (Wright) Shines. He was born in North Carolina, moved early in life to Georgia and settled in Taylor, Co., where he lived and farmed until he died.

Mrs. Ruffin is a member of the Methodist Church, and Mr. Ruffin and his family are much respected in their community.

STORIES ON STONES by V. R. Smith

The final resting place of the outlaw, Jesse James, is in Kearney, Mo., but the original burial place was on the family farm near Kearney, the stone now entirely chipped away by souvenir hunters, was erected by his mother. It read:

"In Loving Memory of My Beloved Son - Jess W. James - Died Apr. 3, 1882 - Aged 34 years, 6 months, 28 days - Murdered by a Traitor and Coward - Whose Name

Is Not Worthy to Appear Here"

Walnut Grove Cemetery, near Delphos, Ohio: "Isaac Thurston, died 1914, aged 74 (log shaped monument):

"He sawed logs for forty years - But he wont saw this"

"Passing of a Good Man"

The death of Uncle Francis Millican, Tuesday night, November 19, at his home at New Hope, is sincerely mourned by a large circle of acquaintances in McKinney, where he was extensively known and highly esteemed, as well as in the eastern part of the country where he lived so long.

Francis M. Millicam was born in Tennessee just 72 years prior to his death, having died on his birthday. With his father he came to Collin County 60 years ago and was therefore one of the county's oldest pioneers at the time of his death. He married Miss Bettie Williams, daughter of John Williams and had ten children, seven of whom are living, as follows: John E., I. N., Marlon, and James, and Three daughters, Mrs. L. C. Counts, of Lebanon, Tennessee, Mrs. John T. Ault of Woodford, Oklahoma, and Mrs. Eula Tarvin, a widow without children, who lived with her father. He was a faithful member of the Baptist Church for many years and a regular attendant of Sunday School at New Hope. His remains were laid to rest by the side of his wife at Stiff Chapel Cemetry. Dr. E. E. King, pastor of First Baptist Church at McKinney, conducted the funeral services.

Uucle Francis Millican was a true man in every sense - sturdy, honest, moral and a friend of right and righteousness throughout a long and useful life. The influence of his modest, unassuming but highly honorable life will long remain to bless his memory among those who knew him best 1.

In Howard's Grove Cemetery, on Lexington's Bryant Station Pike (Ky), lies a flery young man who killed one newspaper editor and in turn was killed by another. Charles Mickliffe became embroiled in a violent controversy via the pages of the Kentucky Gazette. This led to the sudden death of editor Thomas R. Benning, at the hands of young Wickliffe. Henry Clay won his acquittal despite his guilt. Later he was challenged to a duel by another 21 year old, George James Trotter, who had taken over the Gazette. On the second shot, Wickliffe was fatally wounded. His stone reads: "Charles Wickliffe son of Robert and Margaret P. Wickliffe was killed in a Duel, by James Trotter in October 1829, age 21.

Another Pioneer Citizen is Dead
Capt. William A. Shelton of Melissa
died at home Wednesday evening.

Capt. William A. Shelton died at his home near Melissa on Wednesday afternoon. The deceased had been in fooble health for sometime and the demise was not altogether unexpected.

Capt. Shelton was born in Alabama on December 5, 1840; and was, therefore, 79 years, 2 months and 29 days old at the time of his death. He came to Texas first about the year 1848; and settled on the Jordan O. Straughan farm near Viney Grove. In the year of 1860 he returned to his old home in his native state, and enlisted in the Confederate army service.

He served for four years under the Stars and Bars. During the latter two years of that struggle he was under the command of Gen. Nathaniel B. Forest, as Capt. of the Ninth Alabama Gavairy. When the civil strife had closed, he removed to Aberdeen, Mississippi, where he lived for 11 years. It was there that he married Miss Laverna Williams, a woman of many lovely traits of character.

To this union 10 children were born, seven of which survive, as follows:
Nrs. W. T. Cave of Princeton, Nrs. C. W. Frost of Denison, Nrs. John Spencer of
Trinidad, Colorado, and Misses Helen and Massie Shelton and Messrs. Claibourne and
Douglas Shelton of Melissa. All of the above, and the devoted wife were at the bedside at the time of the demise, except Mrs. John Spencer of Trinidad, Colorado. Besides the children, the deceased is survived by two brothers, C. W. Shelton of Wils
Point, Texas, and C. P. Shelton of Farmersville, Texas: and three grandchildren, Joe,
Tom and Verna Bassham, who lived at the homestead at Melissa.

About the year 1877 he came again to Texas, this time with his family, and settled near where he resided at the time of his death.

Capt. Shelton was a consistent member of the Christian church for more than 30 years He had made farming his life occupation, following that work without interruption except during the years of his service in the Confederate Army.

Capt. Shelton was a kind and loving father, a devoted husband, and upright citizen, and a good man, and he will be remembered for many years for his acts of kindness and neighborly bearing towards one and all.

The interment was made this afternoon at the Melissa Cemetery. Rev. V. L. Graves, his pastor, conducted the funeral service. These papers join with the many friends in extending sympathy to the grief-stricken relatives and friends.

The pallbearers were as follows: R. V. King, G. O. Knox, H. H. Hill, Lee Darling, M. Douglass and H. H. Martin.

In the old Episcopalian Cemetery in Lexington, Ky. - a 150 word epitaph begins: " In memory of Franklin Combs, born Nov. 17, 1824, died Dec. 31, 1844. Having been waylaid and assassinated by a cowardly villian named George O. Blennis in Pointe Coupee, La."

In the same cemetery is a lady who died in an early American traffic accident. "In memory of Mrs. Eunice Lockwood Formerly Mrs. Ayers, who died on the 15th of Nov. 1837 aged 59 years. Her death was occassioned (sic) by the upsetting of the stage between Louisville and Frankfort.

In the Paris, Ky, cemetery: "George W. Watters born Oct. 20, 1827. Murdered in Cin. O. June 1, 1862. Here lies an honest man but an imprudent one. * * * * * * * *

In Frankfort's Cemetery, Ky .: "John Milton Elliott born May 16, 1820. Assassinated for having done his duty as a Judge Mar. 26, 1879." Judge Elliott was shot down on the streets of Frankfort by Col. Thomas Buford, of Woodford Co. Elliott and rendered an adverse decision in a property suit in which Buford's sister was involved. Buford was tried, judged insane and locked up in the asylum. Escaped and made his way to Ind. * * * * * * *

Simsonville, Ky. Cemetery: "In Memory of Margaret Alexander who was born 1st of Jan. 1788 and was brought to her death by the violent hands of her servant, on the 3rd of Sept. 1838, aged 50 years 8 months and 2 days," Left alone with her slave girl in the country one night, the girl choked her to death. No one knows name of slave girl -



TEXAS STATE MARKER DEDICATED Submitted by Lucile Hallmark

Theo S. Daniel, 3rd Chairman of Henderson County Historical Survey Committee, Athens, Texas was the Master of Ceremonies at the dedication of Texas State Marker for Centerville on 9 September 1973 at Cedar Lake Baptist Church, Gun Barrel City.

Centerville replaced Buffalo (near Porter's Bluff) as the second County seat, 1848, due to the central location in the county at the time. This land was donated by James Harper Starr, (1809-1809) a Texas Statesman. In 1850 when the county was reduced in area the county seat was moved to Athens and Centerville died.

The marker stands 1.25 miles south of F R 85, 6 miles northwest of Eustace.



THE RUFFIN FAMILY

George T. Gowan

On 27 December 1868, my great-great-great grandmother, Sarah Jane Ruffin, married John Forsyth Parker in Taylor County, Georgia. After marrying the couple remained in Taylor County until 1887 at which time they emigrated by train to Rice, Navarro County, Texas. There they settled down and farmed for several years. There were several children born to this marriage; however, they are not listed in this paper. Sarah Jane died the 27th of May 1918 in Coriscana, Navarro, Texas and is buried beside her husband in Cakwood Cemetery, Corsicana, Texas, Her husband survived about one year dving on 1 May 1919 in Dallas, Dallas County, Texas while waiting for a train.

Sarah Jane was the seventh of ten children, and one of only five who survived childhood to marry. These ten children included:

Mary An born 21 September 1838, died 30 June 1841

Lucinda M. born 30 December 1839

James M. born 17 March 1841, died 14 October 1340 in Marion County, Georgia William A. born 26 May 1843, died 30 December 1852

Henry James born 23 April 1845, died 10 July 1916 in Alma, Ellis County, Texas

Margarett Elizabeth born 20 September 1847

Sarah Jane born 30 October 1849 in Marion County, Georgia, died 27 May 1918 in Corsicana, Navarro County, Texas

George T. born 3 or 8 December 1851, died 25 December 1913 in Georgia Emer R. born 23 September 1854, died 8 July 1856 Susan Fannie born 31 March 1858

The children who married are listed below:

Henry James, Margarett Elizabeth and Sarah Jane were those who eventually migrated to Texas.

James Joel Ruffin2, the father of Sarah Jane above, was a farmer and dealer in dry merchandise living most of his life in Taylor County, Georgia. Born in Bertie County, North Carolina on 14 November 1814, he emigrated with his brothers and sisters and with his parents, James Ruffin and Murgaret Veale, in that same year of 1814 to Jones County, Georgia. James J. is listed on several censuses as listed below:

His location in 1830 is unknown; however, he may have been in Upson County, Georgia as "James Ruffin's orphan" drew a land grant in Upson County from the 1832 Cherokee Land Lottery and as there is a Thomas Ruffin listed on the 1830 census for that county.

One of his sons, James M., is listed as dying in October, 1840 on the Marion County, Georgia 1850 Mortality Schedule.

James J. married Sarah Averett, the daughter of Drury Averett and Elizabeth Smith, on 1 October 1837 and after Sarah's death in 1888, Mrs. Carrie Lucas on the 1st of August 1889 in Taylor County. Georgia.

According to an act dated 14 December 1863, a militia enrollment list for the 757th Militia bistrict was prepared in which J. J. Ruffin is listed. On this particular roll, he lists his age as 51 years 2 months and birthplace as North Caroliname explanation for this variance in age. A biography writes, "in 1864 he enlisted in the state militia under Beale and was principally assigned port duty." The enrollment roll was the only record of a J. J. Ruffin during the Civil War according to the Georgia Department of Archives and History.

James J. Ruffin's will dated 26 December 1899 with two codicils dated in 1901 was probated on 27 February 1905 in Taylor County, Georgia. The will listed his wife as Caroline and children as Lucinda Salter, Henry J. Ruffin, Margaret E. Layfield, George T. Ruffin, Sarah Jame Parker. It is unknown whether Caroline was the same person he married in 1889.

James Ruffin³, the father of James Joel, was born in North Carolina and was the son of William Ruffin and Patsey
Of his early life nothing is known. On 22 December 1794, a marriage bond was made between James Ruffin and Margaret Veale, the daughter of Thomas Yeale and Margaret made and Margaret made setween James Ruffin and Margaret veale, the daughter of Thomas Yeale and Margaret made setween James Ruffin and Margaret Margare

In a deed dated 14 November 1796, 50 acres were sold to James Ruffin by his father, William, but in another deed dated Il November 1799, these same 50 acres were sold back to William by James. The first deed was witnessed by Thomas and Richard Veal and Jason Gardner, and the second, by Allen Purvis and John Ruffin.

James appears on the 1800 and 1810 censuses for Bertie County, North Carolina and on the 1820 census for Jones County, Georgia, The entries appear as follows:

From the Biography of James Joel, James "settled in Hones County in 1814 for life. He was a carpenter by trade and also a large slave owner.

There is no listing for any Ruffin in the 1830 census for Jones County, Georgia. The land grant to "James Ruffin's ofphan" in the 1832 Cherokee Land Lottery would indicate that James had died before that date and with the census information before 1830. There is no will on record in this county.

James' wife, Margaret Veale Ruffin, is listed on the 1840 and 1850 Talbot County, Georgia censuses -- in the latter as 80 years of age.

The remaining portion of this presentation is a mere statement of facts gathered in my research with some analysis.

Nothing is known of William Ruffin⁴ or his wife, Patsey except for the biography of his grandson, James J., which states he served in the American Revolution and was a native of North Carolina.

There are several entries in the will records for Bertie County, North Carolina of Ruffins:

William Ruffin - will dated 7 February 1808, probated August Term 1808; mentions brothers Starkey, Thomas and John and sister Sarah King.

Thomas Ruffin - will dated 22 August 1832, probated november Term 1840; beneficiaries "children of brother Henry Ruffin and James Ruffin, brothers Whitmell B., John and Blount B."

John Ruffin - will dated 10 November 1841, probated February Term 1845; mentions wife, children -- John, Thomas, Wm., Julia and Sally Ann.

William Ruffin of Northampton County, North Carolina - will dated 1 March 1779, probated November Term 1781; sons William and Richard, daughters Faith Pender and Purity Deloach.

The marriage records for Bertie County List:
Henry Ruffin to Treacy Benton bonded 11 July 1799
David King to Sally Ruffin bonded 10 May 1793
Frederick Ruffin to Elizabeth Cotten bonded 15 August 1776

There is a William Ruffin listed in the State Census of North Carolina, 1784 - 7 for Bertie County. The entry listed one male 21 to 60, 6 males 21 and under, and 3 females.

The 1790 census for the same county lists 3 males 16 and above, 5 males under 16 and 3 females under William Ruffin.

The 1800 census for the same county lists 3 males under 10, 2 males 10 to 15, 1 male 16 to 25 and 1 male 45 and over -- no females. There is no entry for a william in the 1810 census although there is a william H. listing 1 male 26 to 44,

Using the above consus and will records, William Ruffins's children might have been William, James, Starkey, Thomas, John, Henry, Whitmell B., Sally and another girl as yet unknown.

The 1820 Census for Jones County, Georgia included a Robert R. Ruffin. The entry lists 1 male under 10, 1 male 10 to 15, 2 males 16 to 25, 1 male 26 to 44 and 1 female 16 to 25. His relationship to James is unknown; however, he may have been a son -- probably a son as his age is 26 to 44. Since James listed a male in 1810 as 16 to 25 then he would seem to be a son. This is based on the assumption Robert R. is the male 26 to 44.

There is a marriage entry in Richmond County, Georgia for the marriage of Maj. Robert R. Ruffin to Harriet P. Fox on 23 December 1818.

James and Richard (may be same person as Robert R.) participated in the 1821 Land Lottery of Georgia. In addition, Robert R. participated in the 1820 and 1826 Land Lotteries. A Thomas Ruffin also participated in the 1820 Land Lottery; however, his relationship to James is unknown for sure -- although he was probably a son of James.

The following is listed in an Index to the 1840 Georgia Census:

Carroll County - Richard Ruffin Richmond County - John Ruffin

Family group number 1097 on the 1850 Talbot County, Georgia lists a farmer aged 45 named Thomas Ruffin having his birthplace in North Carolina.

James J. was probably the orphan who drew the land grant in Upson County, Georgia as he would have been only 18 in 1832.

James Ruffin's family probably included three sons, Robert Richard, James J., and John; however, the names of his daughters is unknown.

Mrs. Read was a descendant of Dr. James Craik who was the surgeon general of the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War and the personal physician to George Washington.

Deed records in Collin County Court House in McKinney, Texas, show that Mr. and Mrs. Nathaniel Murphee of Nodaway County, Missouri, sold property in Collin County to Caleb S. Burnes (Burnes). The deed was signed Sept. 24, 1861 in Nodaway County, recorded in Collin County, Dec. 19, 1861, This property located near the community of Weston, in M/E Collin County, Weston is the oldest town in the county and is 13 miles N/N of McKinney.

SOME BIOGRAPHICAL EXTRACTS OF GENEALOGICAL VALUE FROM FARM AND RANCH

In the early 1880s a new magazine appeared devoted to agricultural interests in the state of Texas. Prominent Texans involved in various aspects of agricultural business were featured in biographical articles. Each sketch had an engraved portrait of the biographee accompanying the sketch. The following are summaries of some of these sketches; after each sketch appears the date of the issue in which the original sketch appeared and the page number of that issue. While the Dallas Public Library does not have a complete run of this periodical, it does have one of the more nearly complete sets.

- 1. R. V. Tompkins, of Dallas. He was born at Hyde Park, Duchess County, New York on 1 May 1840. His parents were of Holland stock. Coming to Texas in 1860 he served in the Second Texas Infantry for four years during the Civil War. 15 February 1885 issue, page 11.
- 2. H. B. Sandborn, of Houston. Born in 1845 in Saint Lawrence County, New York. he accompanied his parents to Illinois in 1864. The latter were originally from Vermont. Moving to Denver, Colorado in 1871, he came to Texas in 1875. 1 March 1885 issue, page 11.
- 3 Capt. Sydney Smith. He was born in 1839 in Marengo County, Alabama one year after his parents' marriage there. His father was from Maury, Tenn. and his mother was from Pitt County, North Carolina, He graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1859. During the Civil War he served in Co. D. 1st Mississippi Cavalry under Col. Dick Pinson and later on the staff of W. H. Jackson. In 1874 he came to Dallas, Texas. 15 March 1885 issue, page 11.
- 4. John G. Hunter, of Dallas. He was born in Richmond, Virginia in 1840. His father James Hunter was a native of Tredegar, Wales while his mother was a daughter of a prominent Scotch merchant of Richmond. He served 8 months in the Civil War with Richmond's Grays in the 12th Virginia Regiment and later with the Ordance Department. In 1878 he moved to Oswego, New York thence to Waxahachie, Texas in 1881 and to Dallas two years later, 1 April 1885 issue, page 11.
- 5. C. A. Keating, of Dallas. Of English descent, he was born at Halifax, Nova Scotia in 1850. In 1870 he moved to Chicago and five years later he settled in Austin. He came to Dallas in 1877. 15 April 1885 issue, page 8.
- 6. Henry William Graber, of Dallas- He was born in Bremen, Germany 18 May 1841. His father was a Prussian, but his mother came from Hanover. He immigrated to the United States in 1853 and settled in Houston, Texas. He served in the Eighth Texas Cavalry during the Civil War. After the war he removed to Grimes County where he married M. Louise Parks. Prior to coming to Dallas in the 1870s, he lived in Hempstead. Rusk and Waxahachie. 1 May 1885 issue, page 8.
- 7. M. Drane, of Corsicana. He was born in 1837 in Shelby Co., Kentucky. Coming to Texas in 1858, he settled in Navarro County in 1860. 15 May 1885 issue, page 8.
- 8. George J. Bartram. A native of Norfolkshire, England, he was born in 1849. He immigrated to America in 1855 and settled in Illinois. In 1877 he came to Sherman. Texas and in 1884 moved to Dallas. 1 June 1885 issue, page 8.

- George E. Bennett, of Dallas. He was born 6 October 1852 at Springfield, Clark County, Ohio. Later he started in business in Holt County, Missouri. Coming to Dallas in 1876, he married 19 September 1884, 1 July 1885 issue, page 8.
- 10. Walter A. Huffman, of Fort Worth, Born in Kentucky 16 October 1846, he came to Texas in 1857 and settled in Collin County. At the age of 17 he joined Gano Guards and fought in the Civil War. He went to Tarrant County in 1870. 1 September 1885 issue, page 1.
- S. O. Daws, of Wise County. The son of an Irish father and a Teutonic mother, he was born at Kemper Co., Mississippi on 28 December 1848. He came to Texas in 1868. 15 January 1886 issue, page 13.
- 12. John M. Crockett, former Lieutenant Governor of Texas. A native of the Lancaste: District, South Carolina, he was a son of Robert N. Crockett. He married a Miss Polk in Tennessee and came to Texas in 1847. 1 March 1886 issue, page 13.

THE TRUTH ABOUT THE PILGRIMS

Francis R. Stoddard

This book was originally published in 1952 by the Society of Mayflower Descendants. This is a reprint with corrections and a preface by Walter M. Pratt, Governor General of the Society.

This book gives a more thorough insight into the lives of the Pilgrims while they were still in England. It also explains many of the errors that certain historians have made about them and why.

Among other things, it informs us just how little is known, in most cases about the background of many of the Pilgrims. It does give a very good insight on the conditions of the time and why it was necessary for them to do and perform the mental positions which they did do while in Holland.

It certainly is an honest study of our Pilgrim Fathers and deals with the subject with precision without making any false claims. If there is a lack of information in a certain area, Mr. Stoddard makes it known. He makes no assumptions and tries to correct false legends that have come about since their landing.

Anyone having Pilgrim ancestors will find this book a must for their own library. Not only is it easy reading, but gives a great deal of background on all the Pilgrims.

Darden from Alabama and Tennessee respectfully and Samuel T. Owen from Alabama.

A PARTIAL GENEALOGY OF THE MOODY FAMILY OF GRAYSON AND FANNIN COUNTIES, TEXAS

by L. D. Bockstruck, M. A., M. S.

The progenitor of the earliest Moody settlers in northeast Texas was Andrew Moody who was born in Pennsylvania on 16 May 1779. He probably grew to manhood there and not far from 1800 married Gusannah Rippy. One of their sons was born in Kentucky, so it is possible that the Moodys lived in that state a few years prior to settling in Tennessee near the present city of Nashville.

During the War of 1812, sometimes referred to as America's Second War for Independence, Andrew Moody enlisted as a private at Fayetteville in Captain Joseph William's Company, 1st Regiment Tennessee Volunteer Mounted Gummen. He entered the service at Clover Bottom on 28 September 1814 and served until the expiration of his enlistment on 3 May 1815.

After the end of the war and the inauguration of James Monroe as the fifth president, an era of good feeling emerged and Americans continued to move westward. Andrew Moody took his family into the Illinois Territory and settled in what was to become Bond County. On 20 May 1817 he sorved as a grand juror in that county. He had occupied a farm originally settled by Thomas Kirkpatrick about one mile southwest of the future city of Greenville. The famous spring at that place took its name from Mr. Moody and was known far and wide as "Moody's Spring." It was the sight of numerous religious meetings, and it was there that the first church in Bond County was organized. The building was erected by the Methodist denomination in 1817 on land which the trustees of the congregation, John Kirkpatrick, Robert Gilzepie, Andrew Moody, Robert Diamond, John Spiller and Issac Price, acquired from the heirs of Thomas Kirkpatrick, Noatrick.

The county's first camp meeting was held at Moody's Spring and for a series of years thereafter these meetings, social and religious highlights of the community, were annually held. As a result the area became popularly known as "Moody's Campground."

On 9 September 1821 Andrew Moody, Samuel Houston, and Elisha Blanchard were the securities for Robert G. White, the contractor for the proposed county court house. he did not purchase any land until 1825 when he bought 120 acres from the Kirkpatrick family, and the following year he and his wife Susannah sold 81 acres to Samuel Hunter. The population of the county was growing, and the increased number of people brought with it the need for social services and formal governmental structure. Accordingly the county officials let a contract for a jail. Andrew Moody and Thomas Stout agreed to build the first jail out of square logs at a cost of \$244.50 in State paper. Dated Independence by 1829, the contract stipulated that the structure be completed by the first Monday of the following December.

Frontier life was demanding and Susannah Moody died sometime between 1826 and 1829. Andrew Moody apparently remarried on 17 September 1829 to Elizabeth Deshane. However, at the time of the fifth federal census in 1830 he was living alone, so his second marriage was of short duration.

On 1 October 1832 Andrew Moody and his son and daughter-in-law, John F. andAsenath Moody, sold 120 acres to James Johnson. He was appointed fence viewer in Town 4 North, Range 4 West in March 1834. Because of the lack of a groom index to early Bond County, Illinois marriage it is not possible to ascertain the date of his third marriage nor the identity of his wife. A deed dated 15 January 1837 between Tobias

File and Andrew Moody and his wife Martha indicates that he had remarried by that date. Whether or not he had still another wife is uncertain because on 18 December 1844 Andrew Moody and his wife Sarah Moody sold their land in Bond County to Noah and John A. Leverton. His wife may have been named Martha Sarah or Sarah Martha. A second possibility is that the clerk of the court entered the wrong name in the deed hook.

Just when Andrew Moody left Illinois and came to Texas cannot be exactly determined. One of his sons had taken his family to Fannin County during the days of the Republic in 1836. No doubt Andrew Moody wanted to see his grandchildren and the Texas government was eager to attract additional settlers. Presumably Andrew Moody felt he could better himself or perhaps his son John Moody persuaded his father to leave for Texas and followed some months later.

The earliest dated document indicative of Andrew Moody's presence in Texas is a deed executed on 24 October 1348 by which Alonzo Larkin sold Andrew Moody and Able I. Drake 280 acres of land in Grayson County. In 1850 Andrew Moody and his wife Sarah had a two year old child named A. G. Drake, and a native of Texas, living with them. Sarah, a native of North Carolina, gave her age as 65. The exact relationship between Andrew Moody and Able H. Drake, if one exists, has not yet been determined.

Later in 1850 Congress enacted legislation granting bounty land to certain Officers and soldiers for their service in previous wars. On 21 February 1851 Andrew Moody awalled himself of this opportunity and applied for his bounty land. Receiving no satisfaction from his initial application, he repeated his claims on 12 May 1852 and received 80 acres. Congress, by the Act of 3 March 1855, provided for additional bounty land benefits and Andrew Moody submitted his second application of 14 July 1855. There is no evidence to indicate this his second request was acted upon.

It would appear that Sarah Moody died before Andrew Moody because on 23 June 1857 he placed himself in the care of Able H. Drake of Grayson County. Drake paid him \$5.00 and promised to support and maintain him for his natural life. In return Andrew Moody granted all of his real and personal property and all future income therefrom to Drake. At that time Moody was in frail health and probably died not long after. Nonetheless, the nature of the agreement climinated the necessity of his preparing a will so his exact date of death is unknown. Neither Able H. Drake nor Andrew Moody appear in the 1860 census of Grayson County. Whether Andrew Moody had died and Able H. Drake had relocated elsewhere is uncertain.

Although the names of the children of Andrew and Susannah (Rippy) Moody are no where set forth, the following were among their children:

- Jane Moody. She married William Lindley in Bond County, Illinois on 18 March 1818. and had issue. This family remained in Illinois.
- (ii) Richard Moody. His wife's name was Melinda and she was born in Henderson County, Kentucky on 17 July 1810. They became members of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Bond County, Illinois in 1829. Richard Moody was a veteran of the Black Hawk War. He died in 1835 leaving a wife and several children. His widow married James Stome in Bond County, Illinois on 20 July 1837 by whom she had several other children. She died in Bond County on 24 February 1876.
- (iii) James Moody. He was born ca. 1803 in Kentucky and married Mary Ellis, a native of North Carolina, in Bond County, Illinois on 6 March 1822. They lived in Wisconsin a short time but returned to Bond County to make their home until they removed to Texas sometime prior to 1850. In 1850 they were residing in Graysor County but the following year James Moody purchase.

160 acres in Fannin County. He may have been the James H. Moody who in 1852 was appointed Deputy County Cierk of Fannin County. His children were: George Moody born ca. 1827 in 111.; A. J. Moody, a daughter, born ca. 1833 in Wisconsin; Mary E. Moody born ca. 1838 in 111., and married to Joel Barnett in Fannin Co., Tex. on 28 Jan. 1855; and Noah Moody born in 1840 in 111. The Andrew Moody born ca. 1831 in 111. Who married Louisa Jones on 21 December 1859 in Fannin County, Tex. was in all likelihood a son of James and Mary Moody. This Andrew Moody died prior to 1868 when his widow married William Fleming on the 9th of January. She applied for custody of her two children George A. and Martha Ann a few days after her second marriage.

- Elizabeth Moody. She was born 6 December 1804 near Nashville, Tenn. She (iv) married ca. 1820 Henry Briggs 6 (John , Richard 2-5) who had come to Bond County from Abington, Massachusetts. He died in Bond Co., Ill. on 16 June 1851 and she died there 28 June 1865. They were the parents of eleven children: Huldah, 20 Oct. 1822 -- 6 Sept. 1823; infant daughter, 30 Dec. 1825 --6 Jan. 1826; Susannah, 3 Jan. 1826--18 Aug. 1893, who married Johnston Brooks of County Galway, Ireland; Robert R., 22 Jan. 1828--23Nov. 1828; Abigail, 14 Mar. 1830--25 July 1892, who married Mathew Watson of Ireland: Henry Kendall, 19 May 1832--18 April 1915, who married Mary Jane Speed of Lancashire, England; Mary E., 8 Feb. 1834--9 Feb. 1835; William D., 28 Dec. 1835 -- Sept. 1838: Alfred, 2 Oct. 1839 -- 19 Dec. 1921, who married first Sarah Elizabeth Robinson and second Mary Pauline Holman; Ralph N. Briggs. 12 Dec. 1841-- ?, who married and had issue; and Nellie, 17 August 1844--16 Mar. 1929, who first married Robert Scott and second William Berner Reeves.
 - (v) John F. Moody. He married Asenath Ellis in Bond Co., Ill. on 15 Sept. 1824. They came to the Republic of Texas in October 1836. As a married man, he was entitled to 1280 acres of land after 1 August 1838 which he received in Fannin County and then promptly sold to James B. Shannon. He was one of the reviewers to mark the Warren Coffee Station road in Grayson County. He rented land from John Hart at Preston in Grayson County, but early in 1839 he was killed and scalped by the Shawnee Indians when he was en route to Warren on Business.

Many settlers believed that the Indians had confused Moody with Richard McIntyre, another settler in the area who had in some way offended the Shawnee. McIntyre heard the gunfire and saw Moody fall from his horse. The Indians horribly mutilated Moody's body and built a hugh bonfire about which they danced throughout the night. They did not attack the McIntyre cabin which was nearby. By the next morning they had departed, although a few days later two of McIntyre's sons were murdered by the Indians.

Asenath Moody continued to live in the area, but in 1839 she joined the other settlers in seeking refuge in the stockade at Warren. There her children were student in the first school in the county. She made application for letters of administration of her late husband's estate on 30 March 1840. Minor heirs mentioned in the probate file were: Susamnah, James H., Nancy and John F. Moody. The 1840 census of the Republic of Texas indicates that Joseph Duty of Travis County was the agent of the heirs of John Moody.

The son John was probably the John H. Moody, age 22 and a native of Illinois, who was an apprentice to William J. F. Morgan in 1850 in Lamar County, Texas.

Mr. Redditt continues: Re: George Crawley -- "My wife has a Crawley line and we have gathered quite a bit of information on the family, however, the Indian connection is new to us.

Her family came from Georgia, her grandfather moving from there to Harrison Co., Tax a 1850. There were also some Crawley's in the Fort Worth area (Tarrant Co., Tx) who received land titles in this county:

307 3 Benj. Crawley 320 acres 26 June 1860 163/30 312 3 Richard Crawley 320 acres 10 July 1855 790/9

There was a Charles Crawley Sr., who died in Georgia in 1849, leaving a will. (Morgan Co., Ga.) One of his sons was George Crawley.

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The first court session held in Shelby County Texas was in 1837. Judge Robert McAlp of Williamson was appointed Circuit Judge by Sam Houston. He usually held court behind a big box under a large oak tree in the now town site of Shelbyville. Since there were no jails, various forms of pumishment were meted out. One sentence by Judge McAlp - "Take this man across the Sabine River and if he ever comes back or even west his toes in the river --- shoot him."
