Dear DGS Members,



BAIRD FAMILY LETTERS - DALLAS, TEXAS

Letters submitted by: W. D. Baird.

Dallas, Tex Dec 29 (1876)

Dear Mary and Willie,

I hope you have not forgotten your old Uncle & Aunt, but at least you do not write to them. I write this, this cold night, to induce you to write to us. When I was young I loved to write, but now it is a task.

We are now living here, entirely alone. Came here about 6 weeks ago. Bought a lot ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre) good house, well, & we keep one cow & calf and some chickens!

Dallas is quite a large city & an immense amount of business is done here. There are at least 1 dozen churches here & I suppose as many Sunday Schools.

All that I have been in have organs in them. We live about a mile from the business part of town. One of the street rail roads passes near our house. Cars run by ever 25 minutes from 4: AM til 11: PM. Get a ride "down town" as far as it goes - say $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile - for 5 c. Trains on the Tex. Central R. R. thunder along as if they would run over us, but we know they can't, so we go to sleep again!

There is a noise all the time - church Bells - steam whistles on R roads mills - machine shops, factories etc. trains on the different R. Rs. etc.

You could see a great many things to interest you if you were here. We have a number of schools (I do not know how many)

Do you want to know about Christmas well, nearly all I know about it, is that it has been, so far, the coldest one I ever saw, in this State. It began to rain Saturday morning - rained slowly all day - snowed at night - snowed again (Ky fashion) half the day Tuesday. It is clear but cold, now. I have been out but little for a week past, but I learn from the Daily Papers that the young people had Christmas Trees - parties, balls, theaters, etc, etc. Saw some sleigh riding yesterday. Your Uncle Wesley lives in Dallas - about a mile from us. His family is well. Got a letter from your Aunt Liz Boliver a few days ago. They live in Honey Grove - a pretty little town in Fannin Co. They were well. Have not seen David since he came to Tex. Have never seen your Uncle Wash, since he moved from here to Ky. nor your Aunt Liz since we passed through H. G. on our way home from your house. We intend to go there next summer and stay a long time. We have a great many friends and kinfolks there. Wish you all lived in Tex so that we could see you all, too. We often think of you all and talk about the pleasant time we had at your house and Auburn. We love that town.

Will we ever enjoy the like again? If we might live hundreds of years as people once did and the same facilities we now have, we might, but our days on Earth are short now. I have often thought that a short good life is better for us than a long one. It costs us much time and money to visit distant kinsfolk and friends. We cannot do much of it, but we love and serve the good Lord while we live, then the sooner we die the better for us, for then we can visit one another and lose no time or money.

Since we left Ky. your cousin Mollie B. has gone to Heaven. She is now with her Pa - Aunts, Uncles, Cousins, etc. She was probably looking for good old Grand Pa Nourse lately she met him. Soon she will see some of us. Which will it be first? But will she see all of us? Will we all get to heaven? If we do right we will - if not, not. Perhaps the next time you will see your old Uncle and Aunt will be in Heaven. There we all can meet & that before long if we try.

Will you try? It does me good always to hear from my kin and that they are doing well & living comfortably in the world, but what pleases me best is to hear that they are religious.

Willie, will you try to meet me above? My dear little cousins write soon & often to your Uncle

P.S. Dec. 30. 9:30 A. M.

This morning if the coldest I believe that I ever saw here, but it is clear and still. I think it will be warm soon. Our farm is 13 miles from here. Tom lives in our dwelling house. His farm joins ours. Our other houses, and all our land is rented out. Have not heard from them for a week past. Tom has a pretty baby - we have not seen it in 5 or 6 weeks.

Editors Note: The above letter was written to Mary & William Stagner who lived in Auburn, Kentucky.

Dear Mary and Willie, I thought when I finished the above that I would not write any more, but in the evening a train from the North came along covered with more snow - later it looked like raining, so I cut a fine chance of wood & honed it, and did not go to the P.O. (which is a mile & a half from us). That night about bedtime, your Uncle Wesley came for us to go and see Agie who was very sick. Taken suddenly - speechless - stayed till 2 ocl. it was sleeting as we came home. Next day it snowed all day (Sunday). Went twice to see Agie. She was much better.

Today, (Jan. 1, 1877) is clear and warm. (4:40 p.m.) Snow deepest I ever saw in Tex. Trains on all the R.Rs. stoped till this evening. Two coaches on the Sanja Cinto St. R R was stoped in front of our house yesterday and did not start again till an hour or two ago.

Agie is nearly well today - Hope weather will be fine now.

You see from my writing how my hand trembles sometimes when I begin to write and you can judge how much labor it is for me to write to you, yet I do it.

Now you must write to us.

Our P.O. is almost at the extreme end of town from us. 1½ m. cannot put this in till tomorrow.

Our place here was very shackling when we bought it. We have been tryin hard to get it 'fixed up' ever since we came and there is much to do yet. I have been very busy ever since I saw you and the is not 'by and by'.

We are looking for Eli Sloss now. Can't a parcel of you get up an excursion party & visit us next summer?

Dallas, Tex Oct 1, 1877
(Oct. 5 Campbell McCutcheon & family came to us this morning)

Dear Mary,

I believe you & Willie owe me a letter, but as I have been so remiss in writing heretofore I will anticipate yours.

I have thought ever since I left Ky. that when I got through with my work, I would devote myself to literary pleasures again, but I now think if I wait for that time I will forego those pleasures altogether. Mental & physical labors interfere with, & injure each other. As I left the more intellectual, & engaged in material pursuits (as I thought for a little time only) I must abide the consequences - so I will content myself, to 'catch the moments as they fly' & make the best use of them I can. What have I to do? So little that it will not pay to hire it done, and so much that it requires much of my time to do it.

I am now engaged in the gathering, dividing, and disposing of my part of the crops - bringing food for ourselves & what stock we keep here, from the farm 12 miles distant - hauling cotton in to market & selling it - laying in a supply of fire wood for winter, etc. What will I do when winter comes? I do not know; I have quit anticipating a severance from labor - 'sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof'. Do not understand me, that my labors are onerous, or that I am compelled to undergo them, but that, though I voluntarily perform them, I thereby disqualify myself for more congenial pursuits. I force myself to write a letter or anything else, & am generally ashamed of it when it is done.

It is said that a 'thing is worth what it cost', if so, one of my letters is worth 2 or 3 of yours, for it cost more effort. Recollect that, and 'govern yourself accordingly'. We are well - Eli Sloss is a very agreeable & useful member of our family.

The town and country are very busy now. 'Cotton is King', & commands universal obedience - turns wheels, cranks, levers, cogs, etc. in all sorts of machinery. He is now in thousands of fields, attended by tens of thousands of laborious men, women, & children. There is not a wagon in the country but what transports him - not a road which he has not traveled. North, East, and South he daily travels on our R Roads, to visit some of the greatest cities of the world. Though reared in a certain section, he becomes a cosmopolite. Though he is a rival of Christianity, in the hearts of men, yet he delights in Christendom and follows the standard of the Cross wherever it is planted. His transmutations are innumerable & his benefits unspeakable. But I need say no more to you of our worldly king - he is with us now - is on his way to Galveston - N.O., N.Y., etc and from thence to Europe & (in modified forms) to the whole civilized world; and wherever he goes he distributes wealth to the industrious food to the hungry and clothes the naked.

Just here your Aunt reminds me of our agreement to visit our Female College, which is just being finished. It is a grand 3 story building.

Oct 3. Our visit to the college was a very pleasant one - there we met many of the citizens whose pride & interest were equal to ours. We went from room to room - from story to story, chatting and laughing etc as we went.

How I wish, Mary, you were either a student or teacher in this institution. School is now going on, & it is called Dallas Female

College, it is now the most mixed up school you ever saw.

I do not know how many classes & particular studies there are, but I know that hammers, saws, planes, levels, trowels, paint brushes, etc are being vigorously operated by the energetic contractor - Berry, while President Jones is busily engaged with his teachers & classes.

I suppose we will have a picture of the edifice & a circular before long & then, if you are not here to see for yourself, I will send you one. We have a very interesting protracted meeting going on at one of the four Methodist churches in town. It does me good to go there. I wish your Ma was here to go with us. She wouldn't go much if she were here - would she?

Don't fail to attend church whenever you can and take Willie with you.

To show you how industrious the people in our country are, I will tell you, that, a few days ago I went out to Tom's. I found him, his wife & baby and sister-in-law in the cotton patch. In another part of the field, I found a man - 3 grown daughters & 1 not grown, and 3 young men, in neat clean clothes picking cotton. About sundown, I went to your cousin Nannie Becker's - no one in the house. Started out in the field - met Nanie coming in with her little girl in her left arm (the child had a tin bucket in her hand) and suspended from her neck, hung a sack of cotton which she had just picked. I relieved her of the sack & carried it to the 'big pile'. After dark Becker came in - fed his team and then we had an excellent supper. After supper M & B. milked the cows etc. Next morning I had to get up before daylight to eat my breakfast. On leaving, I said, 'Nannie, when will you come to town?' 'When I get my bale picked', she laughingly said.

I told Tom I would stay with him next time - get up too soon at Beckers! 'Oh, as to that, we get up early, too'.

I hurried through my business, came home that day & have not been out there since.

Don't you wish you were here and married to a man who owned a fine farm and who had a 'big cotton patch', as you would call it in Ky?

Oct 4. 'You see how long a letter I have written you with mine own hand?' Is this quotation correct? From whom & what did I take it? Dear Mary please write to us. Tell Willie to do so too. My love to friends and kinsfolk.

A Young Ky. friend, who was with us a few days, 8 or 10 days back said you the p-----and the most a----- and the most s----- lady in Ky. Do you wish to know who he is?

Well, then, write to

PS we had a brisk Norther last night. Do you want to feel one? Then come to Texas.

This bill of goods and services is surely to improve the house at 623 Ross Ave. from the "shackling" condition it was said by its owner to be in. The year is probably 1877.

The first legislature of the State of Texas passed an act March 30th 1846, creating Dallas County, consisting of a territory embracing 900 square miles.

Texas State - 1891 - It is located on a beautiful rolling prairie east of the city, about two miles from the courthouse.

One of the most exciting events in the early history of Dallas was that of the burning of the town of Dallas in July, 1860.

Dear Willie,

I am sorry that I have been so long delayed in writing to you. I could not help it. I cannot utilize a spare moment in writing as I once could - I must have time. I once wrote as a 'pass time' - now it is labor. I once had leisure - lived in pleasure - 'in otium cum dignitate' (ask your pretty Sister what that means). But now I am 'careful about many things'. Once I wrote fast - now I 'make haste slowly'. Once - well, it doesn't matter - if it was not for the hope of rejuvenescence in the spirit world, what would old folks do?

I have been troubled and fatigued a great deal about renting & fixing up my farm for the last 2 months - going back and forth (14 miles) almost continually.

We have the dryest winter and spring I ever saw. wheat, oats & corn are suffering. Stock water is scarce on the prairie. The drought is death to little fishes in the drying creeks, but oh! (ah!?) what life to fleas in the barn lots, hog pens, yards, houses, beds, clothes - everything.

Locusts in Egypt - Hoppers in California - Fleas in Texas! Notwithstanding the extreme dry weather the ground is in good condition for plowing, for there has not been rain enough to run it together since the hard freezes of last winter. It is a wonder how moist the ground remains a few inches under the surface. Seeds well covered come up well, but corn several inches high, wheat etc are wilting. Farmers are still busy planting cotton mostly. I spent a good deal of labor last fall & winter in deepening and widening the ditches on my farm - they have been ready for the rain for months! I drew and carried to my garden more than a hundred buckets of water yesterday - If it reduced the water, in the well, I did not perceive it. Wish I had such a well on the farm - Dallas is the best watered city I ever saw.

Tom (our son) has a fine farm alongside ours (county road between an elegant dwelling etc and one of the prettiest little boys. Becker (who married Nannie Sloss) has a good farm adjoining mine & a smart little girl. Your uncle Wesley's family is well. They live in Dallas yet. John told me that he would write to you next Sunday - too busy in the week! I wish I could convey to you all how much I wish to see you, without making use of the hacknied terms usual on that subject. Tell your pa & ma to send me your and Mary's pictures. I wish you all could and would come to Texas and not Scatter so when you come. I seldom see, or (hear) from the Bolivers, McKees, McCutcheons, Fuguas, Turners, etc. Have not heard from your aunt Amanda for a long time. I intend to go see her & the Bolivers & McKees this summer. Now see what a trip it will be - Will Bairds, Wise Co. NWest 70 mi. Bolivers, and McKees - Honey Grove, 80 mi NEast. Turners - in Hill Co S. W. 90 mi. To do all this traveling it will require time, labor, and money. Will it ever occur in our duration that we can travel without either? That will be the case if we wish it. Write to me again & again Willie. Tell Mary to write. I saw notice of Miss Lucy Holland's marriage in the Nashville Christian Advocate. Did she do well? Hope she did. Does your Ma take that paper? Hope she does.

I have told you nothing about the improvements in our towns & country. 'Twould take too much time & space. Eli Sloss stays with us. He is at Becker's & Tom's now. Aunt Agnes is coming today.

Our love to you all - farewell J. B. Baird

RENTAL AGREEMENT - DALLAS COUNTY, TEXAS

STATE OF TEXAS
County of Dallas

This article of agreement made and entered into between J. B. Baird and D. D. Rodgers witnesseth: That the said J. B. Baird has this day rented to the said D. D. Rodgers all the premises occupied and cultivated by J. H. Ashields the past seasons Viz: sixty acres of land - more or less - including the same houses, barn, etc for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to be paid on or before the 15 day of November next the payment of which is secured by a mortgage of even date with this article of agreement. It is agreed that the said Baird reserves the same cribs in the barn which he had last year, with free access to and from the same at all times. No one is to occupy the dwelling house but the said D. D. Rodgers and his family, without the consent of the said J. B. Baird. The said Rodgers hereby binds himself to make a ditch extending from the South boundary (along the East boundary line, to the ditch which runs East through the field) of sufficient width and depth to carry off all the water which may flow into it; to plow all the ditches on the premises at least three times during the spring and summer with not less than four furrows, and prevent all large weeds from growing in or near them (and to place Bois d'arc brush on the hedge from the SW corner to Eastern terminus of the premises, in sufficient quantity to prevent stock from jumping over the same).

He, the said Rodgers, further obligates himself to cut and keep down all sprouts - as bois d'arc, locust etc which may grow on said premises.

Fire wood may be got on the said Bair's land on Rowlett Creek.

This lease or rent is to continue till the first day of December next and for no longer time when all the above premises, in good order & repair, are to be delivered up to the said J. B. Baird.

Submitted by W. D. Baird who states: This is a handwritten document, written in pencil on lined note paper in the handwriting of Dr. J. B. Baird. This is believed to be an agreement to rent his land in North Dallas County adjoining that which was farmed by T. S. Becker. The reference to the Rowlett Creek property is solely permission to gather firewood from the property.

Dear Brother

A long time ago I intended to write to you, and only waited till I could know where to send a letter to you. After a while I heard that you had got to your old home again. Soon after I learned that Charley would be in Dallas in a short time; so I concluded that I would not write, but send news etc by him. After some time I learned that coming to Dallas and coming to see us were two different things, for Charlie had come to Dallas twice and left before we knew of it.

However, it was told us that he would surely come to Dallas Christmas & remain some days - so I thought we would be sure to see him then and send you word & consequently did not write. After Christmas I found out that there is a difference between a promise and a fulfillment to visit Dallas!! Howbeit, I saw Wesley on that festal occasion and he promised to tell you all 'our status' by the next week. Whether I have been disappointed in that or not I do not know.

There being no prospect on hand just now to send you a verbal message I have determined to write. As to news - it comes and goes - like the old & new year. I will now only write of present surroundings. The weather - you have the same. I know more of Texas winters than you do I have known many a pleasant one, but I believe I never saw it after this fashion! We have a very fat young hog - it was a pig, or rather shoat, when it was brought here. Having a distinct remembrance of the troublesome nature of such animals, I wished it dead when I just saw it & have so wished 100 times, but lately I have changed the wish - that it might be hog killing weather a few days.

Mr. R. D. Becker has rented out all his farm & is living in a part of our house here. His aim is to get a place as Bookkeeper or Clerk in Dallas. He has bought 5 acres of land on Ross Av. about 1 1/2 m East of us. Gave 75 Dollars an acre - made a good trade. He will improve and settle on it as soon as he can. Dallas is still improving. It is difficult to rent a house here. Buildings going up everywhere.

I have been tormented for a month past with a cutaneous affection - may be, chronic urticaria. It began between my shoulders - then gradually spread over them & downwards & in the right chest & arm. We have done many things to cure, but it has not yielded to treatment. We have applied stramonium ointment, calomel, morphine and lard - Spt turp - camphor - sulphur & lard etc etc. I have taken a full dose of a.c. pills - iodine potash freely etc. I am now taking Fowlers Sol of Arsenic & using a linament of Laudanum, olive oil & camph. We painted the entire surface 3 times with Tr. iodine at intervals of 3 days. It caused great suffering. The skin on my back - pinched up between the thumb and finger - seemed to be as thick as a horses skin - elephantiasis? - not so thick now. I took Quinine 3 days - my head would bear no more. Much worse at night - sleep but little. I feel something better the last 3 or 4 days. Can you tell me what else to do?

When can you & Sally come to see us? We would be very glad to see you - our love to all the families write soon, or come to your Bro etc

This letter was written by John Barnet Baird to his brother James Monroe Baird who was in Lewisville, Texas at the time.

Dear Sister,

If I could write as I once did I would have written to you long ago - but it is, as it is. 'There's a better time a coming' I hope. We have had the warmest and the wettest winter I ever saw. There were a few clear days last week & farmers began to sow oats - garden etc I had arrangements made to have my garden broke up this morning - yesterday morning - Sunday - was warm and pretty. Agnes & I went to church afoot (streets for almost three months past, too muddy for buggy travel) during the sermon it began to rain - it poured down The house was full of people - all walked there - no umbrellas - One woman asked me how I would get home. I told her my wife would take me home as soon as it slacked up a little - she laughed - after a while it 'slacked up' - just long enough for the wind to get in the North! During the lull we started for home - about ¼ mile - Soon it began to rain again - wind north, we facing it - a good part of the way the ground was flooded with water - many side walks ankle deep in water. We got home wet, but not muddy! Cleared up last night, but cloudy this morning - cold, but not freezing. Plumbs, peaches etc in full bloom - grass green - been so all winter. I am afraid they will fare worse than we did yesterday, before Spring is over. Notwithstanding the great many light rains, and impassable roads the creeks and rivers in our section have not been as high as usual in the rainy season - but if yesterday's rain was general, they must be very full now. Tell Willie I got two numbers of the Koonranger he sent me. I thank him. The last one, in news and tone much superior to the first - If it continue to improve in the same ratio for 100 years, it will be the greatest news paper in the---world! I see in it that the name is objected to - I like it. Tell Willie to tell them not to change it. I would suggest that they have a Vignette engraved for their paper representing raccoons hunting tad poles, frogs, fish etc, on the tributaries of Mud River; and after using that for a few months, replace it by another, representing a 'Koon' 'sitting on a rail' - the moon shining, and a negro man passing along singing (as they all used to do, in their halcyon days, (when I was a boy.)

'As I walked out by de light of de Moon,
So merrily singing dis ole tune,
I spied a big - afat old Koon
A setin on a rale.

Chorus - A setin on a rale etc

If these engravings cannot be obtained at Russelville, Bowling Green, Louisville or Nashville they can be made here - We do everything in Dallas - Most! There are topographies in, perhaps, all the States, christened in their infancy, with synonyms signifying some peculiar fauna, or feature of the region -- Thus: Ky. has her 'Barrens', (Our native place) her Koon Range - her Green Brier Country her 'Salt River', her mountains, her Blue Grass etc Situated on the periphery of the Koonrange - that being, (I suppose) as near the Center as a news paper could live! - Your Auburn paper has sense and manliness enough to take to itself a name significant of that fact. Other sections ought to 'follow suit' - viz: 'The Barrens - have become fruitful' - 'Tangled in the Briers' - An Echo from the Mountains 'Rowing up Salt River' etc May the Koon Ranger, with its present name, live and thrive till it will be the only remembrance that a Koon ever lived 'in them parts'.

When I was on a visit to you a few years ago, you had, as I now recollect, a stationed preacher with services held midally - Now, as

the Koonranger informs me, you have preaching only menstrually. What's the matter with you Methodists? Hadn't you better stop that announcement - throw yourselves back on your dignity - and 'make out' that you are above puffing yourselves (as a church) in News papers!

Please excuse the strain in which I have been scribbling. When I began to write this, I felt moody - I felt impressed that I ought to write you all, so I began, not thinking what to say to you. When Willie sent the last paper he asked how I liked it. I thought of that, & queried with myself how I should answer him. The answer occurred to me - I put it down - it was the truth - it tickled me - I became faceious in spite of myself & continued to think of, & write about the Koon Ranger - the Koonrange etc. I have spent many pleasant days & nights in the Koonrange - I love it. We are both well. Our love to Mr. Stagner, Mary & Willie. Write soon to your Brother

DALLAS FEMALE COLLEGE
DALLAS, TEXAS

In the fall of 1865 a small school was opened by Mrs. Helena Winn in a little house at 18 Bryan Street. Mrs. Winn was educated at McKenzie College, Clarksville, Texas, a college operated by Rev. J.W.P. McKenzie who came to Texas in 1839 and began teaching school in 1841 in his home, four miles southwest of Clarksville, Red River County, Texas.

In 1869 a number of men of Dallas decided the school of Mrs. Winn should be expanded. They elected the following men as President and Directors of the Dallas Female College Association: W. J. Clark, A. C. Camp, A. M. Moore, W. H. Scales, George M. Swink, A. M. Cochran, and John T. Aull.

The Association purchased the following described property for the site of the new building: "Beginning at a stake near the East End of the picket fence on the line of Elm Street opposite the present residence of said John W. Smith. Thence on the line of said street N. 75°, E. 200 feet to a stake at corner on said street. Thence N 15°, W 425 Feet to a stake at corner of division line between lands of said John Smith and J. M. Patterson - Thence S. 50° W 213 to a stake at corner of said line. S 15" E. 330 feet to the place of beginning. Containing 75,500 square feet of land on the homestead tract of J. W. Smith being part of the John Grigsby League" - date of deed of conveyance September 25, 1869.

From the records available it appears they began the fund raising by obtaining subscriptions. The records do not indicate whether the subscriptions were in dollars or shares. A list of share holders with number of shares pledged at \$50 per share follows this article.

As happens so often it is easy to pledge but hard to collect. We have recorded the amount paid by individuals and also part of the disbursements. One of the contractors did not fulfill his contract, so in order to save the school, the Lamar Street Methodist Church guaranteed the balance needed to complete the construction of the building.

The school opened in the new building March 7, 1870 with 180 students registered.

OAK CLIFF CEMETERY BURIALS

The old Oak Cliff Cemetery, formerly known as the Beatty Cemetery was established in 1846. It is located on 8th Street in the Oak Cliff section of Dallas, Texas, and is comprised of three integral parts--The Old Cemetery--The New Additions there to--and The North Addition which was dedicated in 1913. The land for the cemetery was donated by W. S. Beatty and was known for years as the Beatty Cemetery. There is no maintenance being performed. Lots cannot be sold, but there are still burials being made.

The available records are maintained by the Oak Cliff Cemetery Association. Several years ago, they furnished the Dallas Public Library the two record books and they were filmed by the Library where the film is now available. This film was used in compiling the lists that follow.

There are two lists of Burials in Book I. They are duplicates in most cases, but if not covered in list I, then they are listed on list II. There are two Supplementary Records of Burials in Book II. In these lists we have Section, Lot, Grave Number and in some cases additional information. We have only shown Lot number is there is an indication that they are from the same family. We also show if buried in "Potter's Field" of "Stranger's Rest" as it is our understanding these in these sections were infants and individuals who did not have relatives in the city.

A list of all the individuals mentioned in the inventories is given not a list of all he owned. The purpose of this article is to pick up names of many early Dallas settlers and thereby help you in your research. When estates were settled, friends, relatives and neighbors came from miles around to buy what was being sold of the estate, especially in early times when many things were difficult to buy because of lack of easy and quick and safe ways to transport goods. Also, any money the estate owed would be listed along with any money owed to the estate. This would give you the names of the debtors as well as the creditors.

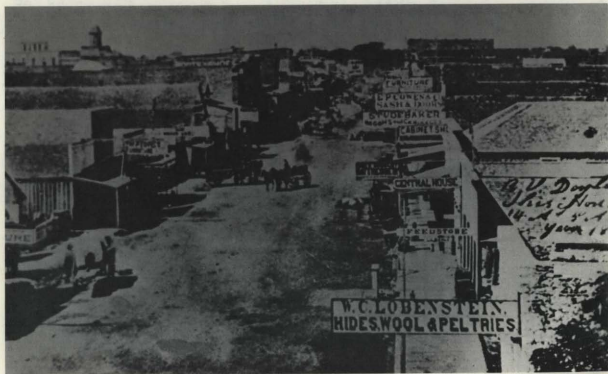

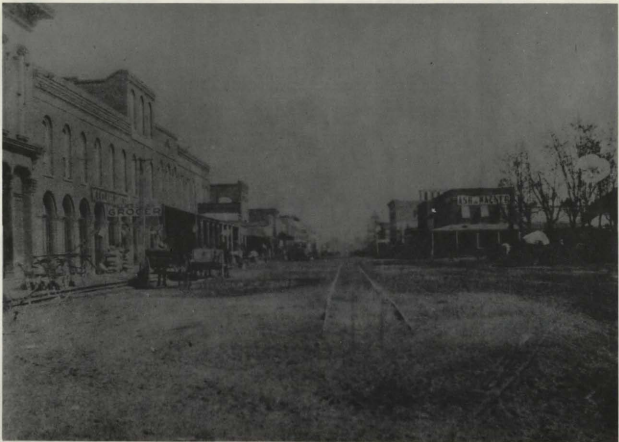

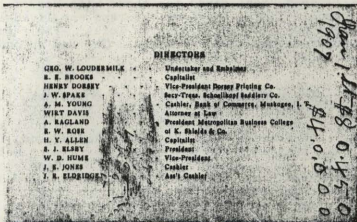

The information given for the veterans includes, whenever possible: birth date & place, where died, residences, his service record, pension or bounty numbers if known, parents (many times giving his mother's maiden name), wife, if known and sometime her maiden name, & children. The sources of information are generally given. This book will be a "real find" for those with War of 1812 ancestors. The 1st Appendix lists widows of veterans who lived in Texas, even though their husbands never came to Texas. Their maiden names are given whenever they could be found. The 2nd Appendix is a list of books consulted for this book.

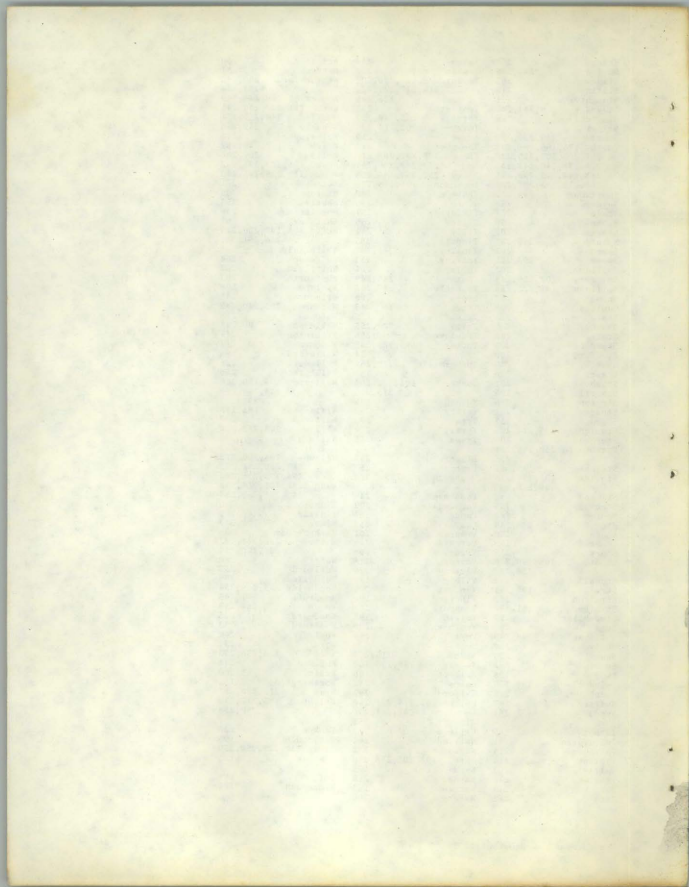
