MRS. MARGARET BARRET PRATT

IN MEMORIAN

Friends of the Dallas Public Library and staff members were saddened by the death of Mrs. Margaret Barrett Pratt Monday, January 31, 1983 after an illness of six months. Each person whose life was touched by her genuine enthusiasm for family or historical research will recall the meticulous attention she gave to queries of all kinds.

Mrs. Pratt was born on a ranch near El Campo, Texas, but spent most of her early years in the Central part of West Texas and in Tennessee. At Stamford, she was valedictorian of her high school and junior college classes. She received a B. A. Degree at Southern Methodist University in 1918 being a member of the school's second graduating class. At SMU she had the distinction of being the first woman elected president of a senior class. Following graduation from college, Mrs. Pratt returned to Memohis to teach junior high school history. After the death of her mother, she returned to Texas where she married James Reece Pratt. Until Mr. Pratt's death, she gave up thoughts of teaching to be a houswife and mother to James Reece Pratt, Jr. who became an architect. He is currently making Dallas history by sparking an interest in downtown revitalization with his own work on planning committees and restoration of the old Dallas County Courthouse. His three daughter, Sabrina, Alexandra, and Ilya Pratt were great joys to their grandmother. Mrs. Pratt's sister, Mrs. Ruth Barrett DuBrul survives also, encouraged her to take library courses which resulted in a second degree in 1954 from Texas State College for Woman, Denton,

When the Dallas Library building located at 1954 Commerce was opened in 1856, Mrs. Pratt organized the division, widely known as Texas/Local History and Genealogy Department, and served as division head until her retirement, August, 1862. Her wide range of reading interests, continuous study of history and genealogy were reflected in the care she took to collect materials for local history and family research. A news clip file of Dallas newspapers will always be a record of her untiring effort to make available ready reference information on all topics of Dallas history for the patrons of the library. The collection, today ranks as one of the foremost in public library local history resources in the Southwest. The high quality of public service which she maintained was known, not only locally, but also nationally through convention visitors who used the department.

Two outstanding exhibits, prepared for the library brought many visitors to the library. In October, 1987, during the Neiman-Marcus French Fordright, she created displays depicting the French influence in Texas and Dallas. A year earlier, to mark the library's first anniversary in its new quarters, she prepared an exhibit on the Aviation History of Dallas, a comprehensive collection that took several months to assemble. From this effort came the citation awarded her by the North Central Texas Chapter of Woman's National Aeronautical Association.

Mrs. Pratt was one of the founders of the present Dallas Genealogy Society, and honored as a life member by the organization, having lectured over the state on the subject of genealogy. Her visits to other libraries and archives provided a network of contact which ultimately provided patrons with ways to continue research outside the boundaries of Texas.

In the 1960's a Junior Genealogical Society of Dallas was formed, co-sponsored by the Junior League of Dallas and the Local History and Genealogical

Society in cooperation with the Dallas Public Library. At those meeting Mrs. Pratt conducted the laboratories by assisting the students in use of the library's local history and genealogy collection. In an article about her work in the February. 1958, Dallas Magazine entitled "Woman in Business", she was cited for her direct contribution to Dallas business through her many special services to business people. Among other groups which honored her work were the Women's National Aeronautical Association, with whose help she established an important collection of aviation history, and the Dallas Philological Society, which gave her its 1959 annual award for Distinguished Service. After her retirement, Mrs. Pratt served from 1962-64 as program chairman of the Local History and Genealogy Society. Earlier from 1955-1962, she had served as its advisor/librarian and Director-at-Large. She inspired the high quality of workshops and seminars which have long been recognized as outstanding programs for genealogist of the region to attend. By September, 1957, The Margaret Barret Pratt Fund for the Genealogy Collection of the Dallas Public Library had established. At its inception, it was given in recognition, and appreciation, to Mrs. Pratt for her untiring help to all interested in research. Contributions were made from a number of Dallas hereditary and patriotic organizations, individuals and the society.

Other organizations in which Mrs. Pratt held membership were: Phi Mu, Beta Phi Mu, national honorary fraternity; the American Association of University Women; the Jane Douglas Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution; the Highland Park Methodist Church; and the Dallas Council on World Affairs. In the latter group, she arranged for foreign visitors to tour the library and Texas Room in their visit to the city.

To have known Mrs. Pratt was to have great respect for her dedicated, enthusiastic work for the citizens of Dallas. Each of us is richer because of her friendship.

Article I - Name

The name of this society shall be the Dallas Genealogical Society, hereinafter referred to as the Society.

The objectives of this Society shall be to create, foster and maintain interest in Genealogy, and to assist and support the Genealogical Department of the Dallas Public Library; to collect and preserve information relating to those pioneers who settled Dallas County, and to the early history of this City and County; to preserve Church, cemetery and land records, testimonial documents, diaries and manuscripts and other source materials, copying and indexing these records.

Article III - Membership

Section 1. Regular membership is open to any interested person who submits a written application for membership to the Vice President for Membership, accompanied by payment of annual dues for the first year.

Section 2. Other categories for membership may be established by the Board with dues and qualification to be set by the Board and presented at the Annual Business Meeting.

Section 3. Annual dues shall be established by the Board, and approved by the membership at the Annual Business Meeting, payable in advance by January 1. Members whose dues are not paid by January 31 shall be dropped automatically from membership in the Society, Dues paid after January 31 may be subject to a late charge, the amount to be set by the Board.

Article IV - Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Society shall be a President, Executive Vice-President; Vice President for Programs; Vice-President for Membership; Vice-President for The Quarterly; Vice-President for the Newsletter; Treasurer; Secretary; and Seven Directors, one of whom shall be the representative of the Genealogy Department of the Dallas Public Library.

Section 2. At the Board meeting held in February, a Nominating Committee of 5 members, 2 from the Executive Board and 3 from the membership shall be elected by the Board. It shall be the duty of this Committee to nominate candidates for the offices to be filled at the annual meeting in May. Additional nominations may be made from the floor provided the consent of the nominee has been obtained. Only members in good standing may be nominated for office.

Section 3. Officers shall be elected to serve for one year, or until their successors are elected. Election shall be by a majority vote of those present and voting. The term of office shall begin June 1.

Section 4. No member shall hold more than one office at a time, and may not hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms except that of the representative of the Genealogy Department of the Dallas Public Library. No member may serve on the Board for more than three consecutive terms in an elected office except the President and Executive Vice President who may have served previously three consecutive terms. No officer shall be eligible to more served previously three consecutive terms. No officer shall be eligible to more

than three consecutive terms in the elected office. No member may serve as President unless he has served as a member of the Board for at least one year.

Section 5. In the event of a vacancy in the office of President, the Executive Vice-President shall become President. A vacancy in any other office shall be filled by the Executive Board.

Section 6. Resignation of officers and directors shall be by letter to the Executive Board at its meetings, except in cases of death or serious illness when the Executive Board on its own motion may accept the resignation of an officers or director.

Article V - Duties of Officers

Section 1. President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society and the Executive Board. He shall appoint all committees except the Nominating Committee. He shall make an annual report to the membership for publication in the fall periodical.

Section 2. Executive Vice-President. In the absence or inability of the President, this officer shall perform the duties of the President.

Section 3. The Vice-President for Programs shall be responsible for programs at the regular meetings of the Society.

Section 4. The Vice-President for Membership shall record new membership application, forwarding the dues to the Treasurer and compile an official membership roll by March 1 of each year. Additions and changes in the membership shall be presented to the Executive Board two weeks prior to the distribution of the DGS periodical.

Section 5. The Vice-President for the Quarterly shall be responsible for the editing and publication of a periodical four times a year. He shall have control of the equipment of the Society relative to his office.

Section 6. The Vice-President for the Newsletter shall notify the members of meetings as directed by the Executive Board.

Section 7. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of the Society and disburse the same on order of the Executive Board. He shall make a financial report of all receipts and expenditures at the Annual Meeting. He shall keep an inventory of equipment and publications owned by the Society. He shall be chairman of the Budget Committee. He shall be responsible for filing all governmental tax forms.

Section 8. The Secretary shall keep a permanent record of the procedings of the meetings of the Society and Executive Board. He shall have a copy of the By-Laws at all meetings. He shall turn this permanent record over to the president at the end of his term of office.

Article VI - Directors

Duties of Directors shall be established by the Executive Board and may include; Public Relations, Supervision of the Exchange List; distribution of the DGS periodical, Newsletter, and other mailing; Research; publishing and distribution of projects which have been authorized by the Board; and other duties as deemed necessary. Article VII - Executive Board

Section 1. The officers of the Society, including the Directors, shall constitute the Executive Board. The President shall appoint a Parliamentarian who shall attend meetings of the Executive Board, but shall have no vote except to break a tie.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Society between its business meetings, fix the hour and place of meetings, make recommendations to the Society and perform such other duties as are specified in these By-Laws. The Board shall be subject to the orders of the Society and none of its acts shall conflict with action taken by the Society.

Section 3. Regular meetings of the Executive Board shall be held in each month in which regular meetings of the Society are held. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of 7 members of the Board. Seven members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Article VIII - Meetings

Section 1. The regular meetings of this Society shall be held at such time and place as may be determined by the Executive Board.

Section 2. The regular meeting in May shall be known as the Annual Meeting and shall be for the purpose of electing officers, receiving reports of officers and committees, and for any other business that may arise.

Section 3. Special meetings may be called by the President or by the Executive Board, or shall be called upon the written request of 25 members of the Society. Eight days notice shall be given to the membership by those calling the meeting at their expense and business transacted at any special meeting shall be limited to that mentioned in the call.

Section 4. Thirty members shall constitute a quorum.

Article IX - Committees

Section 1. The Budget Committee shall meet after the Annual Meeting in May and prepare a budget for the following year. It shall submit the budget to the Board for approval and submit it to the Society at the next regular meeting. The committee shall consist of the President, Executive Vice President, the Treasurer, the immediate Past-President and the immediate Past Treasurer.

Section 2. An Audit Committee of 3 members shall be appointed by the President in May. This Committee shall audit or have audited the Society's financial books and records by August 15 and report at the September Weeting.

Section 3. Such other committees, standing or special shall be appointed by the President as the Society or the Executive Board shall deem necessary to carry on the work of the Society. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.

Article X - Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Society in all cases in which they are not in conflict with the Charter and By-Laws of the Society.

Article XI - Amendments of By-Laws

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Society by a two-thirds vote of members present and voting provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing and read by the Parliamentarian at the previous regular meeting.

Article XII - Standing Rules

Standing rules may be adopted by the Executive Board by majority vote. Such rules are for the guidance of the members and officers and cannot conflict with these By-Laws.

STANDING RULES

1. Non-Members shall pay \$3.00 per query.

Advertising in the DGS Periodical shall be subject to approval of the Board at prices to be set by the Board.

Notices and announcements of activities, meetings, and events other than DGS shall be subject to the approval of the Board.

4. Co faxtra periodicals and sets of the Quarterly shall be set by the Board.

Any announcements, presentations and business other than DGS must be submitted in writing, to the presiding officer for his approval one week prior to the meeting at which it is to be presented.

6. DGS shall not do research for persons in the name of the Society.

Profit making persons or organizations are prohibited from soliciting, handing out flyers or in any other way advertising their goods and services at Dallas Genealogical meetings or on the premises.

 The outgoing president shall have the past years' minutes and newsletters bound and turn the bound books over to the incoming president.

 DGS presents Memorials to the Dallas Public Library (Genealogy Dept.) annually. Amount to be determined by the board.

 All Life Membership dues shall be separately invested in an interest bearing account.

Dear Mrs. Hudson,

My attention has recently been drawn to an article by Mrs. John B. Gunn which appeared in The Quarterly, vol. XXVII, no.4 (December 1981) entitled 'Doing Research in the Bodleian Library, Oxford, England'. I wonder if you would allow me to comment on it, particularly on its last three pages, since, as head of the Department which administers most of the genealogical material, I am presumably the chief of that 'race of troglodytes' which receives the sharp edge of Mrs. Gunn's tongue.

May I comment on three points?

- Application for admission as a reader.
 Mrs. Gunn makes the procedure sound much more
 complicated than it is. Simply write to us for
 an application form, have it filled in by your
 recommender (who does not need to be English),
 and bring it with you. As from next year there
 will be a small charge for a reader's ticket.
- 2. If Mrs. Gunn was indeed treated in the admissions office in the manner described, she is due a sincere apology. We are only too well-aware of how much we owe to past and continuing support from the United States, and during the summer months particularly the accents of the United States are heard much more frequently in the Bodleian than those of any other part of the world. So far as I can discover, we did not receive a complaint from Mrs. Gunn. Had we done so, an immediate investigation would have been made. I am very concerned that any of our readers should feel bitter about their treatment

here. The Bodleian's reputation, and it is one which we jealously guard, is one of being a friendly place and of being helpful to its readers.

I should however point out that we admit something of the order of 10,000 new readers a year: all of them have to read the declaration which was laid down by the founder 380 years ago. It is perhaps understandable that there is sometimes a queue in the admissions office, or that the admissions officer (who is not, incidentally, a don) should sometimes have an off-day. He should never, however, be rude. Perhaps I should mention, in passing, that the antics of the Ewing family in the TV series entitled 'Dallas' (which has achieved notorious popularity in England) has given many people an image of Dallas and its citizens which I am sure is far from the truth. Mrs. Gunn was perhaps stung by some flippant remark arising from this, as we in Oxford are constantly stung when we are expected to behave like characters from 'Brideshead Revisited', 'Upstairs, Downstairs', or even like Alastair Cooke.

3. The complexities of working in Duke Humfrey's Library. Here I do take issue with Mrs. Gunn. Any library which is one of the major research libraries of the world, which has been growing for 380 years and which occupies a series of buildings which in themselves are historical monuments, can be expected to be a complex organisation, complicated to use. No new-comer can expect to master such a library's procedures quickly. It takes time. It is easy to grumble about these complexities, but they are easy enough to master if you give yourself time. And the staff are there to help outsiders - indeed, we help 10,000 of them every year!

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
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
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
