EDITOR'S PAGE

This issue of The Quarterly, although it is the second issue since I became editor, is the first in which I have had a special "Editor's Page." As you know, our last issue, which was supposed to be in the mail to you approximately September 1st, was delayed by the necessity that we change printers, and was therefore more than a month late in reaching you. We are hopeful there will be no more disruptions of this sort, and that we can maintain our normal publishing schedule for the future.

This seems a very special issue to me, for not only do we complete publishing the 1890 Poll Tax List and the Dallas County Naturalizations Index, each of which has been continued in past issues over a long period of time, but we start publication of the "White Rock Camp Ground Meetings," detailing the personalities and problems of early Methodism in this area beginning with the year 1854.

A source of complete amazement to me is the list of acquisitions coming into the Genealogical Section of the Dallas Public Library. I've decided, as soon as each issue is published, I'll take a "hi-liter" pen, and mark my Quarterly as a "finding guide" to look these materials up in the Library. It had never occurred to me that I would be able to read Connecticut Court materials without going to Connecticut! The scope and quantity of these marvelous materials is something that is hard to realize if you walk into the Genealogy Section without such a list! I hope you will all study carefully the Acquisitions shown in this Quarterly.

Recently attending the Dallas Public Library workshop on Texas History, I became aware of the fact that there are many, many sections of the Library that have materials that can provide aid to those with Texas ancestry. Check with the Texas Section of the Library to see maps showing all the early immigration routes into Texas. Among others, there is Pramm's Map showing completion of the railroad system in Texas, an 1889 Dallas County map showing major railroad lines leading into Dallas County (published by the U. S. Geological Survey); and Street's map of Dallas County in 1900. The Archival Section of the Library has valuable early records of this area. If there is a book you need which is not in the Dallas Public Library, there is an "On-Line Computer Library Center" for Inter-Library Loans. You can place Inter-Library Loan requests by telephone by calling 749-4341. Be sure to give as much information as possible about the book you seek. Your request will be sent out by the OCLS in ever-widening circles to all participating libraries in Texas until they find what you want, if that is possible.

One of the speakers at the workshop was Mrs. Lucile Boykin, who is a goldmine of information. She laid down some very basic and valuable suggestions that will help me in my own research, and may also help others: outline what you want to do at the Library. Bring pencil and paper. Bring your own magnifying glass. Be sure to put down what you are looking at, followed by what you found there. Many libraries, she pointed out, are now allowing nothing to be taken into the Library by a researcher except pencil and paper, since valuable materials are being defaced each day. I've told others I often feel like "a hog on ice" when I go into the Genealogy Section. There is so much to look up -- so many sources -- that my whole search lacks organization. Perhaps using Mrs. Boykin's simple rules, I can work out a "road map" in advance and stay "on track" in my searching!

For those who are interested in the use of computers by genealogists, I have learned from news notes of the Genealogical Society of Vermont that there is a publication now starting its third year - Genealogical Computing, published bimonthly by Data Transfer Associates, Inc., 5102 Pomeroy Drive, Fairfax, VA 22032. A subscription is \$20 (\$25 outside the United States).

It seems appropriate as we begin the "White Rock Camp Ground Meetings" to reprint the following poem by Ann Barcus Minga, now deceased, which is reprinted with the permission of Dr. Herbert Minga of the White Rock United Methodist Church of Dallas, Texas. This is from Mrs. Minga's lovely book of verse entitled "Threaded for Me":

THE ROAD IS CHARTED

At times I feel an arm laid on my arm
To point a path, or lend the boost I need
To keep on plodding. Always when I heed
The touch, I find I have dispelled alarm.
Sometimes it is the presence warm and sweet
Of one I loved, and sometimes I have heard

For books of childhood, stories heard and kept.

VIGNETTES OF MILITARY HISTORY - Evolution of the Chevron

Up to, as late as the 18th century, history reveals little information concerning marks for distinguishing ranks of the soldiers of the world's various armies. The wearing of colored ribbons or sashes around waists, shoulders, and hats and the carrying of special weapons were the most common means of designating ranks in the early armies. Among the first known to have adopted the use of the uniform for soldiers were the legions of Caesar, who were all dressed and armed alike. In the latter part of the 12th Century, armorial marks or devices were used to indicate rank and were placed on the shields of knights whose deeds merited them.

In the time of Elizabeth I of England, a captain, a lieutenant, an ensign, a surgeon, two sergeants, and approximately 90 privates comprised a company. Still no grade distinctions were used except in the wearing of scarfs and in the arming of officers with daggers and rapiers.

In America, with the beginning of the Revolutionary War, the soldiers of the American Colonies were found in want of uniforms. This necessitated their wearing any type of clothing available, creating difficulties in discriminating between commissioned officers and privates. Shortly after Washington took command of the Continental Army, he ordered that badges of distinction be provided for officers. His orders authorized the wearing of red or pink cockades in the hats of field officers, yellow or buff cockades for captains and green for subalterns, also the wearing of an epaulette or stripe of red cloth on the right shoulders of sergeants, a green stripe for corporals.

In 1799 changes were made in army uniforms and in grades of distinction for commissioned and noncommissioned officers. Worsteds epaulettes were assigned to noncommissioned officers as follows: sergeant major, red epaulettes; sergeant, one epaulette on the right shoulder; for corporal, one epaulette on the left shoulder. In 1813 sergeants were authorized to wear two epaulettes and corporals one.

The chevron was first adopted in 1821 as an emblem of rank for noncommissioned officers, lieutenants, and captains. However, they determined rank only by the position in which the chevrons were worn. Therefore, to identify officers and noncommissioned officers more clearly, the wearing of chevrons by officers was abolished in 1832.

The army of the Confederate States during the Civil War used the chevron in a manner similar to that of the Union Army. Noncommissioned officers wore chevrons, points downward, on both sleeves of the uniform coat above the elbow, the color being that of the facing of the arm of service to which a soldier belonged.

Since the origin of their use as marks of distinction in our Army, chevrons have undergone various changes; for instance, in their placement on articles of the uniform, in their color and the prescribed color of stitching, in their size, and in the ranks and authority they represent.

In 1942 the army of the United States had 7 grades of noncommissioned officers. The army of today has a total of 14 different chevrons to depict the ranks of private through command sergeant major, including 4 specialist ratings.

Dr. Sommers writes: "Your members might also like to know that our Reference Branch may be able to assist genealogists whose ancestors served in the Army. To be able to do so, we must know not only the soldier's name but also his unit (regiment, battalion, etc.). If the genealogist cannot tell us the unit, we rarely can help. But if the genealogist already knows the unit, we may well have books on it that would recount the circumstances under which the soldier served and probably even mention him. The following records have been furnished to the Dallas Genealogical Society through the courtesy of Annie Hall Hurd and Cora Hall Moore, daughters of K. Hall, Dallas pioneer. Through the finely-etched old-fashioned script comes an understanding of the responsibilities shouldered by our forefathers through which have emerged all that is meaningful in today's society. No liberties have been taken in transcribing this record, although subject headings appearing in the left margin of each paragraph have been omitted (i.e., this page alone, in which almost each sentence comprised a paragraph, included seven separate headings). To preserve as much as possible the "flavor" and charm of these early records, the title below has been reproduced from the front page of the Camp Ground Meeting Record Book, and a script-like type has been used for the record itself, which extends into the 20th Century. These White Rock Camp Ground Meeting records will be carried in succeeding issues of The Quarterly as space permits.

EARLY INCIDENTS OF DALLAS COUNTY

Dallas County Texas, August 28th, 1890

My father and family, consisting of twenty-eight souls, white and black, left Independence, Mo., March 20th, 1844, and arrived at Cedar Springs in Peters Colony, May 20th during the same year. There was fortified at that place five families, as follows: Mr. Shelly, Jeff Tillery, John Hewitt, John Couch and Wm. Skurlock. Dallas was then known as the "Three Fork City." It had only one cabin. Its occupant was Col. John Neely Bryant, a lawyer by profession.

The first sermon I ever heard preached in the Colony was in the grove where Jack Cole now resides, by Rev. Carver of the Campbellite Doctrine. There were so few changes in those days it was hard to keep the time. There was one good old Presbyterian brother who plowed all day Sunday and kept Monday. My mother read the Bible regularly and prayed the Lord to stay the savage Indian who was ready to wield the tomahawk on the Pioneers. We could hear of the revivals of Rev'd. Henry Stevenson and Sumner Bacon on the coach and at Palestine and wondered if we should ever hear another Methodist minister.

One evening in the year of 1846 Rev's. Dennis Fields and Rhone came to my father's house and said that they were Methodist missionaries. They then appointed a brush arbor meeting to be held at Bro. Franklin Fortner's on Browning's Branch. This meeting proved to be a failure and was broken up in a row. The good ministers left the colony. In 1848 Rev. Fields preached my brother John's funeral at my father's house. He fell at his post in the Mexican War. The next meeting was held in a little log-house near Wm. Cochran's on Farmer's Branch. A Norther came up and the meeting was moved to Isaac Webb's residence. It was conducted by Rev'd's Biggs, Cole and James A. Smith, the singing led by Bro. Minter. The meeting held a week, resulting in about forty conversions. There are but few us left, who date our conversions at that place. The rest have crossed over the river and are waiting.

In the year 1848 at the Ned (pencilled in "Wilborn") Spring, one half mile north of the present Camp Ground, we established a permanent camp ground. Had a shed covered with boards and log camps. We met there every year until burned down by movers in 1851. The following were permanent campers on this ground:

The next brush meeting was held at Col. Record's on Elm in 1859; the next at Bird's Spring on White Rock Creek in 1871 by Rev. Cobb. In 1872 a camp meeting was held at McKamy's Spring on White Rock, conducted by G. S. Gatewood. During the same year at Bachman's Spring on Browning's Branch, called "Soldier Spring," a camp meeting was held, conducted by G. S. Gatewood. The first camp meeting held at the present place, known as the Clark and Bryan Camp Ground in 1873, conducted by Rev's Gillam and Baldrige. In 1875, when the new harbor was built, M. H. Cullum conducted the Camp Meeting and the following were Campers:-

The first church was organized at Isaac Webb's on Farmers' Branch in 1847 and during the same year one at John Thomas' on White Rock, also at Dallas and at Mr. Russel's near Plano, Collin County.

Proceedings of the Camper's Meetings beginning with 1888.

MINUTES - 1888

The Tent holders of the White Rock Camp Ground met under the harbor August 17th, 1888, for the purpose of making arrangements for the next annual Camp Meeting. On motion the time for the next Camp meeting was fixed to begin on Friday before the 3rd Sunday in August, 1889 and to close on Friday of the following week. Bro. Bob Brown was appointed a committee to remove the hay from the harbor; Bro. J. W. Christler to put up the seats and take charge of the lamps. The following committee: H. B. Johnston, J. J. Wells, J. W. Christler, Frank Jackson, J. L. McKamy, was appointed to consider the repairing and improving of the camp ground property, and to secure additional land for camping purposes, also to determine regulations in regard to eating stands &c.

No further business being proposed the meeting after reading and approving minutes adjourned with the benediction.

CAMP GROUND - August 26th, 1889

MINUTES - 1889

The Campers of the White Rock Camp Ground met August 26th, 1889 under the harbor for the purpose of arranging matters for the next year's camp meeting. After religious service D. J. Martin was elected chairman and C. I. McWhirter, Secretary.

A committee consisting of J. H. Bowman, W. D. McFarlin, Col. Bishop and H. B. Johnston, was appointed to write and formulate such laws as are necessary for the protection of the property, campers and Divine worship under the Incorporation Act of the Legislature of Texas. J. M. Cannady, J. L. McKamy, J. W. Christler and J. M. Wells were appointed a committee to regulate matters at the next Camp meeting in regard to stand privileges, to rebuild and set out fence around the harbor, the fence to consist of bois d'arc posts, plank and wire on top - also to repair harbor in so far as to protect the frame, to appoint the time to cut a proposed road through the Camp Ground, running east from the harbor to the boundary line; thence north with this line to the road; to remove the staves from the harbor and prepare the same for the next annual meeting.

By resolution the time for the next Camp Meeting was fixed to begin on Tuesday before the 3rd Sunday in August, 1890, and to close on Thursday night of the following week. On motion, the secretary was ordered to purchase a record book for the purpose of keeping a record of the acts and proceedings of the Camper's Meeting from year to year and to record all former meetings in so far as the minutes can be obtained as well as the proceedings of this meeting. The amount of one dollar and thirty-five cents was raised for the purchase of the record book.

There being no further business proposed, the minutes of the meeting were read and approved and the meeting adjourned with the benediction.

CAMP GROUND - August 18th, 1890

MINUTES OF MASS MEETING - 1890

A mass meeting composed of Campers and persons interested in the White Rock Camp Ground met under the harbor at 2 P.M. August 18th, 1890, for the purpose of considering the question of recovering the harbor as soon as practicable. Rev. W. H. Hughes was made chairman and C. I. McWhirter was appointed secretary.

On motion of J. M. Cochran the committee appointed last year on arrangements, composed of J. M. Cannady, J. L. McKamy, J. W. Christler, J. M. Wells, was authorized to borrow money necessary to recover harbor and have the work done as soon as possible. J. M. Cochran was added to the committee.

The payment of the debt to be incurred hereby is to be provided for through the sale of stand privileges and in case of a deficit to be met by friends during the progress of Camp Meeting next year. The following persons equally bound themselves in writing with the committee for the necessary money for the said purpose:

The GARDNER, KENDRICK, FORGEY, PARKER, GAGE-McCOMAS Families, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11", hardbound, 366 pp., Order from author: Claudine Dollar, BOX 487, Blair, OK 73526. \$25. plus \$2. postage and handling.

This family history is divided into five sections, one section for each of the surnames in the title. In each section the eldest member of each family is introduced, and all of his descendants are traced to at least the 3rd generation (and in several families, to the 4th and 5th generations). The author has documented her book with censuses, newspaper reports, and courthouse records; and is to be complimented on her choice of materials, both serious and humorous.

Of interest to all genealogists and history buffs are the 1843 inventory and appraisal of Jesse Kendrick (p. 295) and the 1883 letter from Will of Ann Tyler (p. 298). Claudine McCallay Dollar's ancestors are not mere names, they have come to life!

This is a clean, neat book with wide margins and clear print. It includes many photographs and an every-name index.

Beginners' note: This family history is a superb example of serious research and skillful reporting.

Genealogical Research Directory - A Key Work for Worldwide Family History Research, 5" x 8", softbound, 243 pp., order from: Mrs. L. Kiviitt, 2707 West Clark Ave., Burbank, CA 91505. No information on price.

The title of this little red book conjures up some very interesting possibilities about the contents, and almost promises to solve all the problems that confront the family genealogist.

Actually, it is a directory of approximately 14,000 surnames with the corresponding family societies. Many of these are located in England and Australia, but some are based in the United States. Because the scope is world wide, the potential for finding more researchers in a given family is greater than the usual list found in quarterlies. The editors have prepared an excellent introduction and have reminded the reader to use international reply coupons.

If you have your ancestor back to the boat, or have reasonable suspicions about the overseas origins of your family, this is for you.

Genealogy Digest, magazine, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11", 66 pp., published monthly. To subscribe: Subscription Dept., P. O. Box 15861, Salt Lake City, UT 84115. \$18. for 1 year.

This magazine appears to be published for the general public, the quasi-researcher, and the family researcher. Because it is aimed at such a broad base of readers, and because it is a digest, there is limited in-depth material, but it will appeal to the beginning genealogist. A sampling of the titles in this issue (Oct., 1982): "Have You Overlooked Military Records?" "What to Do When the Courthouse Burns."

The title of another article was misleading: "The McCubbins Collection" was not a review nor a critique of this valuable collection. Instead this article contains facts about the Rowan County Library and a bio-

logical sketch of the collector - editor.

Another article deals with John Wayne's ancestry. While his background is interesting, the article has limited value for the serious genealogist.

Probably the most informative parts of the magazine are "Fast Facts," and "Questions and Answers," which consist of newsworthy genealogical tidbits. The concluding article is the "Ancestor Exchange" (a query section that is not indexed).

Beginners' note: This magazine has high-quality slick pages, but much advertising - 41 pages of the 66 pages carried advertisements, and these advertisements were not all for genealogical supplies, but were for Amtrak and for kitchen appliances.

MARY E. WARREN GILL BIBLE RECORDS

The old Bible says on the front: "Mary E. Gill, December 25, 1896." Mary E. Warren Gill was born 16 Nov 1860, died 8 Feb 1951, Petersburg, Lincoln Co., TN., married Oliver F. Gill. She was first daughter and first born of Rev. John Bright Warren and Margaret McBride Benedict Warren (born 13 Aug 1832; d. 24 Jun 1911). It was the second marriage of each. Margaret McBride's family are of Marshall Co., Tennessee, and it is presumed the Gills lived in Lincoln or Marshall County. The two counties cut Petersburg, Tennessee in half. Most pages of the Bible were loose and tattered, but this one remains fast. I thought it most appropriate to send to Texas. John Bright Warren was Doug's great-grandfather, and we do not know who his parents were. This looks like a list of his siblings:

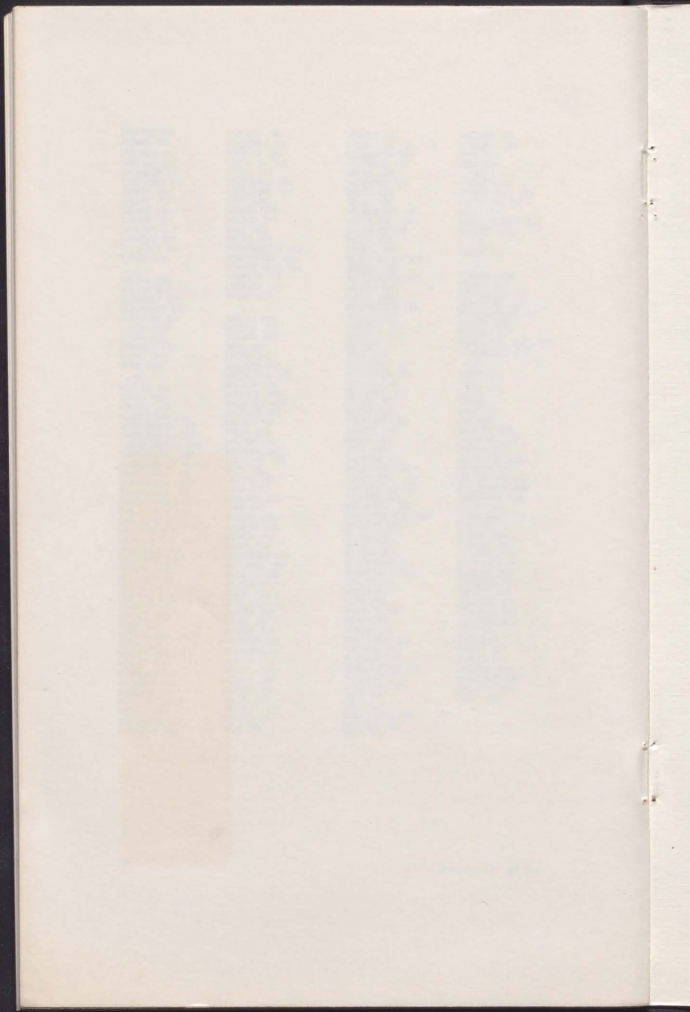
