CAMPER'S MEETING - 1890

The Campers of the White Rock Camp Meeting met under the harbor at 2:30 P M, Friday, August 21st, 1890. D J Martin acting as Chairman and C I McWhirter as secretary. J W Christler was appointed a committee to take charge of lamps, put up the seats, close up the gates &c. at close of the meeting. The Committee of Arrangements appointed last year to take charge of matters in regard to the succeeding camp meeting, viz, J M Cannady, J L McKamy, J M Wells, J W Christler, was re-appointed, and J W Cochran was added to the committee. It was decided that the next Camp meeting should begin on Friday before the second Sunday in August, 1891 and should close on Friday after 3rd Sunday, being two weeks.

A former committee having failed to act, Dr H L Kyle, H B Johnston, Capt Wm C McKamy were appointed a committee to draft such laws as may be necessary for the protection of the property, campers and divine worship under the Incorporation Act of the Legislature.

The minutes were read and approved. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

CAMP GROUND, AUGUST 13TH, 1891

After some discussion as to the time for holding the Camp Meeting for next year, the question on motion was postponed for further consideration till 2:30 P M to-morrow.

The meeting then adjourned till 2:30 P M, tomorrow.

CAMP GROUND, AUGUST 14TH, 1891

On motion, it was decided that on Saturday, before 1st Sunday in August should be the time for preparing grounds, letting stand privileges and selecting some one to furnish beef to Campers. The following persons were elected as the Committee of Arrangements for the ensuing year: J M Kennedy, Chairman, J L McKamy, J M Wells, J W Christler, J M Cochran, H B Johnston and John Russell. J W Christler was appointed a committee to take charge of lamps, put up seats, close up the gates &c at close of meeting.

The meeting then adjourned sine die.

REMINISCENCES: A GLIMPSE OF OLD EAST DALLAS.

What an enjoyable book awaits the Dallas researcher in 1984!

Reminiscences: A Glimpse of Old East Dallas is a combination of oral history and old photographs for the years 1872-1960. The bulk of this book is the oral history text which was excerpted from recent interviews. It introduces East Dallas personalities, customs, and institutions as older East Dallas residents remember them. Interspersed are photographs which bring East Dallas into focus, with scenes of familiar intersections and well-traveled streets.

East Dallas is defined as the area bounded by Central Expressway on the West, Mockingbird Lane on the North, Loop 12 on the East, and Fair Park on the South.

This volume will be a useful tool for future generations, not only for the wealth of information concerning 1872-1960, but for the photos and names of those who spent several years collecting the material for this book.

Although there is an Index, it is limited, and is not a complete index. Names abound in the text of each interview, so it is necessary to read this book from cover to cover. Because this book requires perusal of each page, older researchers may find the sepia-brown print difficult to read for long periods of time.

HANG ON THE POTATOES.

Erling H. Peterson, 1982, 6"x9", hard bound, 308 pp. Available from Erling H. Peterson, 8518 Fathom Circle, #108, Austin, TX 78750. Price not Listed.

Hang on the Potatoes is a narrative about the Peterson family from the Lofoten Archipelago of Norway. The author begins with his parents and grandparents and then introduces the many relatives and friends, both in Norway and the United States, who helped the Petersons to come to America. He describes each person, notes his place of origin, and if he is alive at this time. Within this framework, the author relates his travels to Norway, where he found other descendants. As he introduces them, he shares their stories of the Norwegian culture and the daily life of their ancestors. The major families included in this book are: Matthiason, Knudtson, Steen, Svensdatter, Johanson and Anderson; but there are many others mentioned.

This is a book for everyone of Norwegian ancestry. It gives the reader an appreciation of the immigrant's life and his customs. Unfortunately, there is no index, but reading from cover is worth the search.

THREADGILLS - BOOK II.

J. H. Miller and W. T. Wicker, 1983, 6"x9", hardbound, 325 pp. Order from J. H. Miller, P. O. Box 2245, Hudson, Ohio 44236. \$35.00 includes postage.

Published twelve years after Book I, this book deals with the southern Threadgill families during the period from 1800 to 1865. These Threadgills are descended from John Threadgill who arrived in Virginia about 1732, and his three sons who were in Anson Co, NC. Documentation includes Bible, land, Court, and probate records, and also a map and chart of the pre-1820 Methodist Circuit in the counties of Anson, Union, and Stanly. The descendants of each son are traced by the registry system with unit numbering of major members of the family. Other families included are: Beverly, Adams, Wright, Fesmire, Ingram and Threlkeld.

The final part of the book contains unidentified Threadgills who were listed in censuses from 1860 to 1910. Following this is an accurate index and a list of Threadgills who fought in wars through the Civil War. Clean printing and well spaced paragraphs make this an easy book to use.

ELM FORK ECHOES - ANNIVERSARY ALBUM.

This issue of the quarterly published by The Peters Colony Historical Society is titled Anniversary Album, and it is exactly that: a delightful collection of photographs of the early settlers and families of Peters Colony. Many of these pictures are of complete families; others are baby pictures followed by adult pictures of the same person. Names of all of those pictured are listed and frequently their relationship to others in the community (plus wedding dates) are included. There are a few familiar street scenes, and an every-name index completes this album.

ORDINARY AMERICANS.

Charles E. Cole, 1981, 6"x9". Softbound. 79 pp.

This is the history of the Kohl family as they migrate from Pennsylvania to Texas. The author begins with Jacob Kohl of Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, who was born about 1795. He continues with Jacob the second generation and his removal to Illinois and then to Denton, Texas. With relative ease, Cole ties his ancestors' religions and occupations into the norms of the new areas. His discussions of the third generation is expanded to all collateral lines scattered across the country, and he has included photos and a U. S. map to show the places where the Kohls, Coles, and all descendants settled. Some of the related families are: Miller, Sallach, Finley, Rogers, Houtz, Evans, and Zimmerman.

This book is well documented with family letters, diaries, and censuses. Detailed footnotes follow each chapter, and there is an Appendix consisting of family group sheets. Cole's Epilogue is an ingeni-

ous addition to his family history. Here he discusses the significance of the title of his book and the manner in which the Kohls fit into the cultural patterns of the 19th century without losing their identity. Its index lists complete names and geographic locations.

Smith Papers is published three times a year for all of those who are researching Smith families. This issue contains cemetery inscriptions, marriages, miscellaneous records, census records, and queries - all relating to Smiths. Some of the records are from early Virginia, others from the early frontier (1807 - petitions of Indian Territory and Harrison Co., Indiana), many are later (Masonic Mutual Benefit - Mortality Records, 1869-1877), each containing pertinent information for the serious researcher.

There are also book reviews and advertisements of other family societies, followed by a complete index of Smiths and other surnames contained in the current issue.

To the compilers' credit, aliases are included, and there is an introductory page of abbreviations and explanations. The soldier's application number (and sometimes the widow's number), as well as the state from which the soldier served and the unit in which he served are provided.

This could be very helpful to the researcher.

Under the above title, Judge Jerry Buchmeyer of Dallas, in his "Et Cetera" column of the Texas Bar Journal for September 20, 1982, quoted O. Otto Moore, retired Chief Justice of the Colorado Supreme Court, who in 1969 delivered some remarks to a group of broadcasters in Denver, warning that "when you are dealing with lawyers and judges as a class of people you are dealing with men who are constantly looking to the past" -- illustrating this by quoting the following from a dissenting opinion by Justice John H. Denison (reported in 62 Colo. 4):

"One day through the primeval wood a calf walked home as good calves should. But left a trail all bent askew -- a crooked trail, as all calves do. Since then 300 years have fled, and I infer that calf is dead. But still he left behind this trail, and thereby hangs my moral tale.

"The trail was taken up next day by a lone dog that passed that way. And then a wise bellwether sheep followed the trail o'er vail and steep; and drew a flock behind him, too -- as good bellwethers always do. So from that day, o'er hill and glade, through those old woods a path was made.

"And many men wound in and out --- and bent and turned and dodged about; and uttered words of righteous wrath because 'twas such a crooked path. But still they followed (do not laugh) the first migration of that calf, as through the winding wood he stalked, because he wobbled when he walked.

"This forest path became a lane that bent and turned and turned again; this crooked lane became a road where many a poor horse with his load toiled on beneath the burning sun and traveled some three miles for one. And thus a century and a half they trod the footsteps of that calf.

"The years passed on with swift-ness fleet. The road became a village street. And then before men were aware, became a crowded thoroughfare. And soon the central street was this of a reknomed metropolis; and men two centuries and a half have followed the foot-prints of that calf.

"Each day a hundred thousand route, following the zigzag calf about and over this crooked journey went the traffic of a continent. A hundred thousand men were led by one calf near three centuries dead. They follow still his crooked way, and lose a hundred years each day. For thus such reverence is lent to well-established precedent. A moral lesson this might teach, were I ordained and called to preach, for men are prone to go it blind along the calf paths of the mind -- and toil away from sun to sun to do as other men have done.

"They follow in the beaten track, and out and in, and forth and back -- and still their dubious course pursue to keep the path that others do. But how the wise old wood gods laugh who saw the first primeval calf! Many things this talk might teach -- but I am not ordained to preach!"


