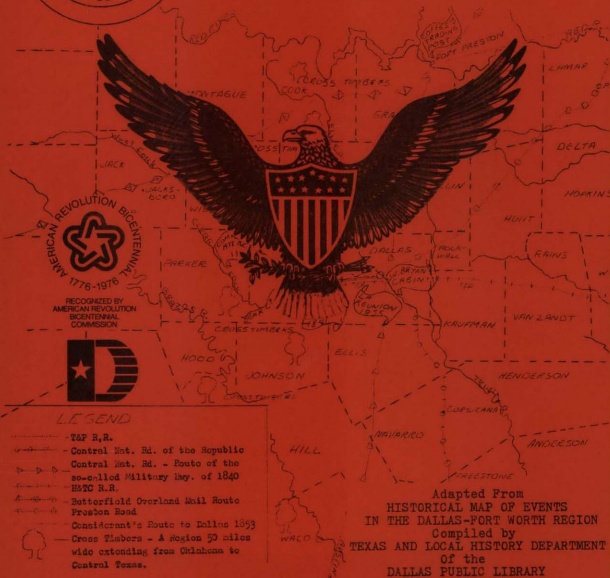

INTRODUCTION: It has been my honor and privilege to compile and edit the wealth of material submitted for inclusion in this Special Bicentennial Commemorative Issue of The Quarterly, which is the Bicentennial Project of The Local History & Genealogical Society, and which has been duly approved by the Dallas American Revolution Bicentennial Corporation.

I have revered each Revolutionary War Ancestor, and his wife, and found each one worthy of grateful respect for their courage, sacrifices and service which made possible the freedoms of this beloved Nation whose 200th Birthday we are all so joyously celebrating while we renew our devotion and loyalty to our Country.

Since the wife of every Revolutionary War Ancestor is also a Revolutionary War Ancestor/Ancestress, we have a double debt of gratitude, and I noted with special pride the recognized service of a number of the wives.

By their examples, these Revolutionary War Ancestors, Patriots, both men and women, have given us the courage, inspiration and necessary strength to go forward in preserving the greatness and continuing strength of our one Nation under God!

EXPLANATION OF FORMAT: The format has been kept simple, using 3 columns. A code number has been assigned to each individual's entry. The individual is listed, in alphabetical order, giving surname first, with name of husband or wife, or parents if the individual is a child, or no name of wife, if any, was given. We then proceed to the Revolutionary War Ancestor and his wife, who are listed in the center column. In the third column we find the date, and service if available, listed. Where no information was given regarding service or date thereof, the Compiler-Editor, after careful research, supplied that information wherever possible, using the DAR Patriot Index, published by the NSDAR, Washington, D.C., 1966; and The First Supplement to the DAR Patriot Index, and The Second Supplement to the DAR Patriot Index, as the source reference authority. Abbreviations used are self-explanatory; for example: b. born, m. married, d. died, etc.

The code number appears on a card which gives all pertinent information in summary form. The same code number appears on the original lineage papers submitted, which are on file in numerical, alphabetical order, as are the cards, in the Genealogy Library of the Dallas Public Library, and should provide valuable source reference data.

Ashby, Stephen, Sr.: 1776-1781-Capt., Va. Continental Line. 9 Sept., 1776, Capt. Ashby was with General Washington at Valley Forge. His name is on the monument at Valley Forge. (Code # H-190)

Cundiff, John; Pvt., Va., was with General Washington at the surrender at Yorktown. (Code # W-446)

Gray, Presley; 1781-Pvt., Va. 1781, Pvt. Gray, under Capt. Charles Little served in the command of the Marquis de Lafayette, in Yorktown Campaign. (Code # S-392)

Higgins, Cornelius; 1776-Capt., Conn. June, 1776-25 Dec., 1776, he served as Capt. of the 8th Co. of Col. William Douglas' 5th Battalion of Wadsworth Brigade, which was raised to reinforce General Washington at New York. Capt. Higgins served in the City and on the Brooklyn front, being at the right of the line of works at the Battle of Long Island, 27 Aug., 1776. He was in the retreat to New York, 28-30 Aug., 1776. Stationed with brigade under Col. Douglas at Kip's Bay, 34th St. on East River at time of enemy's attack on New York, 15 Sept., 1776. Forced to retreat. (Code # H-187)

Lawrence, Nathaniel; Lt., N. Car. & N. York. Nathaniel Lawrence, Ensign, Lt., Capt., served in the Continental Army of North Carolina, and of New York. He was chosen from Queens Co., New York, to the Convention which ratified the Constitution of the United States. He succeeded Aaron Burr to the office of Attorney General of the State of New York, serving in that office from 24th Dec., 1791-30 Nov., 1795. He was at Fraunce's Tavern, New York City, when General Washington "bid Adieu to his Comrades in Arms." He was a member of the Order of the Cincinnati. (Code # H-147, H-149, H-151, L-255)

Musick, Thomas Roy; 1776-1779-Pvt., N. Car., was at the surrender of Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown. (Code # M-282)

Neil, Daniel; 1775-1777-Capt., N. Jersey. Capt. Neil crossed the Delaware River with General Washington on the night of 25 Dec., 1776. (Code # H-143)

Payne, John; 1781-Pvt., Va. Pvt. Payne under Capt. Charles Lille in the command of the Marquis de Lafayette, was at the Yorktown Campaign. (Code # S-395)

Rust, John; Ensign, Lt., Capt., Va. John Rust was promoted to Capt. by General Washington, for distinguished gallantry at the Battle of Brandywine, where he was wounded. He wintered with the Continental Army at Valley Forge and participated in the midnight storming of Trenton, New Jersey, after the crossing of the Delaware River. (Code # R-385)

Thomas, James: 1781-Pvt., Va. 1781, James Thomas, Pvt. in the Va. Continental Line, was stationed at Williamsburg, Va. for several weeks. He was in the siege of Yorktown and the capture of Lord Cornwallis, during which time he served under General Washington and the Marquis de Lafayette. (Code # H-188)

Young, John H.: 1778-1781-Soldier, Va. Pvt. John H. Young served later, Aug., 1778 through Oct., 1781, as an Express Rider having as his run, north to south, Yorktown to New York. He saw Lord Cornwallis surrender to General George Washington, and he was sent with the first intelligence of the surrender of Cornwallis, to the north. (Code # Y-497)

Barry, Margaret Katherine Moore: 1780-1781-Vol. Scout, S. Car. "Heroine of Cowpens." "Kate" Moore Barry was a volunteer scout for General Morgan's Army. Her feats won her the title of "Heroine of Cowpens." (Code # M-288, M-293)

Condit, Huldah Byram: Huldah Byram Condit, widow of Pvt. Ebenezer Condit had the honor of having General George Washington in her home, since he occasionally visited General Gist who was quartered there, in Morristown, New Jersey. General Washington had his Headquarters in Morristown, New Jersey during 1777, and again during the winter of 1779-1780. It was during these periods that he visited General Gist. (Code # L-499)

Cushman, Desiah Branch: 1777-Desiah Branch Cushman, wife of Charles Cushman, Jr., Soldier, Vt., 1775-1778, gave patriotic service by aiding in establishing a hospital in a Church, to care for the wounded after the Battle of Bennington. (Code # N-349)

Hench, Christina Schneider: Christina Schneider Hench, wife of John Hench, (Sr.), Patriot, went on errands of mercy carrying food and delicacies, and ministered to soldiers, sick and dying of typhus fever. She stayed up all night baking bread for the soldiers. She was called nurse at "Yellow Springs" hospital, Chester County, Pennsylvania. Her name is on the List at the Memorial Bell Tower, Valley Forge. (Code # H-176, M-298, M-301, M-304, M-307, M-310, M-313, M-317, M-323, M-326, M-329, W-471, W-474, W-477, W-480, W-483, W-487)

Johnson, Jemima Suggett: Jemima Suggett Johnson, wife of Capt. Robert Johnson, Va., gave patriotic service. (Code # S-393)

Littleberry, Lucy: Lucy Littleberry Holcombe, widow of William Holcombe, Patriot, Va., gave patriotic service by furnishing a horse to the Army, which she lost. (Code # C-100)

It seems most appropriate to close PART I, with the following prayer which was given by President George Washington after his Inauguration, 1789. Prayer: "Almighty God...we make our earnest prayer that thou wilt keep the United States in thy holy protection...incline the hearts of the citizens to entertain a brotherly affection and love for one another and for their fellow citizens of the United States at large."

THE BICENTENNIAL AND AMERICAN MILITARY RECORDS RESEARCH

Amateur genealogists like to tell about their own ancestors and how they found them. Professional genealogists like to tell of the difficult research they have completed for others--or the number of lines they have "worked." To be fair to all of the 469 members of the Local History & Genealogical Society of Dallas and all of their Revolutionary War ancestors who will appear in this Society's special Bicentennial issue of The Quarterly, let's have an impartial roll call in honor of the 13 Privates among the last 25 survivors of the Revolutionary War. Some of these men were living on 18 February, 1866. (The Last Men of the Revolution, by Reverend Elias Brewster Hillard, and edited by Wendell D. Garrett, Barre Publishers, Barre, Massachusetts, 1968.)

1. *Barham, James, born 18 May, 1764, Southampton Co., Va. died in 1857. On the St. Louis, Mo. roll.
2. *Cook, Lemuel, born 10 Sept., 1757/1764, at Plymouth, Littlefield Co., Conn., or at Northbury or Waterbury--both in Litchfield Co. Died 20 May, 1866 at Clarendon, Orleans Co., New York. On Albany, New York roll.
3. *Downing, Samuel, born 31 Nov., 1764/1765 at Newburyport, Mass. Living at Edinburgh, Saratoga Co., New York in 1864. Married Eunice George. He died 19 Feb., 1867. On Albany, New York roll.
4. *Gates, Jonas, born 1763/1764. Served Mass., was in Barre, Worcester Co., Mass. in Dec., 1833. Died Chelsea, Vt., 14 Jan., 1864. On St. Johnsbury, Vt. roll.
5. *Goodnow, John, born 30 Jan., 1762, Sudbury, Middlesex Co., Mass. Died 14 Oct., 1863, aged 101 years, 8 months and 14 days. On the Boston, Mass. roll.
6. *Goodwin, Amariah, born 15/16 Feb., 1759, Somersworth, Stafford Co., New Hampshire, and living at Lyman, York Co., Maine in 1864. On the Maine roll.
7. *Hutchings, William, born in 1764 in York, York Co., Maine, which was then Mass. Died May, 1866. On the Portland, Maine roll.
8. *Link, Adam, born in Washington Co., Penn., ca. 1762. Died in Aug., 1864. On the Cleveland, Ohio roll.
9. *Maroney, Alexander, born in 1770. Enlisted by his father at Lake George, New York. Living in 1864, date of death unknown.
10. *Miller, Benjamin, born in Springfield, Mass., 4 April, 1763/1764. Living at Laurens, Otsego Co., New York, in 1864. Date of death unknown. On Albany, New York roll.
11. *Pettingill, John, born 30 Nov., 1766, at Windham, Conn., married Hannah Fox, died 23 April, 1864. On Albany, New York roll.
12. *Waldow, Daniel, born 10 Sept., 1762 at Windham, Conn. Died 30 July, 1864, Syracuse, New York. On Albany, New York roll.

When in 1864 Reverend Hillard first published his biographical sketches, G. W. Tomlinson published in Boston, his Patriots of the Revolution of '76, (Boston, 1864), he found in March,

1863 that there were 12 veterans of the Revolution in the Union states and 12 in the Confederate states. Both writers missed the last survivor.

13. *Bakeman, Daniel T., of Freedom, Cattarangas Co., New York, who died 5 April, 1869.

It is only once in a hundred years that we have such a glorious opportunity to give our personal "Thank you" to the soldiers and patriots of 1776-1783 for our independence as a Nation and for our Freedoms. This 4th of July will be especially precious to us because each one here will be keenly aware of his or her ancestor/ancestors, by name to whom a debt of gratitude is owed.

To obtain the written record--the application for a pension or bounty land or the military service record, which may only contain proof of service--is only a part of our obligation to those who come after us in the next 100 years. Beginning now, let's gather in our children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren to see their Revolutionary ancestor's hand written record of his recollections of the Revolutionary War; the signatures of his neighbors and relatives witnessing as to his truthfulness; the signatures of the men under whom he served; the affidavit of the minister or legal officer about his marriage, required for a widow's pension. Mark a map to show the places he mentioned and where he lived when he applied for a pension; where he lived in the 1840 U. S. Census; and where he died.

If you do these things the child watching this 4th of July parade, playing in the band, marching in the parade, or riding a float may do so more willingly and with feeling for the men in his family who made the day possible, because he will know them by name. Perhaps his descendants in the years 2076-2083 will recall hearing that great grandmother "got it all together" and made the children listen before they joined the parade in Dallas, Texas, 4th of July, 1975.

At the family picnic supper or patio cook out, ask now for the "time to tell them something important." Then TELL THEM about their Revolutionary ancestors by name--Robert Coe, Stephen Irons, John Stanclift, Sr., Allen Breed, or whatever his name may be. You will be planting a memory, which like our other family traditions, may not be quite accurate in 2076, but certainly a worthy memorial to you, the mother, the father, the grandmother or grandfather, or the great-grandmother or great-grandfather, who cared.

There is no home too beautiful or too small for making HISTORY LIVE with framed pages from the Revolutionary records you have gathered for this magnificent project of the Local History & Genealogical Society. Truly, it is one of the most valuable projects approved by any State and/or City Bicentennial Commission. Now is the time to get extra copies of your Bicentennial Special Edition of The Quarterly for each of your grandchildren. Write their names in them, the date, and a note of affection and patriotism. Put them away--they will be found when you are gone. They will know you were thinking of them that day. Who knows what it will be like on 4th of July, 2076? At least you have helped in creating a resource for young Texans to know what it was like in 1776 and 1976. Perhaps your Bicentennial efforts in behalf of your descendants will bring the Revolutionary War to the forefront in their consciousness along with the war for The Republic of Texas, the Mexican War, War Between the

States, World Wars I and II, and the Korean War. Do all that you can to make it so--at least this once in your lifetime!

Congress created the National American Revolution Bicentennial Commission in 1966--a non-partisan body composed of both public servants and private citizens. They suggested a celebration encompassing the entire nation and involving all citizens of it. They suggested the three major themes--Heritage, Horizons, and Festival and the idea of a Bicentennial era ending in 1983--the anniversary of the peace treaty which ended the war. They created the era but only We The People--can bring back the ideas and ideals for which our ancestors offered their lives and worldly goods--and recreate those ancestors as living human beings. Each of you who THINKS BICENTENNIAL--and it takes that--will become more alert to ways and means to help revitalize family patriotism as we have known it through our lifetimes.

Now let us turn our attention to American Military Records Research. In 1962 at the Oklahoma State Genealogy Conference, University of Oklahoma, I presented the first known compilation in the Southwest on military records, where and how to get them. A copy may be in the Dallas Public Library. It summarized by states (those replying) the records available and in what offices.

In 1967 some of you may remember I substituted at the last minute because the program speaker had been called to Washington. Later we learned it concerned the nutrition of the astronauts. Since then man has walked on the moon but the same framed military records still tell the same story of Patriotism in the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican War, Civil War, World Wars I and II, and later wars. Those values and the geography of those wars are still strong and vivid.

The National Archives form 6751 is still one of the gateways for you to make United States History a personal, living force in your family--the means of getting records for the soldiers in the various wars up to 1900 and of World War I if you are next of kin to a soldier no longer living. The other major gateway is the Office of the Adjutant General in the home State of the veteran or the State which he served.

The Table showing available records prepared by Dr. James D. Walker for the World Conference on Records in 1969 is the best source for this information. Dr. Walker has given me permission to reproduce this Table, which is shown on the next page (page 80.)

At this time I would like to urge you to continue gathering from the National Archives your ancestor's records in later wars. The War of 1812 files (that war ended in 1815) contain the soldiers discharges which they presented to the nearest land office where they claimed their Bounty Land, if they wanted land. These discharges contain much genealogical information--where born, a personal description, and often a note showing where the Land Warrant is to be sent. Many Revolutionary War soldiers were also in the War of 1812. These discharges will tell you what they looked like. It is the Bounty Land file for the War of 1812 you want to ask for first. Use Form 6751.

If you find your ancestor in the War of 1812 served in an organization showing in the name of it "U. S." Infantry, Artillery, etc., then the second most inspiring document you should ask for--by all means--on form 6751 is indicated by the square "Military"

to which you should add "Military Enlistment Register." To get the Register pages containing those of your ancestor, first get the approximate dates of enlistment in the Regular Army organization from the Bounty Land file. Fewer soldiers in the War of 1812 lived long enough to be pensioned. Incidentally, the last 6,000,000 acres of Government owned Bounty Land were in the Territories of Illinois, Arkansas, and Missouri. Now you have a clue as to why they migrated there. More details will be found in the September, 1974 edition of Military Records and Where to Get Them. A copy of which follows immediately below. (Permission has been granted by Mrs. Wilkinson.)

MILITARY RECORDS AND WHERE TO GET THEM

- I. HOME GUARD-These were men assigned to guard buildings, rivers, bridges, harbors, ammunition, food supplies, etc., in their home communities. Many were too old to be in the militia or Continental line. They were not pensioned by the Federal Government for this service alone; but some towns and townships or counties occasionally paid them a small stipend if they were in dire need because they had to be away from their work for a long period. Their names appear in some county histories; in some minutes of Town Meetings particularly in New England Town Minutes (some of these have been or are being published); and some tell about this experience in their applications for pensions. If this were their only military service, the application may have been rejected for lack of qualifying military service. Nevertheless they were Patriots. In one application, the home guard tells of guarding the bridge into town, being captured by Indians before he could notify the militia; and gives names of some women and children taken prisoner by Indians to live in captivity in Canada. Think of the men in the Home Guard as men in your own community in the Civil Defense Corps.
- II. MILITIA-These were men who volunteered or were drafted to serve in the Militia Companies formed by, and for service within their own colonies or states, such as 16th Co., Massachusetts Militia. In early pension laws, the Federal Government did not pension them for this service alone because they were troops of a specific colony or state. However, the State of Virginia pensioned their men on half-pay basis, so did North Carolina. When Virginia and North Carolina gave up their Western Lands to the Federal Government, our Federal Government took up the responsibility and paid men with land chiefly in Ohio and East Tennessee respectively. Another example is the "Fire Lands" across Northern Ohio containing land granted to the "Burned Out" Connecticut families.

Many of the men in the Colonial or State Militia had several periods of service--some of which may have been in the Continental Lines--George Washington's troops from the Colonies and States--the nearest approach to a Federal Army.

Levies for a certain number of men were sometimes placed on towns to replace militia vacancies or to increase the strength of the militia. The Federal Government did not pension for this service alone.

Pay, clothing, food, etc., for Militia Companies had to come from their own colony or state. Many Commanders had large

claims in later years against Congress for food, ammunition, wagon and horse hire, etc., they personally bought or furnished their men in their Militia Companies and also in the Continental Lines. Homes were taken or volunteered for shelter of troops and the wounded. The soldier lived, retreated, and advanced on "The Economy of the Land." Those who "gave" or had items commandeered, are Patriots. Records of their participation are likely to appear in the same sources as those cited for Home Guards. Some have been published as Claims or Indentures.

A major source for records of the "fighting men of the Militia Companies", is the Office of the Adjutant General, in the State or Colony from which the men served. Many of the Adjutants General no longer have physical possession of the old records but their office does know where the records are kept. This is a "lazy" way to find out instead of compiling one's own resource file on a specific state before one begins research in that state. Many of the old records have been retired to State Libraries, State Historical Societies, and some to Local Historical Societies, and some to local Historical/Genealogical Societies-the latter usually being about the Home Guard, copies of old payrolls, etc. Many State Libraries and Historical Societies have compiled free or low-price "Finding Aids" about the holdings which they have. Pennsylvania, Tennessee, North Carolina and Oklahoma are examples.

And ALSO-DON'T OVERLOOK THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES for Militia Soldiers, Applications for Pensions, Bounty Land Warrants, and "Military" Records. The soldier may have served in the Continental Line as well as in the Militia. His Militia Company may have become Pensionable Service later. In any event, the laws were liberalized as time passed by and if the soldier lived long enough he was probably pensioned or given a warrant. IF he or his widow or their heirs applied. An example is a soldier who was 66 years old when he served in the New York Militia and his 3rd wife got a bounty land warrant in 1855. A Connecticut soldier served as a replacement in a Massachusetts Militia Company. Replacement men served for those who were killed and or wounded. "Substitutes" served in place of draftees who sometimes were already off at war when they were drafted. Brothers served for brothers and neighbors for neighbors in those days as substitutes.

Think of the Militia as the National Guard which it is now named. When it is called out by the Governor, it is State Service and there would be a State Record. When it is mobilized by the Federal Government for a war as in the case of the 45th, 36th or Rainbow Division in World War I and World War II, it is Federal Service and of Federal Record.

- III. CONTINENTAL LINE-This may be written as "N. Y. Line or as N. Y. Continental or 1st N. Y. Regiment", as examples. The word "militia" does not appear in the name of the organization or military "outfit" as we now usually call the organization. The National Archives created for custody of Federal Records (and not for State Records) is the prime source for information about these soldiers' service.
- IV. U. S. ARMY-This is the "Regular Army" and can be recognized as

in 13th U. S. Infantry as an example. A vast number of the men in the War of 1812 served in the Regular Army. Enlistment was slow. The Revolutionary War was still too vivid. Massachusetts as an example passed a law prohibiting their Militia Troops from going outside the state's boundaries. The Federal Government to meet the need, enlarged the Regular Army and more unoccupied land than money, "sweetened the pot" with the Bounty Land Warrants for each term of enlistment. Presenting the Honorable Discharge at the nearest Land Office established quick eligibility at first and this discharge is usually in their file with other papers at the National Archives. Later they applied with more "paper work" involved.

Men in the War of 1812 unless disabled in service or later, had to live to be very old to be pensioned. However, their widows and children might apply for pension benefits and for some Bounty Land Warrant privileges. For men who served in the Regular Army in addition to the pension and bounty land files, it is always wise to check the "military" square when ordering copies of Veterans Records on GSA Form No. 6751 which one gets from the National Archives. Hundreds of these forms have been distributed at Workshops by DAR's to DAR's. The so-called "military" record for a Regular Army soldier may be two very large pages from the Military Enlistment Registers. The pages show when and where born, give a physical description, the age and occupation, where and by whom recruited and some more comments about the man's service including whether AWOL or Court Martialed.

A soldier in the early wars, whether Continental, Militia or Regular Army sometimes went home AWOL to cut wheat, to see about his family, or he might be delayed in rejoining his troops when cut off by the enemy, or by difficult terrain. He reported for duty later and was "forgiven."

NATIONAL ARCHIVES-The doorway to obtaining copies of the pension applications, bounty land warrants (for service before 1856 only) and "military" records on file is the free GSA Form 6751 which one obtains by a written request to: Military Service Records (NNCC), National Archives (GSA), Washington, D. C., 20408.

The form explains itself but does not say that the usual file contains only the selected documents--selected as the most useful information. The complete file for one man is likely to be much more costly. The "Military" file except for the Regular Army men may contain little genealogical information at first glance but it may be the clue to more follow-up in other sources. These "Military" records are payroll and muster roll "bits and pieces"--sometimes "sick call", etc., maybe giving place and date information.

It should also be kept in mind that the earliest records were burned in National Capitol fires including the War of 1812 when the Capitol was burned by the British.

Soldiers also lost warrants--sometimes in card games and in wash kettles; gave them away; and sold them. Some were also thrown away because they did not want land in "wilderness" so far away from home.

V. MICROFILM--First, what is it and why? Many of us have not had

an opportunity to see and use microfilm. It looks like photographic negatives in a long strip—perhaps 60-100 feet long wound on a reel or spool, and it is called a roll. The pictures of the pages, photographed by a special camera, are very small, about one inch square, called frames and are too small to read without a special magnifying machine called a microfilm reader/viewer. Micro means small. Revolutionary War soldiers' files have been microfilmed to save the originals from complete destruction but prints on paper can be made of the records on film wherever there is a microfilm printer machine. Records ordered on GSA Form 6751 are "paper" records.

The Oklahoma Society NSDAR in 1973 chose as their second statewide Bicentennial Project the purchase of the rolls of Microfilm, known as the M804 Series, containing the microfilmed pictures of each and every piece of paper in the soldiers' file including letters of inquiry from descendants up to about 1930 and the replies from National Archives. Each roll of microfilm averages 80 feet in length. Some contain "gold mines." In one letter a lady wrote she "decorated John Stancliff's grave Memorial Day. He is buried in the Friends Cemetery (at North Collins, New York.)" No other record of his burial site had ever been found.

These records connected with various kinds of military service whether Army, Navy, Marine, Federal, State or Local, are our Heritage. First hand accounts MAKE HISTORY LIVE and interest people of all ages.

Frequently the only available records which furnish guidelines to time and place are military or are lists of soldiers appearing in County Histories.

A safe rule to follow is that if an ancestor or his sons were between the ages of 16 and 60 when there was a major war going on, they were probably participants at some level. That is a far cry from so many of our 16 year olds today. And our 60 year olds are confronted with retirement upon reaching that age. The Fife, Drum and Bugle Clues list prepared at the request of the late Abby Moran with which I conclude this paper, will suggest historical resources --there is always another place to look! The list is as follows:

A Biographical Sketch of Dorothy DeWitt Wilkinson, Mrs. Jim Wilkinson

His first wife was Ann (Tatum or Knowles), and the second wife was Joanne Bodycoat. He is supposed to have come through Bermuda. Can you supply any information on his immigration?
 2. My great-great-grandfather James Todd born 1788 was in Tennessee from 1811 until his death 1860/70. His brothers Robert and Benjamin served in the War of 1812, as did some cousins. I

- wrote the Archives for his War of 1812 record, and was sent one for a James Todd who served in a West Tennessee unit (mine was in Middle Tennessee--Rutherford County.) How can I be sure that the James Todd of the War of 1812 in Tennessee is mine? (There was another James Todd around Nashville who was in the state very early and moved to Greene County, Ohio, in 1815, and another James Todd who was in East Tennessee--Greene County or one of its derivatives.)
3. My great-great-great-grandfather Benjamin Todd was a Revolutionary War Soldier (pension application S-1597, serving as a Private. I have found no reference to his having received land for his service. There is no deed to him in Rutherford County, Tennessee, where he was by 1811, nor is there a grant in his name at the Tennessee Archives. Yet beginning in 1811 he was paying taxes on 40 acres in Rutherford County. Did he receive bounty land, possibly never recorded by deed?

THE 11TH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF GENEALOGICAL AND HERALDIC SCIENCES

A REPORT

In addition to representing myself, it was my honor and privilege to be the official representative of twelve Societies to the 11th International Congress Of Genealogical And Heraldic Sciences, at Liege, Belgium, 29th May-2nd June, 1972, which included the Local History And Genealogical Society, Cooperating With The Dallas Public Library, Dallas, Texas.

From the moment of arrival in Liege on Sunday, 28th May, 1972, with the Reception at the Secretary General's Office and Welcome Desk at the Palais des Liege, which was originally built 990/1000 A.D., the Congress was an outstanding success, and an intellectually stimulating experience.

The 11th International Congress Of Genealogical And Heraldic Sciences enjoyed the Patronage of le Prince Albert, Prince de Liège, Prince de Belgique, with the Congress being organized under the direction of the Fédération généalogique et héraldique de Belgique by l'Office généalogique et héraldique de Belgique, with many distinguished and illustrious persons listed on the Committee of Patronage, and Committee of Honor, while the Committee of the Congress and the Executive Committee was headed by Le prince Alexandre de Merode, President of the Congress.

The Ceremonial Opening of the Congress was held on Monday morning, 29th May, 1972, at 9:30 A.M., in the Auditorium of the impressive Le Palais des Congrès, Esplanade de l'Europe, in which building all sessions of the Congress were held, including all seminars. Le prince Alexandre de Merode presided and a warm welcome and cordial greetings were extended, followed by an allocution by Dr. Hans R.von Fels, and a statement by the Secretary General, the chevalier Xavier de Ghellinck Vaernewyck, and closing with a seminar lecture by Monsieur Jacques Stiennon, Professor of the University, on "Les sources de Liège dans l'héraldique et la généalogie."

Following the Ceremonial Opening of the Congress, we were officially welcomed at a Reception by the Collège des Bourgmestre et Echevins de la Ville de Liège, in the former St. Andrews Church, place du Marché, followed by a visit and tour of the City Hall, located directly across the street.

The seminar lectures and papers to which we had all been looking forward with such keen interest, began on Monday afternoon, the 29th May, and continued through Friday, 2nd June, 1972, with the closing lecture at 6:00 P.M. The entire schedule was superbly planned and perfectly executed. There were a total of sixty lecture-papers given, and with the Genealogical and Heraldic divisions running concurrently, it made one long to be able to be in two places at once, and thus attend two lectures simultaneously. I wish that I might have the space and time in this report to give a brief biography of all the distinguished speakers, and a resumé of their respective individual papers, but suffice it to say, all were superb.

I had known that Liege is an industrial city, but had not known

previously of its rich cultural heritage, which I was delighted to observe and enjoy during the beautifully planned social events and tours which were so thoughtfully arranged for us.

In addition to the genealogical, heraldic, and publications displays, which included the publications of all the Societies which I represented, and my own books and publications, at the Palais des Congrès, all of which were most interesting, and which I enjoyed daily during the Congress; the formal opening of the exhibition "L'Église And Heraldry" at the newly established "Maison de la Culture-Les Chiroux", place des Carmes, on Monday evening, 29th May, 1972, was brilliant and spectacular.

A delightful intermission in the lectures was the tour on Tuesday afternoon, 30th May, 1972, to Waleffe; the ancient Chateau of Warfusée; and Lexhy, where we were received with gracious hospitality by the present owners of each.

Wednesday, 31st May, 1972, was a full day of lectures, during which I presented my own paper on "Heraldry In The Republic Of Texas Era In The United States Of America", which was well received, for which I was grateful. In the evening a wonderful Concert by the Chamber Orchestra of Wallony, conducted by Lola Bobesco, was presented in the former St. Stephens Church, rue du Vertbois.

The seminar lectures were resumed promptly at 9:00 A.M. on Thursday, 1st June, 1972, continuing until noon, when a tour to Hex, the very beautiful former summer home or Palace of the Prince-Bishop; Hamal; and Lantin; where we were most graciously received at each chateau and palace.

Friday, 2nd June, 1972, came all too soon, but it was indeed a mental feast, with a full day of scheduled lecture-papers. That evening, the 11th International Congress came to a close with a formal dinner at the Castle of Aigremont, at which brilliant conversation, fine wines, and gourmet foods were featured, against the rich background of the beautiful interiors of the Castle, all of which made a beautiful memory for reflection upon a most successful, intellectually inspiring, and informative Congress.

In addition to all of the above there were many extra entertainments and excursions for the wives and families of the participants in the seminars, which of course I did not attend since I was a participant and deeply interested in hearing all the lectures possible, and in learning all I could, for I considered it a rare opportunity, not only to participate, but to observe and learn.

As I looked at the many brilliant participants, all recognized authorities in their respective fields of genealogy and heraldry, who were in attendance at the Congress, representing many countries and languages, I was impressed by the common bond of keen interest evidenced by all, in what everyone else could contribute, thereby contributing to and increasing the knowledge of all, thus making it a most interesting and stimulating experience, which I shall always enjoy and treasure.

All of those in authority, and all those who worked so hard toward the success of the 11th International Congress Of Genealogical And Heraldic Sciences, must have felt well rewarded for their efforts, by the appreciation and enthusiasm exhibited by all participants, and all who were fortunate enough to be in attendance. The lush beauty of the landscape of Belgium, the friendly cordiality of all those in authority, and all of the people in Belgium, particularly the people

of Liege, as well as of all those in attendance, made the entire event a most pleasantly memorable experience, and we were all indebted for a brilliantly successful Congress.

As we begin our celebrations and observances of the Bicentennial, it seems most appropriate to present this report at this time since many of the men of early Texas who came to carve out of the wilderness the Republic of Texas, and later the State of Texas, were armigerous, and were also the sons and grandsons of men who fought and served in the Revolutionary War to establish the United States of America. Among these were Austin, Bangs, Burnet, Crawford, Crockett, Hamilton, Houston, Lamar, Smith and Travis—all in my paper.

It has been a pleasure to bring you this Report, and I deeply appreciate the honor and privilege of representing the Local History And Genealogical Society, and the other Societies.

PRESIDENT-EDITOR'S MESSAGE-A BRIEF REPORT FOR 1974-1975

My husband wants you all to know that he is glad he could share me with you, for he knows I must love you all to work so hard for you. However, he almost had another "heart attack" when I received a bill for \$1,271.32 from the Statler-Hilton Hotel, which I had had to guarantee, since the Society has no credit rating, for our recent most successful 20th Annual Genealogical Seminar And Workshop.

This has been a busy year, and a good year!-I began my administration with \$121.75 with which to put out 4 Quarterlies and run the Society-I rolled up my sleeves and went to work. Contents were good for the first 2 issues but the print jobs were poor-no money, but thanks to a nice increase in membership (we now have 469 members), plus money made on the Seminar on February 22nd, 1975, with Mr. Ron Bremmer-and on our 20th Annual Genealogical Seminar And Workshop-plus good sales of Quarterlies, Handbooks, and plus the percentage to the Society from the sales of my "Primer Of Genealogical Research" and some donations, we have been able to have professional printing of our March and June, 1975 issues.

We honored our Founders and Past Presidents with our 20th Anniversary Tea, 4th January, 1975, at the Dallas Woman's Forum, and we have had a year of outstanding programs. We have honored the memory of our deceased members by presenting 5 books to our Genealogy Library of the Dallas Public Library, and we have honored Mrs. Lucile Anderson Boykin by a gift of \$100.00 to be used for the purchase of 2 books and periodicals for the Genealogy Library. I have presented 6 books also.

We have had some new and innovative ideas added to our operation by having our Lineage Research and Library Day at the Library; our Oral History Project; our Vital Records Research; we have our official Bicentennial Project; Indexing has been continued; we have had a Speaker's Bureau; we have set up a genealogically orientated program in one of the elementary Public Schools of Dallas, with the prospect of another; and for the first time a History Book, this one being for 1974-1975. We had an excellent working Genealogical Seminar and Workshop; and for the first time we have had a Chaplain, a Historian, a Parliamentarian, and a Past Presidents Council. We have upheld the goals of our Society, and have engaged in personal family research with which we are closing our year by incorporating the results of that research in the "Special Bicentennial Commemorative Issue of The Quarterly".

This has been a year of many firsts. I have been the first woman President of the Society, in this "International Women's Year". I have been the first President-Editor, also the first Editor to serve 4 years as Editor, (1963, 1964, 1965, 1974-1975.) It has been a year of much hard work, but I look back on it with a sense of pride and accomplishment, and have greatly appreciated the opportunity for service. I wish to thank all of the Officers, Committee Chairmen and their Committees, and all the members, for their assistance and support. Now that the pattern has been set-go forward!
Recommendations:

I have dared to dream and want to share my dream with you for the future-I think the old Belo home, which was recently Sparkman's Funeral Home, on Ross Avenue in Dallas, would make a perfect Genealogical

ogical Library, and would be a splendid place for our Society to hold its meetings, Workshops, etc. I hope my enthusiasm will spark your interest and enthusiasm, and that it will be a project for the Society, which would be a permanent headquarters for the Local History And Genealogical Society, and serve all those who are interested in genealogy, heraldry and history. Let my dream be your legacy!

1. I still think the official year should be changed back to having the election and installation of Officers in November, with their term to begin January 1st, to coincide with the fiscal year of 1st January to 31st December, and to insure the uninterrupted flow of Quarterlies for the year, not 2 by one Editor, and 2 by another in one year, thus interrupting the continuity for the year, and making binding difficult, since the No. One of each Volume begins with the March issue, and ends with the December issue, which is No. Four of the same Volume.
2. I still think the Society should have a Year Book, containing the Roster with the family names being researched by each member; the Calendar of events for the year, and the By-laws; the Executive Board, Committee Chairmen, and Projects. We have 469 members. Do you know who they are?
Note: The Membership Roster should not appear in The Quarterly, because it immediately becomes a public and sometimes commercial mailing list, whereas a Year Book is private to the members only.
3. I urge active participation by both Officers and Members, for you will get more out of the Society and your membership in it, and the Society will prosper!
4. ADOPT A PROJECT!-and BLESS YOU ALL!
