Mrs. Morris has served on several occasions as both President of our society and editor of our quarterly, and most recently has reviewed books for our quarterly. Please see our memorial to this remarkable person in this issue. The ready offer of assistance by Margaret Ann Hudson, also our former president and former editor who has

reviewed books for this issue, is sincerely appreciated.

Please note that several Ancestor Charts are included in this issue. In the September, 1985 quarterly, I asked anyone who would like to have their charts included in a second volume of DGS Ancestors to send those charts to me. Only six charts were received, so three of them are being published in this issue as an addition to our Query Page, and the other three will be published in our March, 1987, Quarterly. Please do NOT submit any other charts, as it will be up to future editors and/or boards as to whether (or when) they wish to undertake and carry forward such a project. It may be that the surname interests to be shown in our 1987 membership roster will serve that purpose for the present.

In our June quarterly we completed the early Dallas Deed Records which had been abstracted by our members at the Courthouse — and in these pages we complete all usable marriage records on hand. Our member Kelvin Meyers has undertaken to forge ahead with copying marriage records at the Courthouse — so, if he is able to obtain these, we hope we will be able to publish the continuing marriage records of 1885, and following. If any of our members, particularly those with clear and legible handwriting and an eye for accuracy, would care to assist in these projects, please let Adrienne Jamieson at the library know of your availability.

When I visited my grandchildren in Michigan last May, I learned about the Doherty/Dougherty/Daugherty/McDougherty/O'Doherty family organization formed up there. Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Doherty, in Brown City, Michigan (the thumb of Michigan, about 50 miles North of Detroit) became interested a number of years ago in tracing their forebears. They found many, many spellings with the same heritage, and formed a nationwide (and then an international) family group. In most recent years the family group has purchased the Doherty castle in Ireland, and Mrs. and Mrs. Doherty from Michigan manage it for the family group. This has recently been publicized in the Tri-State Trader/Antique Week of Knightstown, Indiana — and we hope to report on that article in our next issue.

A similar situation arose when Mr. Lorenzo Wilder, who lives near San Antonio, Texas, sought his Wilder forebears in New England. In visiting New England for the first time, he passed an old mansion labeled "The Wilder Home." The old gentleman living there, it developed, was the last of the Wilder line in that vicinity. Mr. Lorenzo Wilder's own antecedents had been away from New England for several generations, and the New England family had lost track of them. Perhaps recognizing Mr. Wilder as a person of substance, interested in his heritage, the home was left to him. The Wilder home, refurbished by its new owner, was deeded by him to the local historical society. Mrs. Ansel J. (Frances) Syphers, a DGS member, is of this Wilder line.

Mrs. Harry Joseph Morris, Ph.D., C.G., F.H.G., F.S.A., Scot, F.T.S.C.S.

Deceased November 5, 1986

Born at Arleston, Texas, the daughter of Edgar Lee Burton and Myrtie Etoile Black, granddaughter of Albert E. Burton and Luise Anne Taylor; and, Asa Rebecca Black and Sarah Elizabeth Boynton, Iouise Morris was married to Harry Joseph Morris November 2, 1945 at Dallas, Texas. During the early years of their marriage they resided in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and Chicago, Illinois, returning to Dallas in the early 1960's. Louise Morris was the founding president of many of Dallas's hereditary societies. She was the Honorary Life President-Editor of Texas State Genealogical Society, Honorary Life President Editor of Dallas Genealogical Society, Honorary Life President/Regent of 16 Genealogical, Hereditary Lineage, and Patriotic Societies. She was known nationally and internationally for her expertise in genealogy and heraldry, having authored many lineage books. Always willing to assist and further the work of others in her chosen fields as well as to furnish the leadership necessary to open up those fields, she labored without stint to be that each was nurtured and well established. During the past year she has assisted the Dallas Genealogical Society by reviewing books for their Dallas Quarterly. She spent her days even to the end of her life, working tirelessly and continuously, teaching classes in genealogy when she was able, most recently under the auspices of the University of Texas at Arlington, where she was scheduled to conduct classes in the Spring of A full life, it is said, is a happy one -- and Louise Morris, in her refusal to acknowledge impediments imposed by the pain of arthritis, a weak heart, and failing eyesight, worked to the end on the things she loved best. She was a happy woman whose works will continue to speak for her long after she herself has gone. We are privileged to have known her. Her presence, her contributions and her encouragement will be sorely missed by all who knew her.

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THE LIBRARY RESEARCH SERVICE OF WESTERN RESERVE

The Western Reserve Historical Society's History Library have made a new service available to genealogists and historians around the world, as announced January, 1985 in the Genealogy Section of the Tri-State Trader/Antique Week. Published in Knightstown, Indiana, the TST deals mainly with the states of Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania.

This Library Research Service makes a facts-for-a-fee service available to individuals who cannot visit the library to conduct their own research, which could conceivably include many families which dwelt there temporarily en route to Texas. According to the article the Library Research Service (LRS) is supervised by the reference staff of the library. This service is on a fee basis of \$20 per hour (one-half hour minimum which includes up to 10 photocopies). Persons writing to the library about genealogical or historical research problems are sent an order form which outlines the sources to be searched by the LRS and provides an estimate of the amount of time the research will involve. Anyone wish-ing to take advantage of this service must then return the order form and prepay the charges.

While the staff of the LRS pledges to be as thorough and accurate as possible, patrons are warned that some records, such as census schedules, newspaper articles, and family genealogies may not be entirely reliable. The LRS does not guarantee to provide an answer to every question, but only to report on the results of research conducted. Research results consist of transcriptions or photocopies with a written explanation if necessary. In most cases the re sults are mailed within twoweeksafter the orderisreceived.

"This is an exciting development for genealogists who have long heard of the vast resources of the WRHS library," commented the article, "but have been unable to travel to Cleveland, Ohio. Through the IRS, clients will have access to many records, including the following: federal census schedules for all states from 1790 to 1900; more than 15,000 family genealogies; a voluminous collection of newspapers, including titles from every state in the Union; thousands of volumes of county histories and transcriptions of local records of Ohio, its neighboring states and New England; and more than 2,000 collections of papers of individuals and records of organizations, including many 19th century Ohio churches."

RALPH HILL OF NEW ENGLAND -- PROGENITOR OF TEXAS PATRIOTS A SESQUICENTENNIAL TALE

-- by Marie Brady Hunter, descendant of Ralph Hill

A vignette of this family history has been published in Texas — Some Family Histories, the Texas Sesquicentennial project of the Texas Colony of New England Women (a copy having earlier been presented to The Genealogy Section of the Dallas Public Library). Mrs. Harry Joseph Morris, recently deceased, the founding president of New England Women in this area, and Honorary Lifetime President/Editor of Dallas Genealogical Society reviewed these family vignettes in our June, 1986 issue. Ralph Hill, born in Somerset, England, arrived at Plymouth, Massachusetts in 1632 with his brother Thomas Hill. Admitted a freeman, he was elected a selectman of Woburn, Massachusetts in 1647. He enjoined the settlement of Shawshin (later known as Billerica, Middlesex County, Massachusetts), of which he and his son Captain Ralph Hill, Jr., were original proprietors, and of which he was the first selectman. Ralph Hill, Jr., served as a soldier throughout the Indian campaigns, particularly in King Philip's War of 1674. . . . Not by the farthest flight of Ralph Hill's imagination could he then have envisioned that his descendants would migrate from New England to Maryland — or that his great great grandson Isaac' (Abraham', Samuel's, Ralph, Jr.', Ralph'), born in Charleston, Maryland in 1748, would fight for the freedom of this country from the British in the Revolutionary War — or that he would migrate even farther to the South, to North Carolina, and become the ancestor of many families that have distinguished themselves in the history of the State of Texas, a number of them having taken active parts in the Texas fight for freedom from Mexico. . . What would Ralph Hill have thought to know that one of his progeny, among many who were active in that fight, would be captured by the commanding general of the opposing army, and raised as his son in a far away land, even beyond the boundaries of this nation which in 1632 was Ralph Hill's new home!

Isaac Hill, the great great grandson of Ralph Hill of New England married Lucy Wallace. With their ten children, all born in Edgecombe County, North Carolina, the family moved to Georgia around 1800, founding the little town of Hillsboro, near Fayetteville in Fayette County, and La Grange, in Troup County. It was in LaGrange that Isaac's son Asa met and married Elizabeth Barksdale. Asa and Elizabeth raised twelve children. Their sons were Green Washington Hill, William Carroll Jackson Hill, Jeffrey Barksdale Hill, James Monroe Hill, Asa Collingsworth Hill, and John Christopher Columbus Hill (after whom Columbus, Georgia was named—but that is another story!); daughters: Serena Pinckney Hill (Mrs. Geo. A. Kerr), Susanna Amanda Hill (married Rev. C. W. Thomas), Louisiana Elizabeth Hill (Mrs. William P. Kerr), Mary Anne Rebecca Hill (Mrs. Peter B. Shaw), Sarah Anne Amelia Hill (Wife of General Wm. G. Webb); and

Martha Anne Eliza Hill.

Asa and Elizabeth Hill were of hardy English and Scotch stock; though their children were numerous, this was not unusual, as the brothers of Asa Hill likewise had large and rugged families. In 1834 Asa Hill, accompanied by one son, William Carroll Jackson Hill, and his nephew, Isaac Lafayette Hill, journeyed to Texas to select a place for settlement in Austin's colony at Washington County, returning to Georgia to arrange for the removal of the family to Texas. The return voyage commenced at Columbus, Georgia, in the spring of 1835. The party set out by steamboat on the Chattahoochee River to the port of Appalachicola, where they reembarked on a schooner for New Orleans, by way of Mobile. At the port of New Orleans, they boarded a sailing vessel to cross the Gulf of Mexico, and after a voyage of eighteen days, reached the little port of Matagorda Bay. Traveling in ox wagons from Matagorda to San Felipe, then the seat of the provincial government, they went on to what was later named "Gay Hill," Which required seven days of travel.

The clearing of land for farming, the erection of a dwelling house, and all of the preparations for farming and stock raising were progres-

sing apace when a courier arrived bringing word of the siege of the Asa Hill and his son, William Carroll Jackson Hill, immediately an expedition for the relief of the garrison at the Alamo, but were unable to reach San Antonio before its fall. On this expedition they witnessed the burning of Gonzales.

A convention of all Texans met March 1, 1836 at Washington on the Brazos, at which convention, William Carroll Jackson Hill was Corporal of the Guards during the signing of the Declaration of Independence of the

Republic of Texas .

In the absence of Asa Hill, his family had been busily engaged in moulding and patching bullets for use in the reception of General Santa Anna's army, as reports of its movements and planned invasion had spread throughout the length and breadth of the colony. As soon as Asa Hill throughout the length and breadth of the colony. As soon as Asa Hill returned, he and his son James Monroe Hill and seven others, went in search of General Sam Houston, who had been empowered, upon the declaration of independence of the Republic of Texas on March 2, 1836, to raise an army of defense. Houston's trail was encountered at Burnham's Crossing on the Colorado River, and contact was soon made with a detachment of his army who were guarding the ford of the river near Columbus.

James Monroe Hill enlisted in Captain W. W. Hill's company at this

point, and Asa Hill proceeded down the Colorado River to report to Gene-He was detailed by General Houston to contact all families in the colony west of the Brazos and to warn them to hasten to cross the Brazos and fall behind the protective cover of Houston's army, which was being organized for a strategic retreat before the approaching enemy army, led by General Santa Anna. The rest of the story is history.

James Monroe Hill continued with Houston's army, and was one of those of extreme youth who served valiantly in the battle that won independence for Texas. In his later years he served as President of the pendence for Texas. In his later years he served as President of the Texas Veteran Association, was instrumental in inducing the State of Texas to purchase the battlefield as a State memorial park, and served as chairman of the commission appointed by Governor Culberson to locate and effectuate the purchase of the battlefield by the State of Texas. this work he was assisted by his son, George A. Hill, Sr., who served as secretary of the commission.

After the victory at San Jacinto, the Hill family and their neighbors and relatives turned to more normal pursuits, but Indian depredations made life on this frontier a matter of constantly recurring haz-Unorganized as well as organized Indian warfare was a matter of

great frequency.

In 1839, As a resettled his family in Fayette County, near Ruters-ville, leaving the family homestead, the original two-story cedar log mansion in Washington County, to his older son, William C. J. Hill and his first wife, Elizabeth Bowering Jack. There were four children born of this marriage. When he was 55, following the death of Elizabeth Hill, William was remarried to Amelia Williams, of Americus, Georgia, of which union there were 12 children.

In 1855 William C. J. Hill erected one of the first meeting houses, (Mount Olivet Presbyterian Church), on this plantation, and was superintendent of Sunday School. He wrote a letter to the press describing its

progress for the inspiration of other potential colonists.

Gay Hill was named after William Carroll Jackson Hill and his friend, Thomas October 6, 1859. Thomas Gay. W. C. J. Hill was appointed its first Postmaster

The continuance of appropriate education of their children was one of the great problems in the daily lives of these early families, and they therefore welcomed and supported the Rutersville College, organized nearby in honor of the Reverend Martin Ruter, one of the first Methodist missionaries who had been sent to Texas. Through the energetic zeal Reverend Chauncey Richardson, a charter was obtained for Rutersville College from the Republic of Texas, with a donation by the Congress of the Republic of four leagues of land for the benefit of the college. The Reverend Chauncey Richardson became its first president. The roster of this college, for its first term (1840), included the following children of Asa and Elizabeth Hill: Monroe Hill (James Monroe Hill); Asa Collingsworth Hill; John C. Hill; Sarah Anne Hill; Mary Anne Rebecca Hill; Martha Anne Eliza Hill; Susanna Amanda Hill; and Louisiana Elizabeth Hill, as well as a little Mexican fifer boy captured at San Jacinto by

James Monroe Hill, and whose name was Joseph Mendes. This little Mexican boy was offered the option of returning to Mexico, but he expressed a preference for remaining in Texas, and he lived with and was educated by

Asa and Elizabeth Hill.

In February, 1839, Colonel John H. Moore, in an engagement with the Comanche Indians on the San Saba River, had suffered a repulse, and in August, 1840, the Comanches had made a serious invasion of the peaceful settlements. Necessity required that this Comanche menace be removed and destroyed; therefore, Colonel Moore, with two companies of volunteers, captained by Thomas J. Rabb and Nicholas M. Dawson of Fayette County, undertook an expedition far up the Colorado River to effectively suppress the savages. James Monroe Hill became one of these volunteers and participated throughout this Indian Campaign. A Comanche village near Colorado City was subjected to a surprise attack by Moore's command, resulting in one hundred and thirty Indians being killed. No fatalities were suffered on the part of the volunteers, although a number were wounded. This proved to be a most decisive campaign, which it was felt

the former Comanche massacre at Lynnville.

In 1842, during the second administration of General Sam Houston as President of the Republic of Texas, the republic was again invaded by a Mexican army under General Woll, which resulted in the capture and occupation of San Antonio. President Houston authorized the enlistment of an army to repel the invasion, under the command of General Somervell, and a number of volunteers from Fayette County hastened to the points of mobilization, including Asa Hill and two of his sons, Jeffrey H. Hill and John Christopher Columbus Hill, the latter a small boy thirteen years of age. Before taking leave, the youngster's older brother, James Monroe Hill, gave him the rifle he had used at the Battle of San Jacinto extracting from him a promise that he would not let a Mexican have it. The expedition proceeded overland, suffering every kind of hardship, to the little border town of Laredo, and thence down the Rio Grande River opposite the little Mexican village of Mier (pronounced "Meer"). A number of this expeditionary force, under General Somervell, withdrew at this point, in the face of a Mexican army under the command of General Ampudia, but those remaining, who numbered less than three hundred, were determined to occupy the town of Mier and conquer the tremendously superior forces arrayed against them; and these were commanded by William S. Fisher and Thomas J. Green. The town was occupied by the Texans, and there was a bitter engagement throughout the 25th and 26th days of December, 1842, which finally resulted in the capitulation of the Texans under the terms of a truce. At the point of capture by the Mexican army, when it came his turn to stack his arms, little John Hill broke his rifle in two on a nearby stone. As he placed the pieces on the stack, he was heard to say "I have kept my promise." His small size and the bravery of his act won the hearts of his Mexican captors.

In this engagement the Texans exhibited great heroism, but none more so than the little boy, John Christopher Columbus Hill. His conduct in this battle, and the subsequent chapters of his romantic life, have been preserved to Texas history in "The Boy Captive of the Texas Mier Expedition," written by Mrs. Fanny Chambers Gooch Iglehart, in "Recollections of Mexico," by J. Waddy Thompson, the American ambassador, and in various other historical works. In 1937 the brilliant historical pageant "Cavalcade" of the Texas Centennial Celebration at Dallas prominently featured this episode. William Preston Stapp kept a journal which was published in Philadelphia in 1845 under the title "The Prisoners of Perote," and in this journal, on page 83, he recalls having met little John Hill at

Matamoros, en route to Mexico City, and described him saying:

"Little John Hill, thirteen years old, a brave and handsome little fellow, was afterwards liberated by Santa Anna, who has since charged himself with his education and has him now at school in Mexico. Through this partiality he is said to enjoy with the usurper, his brother and father (who likewise belonged to the expedition) were successively released and money provided them with which to reach home. He frequently visited us in our confinement, expressing the keenest solicitude for our welfare and the most earnest hopes of our speedy deliverance. This was the boy whom the

newspaper accounts of the Battle of Mier represents to have killed seventeen Mexicans. He behaved with the gallantry of a veteran throughout that bloody fight, and we daresay, from the deliberation and the frequency of his shots, added largely to the enemy's loss."

It will be recalled that the Mier prisoners were marched overland to the Rancho Salado below Saltillo, where a general escape was attempted, in punishment for which the recaptured prisoners had to submit to the famous drawing of the beans. One hundred and seventy-six beans were placed under a crock, among which were 159 white and seventeen black beans. As each prisoner drew a bean therefrom, each one having drawn a black bean was condemned to death by musketry. Asa Hill drew a white bean, but N. J. McD. Thomson, drew a black bean and was, at the hour of twilight, shot to death by musketry before an adobe wall with sixteen other companions. Jeffrey Hill, who was wounded, was then at Matamoros

under quard.

Meanwhile, John C. C. Hill was sent on to Mexico City by his admiring captor, General Pedro Ampudia, under special escort and presented to General Santa Anna, who was again the President of the Republic of Mexico, and both General Santa Anna and his wife became attached to this diminutive and courageous little Texan. At an audience with Santa Anna granted to him, there were present General Jose Maria Tornel, Secretary of War, and President of the School of Mines of Mexico City (the Mineria), and General Gomez Farias, who was the Commandant of the Military Academy at Chapultapec. John Hill had declined Santa Anna's importunity that he consent to adoption, but was at this audience given the choice of being enrolled in the School of Mines under General Tornel or in the Military Academy under General Farias. He selected the School of Mines, and had a brilliant career therein, subsequently graduating and becoming one of its professors. After the Mier prisoners, including the father and brother, had reached Mexico City and were sent for imprisonment to the Castle of Perote, he consented to adoption by General and Senora Santa Anna, conditioned upon the parole of his father and brother and a boyhood playmate, Harvey Sellers, who was one of the Mier prisoners. Shortly thereafter, Santa Anna's abdication as President of Mexico occurred, and John Hill became a member of the family of General Tornel, who was a distinguished and cultivated Mexican soldier, statesman and historian, and whose paternal affection and solicitude for him continued throughout the remainder of his long and useful life in the Republic of Mexico.

The State of Texas erected a monument to the memory of the heroes of the Republic of Texas who resided in and near Fayetteville, which was dedicated December 9, 1936, bearing the following inscription:

FAYETTEVILLE Stage Station on the Old San Felipe Trail Founded by James J. Ross, John Crier, James Cummins Members of Austin's First Colony Nearby Resided William J. Russell Participant of the Battle of Velasco Jerome B. Alexander Fedelia Breeding James Monroe Hill Veterans of San Jacinto Andrew Crier Wm. Hill Dr. Wm. P. Smith of San Jacinto Campaign Asa Hill Jeffrey B. Hill John C. C. Hill Member Mier Expedition Erected by State of Texas.

Geo. A. Hill, Jr., the great grandson of Asa Hill made the dedicatory address at the time this monument was unveiled. He told his assembled audience that one of the happiest experiences of his life had been when, during the summer of 1935, he visited in the City of Mexico, Luis Tornel, a distinguished lawyer, the son of General Jose Maria Tornel. He to expressed again his family's appreciation to General Tornel and his family for their outstanding kindnesses to John Christopher Columbus Hill, whom the fortunes of war had thrust into their midst, and who had been received by the Tornel family in generous and affectionate custody as one of their very own.

Even as Asa and Elizabeth Hill had taken into their own home and educated at Rutersville College the little Mexican fifer boy, Joseph Mendes, captured by Asa's son, who was quite young himself at that time, at the Battle of San Jacinto, even so did fate decree that Asa's own son, John C. C. Hill, as a captive of the Mexicans, should receive the kindness and paternal care of General Santa Anna and General Tornel and have the advantages of an education in the famous School of Mines in Mexico City, thereby procuring the release and parole of his father and broth-

er, Asa and Jeffrey Hill, from the dungeons of Perote Prison.

History records that in later years John C. C. Hill was enabled to repay the kindness to him of General Ampudia, who had sent him on to Mexico City from the town of Mier under special escort and with glowing accounts of his bravery. At the time of the fall of the Empire of Maximilian and Carlotta in 1867, General Pedro Ampudia and his brother were adherents of the Empire, and were imprisoned and awaiting execution. John Hill, who at the time enjoyed the friendship and the confidence of President Benito Juarez, interceded in their behalf and procured their pardon and release. At that particular time, John Hill was being visited in Mexico City by his brother, Asa Collingsworth Hill, who later returned to John's former home in Fayetteville with an account of this extraordinary experience.

In the war between the United States and Mexico, Asa Collingsworth Hill had commanded a spy company on the border, and in the war between the States, James Monroe Hill and his two eldest sons, James Leonidas Hill and John W. Hill, as well as his brother, William C. J. Hill, served

in the Confederate Army.

After Texas was annexed to the United States, another appointment was given to William C. J. Hill in 1862 by the State of Texas, Washington County, making him a commissioner for the Gay Hill Beat, for the purpose of looking after the comfort and necessities of the families of soldiers then in the Confederate Army. He reported to each regular term of Court what he had furnished each family from time to time, for which he was

reimbursed by the Court.

In the battle of San Jacinto there was also engaged the first cousin of James Monroe Hill — Isaac Iafayette Hill, whose name is inscribed upon the monument erected by the State of Texas at Round Top, and who had a distinguished career in the later period Texas history. He was a brother of Benjamin Harvey Hill, Georgia's great statesman (a boyhood schoolmate and cousin of James Monroe Hill in Hillsboro, Georgia) who served in the Senate of the Confederacy and in the Senate of the United States before and during the era of reconstruction following the war between the States. Senator Hill first opposed secession, but, after the event, became its ardent champion. Isaac Iafayette Hill presided over the meeting of Texas Democrats gathered at the site of the San Jacinto Battlefield on April 21, 1860 (two days before the meeting of the National Democratic Convention at Charleston, South Carolina, on April 23, 1860) at which Texas Democrats presented the name of Sam Houston (who also opposed secession) to the country as "the people's candidate for the presidency." Resolutions were adopted at the battlefield conventions looking toward the preservation of the Union and opposing matters creating internal discord. It is interesting to record that the government of the Confederacy established, in its judicial system, two Federal judicial districts in Texas, and another brother, a distinguished lawyer, William Pinckney Hill, was appointed to this Federal Judgeship of the Confederacy by President Jefferson Davis.

No, there was no way in the world that Ralph Hill, traveler from Somerset, England, to New England in 1632, could have envisioned -- even

by the farthest flight of his imagination -- where that same venturesome spirit that he possessed would take his descendants in the next two and one-half centuries, indeed that it would move the Hills of New England to the plains of Texas, and beyond.

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METRO PAST

The following news items of early years are reprinted with the permission of the $\underline{\text{Dallas}}$ $\underline{\text{Morning}}$ $\underline{\text{News}}$, (our own headings added in parentheses).

Feb. 26, 1886 - (JUST A SMALL TOWN PICKPOCKET, AFTER ALL)

The widow of Col. Fred Barnaby, of the Royal Horse Guards, is about to remarry. Mrs. Barnaby is related to have been somewhat unhappy in her first marriage because of the towering ambition of her liege lord for adventure and exploration. On one occasion when she pleaded with him to yield some of his time to his wife, he endeavored to arouse her ambition in the direction of travel and discovery. It is to be hoped the new husband will not expect the wife to do any more exploring than the pockets of his wearing apparel may afford.

March 3, 1886 (IT TAKES TWO TO TANGO!)

T. Schreder, a sausage maker, was making a pistol play in Meyer's Garden at a late hour Saturday night, to end which a policeman was telephoned for. Schreder took the hint, mounted his horse and galloped off, coming into collision with Tom Anderson's hack. The police of the hack struck him in the mouth . . . The unfortunate man is suffering severely from the wound.

March 14, 1886 (EUCHRE, ANYONE?)

Miss Emma Taber gave a progressive euchre party on Tuesday evening at her home on Corsicana and Evergreen streets, in honor of Misses Anna and Katherine Deere, two charming and vivacious young ladies from Moline, Ill. The affair, although entirely impromptu, was very skillfully managed by the young hostess, and proved highly delightful to the invited guests.

March 19, 1886 - (A TALL STORY - BUT NO EXCUSE!)
Charles Wood and John Ryan were fined the regulation amount yesterday by
Justice Kendall on the charge of tramping. They were rounded up in the
river bottom by Deputy Sheriff Haskell. Woods is 6 feet 9-1/2 inches
high, but he did not make that an excuse for the deadly sin of sloth. It
is said that a couple of hundred tramps dwell in the river bottom at no
great distance from the city, where, like the ancient Numidians, without
settled habitations, they feel free as the wind, and can accommodate
anything to their digestion that would spoil the stomach of a coyote.
They have not, however, lost their taste for spring chickens, as may be
observed from the bones which these fowls, having ventured too close to
the camp, have left behind them.

March 25, 1886 (HO HUM)

W. M. Gunnell, a merchant of Marlin, is very much impressed with the liveliness of Dallas and the commercial spirit prevailing here. The life upon the streets and the magnificent new buildings that are going up on every hand can not but impress a visitor, although the citizen may become used to this.





SPINKS AND ALLIED FAMILIES, compiled by Jackson Kindred Morgan, 403 Allen St., Thomaston, GA 30286, Copyright, 1984. Donated by Mrs. Andrew Schroder in memory of Annie Blanche Swanzy, wife of Frederick Mathew Tange. 215 pages, including everyname index; plus 28 pages of pictures; 6 x 9"; hard cover.

Descendants of Enoch Spinks, Sr., possibly the son of John Spinks of Fairfax Co., VA, who married Amy and died ca 1772, Randolph Co., NC. The descendants of John Spinks, born ca 1750, who married Sarah Baker ca 1770, NC, and died ca 1800 Lincoln Co., GA, are given. This book also covers the descendants of Enoch's son, Rev. Enoch Spinks, Jr., and his wife Elizabeth Needham. He was born 1762, NC, and died 1842, Randolph Co., NC.

The chapter on allied families gives further information on an individual that did not fit comfortably in the format. Notes are given in the text to see the allied family. Key to generations chart makes it easy to follow descent.

David Morgan, born 1779, NC, married Elizabeth Rylee, b 1783, VA. He died 1857, Hall Co., GA. Chapters are given on the descendants of the following children of this couple: Sarah Morgan, who married Alexander Johnson: Kindred Morgan, who married Sarah Thompson Mann; James M. Morgan, who married Elizabeth Howington; Polly Morgan, who married Samuel Nunn; Wilson Morgan, who married Louise Allen; John Morgan, who married Amanda Rice; and Miriam Morgan, who married George Hanes; and others.

The following children were named, and their marriages and children's names are given, with no further information on these: Nancy Morgan, who married Guy W. Allen; Margaret Morgan who married William W. Rouse and William W. Morgan.

Information on allied families that was not appropriate for the text was given in a separate chapter. These included: Rev. James Rylee, Sr.; James Mann, Sr.; Burk or Burke Bible; David H. Starling; John Edward Johnson, included in Bible record; and John Sewell. Key to generations chart

makes it easy to follow descent fdrom David Morgan and Elizabeth Rylee.

This issue includes Marriages from MD, VA, PA, IL, MO, and KS; Baptism and Birth Records from MD and PA; Cemeteries and Death Records from MD; PA; MO; OH; and IL. The time periods covered are from 1772 to 1922. Many FrederickCo., MD, records are referenced.

Sources of information are given, making it helpful to anyone searching this surname. If you have a Lehman ancestor who is not listed, this book will be at least help you by showing what has already been searched.

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SOME DEFINITIONS

(from Antique Week of Knightstown, Indiana - formerly known as the Tri-State Trader)

DEED: A legal document containing the record of a transfer, as of real estate, or of some bargain or contract.

CHRISTEN: To baptize, or name at baptism or other ceremony. INDENTURE: A deed or agreement in writing, usually in duplicate, the parts originally being notched or cut so as to match; contract binding an apprentice to a master.

COLONIAL RECORDS: Indenture and apprentice records, tavern petitions and account books are among business and employment records that researchers should consider when seeking family data of the Colonial Period.
