

HISTORY OF OAK CLIFF

Extracts from the HISTORY OF OAK CLIFF published in the Oak Cliff Edition, 'Dispatch Journal' between March 6 and June 22, 1939 by Don Dreesen. (Library Card No. R 976.428 D 77lh)

The year 1888 was when Oak Cliff showed its greatest growth in early years, not only in population and development, but also in culture.

The West Dallas Methodist Church, now known as Western Heights Methodist, was oralized during the year. This church was called St. Paul's for many years. Rev. C.G. Shutt was the organizer, starting with a congregation of about 25 people.

At the same time, Rev. Shutt organized the Oak Cliff Methodist Church, known in early years as St. Mark's. Rev. Shutt was a member of the old North Texas Methodist conference. He started the Oak Cliff church with 25 members. F.N. Oliver assisted in the church organization. The Women's Missionary society was formed in October, 1888, with Mrs. H. W. Shelton as a charter member. The auxiliary met once each month in a residence at Lancaster and E. Eighth. The first church building was a frame structure at Grand Marsalis) and Starr.

The second annual session of the Oak Cliff institute opened on Sept. 3, 1888.
This early Oak Cliff private school was headed by J. C. Roberts, principal.

T.L. Marsalis this year offered to Rev. Joseph Martiniere, Roman Catholic cleric of Dallas, a site of land in Oak Cliff for a charitable institution. This

gift was approved by Bishop N.A. Gallagher of Galveston.

On this site the first Catholic unit established in Oak Cliff was an orphange located at what is now Adams and Page streets. The building was erected under the direction of Bishop Gallagher and was completed in 1891, at a cost of \$5,000, on the eight acre site. The orphanage was first conducted by the Sisters of Mercy and later by the Sisters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, who now conduct St. Paul's Hospital.

Among the early settlers of the Oak Cliff addition was John B. Martin, who came to this section when only seven families lived here. Martin died in 1938 in Dallas. In April, 1888, a kiln of 300,000 bricks was fired at the home of T.L. Marsa

In April, 1888, a K lis on Grand (Marsalis).

The first Texas League game of baseball to be played in Dallas was at the Oak Cliff Park Sunday afternoon, April 22, 1888, before a crowd of 3000 people. The score was Dallas 13. Fort Worth 5.

That month H.C. Clark of Oak Cliff let the contract for his new two-story brick and stone residence to be built on Seventh Street at a cost of \$15,000. The structure still stands on the hill overlooking the Trinity valley two blocks

east of Jefferson.

Oak Cliff Park (Marsalis Zoo) was laid out early in 1888 by a landscape gardener. The park ran from Thirteenth street to the lake (Cedar Creek) and contained 60 acres. A pavilion was built located on the high point in the park at the foot of Grand (Marsalis) where the Hord Ridge marker now stands. The pavilion was three stories high with a dance floor 75 feet square on the second floor. The dam across Cedar Creek was completed at that time. This formed a lake two miles long, with an average depth of 12 feet, containing 25,000,000 gallons of water.

James W. Kidd, an old resident of Dallas County and the owner of Kidd Springs

died July 21, 1888 at his residence on Germania street in Dallas.

Among the first families to build homes in Oak Cliff along N. Ewing were G.N. Quillman, Judge George N. Aldredge, Judge Robert Cowart, Judge C.F. Tucker and John Fisher.

On April 3, 1892, F.N. Oliver, the newspaper publisher was named mayor of Oak Cliff, succeeding Hugh F.M. Ewing. W.H. Henderson was acting mayor before Oliver took office.

Aldermen named in the election were Robert P. Toole, Clinton Jack, W.H. Henderson, J. W. Roach and J. L. Means. W. F. Daugherty was city secretary, W.H.W.

Smith, marshal, and C.R. Buddy treasurer.

On July 7, 1892, the city of Oak Cliff purchased a site 300x191 feet on the southwest corner of Tenth and Patton from the Dallas-Oak Cliff Land Co. for \$3000. A contract for \$30,000 was let to build the Oak Cliff high school here. This building stood nearly 40 years before it was wrecked about 10 years ago, It housed for many years both elementary and high school classes and was known as Oak Cliff Central School.

In 1892 the population of Cedar Hill was estimated at 600. The town had an academy with 120 students. Rev. Thomaston was paster of the Methodist church.

Rev. Key of the Baptist and Elder W. F. Barcis of the Christian church.

The Oak Cliff Female college was opened Sept. 7, 1892, in the hotel building at Crawford and Jefferson. In April of that year Holt's sanitarium was opened by Dr. P. Holt on the corner of Eighth and Lancaster.

Businesses which were thriving in the area at that time were E.G. Patton

and Co., medicine laboratories and the Texas Paper Mills.

It was about this period that William M. Ward was named first postmaster of Oak Cliff by President Harrison. Oak Cliff soon was joined to Dallas for postal purposes.

In 1892 Rev. Armstrong was pastor of the Oak Cliff Methodist Church and Rev. Thompson was head of the West Dallas Methodist congregation.

In 1892 the long-distance line between Fort Worth and Dallas was erected by

the Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. In 1893 John G. Fleming bought the Oak Cliff Paper Mills from Col. W.W. Lang. It is said that the first paper published in Texas on paper made in Texas was in

Oak Cliff, F.N. Oliver was the publisher. In 1893 F.N. Oliver was named mayor; W. H. Daugherty, secretary; J. W. Moore, attorney; W. H. W. Smith, marshal; C. R. Buddy, treasurer, and W. H. Henderson,

J. L. Means, Jack Clinton, J. F. Roach and R. P. Toole, aldermen of Oak Cliff, In the 1894 election E. W. Foster was named mayor of Oak Cliff; O. W. Grigsby secretary; J.D. Fouraker, attorney; C. R. Buddy, treasurer; M. G. Knight, mar-

shal, and W. H. Henderson, A.P. Tenison, J. W. Roach and W. L. Diamond, aldermen. From 1894 to 1901 John F. Peeler, for whom Peeler school was named, was super-intendent of a one-room school in West Dallas; from 1894 to 1897, Edgar T. Kemp was president of the Oak Cliff college.

In October, 1894, the railway to Oak Cliff was electrified and the route

through West Dallas torn up and abandoned.

On Nov. 6, 1894, J. T. Whitaker was re-elected Justice of the Peace for Precinct 7.

In 1895 the Oak Cliff Methodist church bought its present lot and built a small brick building. E.W. Foster, was re-elected mayor of Oak Cliff; E.P.

Turner and J. V. Spears were named aldermen.

In the 1896 election M. A. Posten was named secretary of Oak Cliff. Other officials elected were C. R. Buddy, treasurer; T.A. Hord, marshal; S.J.D. Foster, assistant collector and G.I. Dorman, Charles Steinman, G.N. Quillman and A.P. Tenison, aldermen.

In the fall of 1897 Oak Cliff Baptist church, now known as Cliff Temple, was founded in a brick building on Lancaster, between Fenth and Eleventh streets.

Dr. Walter T. Gillsman was an early minister.

In the 1897 election R. C. Porter was named mayor and E. P. Turner and A. W. Clem. alderm(a)n of Oak Cliff.

Cochran Chapel Cemetery, located by the Cochran Chapel United Methodist church, Dallas, Texas, had Its beginning when Sarah Jane Cochran, the infant daughter of William M. and Nancy Jane Hughes Cochran, died on April 7, 1853. Her parents looked over the farm to choose a right and proper place for a family graveyard in which to place the body of their darling baby girl. They chose a beautiful wooded spot on the southeast side of the branch that ran in front of their house a short distance away. It was the custom in those days to lay to rest your loved ones on your own property not far from the house, as death to the early pioneers was no stranger and it was a comfort to know the graves were nearby.

Little did Mrs. Cochran realize within seventeen days she would bury her beloved husband near their little girl for William M. Cochran contracted the fever
and died suddenly April 24, 1855. The Cochrans had come to Texas in 1845 and had
settled on the William M. Cochran headright in Peters Colony but on Dec. 24, 1850
had moved near Browning Branch on a tract of land known as the Wilson Baker Survey
and made their permanent home there. William had served as the first County Clerk
of Dallas 1846-48 and wanted to bring his family closer to Dallas. His untimely
death was a blow not only to his family but to many friends and neighbors. Mrs.
Cochran, left a widow with six children to rear, ran the farm and mill, and later
even sent her bows to McKenzie College in Clarksville. Texas and

On July 11, 1856 Mrs. Cochran deeded four acres to the Methodist Episcopal Church, South for a church and cemetery. She had surveyed the land herself and

then wrote the deed which reads in part;

"TO HAVE AND TO HOLD their successors in office and do MARRANT, GURANTEE and FOREVER DEFEND the right, title and interest in and to the said tract or parcel of land, binding myself, my heirs and representatives to the said Trustees, their successors or their assigns in trust and confidence that the said Trustees will build or cause to be built on said lot a house for public worship for the use and benefit of the said METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHUNCH, SOUTH, it being understood and agreed that I shall have the use of one acre of said lot for a FAMILY CEMPTERY including the grave of my late husband, Milliam Cochran, and should the said Trustees or their successors ever at any time sell or otherwise dispose of said lot of land, so as to alienate the same from the said METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHUNCH, SOUTH the above named amount of one acre of said lot revert to me or my heirs in fee simple.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal, using scrawl for seal, this 11th day of Month July A. D. 1856."

NANCY JANE COCHRAN

Cochran Chapel Methodist Church, the first deeded church in the County, and Cochran Chapel Cemetery were named for Mrs. Cochran and her husband. Nancy Jane died Oct. 15, 1877 and rests near her beloved husband Milliam M. Cochran and her son George Washington Cochran. Two other sons, William P. and James M. Cochran, their wives, some of their children and grandchildren are buried nearby as is their only daughter, Martha AliceCochran Harris, her husband and some of their family.

Six other Hughes sisters besides Mrs. Cochran had moved with their husbands from Tennessee to Dallas, Texas and their names are prominent in the early history of the County. Those buried in Cochran Cemetery are George and Amanda Hughes Record, Thomas C. and Sarah M. Hughes Williams, Obadiah and Serena Hughes Knight,

and John B. and Margaret Hughes Bachman. These family names live on in Record Crossing, Knight Street, Bachman Lake and Bachman Boulevard. There is an Obadiah Knight Elementary School -- Mr. Knight was the first to deed three acres of land for school purposes in the County; also there is a Nancy Jane Cochran Elementary School in Oak Cliff. Descendants of these sisters by other names -- Taylors, Fields, Browns, Harrisons, Laws, Jacobys -- lie in family groupings in the cemetery as do some children and grandchildren of a Hughes brother. Nannie Cochran Brown, daughter of W.P. and Amanda Cochran, with her husband Ernest and two of their children are buried in the Brown family plot. Nannie was baptized in Cochran Chapels' first church building, married in the second church, and buried from the third church. There are family plots of Harveys, Wrights, Howells --- neighbors and friends of the Cochrans. Joshua Wright ("Mr. Pete") who is buried among the Wrights was always telling amusing incidents that happened when he was young. "One Sunday," he said, "the wife of one of the early ministers of the church was not only pious but overly zealous. She took him aside and talked to him about dying. This of course frightened him. He didn't want to die and be buried in the nearby cemetery. Then she asked him if he were a Christian? He said he didn't know. He was more frightened than ever. She proceeded to lecture him for not being certain whether he was a Christian or not. By this time he was almost in tears, and as she continued on and on he finally replied, 'If I have to die, I'd just as soon go to Hell as any place. "

In a lone grave in the southwest corner of the cemetery rests the remains of a stranger, He came to the Cochran Gin and Corn Mill seeking work. Nancy Jane hired him and about a month later he died suddenly without revealing anything about himself but his first name. Mrs. Cochran buried him in the family cemetery

to await the coming of the Lord.

During the Civil War when most of the men were gone the women were afraid to put a light in the church at night. Prayer meetings where held in the northwest corner of the graveyard not far from the Cochran house. It was a familiar sight to see the women and children kneeling in prayer taking their problems to the Lord.

Several of those buried in the cemetery died in defense of their country-the most recent being Daniel Jacoby in the Korean War. Virginius Howell (according to John H. Cochran's Dallas County: Its Pioneers and Progress, p. 27) "was shot in the forehead and killed in battle with the Creek Inidans-on Dec. 25, 1861 and was brought back home and buried in the graveyard at Cochran Chapel." An interesting gravestone with the American Flag on its top reads "I'm memory of Knight W. Field (1876-1918) 1st Lieutenant Medical Corps-Buried in France Romagane Cemetery-He gave his life for his country." William A. Knight, a Confederate soldier, died in Des Arc, Arkansas. A wagon was sent for his body to be brought back for burial in Cochran Chapel Cemetery. George W. Newman of Pleasant Valley drove the wagon. On the Knight gravestone is inscribed this poem

"He has gone on the last long march To the land where nevermore Shall the bugle sound reveille Or the dreadful cannon roar He who for his country dies Dies not But liveth evermore."

There are other gravestones on which we find poetry. On the M.M. and John B. Bachman stone we read:

"A loving husband a father dear
A faithful friend lies buried here."
and

and
"Sweet faith comes streaming from the sky
And says there is no death
Our loved ones who in ashes lie
Shall breathe immortal breath
Yes we shall meet our loved ones there
And sing forever sing
And shout while sailing through the air
Salvation through our Kine."

The John and Kate Knight Field stone quotes from the Psalms:

"Faithful his trust even unto death"
"The Lord preserveth the faithful."

John D. Cochran and Charles C. Patterson were members of Woodmen of the World and their stones have the W O W emblem; Laura Jacoby, an active member of Daughters of American Revolution, the DAR insignia. The stone of George Hughes is inscribed with the emblem of the Southern Cross of Honor and that of James M. Cochran with the emblem of Commander of the Confederate Veterans. James was quite young when he enlisted in the Confederate Army. He was seriously wounded in the war and there was a possibility that he would lose his arm if he didn't get home where he could obtain proper medical attention. He and a fellow soldier walked home-all the way from Arkansas. But his arm was saved. Many stones have the open Bible, doves, the hand with one finger pointing upward, gates of Heaven, 'Gone Home', 'Resting', 'At Rest', scrolls. Some baby stones have a little lamb either in resting position on top of the stone or on the front above the name. One is shaped like a heart; another shows a mother bird with a dead baby bird in her beak. One of the most unusual markers in the cemetery is made of lead and is shaped like an obelisk. It is about two and a half feet high and is inscribed with the names of three Bachman infants. We have been told that the marker must have been made in Europe as none of that type was made in our country in those years.

The mortality rate among infants in pioneer times was very high and this cemetery certainly attests this fact as there are thirty-three babies-one set of twinsand five young children under six years of age buried there. Looking closely at the dates of some of the early infant deaths and that of their mothers we find that several women died in childbirth leaving a husband to lead a lonely life of being father

and mother to his other children.

Most of the early pioneers buried here were farmers or farmers' wives. Some were teachers as was William Harris, William Fletcher Bachman, John D. Cochran, Annie Bachman Cochran, Mattie Harris, Māry Alice Cochran. Rev. 0. S. Thomas and his wife lie in their family plot. Rev. Thomas was one of the early preachers at Cochran Chapel and was well known in the North Texas Conference. Another minister buried in the cemetary is Rev. John B. Bachman who was a farmer on weekdays and a preacher on Sunday. Among those who fought in the Civil War but returned home safely were William Harris; William Berry Taylor (who had fought in a series of battles from Bull Run to Gettysburg and had joined Gen. Lee's army until surrender at Appomatox. Lee had sent him as a courier to inform the troops in the field that the war had ended); and William P. Cochran who had fought in battles in Central Tennessee.

Today this little cemetery adjacent to Cochran Chapel United Methodist Church adds to the picturesque setting of days gone by. On some of the stones are the names of those who lived a century ago. They had their joys, their sorrows, their struge

gles, and their triumphs. For those who care to open the gate, it will be like taking a stroll through the pages of the history of Dallas County. Anna Brown Baker Anne Cochran

CARROLLTON STREET RENAMED FOR LARNER ANCESTOR

Mr. William Larner personified the spirit of pioneer determination in 1842 when he sold his farm in Carrollton, Illinois, and brought his wife, Mary Jennings Larner, and their three small children (John Wesley, Mary Ann and Patrick Marion) to Peters Colony. Texas.

They established a new home on the 640-acre tract of land which is in the heart of the present City of Carrollton, TX. During the next 8 years before his untimely death at the age of 36 or 38 in 1850, he established himself as an esteemed member of the growing community.

Mary had two more children in Texas, Mary Jane & William Franklin, before she died, and William martied Elizabeth Masters Pearson, young widow whose husband had died enroute to Texas from Missouri. Their daughter, Clarinda, was born shortly before William died from pneumonia. The limited records from that period indicate that he was a Justice of the Peace and taxpayer on the first recorded Tax List in 1846. Isaac Webb's dlary refers to him several times as "William Larner, Esq."

William Larner was buried in a hollow log because there was no convenient wood from which to make a coffin.

The city Council of Carrollton, as a Bicentennial emphasis, resolved to honor the memory of this early settler by renaming a street within the geographical boundary of the Original survey of his land. School Road between Belt Line and Crosby was officially changed to Larner Road on May 20, 1976, in a ceremony with Mayor Ward Steenson; City Manager Clonis Luallen, and 4 generations of William Larner descendants attending: Ray Larner, a great grandson; Marilyn Larner Hicks, great-great grandsquiter; Ms. Pam Hicks, great-great-great grandsquiter; and, Trae Hicks, a great-great-great-great-grandsquiter; and, Trae Hicks, a great-great-grant-great-grandsguiter; Ms.

IN MEMORY

F. H. Sonntag and Amalie Auguste Diener were born near Olsnitz, Saxony, Germany, on July 14, 1846 and Aug. 10, 1850, respectively, and were life-long members of the Lutheran Church. They were married in 1871. They came to America and settled at Lebanon, Collin Co., Texas, in 1877. There were born to them nine sons and three daughters, all of whom are living except two, one daughter, Minnie, having died in infancy, and one son, Benjamine, died in 1905, at the age of 15 years.

The sons and daughters living are: Gustav and Alvin, of Meridian, Texas; Gottfried; William; Otto; Herman; Emil; Mrs. Annie Antwiler and Mrs. Elsie Bryant, of Frisco, Texas; and Cartwright Sonntag of Sweetwater. Oklahoma, all of whom are highly respectable, prosperous

and honorable citizens.

Mr. Sonntag left Texas and settled with his wife near Valles, State of San Luis Potosi, Mexico, in 1905, where he bought 4,200 acres of land and improved it. They had each visited their old home and children at Frisco since they had lived in Mexico and Mrs. Sonntag was about to start on another visit to Frisco when Mr. Sonntag was taken suddenly sick and died on the 14th day of December, 1915. The war troubles being on, and only two white men being in that part of the country, it was about two weeks before Mrs. Sonntag succeeded in sending a message to her family here. Two of her sons, Gottfried and Herman, immediately started after her. On account of the unsettled conditions, the railroad service was very bad; and they were eight days reaching their mother's place, where they found her alone at the home, except for some peons, or very poor and ignorant Mexicans who lived on the place, and the nearest white people being eight miles distant, and fifteen from the railroad.

There the boys learned that the Mexican outlaws, or soldiers, had taken their father's horses and money before his death, and after his death had entered the home where Mrs. Sonntag was alone and searched everything for money, and took away part of the clothing. The boys, realizing that it was far from being safe there for American citizens and only remaining there a few days, visited their father's grave and hurriedly brought their mother and started for home. But they realized soon after their arrival there that the strain was too great for their mother and her nerves were giving away. They arrived at home safely on the 10th day of January, 1916, and the change seemed for a while to be beneficial to Mrs. Sonntag, but the change from the torrid climate there to the cold January weather here, coupled with the terrible nervous strain she underwent there, proved too much for her. She contracted a throat trouble which soon was followed by pneumonia and, while everything was done for her that medical skill and loving hands could do, she passed away on January 26th and was buried in the family grave vard on the farm on the 27th of January 1916.

Mr. Sonntag was a veteran of the Franco-Prussian War of 1870.



'WHAT TO DO IF THE COURTHOUSE HAS BURNED'

By William Lusk Crawford

In my several years of family research, I have reached the point where I am told, "The courthouse burned." or "Sherman went through here." Every workshop I attend you hear the question from the floor, "What do you do when the courthouse has burned?" The answer given to this question may be "look several years beyond the date you need and see if your transaction has been re-recorded at a later date." Or, "You may find something from the local title company."

While trying to determine the members of the Crawford family that came to Denton Co., Texas, from Monroe Co., KY and when they settled in this county, I found that the original migration from Kentucky to Texas was made by William Crawford and his wife, Elizabeth Howard Crawford. He died 14 Feb. 1863 and wife, Elizabeth, ided 23 April 1868. Before the completion of the probation of their estate on 23 Dec 1875, the Denton Co. Courthouse burned.

I knew from the 1850 Census of Monroe Co., KY and the 1860 Census of Denton Co., TX the names and ages of most of their children and

that they moved during this 10-year period.

My family has known the members of the Jagoe Title Co., presently owned by J. M. Jagoe III, from as far back as I remember so as a last effort, I called on Mr. Jagoe for assistance in helping me determine when and where my great grandfather came to Denton Co. and settled.

Denton Co. was formed in 1846 and a Mr. J. A. Carroll opened a title office in 1854, while the county seat was still at Alton, a town that no longer exists. In 1874, the company was bought by the Jagoe family.

After checking some old files, Mr. Jagoe gave me a copy of the following:

Before me the undersigned authority on this day personally appeared S. H. Crawford who is to me well and personally known to be a resident credable citizen of said county and state and who after being by me duly sworn deposes and says that he is now 71 years of age and that he has resided in Denton Co. since the year of 1856. That he was well and personally acquainted with one William Crawford and his wife, Elizabeth Crawford, both now deceased. That the said William Crawford died in about the year of 1862 or 1863, and that the said Elizabeth Crawford died in about the year of 1870. That they left as their sole heirs at law the following named persons, to wit:

lst. Presilla Crawford, a daughter, who married a man by the name Jessie Harlen in about the year of 1850. He died and she then married a man by the name of Anda Comer and he died in about 1901, and she now

lives in Tennessee.

2nd. Jane Crawford, a daughter, who married a man by the name of John Winkler, in about the year of 1856 and he died in about the year of 1900. His wife is now living in the state of Tennessee. 3rd. J. H. Crawford, a son, who is dead (see below for his heirs).

4th. James Crawford, a son, who is now dead (see below for his heirs.) 5th. John Crawford, a son, who is now dead (see below for his heirs.) 6th. S. H. Crawford, a son, and this affiant, who is now living

in Denton Co.. Texas.

Affiant further states that the said John Crawford died in about the year of 1882 and left as his sole surviving heirs at law the following named persons, to wit:

1st. W. P. Crawford, a son, who is now about 42 years of age at

Bonham, Texas, only child by first wife.

2nd. Joe Crawford, a son, Newton Crawford, a son, Ish Crawford, a son, and Annie McKnight, a daughter, all of whom are children by his

2nd wife and they all now live in Denton Co., Texas.

3rd. Luther Crawford, a son, who now lives at Bonham, Texas; Allie Crawford, daughter, who is now dead, that the two last named children by the 3rd wife whose name is Dony Crawford and who is now also living at Bonham, Texas.

That the said Howard Crawford (J. H.) died in about the year of 1883 or 1884 and left as his sole heirs at law the following named children: 1st. Mrs. Bettie Eddleman, a daughter, now living in the IT (Indian Territory). 2nd. James W. Crawford, a son, 3rd. A. B. Crawford, a son, both now living in Denton Co., Texas. 4th. Settie Harris, a daughter (now dead see below). All of them are the children by the 1st wife who is now dead. 2nd. J. A. Crawford, a son, W. H. Crawford, a son, Dorah Crawford, a daughter, Lena Crawford, a daughter. All of whom are children by the 3rd wife, there having been no children by the 2nd wife and all of them are now living in Denton Co.

That the said Settie Harris died in about the year of 1870 and left as her sole surviving heirs at law the following named persons, to wit:

Walter Harris, a son, and Settie Harris, a daughter.

That the said James Crawford died in Denton Co. in about 1884 and left as his sole surviving heirs the following named persons, to wit: 1st. Sarah Crawford, his wife; that they never had any children born to them, 2nd, Also the above-named brothers and sisters,

nieces and nephews who are also the heirs of the above named William Crawford, deceased, and his wife, Elizabeth Crawford, deceased.

Affiant further states that the said Sarah Crawford, as surviving wife of the said James Crawford, sold and conveyed all of her interest in her deceased husband's estate to this affiant, S. H. Crawford, and W. P. Crawford.

Affiant further states that the estate of the above-named William Crawford and his deceased wife was partitioned by the County Court of Denton Co., Texas, prior to the burning of the courthouse of Denton Co. on the 23rd day of Dec. A D 1875, that said estate was divided as

follows, to wit:

1st. That the said Presilla Harlen Comer and Howard Crawford took the home place consisting of a part of the Francis Pearce Survey, and 40 acres out of the Willis Hammons Survey as their part, and 40 acres of land on Timber Creek in the Jessie Watkins Survey. Jane Winkler took as her part of said estate 124 acres of the R. W. Gibson Survey. James Crawford took as his part of said estate 200 acres of the Willis Hammons Survey in Denton Co.

John Crawford took 80 acres off of the East end of the 160 acres off in the name also 40 acres in the Jessie Watkins Survey on Timber Creek. That this affiant took 80 acres in the 160 acre survey in the name of and also 40 acres of the Jessie Watkins Survey on Timber Creek, all of which facts are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief, so help me God.

/s/ S. H. Crawford Subscribed and sworn to before me by S. H. Crawford on this the 30th day of Sept. A D 1903.

/s/ W. M. Jagoe Notary Public in and for Denton Co., Texas.

This illustrates that there is sometimes "gold" in "those title offices."

Later, I accidently found the deed for the property purchased 20 May 1856 when they arrived from Monroe Co., KY and filed in Deed Book B the same date in the Alton Courthouse. The deed had been refiled for the record thirty-two years later in Deed Book 36, pg. 388, 8 May 1888 at 1:00 PM by J. R. McCormick, Co. Clerk. He gives the Deed Book and page with date filed by Co. Clerk Lloyd at Alton Courthouse in 1856.

The deed gives Mr. William Kelly and wife, Marthaan, as Grantors and Wm. Crawford of Monroe Co., KY as Grantee. The land is described as being on Hickory Creek and a part of Willis Hammond Survey. This information along with the title company information told me that great grandfather William came to Texas in 1854 and settled on Hickory Creek where it empties into Lake Dallas. Members of his family, and most of their descendants, lived, or are living, their lives in Denton Co., many in the same vicinity of Lewisville, TX. The older members are buried in the Old Hall and Flower Mound Cemeteries.
