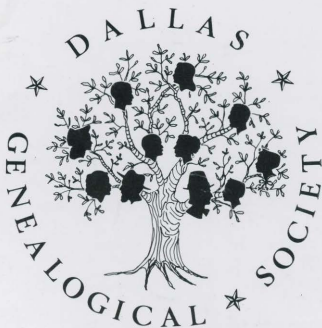

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our year is half over and I would like to take this opportunity to bring you up to date on research activities being carried out by DGS members:

1. Cemetery - As a service to the Dallas Parks and Recreation Department, we are indexing (listing) the tombstone markers found in the abandoned cemeteries which are now under the control of the city.

In addition to these cemeteries our society will continue the project by making an inventory of all cemeteries within the city of Dallas. At such time that we finish this phase of the project, we plan to extend the survey to all Dallas cemeteries.

If you are aware of a Public Cemetery or a Private Cemetery within the boundaries of Dallas County we are asking you to contact us so none will be missed. In addition if you are aware of a previous list, please make this known. We do not wish to repeat any work done by others, however, we do wish this to be a thorough listing.

2. Records Inventory - In co-operation with Dallas Historical Commission the DGS will be lending its assistance to this great project. Members will work under the direction of Mrs. Reuben Adams of the Commission, & Prof. J. McKnight, DGS board member, & ultimately hope to put together a list of old Dallas County Records.
3. Index of Probate Records - The 1978 published index included the names on the outside of the same 3,000 packets microfilmed by DGS, however, papers, documents, etc., inside the packets which were microfilmed contained 1000's of other names which are valuable information for researchers. This on going project will be accomplished by DGS Members using our microfilm reader.

Anyone wishing to assist with either of the above projects is urged to call your President.

TEXAS HERITAGE AWARD

The DGS received the first award for Research that the Texas Heritage Council has awarded. It was presented for the Society's work in microfilming the first 3,000 probate packets of Dallas County and compiling and publishing an index for the film. In addition, we received recognition for the publication of Dallas County Marriage records books A through E.

The bronze plaque was accepted on behalf of the Society by H. Lu, Past President at a luncheon at the Marriott Inn in Austin, Texas on September 16, 1978.

THE GREAT FIRE OF DALLAS

The sectionalism of the 1850's which divided the North and South culminated in John Brown's raid on the United States Arsenal at Harper's Ferry, Virginia on October 16, 1859. As rumors of incendiarism and insurrection swept the South, the public mind came to be characterized by a psychological climate of suspicion, anxiety, fear and near hysteria.

The wildest tales of bloody slave uprisings and poisonings, supposedly inspired by abolitionist agents from the North, appear to have begun in Texas and have spread throughout the older cotton states. In July, 1860 a series of conflagrations swept across the northern counties of Texas, apparently substantiating the rumors. There were fires in Henderson, Denton, Pilot Point, Ladonia, Milford, Honey Grove, Black Jack Grove, Millwood, Waxahachie, Jefferson, Austin, Mount Vernon, Brenham, Georgetown, McKinney, Corsicana, Belknap, Gainesville, Kaufman, Belleview, and an aborted one in Tyler. Deadly poisons were found in the possession of slaves in several communities including Athens, Waxahachie and the Tennessee Colony in Anderson County.

Dallas, but a small hamlet at that time experienced a fire of major proportions on Sunday, July 8, 1860 at about 2:00 o'clock P.M., while most of its inhabitants were taking siestas. With a temperature at about 104° Fahrenheit, and whipped by strong southwesterly winds, the fire which began in some rubbish at the store of W. W. Peak and Brothers quickly spread out of the control of a hastily formed bucket brigade.

Much of the public square, especially on the western and northern sides was destroyed, including the St. Nicholas Hotel, the Crutchfield house, Wester's Barber Shop, Darnell's livery stable, D. B. Thomas drugstore, Lynch and Son's saddle shop, The Dallas Herald office and several other business establishments. Dallas suffered an extensive property loss estimated at between \$200,000 and \$500,000. Upon returning to Dallas, after having held court in Waxahachie, Judge Mat Burford commented on the vast damage done to the public buildings on the public squares and dwellings in the residential areas. A pall of shock and disbelief covered Dallas.

The prevailing mood of the infant community was that of anger at what appeared to be a plot instigated by Northern abolitionists to incite slaves to burn the town. It was believed that the *raison d'être* for the conflagration was to destroy a deposit of arms and ammunition deposited at Dallas for the outfitting of an artillery company.

A committee composed by Judge W. W. Hord, W. B. Miller and Obadiah Knight called upon two white abolitionist preachers, Blunt and McKinney from Iowa, and confronted them with the plot. Jailed and later released and publicly whipped they were ordered to quit the county. The two departed posthaste for parts North.

Sheriff Trezvant C. Hawpe went to the home of Judge Burford and requested that he go to the Courthouse and address a self appointed committee of fifty two who had gathered there to determine what to do, and to mete out punishment to the guilty. Upon his arrival at the Courthouse the judge was confronted by a guard, posted there to admit only those persons who would agree to the decision and action of the meeting.

Inside the Courthouse Judge Burford discovered passions inflamed, and talk of hanging three Negroes believed to have been guilty of starting the fire. Realizing the extensive property value of the chattels, and employing a bit of ingenious psychology, one man suggested that the committee call up a rich man's slave for hanging and make a fight to save him, and that as a consequence the slaves of the poor whites would certainly be spared. In an attempt to calm passions, Judge Burford opened the crowd for about three quarters of an hour. Being a jurist, and desiring to avoid any further participation, he departed the meeting.

After voting, the jury of fifty two men decided to hang the three accused slaves, and to whip every Negro in the county. A Negro boy, Bruce had been discovered who stated that he had prior knowledge of a fire from "Uncle Cato", a Negro with a bad reputation. After being apprehended, "Uncle Cato" implicated two other Negroes, Sam Smith and Pat Jennings.

Two days later the condemned slaves were hung on a bluff north of the present Commerce Street bridge. They went to their deaths in a composed manner. Pat Jennings died with a chew of tobacco in his mouth. A fourth Negro was expelled from Dallas County, and the remaining ones were shipped, many after witnessing the executions.

There was disagreement as to the guilt or innocence of the slaves, and even to whether a conspiracy had actually existed or if the fire had begun by combustion due to the severe heat or careless smoking from workmen in the area. Judge James Bentley, a member of the vigilance committee of fifty two who condemned the three Negroes to death later stated that he believed them innocent. Bentley believed that scapgoats were necessary due to the inflamed passions of the community.

The most substantial and potent support for the belief in a plot instigated by Northern abolitionist zealots inciting the slaves to start a fire and revolt came from the contents of a letter which was discovered about six miles west of Ft. Worth. As the leaders of Fort Worth did not want to further inflame the public passions they refrained from revealing the letter for thirty two years after the fire. The letter dated July 3, 1860 at Denton Creek was written by a man of the cloth, an abolitionist emissary sent South to incite incendiarism and insurrection among the

slaves. The letter signed by W. A. Bailey was apparently written to another abolitionist clergyman containing a report on abolitionist activities in Texas, as well as advice on sending Negroes North through the underground railroad. The letter also contained suggestions on certain types of matches to be used for starting fires, as well as a request for financial contributions from slaves for the promotion of abolitionist activities in Texas.

The great fire of Dallas and similar incidents in northern Texas served to further alienation among the sections of the country. It greatly inflamed public opinion to the necessity of driving out all abolitionist, and exercising firm control over the slaves. The emotionalism of the events along with the election of Abraham Lincoln to the presidency set the stage for the secession of the southern states and the great war.

WILLIAM PEARSON - TEXAS DESCENDANTS

1. WILLIAM PEARSON was a pioneer settler of Dallas County, Texas. He migrated to what is now Dallas County in 1845 as a widower. William Pearson received a certificate from Thomas William Ward for a 640 acre headright in Robertson's 3rd Class, #1609 after his death. The certificate was patented by his heirs. William Pearson's middle initial may have been "H." He died 8 July 1848 in Dallas County, Texas.

William Pearson married first to Phoebe who died before he arrived in Dallas County, Texas. There is no mention of her in Dallas County records.

He married second to Elizabeth Ogle in Dallas County, Tx. This marriage isn't recorded in the Dallas County marriages, but is stated in the Memorial and Biographical History of Dallas County, Texas, The Ledbetters of Virginia and a common know fact that they were married. Elizabeth Ogle was born 7 June 1825 in Kentucky and died 15 May 1901 in Dallas County, Texas. She is buried in Five Mile Cemetery by her second husband, Rev. Arthur Ledbetter. Elizabeth's father was David Ogle.

William Pearson's will was probated in Dallas Co., Tx. and filed 18 February 1852 by Anson McCracken, his son-in-law, administrator. William died intestate in 1848 as stated earlier. There are more than 60 papers in this probate packet which is #537, Dallas County.

William Pearson's estate contained a 640 acre land certificate worth \$150.00 and three negroes, Patsey, Narcissa and Clary. The heirs listed and the amounts they received were:

Also on file in the Dallas County, Texas Courthouse is probate packet #516 containing 23 papers concerning the guardianship of Nancy Jane Pearson, infant heir of William Pearson, Elizabeth Pearson, made guardian. Elizabeth also made guardian of Nancy Jane & Sarah Pearson.

Probate packet #512, Dallas County, Texas names Anson McCracken, administrator for Mary Pearson, deceased infant of William Pearson 29 November 1852. No date of death for Mary was given. Also included is a filing date of 25 Oct. 1850 stating that Anson McCracken had advanced \$152.00 for the support of Mary Pearson (minor infant). 24 Feb. 1855 Anson McCracken asked the court for the guardianship of said infant to be ended next term.

Children of William Pearson by his 1st wife Phoebe:

2. i. Lemuel Pearson was born between 1810 & 1820.
3. ii. Mahala Ann Pearson was born 1 Sept. 1815.
- iii. Robert D. Pearson was born 4 Aug. 1819 and died 23 Jan. 1873 in Cass Co., Mo. He married Jane Lockhart Belcher, 20 June 1838, Jackson Co., Mo. He was living in Cass Co., Mo. in 1853 when he petitioned the court concerning the estate of his deceased father.
- iv. Dudley F. Pearson was born between 1821 and 1823. It is stated in the Dallas County Memorial & Biographical History that he was in the army and was discharged 6 May 1848 at Vera Cruz, Mexico. He came to Dallas County, Texas in 1848 as a single man and settled on a company survey in present Dallas County. He was issued a Robertson Third Class Land Certificate No. 1655 in 1850 by Mr. Ward for 320 acres which was patented in Dallas County, Tx. He is listed on the 1850 Census of Dallas County as family #372 as a 27 year old farmer, born in Kentucky. Living with him in 1850 was George W. Ragan, 35 years old, born Ky. He is not listed in later census records of Dallas County. He was in Dallas County 3 Oct. 1854 when he witnessed the will of Mychall Farnes (Book A, P. 62). He was also in Dallas County in 1853 when he was made attorney for his sister to claim her part of her father's estate. It isn't known where he migrated to or if he married.

- vii. Mary Pearson was born ca. 1850 and died ca. 1850 in infancy. Probate packet #512, Dallas County, Tx. shows her deceased. Anson McCracken was made her guardian.

William Pearson's second wife, Elizabeth Ogle Pearson married after he died to the Rev. Arthur Ledbetter, a Baptist Minister of Dallas County, Texas. Rev. Ledbetter was born 3 June 1798 in Overton County, Tenn. and died 7 Nov. 1859 in Dallas County, Tx. near the community of Cedar Hill. He was the son of Arthur Ledbetter and Frances Brooks of Overton Co., Tenn. This information is stated in the Dallas County Memorial and Biographical History of 1892 and on his grave stone in the Five Mile Cemetery which is located at the corner of Riest and Cockrell Hill Street in the Oak Cliff section of Dallas, Texas. The Rev. Ledbetter organized 5 churches in Dallas County. He received a 640 acre headright 4 miles north of Cedar Hill, Texas. He lived from 1848-1850 on the East Fork of the Trinity River. The Rev. Arthur Ledbetter was previously married to Elizabeth Robbins who was born 18 March 1802 in Overton Co., Tenn. and died 18 Aug. 1848 at East Fork, Dallas County, Tx. (now Garland, Texas.) By

Elizabeth Robbins he had nine children. Isaac Anderson, born 1823, died at Ft. Belknap Young Co., Tx.; Martha Jane, b. 1825, d. 1865, m. Wesley W. Ware, 26 Dec. 1852 and buried near his father in Five Mile Cemetery; Oliver Vincent, born May 1827 and died 1902-3, m. 4 March 1848 to Margaret Fox; Lewis B., b. 1830, died at Hazeldele, Comanche Co., Tx.; Mary, b. 1833, m. Larner had been previously married to Mary Jennings and had 7 children: John Wesley; Patrick Marion, m. 24 June 1869 to Josephine Spivey; Wm. F., m. Frances Albee; Mary Ann, m. 1855, James Turnbow; Nancy Jane and Wm. Franklin Larner. In 1855 Jesse V. Mounts was made guardian of these children (Probate packet #348) Elizabeth Pearson, nee Elizabeth Masters married William Larner and they had one child before he died in Jan. of 1850.

Newby died but Elizabeth was a widow again by the 1870 Census of Dallas County, Tx. Elizabeth had 2 Newby children living with her in 1870 - James H. Newby, age 16 and Hannah Newby, age 9. It is not known whether these children were Elizabeth's or

William's children by a prior marriage. Elizabeth Masters Pearson Larner Newby died ca. 1892.

3. MAHALA ANN PEARSON (WILLIAM) was born 1 Sept. 1815. The 1850 Census of Dallas Co. states she was born in Ky. The records of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas state she was born in Cass Co., Mo. or Jackson Co., Mo. She died the 6th of October 1869 at Live Oak, Tarrant Co., Tx. according to the DRT records. The 27th of Feb. 1834 in Jackson Co., Mo. Mahala Ann married Anson McCracken. He was born 3 May 1806 in Cass or Jackson Co., Mo., but according to the 1850 Census of Dallas County was born in Tenn. He died the 19th or 20th of Dec. 1879 in Fort Worth, Tarrant Co., Tx. Anson McCracken settled in Dallas County, Texas prior to 1 July 1845. He received a land patent in 1850 for 640 acres in Dallas County (Robertson's Third Class \$1428 according to the records of the Peter's Colony. He served as Coroner of Dallas County from 1846-48; 1848-50 and 1850-52. Mr. McCracken was also a surveyer.

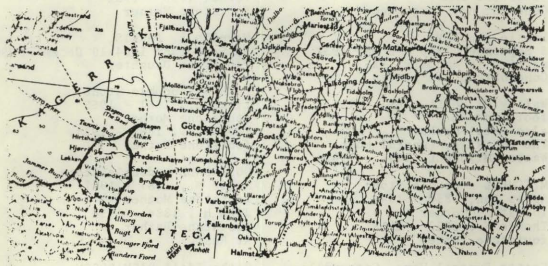

Sixteen 1st rate wagons with bodies of the largest kind, each to be drawn by a team of first rate six horse teams complete in gear and harness, will find employment during the removal of the present Emigration of Cherokees from their homes to their respective points of embarkation upon the rivers; by the owners of such enrolling their names immediately at the agents. The said wagons to be called upon at anytime between the 1st and 20th day of Feb. next to go to any part of this or adjacent states occupied by the Cherokees--to receive such loads not to exceed 3500 pounds per wagon, as shall be assigned to them by their Wagon Masters; and to proceed with the same to such landing places as they shall be directed by the said Wagon Masters. All wagoners or conductors of teams will in all things relating to the arrangement of their respective loads--the infirm or children to be carried--and the routes to be adopted, obey the directions of the respective Wagon Masters set over them, all disputes about overloading shall be settled by weighing.
