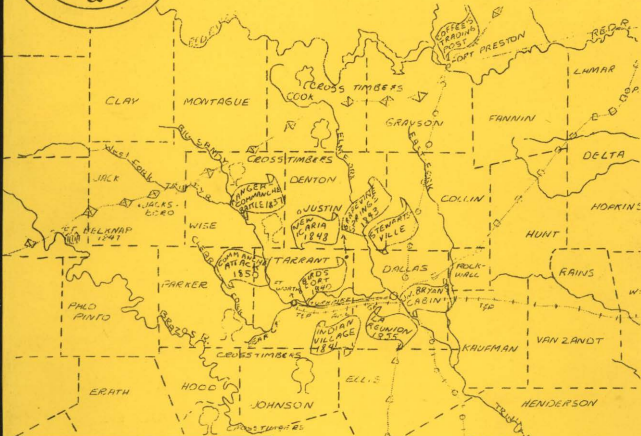

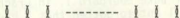

HERALDRY AS AN AVENUE OF GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH

Usually the genealogist does not care much about the heraldist and vice versa. However when the successful genealogist has arrived at his 8th generation, in the time-period when he has something like 64 different ancestors, he will find in all probability some noble families amongst them. Experience has shown that this is the case in almost every family, who was able to trace their ancestry back to the old country across the Atlantic. Why should this be now so important? Because he arrived at the time-period when records became awfully scarce, and church-books were not kept yet with baptisms, marriages and deaths. When the genealogist discovers a noble family with a coat of arms, however, new avenues for research become available to him through heraldry. This art and science has played a most important role in everyday life from the 12th to the 17th century. Wills, deeds, marriage-contracts and all sorts of documents were sealed with the family-emblem. Houses, furniture, weapons and all kinds of utensils were marked or adorned with coats of arms and are preserved to this day. Tomb-stones and epitaphs in Churches as well as rolls of arms and tournament books were illustrated with them, the latter recording sports-events of those times, the jousting, showing who won over whom at what time, with names and dates and the colorful shields each had worn and inherited from his father.

But let's talk about some actual experience I had in combining heraldry with genealogy, allowing me to keep on going further and further in my ancestral research. When I was a boy in my teens, we six brothers started to gather information about our ancestors. We had the 7th generation almost complete and there appeared two noble family-names and a third one, W.F. v. Degenfeld, who's ancestors we could not find and never could get any answers for from the Degenfeld Estates, because there was nobody left with that name. I still remember my younger brother Uli, who was especially keen on genealogy, how he pointed at that vacant spot in our chart and said "and I bet you, we could come to a King there" and then we laughed unbelievably. That spot stayed vacant for over 30 years. When I gave a slide-lecture in Toronto and showed an ancestral tombstone with coats of arms, a gentleman stood up and said: "we are distant relatives; this is my ancestor too." So, it happened on the American continent that I could pick up what had been lost in Europe, and it was only made possible through the sign-language of heraldry. We cross-checked the discovery and it proved to be right and ever since I keep on going with the help of heraldry, adding page after page to my ancestry files. From the little nobleman to a Count or a Duke and further to a King, is often only a jump over a few generations. Noble families have kept careful book on their ancestry or the clergy did it for them, for various reasons. That is why it is fairly easy to keep on going, if you can find out where those books are kept or have been published. But, then came the big test: during another of my slide-lectures, somebody managed to embarrass me in front of an audience and naturally it had to be a distant relative: "how on earth can you prove that this is true? you speak of the years 1496, 1300, 1200, and so on. You got your shields and dates from books, so they are only 'theoretical' at best." Some time later at the International Congress on Heraldry in Vienna I happened to meet the Senior-chief of the House of Wirtemberg, Duke Philipp. I showed him my illustrated charts of the early House of Wirtemberg, which were the ones in question and I asked him how I could prove that they were correct? "Through Heraldry" he answered, "look up the old monuments with their coats of arms and inscribed dates at the birth-place and at the tomb of our mutual ancestor Duke Eberhard I. in Urach."

Stupid me, I had all but forgotten that I had spent many a summer in Urach, where my grandfather had been professor in the teacher's college, and where I knew every nook and cranny. As a matter of fact that was the place where I once had discovered heraldry. Grandfather found me sketching coats of arms from tombstones and church-windows, when I was a boy of less than 13 and he shook his head. "I would not believe it, if I did not see it with my own eyes," he said. "You must have inherited that, because your ancestors were heraldists to the House of Wirtemberg." I inherited later the Armorial of Wirtemberg, 2 heavy volumes, our Otto von Alberti had published during the last century, and I was "hooked on heraldry" for the rest of my life. But, coming back to the 'test.' I took my theoretical charts along to Urach and started searching, and, sure enough, high up on the ceiling of a chapel, in the dark, were the 8 ancestral coats of arms of Duke Eberhard, engraved into stone some 500 years ago. I was almost right with my theory, some shields were just a bit more complicated. They were quartered or divided in 2 parts, which to my delight gave me further clues for research. There had been some controversial answers from France and Switzerland in the bloodline of the Chatillons. For example, the shield depicted on a stained-glass-window clearly showed the arms of Lorraine and the right direction to the Dukes of that line.

As a strange coincidence 8 such shields were again laid free a few years later painted on the walls of a huge hall in the town-castle of Urach and discovered under the whitewash during a renovation. They too had been hidden there for 5 centuries. It was now proven beyond any doubt that my charts of the early House of Wirtemberg were right, but this only whetted my appetite. With the

help of researches all over Europe, I have now completed the ancestry-charts and illustrated them with 431 colored shields, belonging to the persons or families mentioned. 58 Emperors and Kings appear in the charts, which are now on color-slides to be presented at the XIIth International Congress on Genealogy and Heraldry in Munich. My little brother had been right, but who could have known? We were just ordinary folks back home. Naturally, everybody has his roots in past history. It is just a matter of digging them up. Why not apply heraldry to help you do the job?

But let's make a cross check; some people got sarcastic and said "sure, the Dukes of Wirtemberg had lots of illegitimate off-spring. Can you prove your connection is true?" Let's go back in my charts to 1574: Eberhard v. Karpfen had a coat of arms. [Illustration #1] A blue shield with two silver fish, back to back (azure two bars adorsed argent). He was the son of Hans Wirtemberg, legitimized by Emperor Frederic II 15.2.1484 and named Lord von Karpfen, after Duke Eberhard I. of Wirtemberg had presented him as his illegitimate son, and gave him the Wirtemberg coat of arms, with a white bastard-bend. His sons assumed the blue coat of arms. How can heraldry prove the continuity of the blood line? If we climb up two more generations we find that the grandmother Henriette de Montbeliard had a coat of arms [Illustration #2]: two golden fish on red, back to back (gules, two bars adorsed or). We have here a clear heraldic "diminution." Wirtembergs arms were quartered at the time as per Illustration #4.

But let's take an example from North America: only recently did I receive a letter from an old-age-home in British Columbia. 86-year-old Mr. Grossman who had worked in the Rocky Mountains for fifty years and had all but forgotten where he came from, of a sudden remembered having once seen the family coat of arms, "with a winged man on top" [Illustration #3]. The name Grossman, which simply means "tall man," would be pretty hard to locate, because when names were given out, there were an awful lot of tall men around. Heraldry made it easier: eight coats of arms were listed in my collections, and even better, heraldry as a sign-language, which can easily be memorized, had still triggered his memory after some sixty-five years. He knew which one was his. The entry in my armorial contained a locality: Nuremberg. When I cross checked, sure enough Mr. Grossman remembered he had been a soldier before the 1st World War, in Nuremberg.

In front of the Ontario Genealogical Society in Ottawa on April 25th, 1974, I had a chance to show with color-slides how much of such heraldry has been preserved despite wars, fire and destruction in European museums, castles and cathedrals. I make it a point, when I am in Europe, Let's say in Zurich, to see if something has been left as proof that some ancestral line lived there. Grandfather Hirzel had said that his people left Zurich, Switzerland around 1700. It was just a little painted ceramic dish in the museum, but it bore the name "Hirzel" and heraldry had done it again for me. That is why I tell the advanced genealogist "don't disregard heraldry." It was here for a long time and long before church-records were kept!

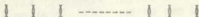

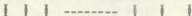

RESEARCH IN TENNESSEE.

(As presented in a lecture to the LOCAL HISTORY & GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY
on June 27, 1974.)

To research Tennessee Genealogical Records and find out more about our ancestor, it is necessary first to understand some of the History of what is now the State of Tennessee.

Tennessee is a rectangular area with the Blue Ridge Mountains to the east, the plateau of Kentucky to the north, the Mississippi River to the west and the more or less level plains of Alabama and Mississippi to the south.

The early migrations to Tennessee were made almost exclusively through the gaps and passes in the northeast corner and over the Mountains from North Carolina.

Tennessee was considered a part of the State of Virginia until Virginia was partitioned in 1663 and became the Western District of the North Carolina Colony. During this period, it was referred to as the "Territory South of the Ohio" and had a Territorial Governor. Tennessee became a State in 1796. The first attempt to establish settlements was made by Virginia when they built Fort Loudon in present Monroe County in 1757. A few pioneer families moved in, but three years later it was abandoned when the Cherokee War broke out.

The "Long Hunters" came in and out of this area and the first actual settlement was in 1769 when William Bean from Pittsylvania County, Virginia built on Boone's Creek, near the Watauga River in what he thought was Virginia. He was joined by several families from North Carolina. By 1771, there were four settlements in northeast Tennessee...the first of these was BEAN'S WATAUGA SETTLEMENT.

The majority of these settlers were Regulators fleeing North Carolina after their defeat in Orange County, North Carolina; they thought they were settling in Virginia but were actually in the Western District of North Carolina.

The second settlement was in the region from the present Virginia State line to the South Fork of the Holston River. The third settlement was established by Capt. Evan Shelby of Maryland and was west of the Holston River near the present town of Rogersville and known as the CARTER VALLEY SETTLEMENT. The majority of the early families were friends of Capt. Shelby, from Maryland. The fourth settlement was established by Jacob Brown on the north side of the Nollichucky River and known as the NOLLICHUCKY SETTLEMENT. The majority of the early families in this settlement were from North Carolina.

It is very important to consider where the people came from to establish these early settlements when hunting for your ancestors.

A family researcher is usually interested in one of three things at some stage. First, where did they come from? Second, where did they live? Third, where did they go? For these reasons, we need to know the trails into, through and out of Tennessee. Since Tennessee was settled from the northeast corner and over the Mountains of North Carolina, we need to begin in Virginia. Families did not go from Maryland or Virginia to Tennessee in one continuous move as we might do now. They stopped, established homes, raised crops, buried their dead, had children born, and other things that still happen to our present families. The trip might take a year, ten years, or two or more generations.

MIGRATION TRAILS:

Migrations trails from Virginia seemed to center at one point before branching off to Tennessee, North Carolina or Kentucky. This was at Wolf Hills, now known as Abingdon, Virginia, in Washington County. Trails all fed into the great Valley of the Shenandoah River, following what is roughly present Interstate Highway 81 and old Route 11 from Hagerstown, Maryland to Bristol, Tennessee.

If you have Scot-Irish Ancestors, you will find that they, in most cases, came down the Valley from Pennsylvania with stops in Frederick County, Augusta County or Washington County, Virginia. The best reference book on the Scot-Irish Migrations is "Records of Augusta County, Virginia 1745-1800" by Lyman Chalkey, in three volumes. Early publications referred to these books as the "Chronicles of the Scot-Irish Settlement in Virginia."

The Migration Trails in Virginia crossed the Blue Ridge Mountains at the Gaps. ASHBY GAP led to Winchester in Frederick County; LURAY GAP to New Market in Shenandoah County; SWIFT RUN GAP to Rockingham County; AFTON GAP to Staunton, Augusta County; ROANOKE GAP from Lynchburg, Campbell County through Bedford County to Roanoke County and FANCY GAP near Hillsville, Carroll County Wytheville, Wythe County. All these trails converged at present Abingdon, Washington County, Virginia.

Prior to the Revolutionary War, there was very little migration from North Carolina to the Western District, now Tennessee. There was an Upper Crossing of the Mountains at BOONE'S GAP from Zionsville, Watauga County, North Carolina to Trade, Johnson County, Tennessee. Further south, there was a very rough crossing from Morgantown., North Carolina.

In 1791, the FRENCH BROAD TRAIL was opened between Ashville, North Carolina through Madison and Buncombe Counties, North Carolina and Knox and Sevier Counties, Tennessee to Knoxville. This is now Interstate 40.

In 1785, North Carolina sent a force of 300 soldiers in to present Tennessee to protect the New Settlements. AVERY TRACE was opened through the Counties of Roane, Cumberland, Putnam, Smith, Wilson and Davidson. The soldiers were paid in land and for the first time, there was some protection for the settlers. This caused the migration from the Atlantic section of North Carolina of many wealthy families as well as families and friends of soldiers serving in the protective forces.

The Great Indian War Path ran along the Valley of the Tennessee River. This trail ran through the Counties of Bradley, McMinn, Monroe, Blount, Sevier, Jefferson, Hamblen and Hawkins, Tennessee. Many of the early families came into the above counties down this trail, but also many used the trail to move on into present Alabama and Georgia. Others from Georgia came up the trail.

The NATCHEZ TRACE from Natchez, Mississippi to Nashville, Tennessee was originated by returning farmers and others who floated their cotton, lumber and other products up the Cumberland River to the Ohio, then down the Ohio to the Mississippi and the Market at Natchez, Mississippi. Coming back up the TRACE, they many times decided there was better land and prospects in Mississippi, so they moved to Mississippi and later to East Texas.

There were other trails through Tennessee that should help as a guide in your ancestor hunt. If you can find where their neighbors went, they probably were traveling together.

Revolutionary Service in North Carolina was rewarded by land grants in East and Middle Tennessee. Information on these grants is given in "North Carolina Land Grants in Tennessee 1778-1791" by Cartwright and Gardiner. The grants are on file in the State Archives. West Tennessee Land Grants have been published in part since 1967 in "Ansearchin' News", the publication of the Tennessee Genealogical Society. These grants are on microfilm at the State Archives.

Military Records are complete for those that served in the various wars since Tennessee became a State. The State Archives has a copy of the Muster Rolls for Tennessee Regiments in the War of 1812. The Roster of the Tennessee Chapter of National Society of Daughters of 1812 gives the ancestor of each member. The State Library has a card file on soldiers who served in the Indian War. This was when the Cherokees were moved west of the Mississippi River. All soldiers who died in the Seminole War are listed in "The Origin, Progress and Conclusion of the Florida War", by John Titcomb Sprague. There is also a card file in the State Archives on Tennessee Soldiers in the Mexican War.

Civil War records for Tennessee are very complete for research due to several actions taken by the State. In 1891, a Pension Law was passed and all applications are available in the State Archives. In 1905, Widow's Pensions were issued and these applications are on file in the State Archives and contain much genealogical information. The most important, if your ancestor was involved, is questionnaires sent to all living Veterans in 1914 through 1920. These are in the Manuscript Division of the State Library.

Earlier, I said that one of the things we were interested in was where did they go? I will use the migrations of some branches of my family to illustrate how they came to Texas:

BOWENS....came from Pennsylvania to Botecourt County, Virginia ca. 1740, to

Davidson County, Tennessee ca. 1785; to Lebanon, Ohio ca. 1805, returned through Tennessee to Limestone County, Alabama ca. 1825, then to Red River County, Texas in 1840.

CRAWFORD....from Virginia to Tennessee in 1798, Jackson County(?) to Monroe County, Kentucky in 1800, then to Denton County, Texas in 1855. A part of the family came to Texas by way of Moniteau County, Missouri.

GRAY....From North Carolina to Monroe County, Tennessee ca. 1820, to Alabama, then to Rusk County, Texas ca. 1845.

Who knows, my family may have been with yours on some of these trails through Tennessee and on to Texas!

SUGGESTED BIBLIOGRAPHY OF REFERENCES:

By all means, you should be familiar with the material available in the TENNESSEE STATE LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES in Nashville. On request, they will send you the following:

1. "An Introduction to the Tennessee State Library and Archives."
2. "Genealogical Source Materials in the State Library and Archives."
3. "Guide to the Use of Genealogical Material in the Tennessee State Library and Archives."

They will do some free search for you, but do require you to follow certain guidelines. I would suggest before submitting your request that you ask for a copy of their instructions that has a place on the back for making a request for a search.

There is an additional service provided by the State Library and Archives: Their Inter-Library Loan. The publication, "Writing on Tennessee Counties Available on Inter-Library Loan from the Tennessee State Library and Archives, State Library Division" is in our Local Library and lists some 47 pages of various published works. The library staff will be happy to arrange for this Inter-Library Loan, if the publication is not available in our local library.

I have only touched briefly on the material in this book. You will also find the following: A list of all Tennessee Libraries with a listing of Collections and Manuscripts they have. A chapter on Funeral Homes giving the name of one in each Community and what you may find and how you should approach this type of research. Church Records with a listing of Histories of individual churches and information on the spread of each church denomination throughout the State. Cemetery Records with a list of those Counties that have their cemeteries listed on microfilm in

the LDS Library. Land Records giving the location of land that was effected by different grants since the founding of the State. List of Tennessee Historical and Genealogical Societies. A list of Tennessee newspapers and those available on film. A list of County Histories, also County Records with the oldest date of the individual record. Finally, an explanation of the different Courts in Tennessee and what records they have that you would find of interest in research.

This cemetery is located west of Ringgold, Montague County, Texas, off a metal surfaced, unnumbered road. It is on the north side of the road and on the west side of Belknap Creek. It is on a hill overlooking the creek bottom. To approach the cemetery stop approximately 100 yards west of Belknap Creek bridge; walk north approximately one mile down fence line from the road to the hilltop, turn west and walk approximately one-fourth mile down fence line to cemetery. There is no gate in this strong, well-kept fence and one must lie down and slip under the fence to gain entrance.

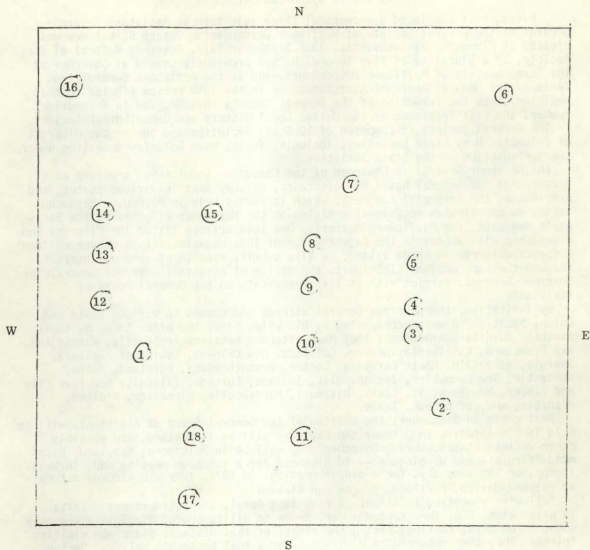

A REPORT FROM MR. JOSEPH B. LATIMER, GOVERNOR GENERAL
OF THE GENERAL SOCIETY OF MAYFLOWER DESCENDANTS

By Joseph Byron Latimer

Having just completed a successful three year term as Assistant Governor General of the General Society of Mayflower Descendants, Joseph B. Latimer was elected at Plymouth, Massachusetts, 13th September 1972, Governor General of that Society, by a plurality of five to one. He had previously served as Governor of the Texas Society of Mayflower Descendants, and as the Assistant General from Texas on the General Board of Assistants. He is the 19th person elected to that position since the formation of the General Society in 1897. Joe is a longtime member, and Past President of the Dallas Local History and Genealogical Society.

The General Society is composed of 50 State Societies and one in the District of Columbia. Many State Societies, including Texas, have Colonies operating under the jurisdiction of the State Societies.

The Governor General is Chairman of the Executive Committee; presides at all meetings of the General Board of Assistants, as they meet in various states; and presides at the Triennial Congress, which is always held in Plymouth, Massachusetts. He contributes occasional articles on the Mayflower Pilgrims to the Society's magazine, The Mayflower Quarterly. One such article titled The Pilgrims and Friendship will appear in the August issue of this magazine. It is condensed from a speech delivered in Rhode Island. He also submits reports of general interest through the same medium. Election to the office of Assistant Governor General, or Governor General, carries with it life membership on the General Board of Assistants.

By invitation, the Governor General attends and speaks to various State and Colony Societies. Always accompanied by his wife, Sina, and often times by their daughter Juanita Scarborough; they have attended meetings in Seattle, Washington, San Francisco, California, Denver, Colorado, New Orleans, Louisiana, Atlanta, Georgia, Asheville, North Carolina, Boston, Massachusetts, Portland, Maine, Newcastle, New Hampshire, Indianapolis, Indiana, Chicago, Illinois, New York City and Albany, New York, St. Louis, Missouri, Minneapolis, Minnesota, Midland, Michigan, and, of course, Texas.

Next month in September, the meeting of the General Board of Assistants will be held in San Antonio. In October the Latimers will be in Montana, and possibly other western states. During November they will be in Baltimore, Maryland, Richmond, Virginia and Washington -- in Richmond for a luncheon meeting and, in Washington, on the same day, for a dinner meeting. In 1975, they are already scheduled for New Mexico, Portland, Oregon and Alabama.

Following a meeting in Atlanta during last April, the Latimers met Juanita in Washington, D.C. They rented a car, drove to Williamsburg, Virginia where they spent three days, resting, seeing the sights of that historic place and visiting friends. They then returned to Washington for a real postman's holiday. During six days they attended, as members or guests, seven heritage functions. These included Magna Charta Dames and Barons, National DAR, Texas DAR, Dames of the Court of Honor, Colonial Dames of the 17th Century, the American Hereditary Register, etc.

Among the "first's" recorded during the Latimer's tenure are: first person to serve as both Assistant Governor General, and Governor General; the first time there has been a contest for the office of Governor General; the first time there has been a Governor General elected without the endorsement of the Nominating Committee; the first time there has been a nomination from the floor for this office; the first Governor General born west of the Mississippi River; and the first Governor General to attend the National Heritage meetings in Washington, D.C. during April.

During these rather extensive travels, the most impressive thing of all has been the wonderful people met; people from all walks of life; but north, east, south or west, they have been wonderful. During the Albany meeting there was a very gracious letter of welcome from the then Governor, who has now been nominated for Vice President. Although not a member of the Society, an equally gracious welcome letter was received from the Governor of North Carolina. One member who was unable to attend the North Carolina meeting sent his regrets. Politically, he was across the aisle from the N.Y. Governor, and at the time was Chairman of the Watergate Committee, Sam Irvin, Senator from North Carolina.

Within the past few weeks, the Governor General has been appointed to the Editorial Committee of the American Hereditary Register, and as a member of the Farmers Branch Bi-Centennial Committee.

Note: We take special pride in Mr. Latimer's impressive record of service in the many genealogical and patriotic societies of which he is a member and frequently an Officer, since he served two terms as President of the Local History & Genealogical Society. His many honors are well deserved.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN, I, HENRY BEASLEY of the Parish of St. Bartholemew and County of Chatham, in the State of No. Carolina, being weak and sick in body, but of perfect sense and memory -- thanks be to the Almighty God for the same. After recommending my Soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently interred in a Christian manner, by my Executors hereafter mentioned, I hereby testify this to be my last Will and Testament as followeth.

IMPREMISO I give and bequeath to my son Isham Beasley the land whereon I now live with one feather bed and furniture, to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Beasley f25 -- to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Wineford Davis f25 -- to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Tabitha Harward f25 -- to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty Bennet f25 -- to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to Beth Wimberley one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever --

And for the raising of the above legacies of money I desire that my stock of horses, hogs and cattle may be sold at twelve months credit. If a balance remain after the legatees are paid off, to be equally divided among my sons.

Furthermore, I desire that my son Jesse Beasley should take my wife Mary

Beasley under his care and that she should have a comfortable maintenance her days, -- and for a reward to Jesse Beasley for his trouble and expense for maintaining his mother each of my sons shall bear an equal part of this expense for her maintenance. And that she shall have negroe Jinny during her life to tend on her.

Item. The remaining part of my estate I give and bequeath until William Beasley, Ephraim Beasley, Henry Beasley, Fondal Beasley, Jesse Beasley and Isham Beasley, to them and their heirs forever which consists chiefly of negroes, and to be equally divided, share and share alike.

Item. I constitute, appoint and ordain my loving friends William Merritt, William O'Kelly, and my son Henry Beasley, and my son Isham Beasley, executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have published and declared it so to be this 19th day of January, A. D. 1791 - -

Lillie Donnelson and Linda Katherine Turnbow said that Susan Bird was buried in the old Fitzhugh part of Forest Grove Cemetery.

Susan B. married (1) E. R. "Lidge" Southwood and they had three daughters. A. Joanna F. born in Ky., died young. She was 2 years old in 1860 Collin Co. Census. B. Florence Southwood, born 1858 in Kansas, married Frank Maddox and they had two children, Iva and Frank Maddox, Jr. C. Laura J. Southwood, born 1860 in Texas, married (1) James M. "Mitt" Miller in Collin Co., Texas on Aug. 12, 1875; (2) Sammy Berry, buried in Dallas at Grove Hill Cemetery. They had one child, Ida, who died in infancy. Laura Berry died in 1937 in Dallas and is buried in Forest Grove Cemetery in Collin County. Her marker was placed at the grave by Juanita Mierzwik, Ruby May Matthews, and Mrs. Price Strickland.

Susan B. married (2) T. Alex Thompson in Collin Co., Texas on July 29, 1866 by Jas. R. Wilmeth, minister. They had two children: D. Mary Alice Thompson was born about 1867 in Texas. E. Dovie Frances was born in April 1869 in Texas. Susan Bird Thompson was a widow in the 1870 Collin Co., Census, living next door to her brother, James M. Houston and family, with 4 little girls.

D. Mary Alice Thompson married Will T. Humes in Collin Co., July 27, 1887 by J. W. Waddill, Clerk. Children unknown. Mary Alice and Will T. Humes are buried at Grove Hill Cemetery, Dallas.

E. Dovie Frances Thompson married Henry Landers on Oct. 15, 1886 by William H. Price in Collin Co. Children: Sam, Bill, Dick, and Annie Mae. Dovie and Henry Landers are buried at Lewisville, Texas.

VI. Susan B. Houston (Southwood) Thompson married James Turnbow in Collin Co. on Sept. 4, 1871. James Turnbow born about 1827 in Mo. They had two boys: F. John Wesley Turnbow; G. Jim Thomas Turnbow.

F. John Wesley Turnbow, born Sept. 5, 1872 in Rockwall Co., Texas and died Oct. 14, 1951, is buried at Wilson Chapel, Cemetery. John W. Turnbow married Linda Katherine Rutledge, born July 2, 1881 in Cumberland Co., Ky., the daughter of Charley and Spicy Rutledge. Mr. Rutledge moved to Collin Co. about 1900 and Linda Katherine (Rutledge) Turnbow said she could not remember her mother (Spicy) because she died when she was a baby at Allen Shade, Ky. Sarah Jane Rutledge, a double cousin, married Jim Thomas Turnbow, brother of John.

Joanna Katherine Houston Chappell married (2) J. Henry Colvin, born Oct. 6, 1836. They married before 1880 in Wise Co., and this union was born a daughter, E. Minnie M. Colvin, born Feb. 12, 1880 near Audubon, Wise Co., Texas. Joanna K. and J. Henry Colvin separated about 1885, and she moved her family back to Collin Co., settling between Lucas and Dump, where they lived until her son, James William "Jim" Chappell, bought land in 1898 south of Princeton (the old Bates place). Joanna's nephew, John Andrew Hall, and her son, James William Chappell, drove two wagons from Audubon, Wise Co., to the Wylie area where she grew up and where her sister, Elizabeth Jane Hall, lived.

B. James William "Jim" Chappell, born Aug. 11, 1869, died at Princeton Dec. 20, 1953. He married (1) Villa Calhoun and (2) Clara Dalton. They had no children and both are buried at Princeton. He lived in Wylie until 1898 when he bought a place south of Princeton (the old Bates place). His mother and sister, Minnie M. Colvin, lived with him.

C. Mary Elizabeth "Mollie" Chappell, born March 5, 1873, died March 13, 1951. She was married to Anthony Thomas Leake on Oct. 30, 1889 by Elder John M. McKinney. He died May 4, 1956 and both are buried at Princeton. They bought adjoining farm to her brother, James William "Jim" Chappell, south of Princeton. They had two children: a. James Luther Leake, born July 27, 1893 near Parker and died July 22, 1973. He and his cousin, Homer Myrick, went to school at Higgins. Luther Leake married Sarah M. "Sadie" Greer, May 13, 1915 at Lowry Crossing. Sarah M. "Sadie" Leake was born on Sept. 20, 1895 in Union, S.C. and died Feb. 21, 1973. Both are buried at Princeton. They had one daughter, Mary Louise Leake, who graduated from Princeton High School and Texas State College for Women. She married Charles Younger and they have four boys - James, Bruce, Blake and Michael.

b. Minnie Ellen Leake, born Oct. 18, 1905, married Paul Gibson Henderson on May 24, 1930. Paul Henderson taught school at Allen and was Superintendent of Princeton High School at the time of his death. He died on Sept. 9, 1957 and is buried at Restland Memorial Park, Dallas. They had two girls: 1. Betty Henderson who married Jimmie Klepper and they have two boys and one girl: (a) John Paul Klepper who married Karen Dianne Fugate and they have one daughter Amy Diane Klepper, born in 1973. (b) James Richard "Rickie" Klepper is still single. (c) Luvenia Sue Klepper married Arvin Glen Yandell, May 26, 1973. 2. Barbara Henderson married Bob Moreland and they have two children: (a) Keith Moreland who attends the University of Texas and (b) Paula Ann Moreland.

D. Susan Bertina "Tina" Chappell, born Sept. 28, 1875 near Audubon, Wise Co., Texas died Feb. 4, 1964. She married Thomas Theodore Myrick on Nov. 19, 1893 at Lucas by Elder J. D. Jobe in a double ceremony with his sister, Clara Bell Myrick, marrying Marion Hackler. "Tina" went to school at St. Paul (have a picture of the class in 1888). Thomas Theodore "Dode" Myrick was born Nov. 29, 1871 and died Aug. 22, 1968. They were members of Wilson Chapel Church until it disbanded and they moved their membership to Wesley Memorial Methodist in McKinney. Both are buried at Wilson Chapel Cemetery. They spent most of their lives around McKinney.

"Tina" and "Dode" Myrick had one child, Leslie Homer Myrick, born Nov. 2, 1894, near Dump. He married Johnnie Belle Short on Jan. 4, 1914 at the parsonage of the First Methodist Church in McKinney by Rev. C. C. Young. Homer, Johnnie Belle, and a cousin, Luther Leake went to school at Higgins. Johnnie Belle Short was born June 21, 1893 near Conway, Ark. Homer and Johnnie Myrick are both members of the Wesley Methodist Church, McKinney. They have six children: 1. Wanda Roberta, 2. Gerald Weldon, 3. Euva Ozella, 4. Leslie Homer, Jr., 5. Joanna, and 6. Emma Sue.
