Our Quarterly has been carrying a good deal of material that will Our Quarterly has been carrying a good deal or material that will be valuable for future research use — but I feel it would be of more general interest to our members if all of this excellent Courthouse material were interspersed with articles written by our members on "How I solved this or that problem!" "How I interested my family in genealogy," solved this or that problem!" "How I interested my ramily in genealogy,"—and when we have a particularly good speaker at our meetings, if a copy could be provided to the quarterly for reprint purposes, wouldn't that be of interest? This is your quarterly—and if you can send in some interesting material for publication—every member of our society

can benefit by it.

In our September quarterly last year, I urged people to send in their family charts, feeling if there were sufficient interest we might be able to plan a new publication of our member's ancestors — as Collin County has just done (see our Book Review Section). Perhaps you missed my request, but if you'd like to see this family information published, please send in your 5-generation chart for that purpose. I have received only three or four of them, and while I haven't begun working on them, I will be retiring from my working career as a legal secretary as of March 1st, and now, more than ever before, I can anticipate being able to work on your charts. Be sure hey are dated, so that if you have sent any earlier on which you might now have updated information, we will be sure to use the most recent and complete. You will remember that we issued such a publication five years ago — and there are many charts in our files that were not received in time to be included. We will need to determine how many of those charts are from our present members -include any address changes -- and decide whether to include the charts of past members. It would probably not be advisable to use them, as earlier members may have moved to some other city or state, and the purpose of such a publication is to allow each of us to contact others

researching the same family lines.
Our Dallas County Marriages will run for at least one more issue but those that are being published were excerpted from records at the Courthouse by a team headed by Clytes Cullar five years ago. They were later re-checked for accuracy at the Courthouse. Very shortly I will arrive at a place in the files where those records have not been rechecked, and unless another team is formed for that purpose, it may be deemed advisable to hold up on printing them until they are rechecked. On the other hand — these are taken from handwritten records — and sometimes I wonder if the first person who checked them might not be just as accurate as the second! It's often just a matter of interpretation! If you have any genealogical material that would be interesting to include in the quarterly, please send it in! In the meantime, see you

at the library!

P. Crum's; tracts sold equal 829 acres. Signed 3 Jan 1852, Recorded 19 Mar 1852, Witt H. P. Crum, L. A. Massey. A. Harwood, Clk.

P. 93: On 29 Mar 1852, D. F. Rose deeded to Elias T. Myers, both of Dallas, Texas, in consid of \$300. 100 acre tract, part of a league surrepatented in name of John Little, adjoining land sold to Myers by John Little. Clk: Alexander Harwood.

P. 96: On 31 Mar 1852, Rufus and Elizabeth S. Burnett, deeded to Anna Duval, all of Dallas Co, TX, in consid. of \$200, Lot \$1, in Block 18, Town of Dallas, Dallas Co., TX.

P. 97: On 27 Mar 1852, James E. Patton, Deputy Surveyor, Robertson Land District, on instruction of P. K. Rawlins and Stephen C. Atteberry, Commissioners appointed by Chief Justice at January Term of Probase Court, 1852, to divide and partition land of heirs of Marady Parkes, Deceased. Section 9, Township 3, South Range I East, as surveyed by Peters Colony, divided thusly:

P. 99: John N. Bryan and wife, Margaret Bryan, in consideration of \$100 on 2 Apr 1852, deed to L. W. L. Hodges of Dallas Co, Lots 1, 2, 7 and 8, in Block 29, Town of Dallas, Dallas Co., Texas. Clerk: A Harwood, Dallas County Clerk.

P.100: Hannah S. Simmons, a resident of Lincoln, TM, on 1 Apr 1850 in Lincoln Co., TM., gave Power of Attorney to William M. Lehard of Dallas, Texas through Henry Kelso, Clerk of Lincoln Co. Court. William B. Rhea, Chairman and Justice of County Court of Lincoln certified that Henry Kelso is Clerk of Lincoln Co., TM Court. Mrs. Simmons, for herself and for herself as guardian of her infant children, appointed William M. Lenard attorney for following purposes: "My husband and father of my infant children, James A. Simmons and my son Joseph Simmons, emigrated to the State of Texas in the year 1846, settled in Peters Colony as colonists. My son Joseph, over 17 years old — husband and son shortly after settlement died, and left myself and infant children destitute. I was compelled to abandon my husband's location in colony and return to the State of Tennessee." Wm. M. Lenard was appointed to prove claims to headrights and obtain patents. Mrs. Simmons signed by mark. Filed in Dallas County by A. Harwood, Clerk of Dallas Court.

Includes certification of Andrew Vannoy, Clerk for Bedford Co., TN by H. F. Holt, Chairman of County Court of Bedford County, TN. Also certificates of H. F. Holt as Chairman of County Court cos Bedford County, TN by A. Vannoy, Clerk of Bedford Co., TN.

Fp. 104-105: John N. and Margaret Bryan deed to James W. Bryne, all of Dallas County on 2 Apr 1852 (recorded 5 Apr 1852), in consid of \$50. Lots 1 and 2 of Block 20. Wit: A. Harwood, Clerk.

Pp. 105-106: William Foreman and wife, Susannah Foreman, on 22 Jan 1850, (recorded 5 Apr 1852) granted Power of Attorney to John Hoffman to acquire patent for headright as Colonist of Peters Colony. 640 acres known as Colonist headright. Pp. 108-109; Jane Wilson, in consid of \$1,400. on 8 Apr 1852, deeded to James Horton, also of Dallas County, TX. two tracts of land, one on the East and one on the West side of Mountain Creek, a tributary of the East and tract contains 640 acres located by virtue of the Headright Certificate of A. B. Wilson, obtained by immigration and tract of land owned by Wm. O'Guinn. who resides there. P. 125: Everhard Sharrock, in consid of \$1,300. on 6 Apr 1852, deeded to Harrison Hustead, also of Dallas, Texas, a parcel of land lying in the County of Dallas and State of Texas containing 640 acres more or less claimed by Everhard Sharrock as his headright as a settler in Peters Colony. Shelton, of Dallas, Dallas Co, TX 320 acres of land on West side of Trinity River, part of the David Patterson Survey #1. Headright certificate belonged to Josiah Beatty, patented on 26 Mar 1844. P. 136: William C. Ellis, of Caldwell Parish, LA, in consid of \$640. on 20 Apr 1852 (Recorded 2 May 1852) deeded to Abner N. JAMES AND RICHARD AYCOCK, THEIR DESCENDANTS, EARLIEST SETTLERS OF WILKES COUNTY, GEORGIA, Compiled by Jame Everline Aycock, Bill Winston Aycock, PARTS I AND II, and Frances Aycock Bednar, PARTS III, 1985. This attractive book has perfect binding, soft cover, 8-1/2 x 10-3/4", 192 pp. plus an Addendum of 6 pages. Order from Mrs. Frances (W. C.) Records of the Aycock name begin in North Carolina as early as 1740 having originated in the 17th Century from Lichfield, Castle Bromwicke, Aldridge, Acock's Green. Brentwood and London, England. The interesting story is presented in Part One: William Aycock, Part Two: James Aycock; Part Three: Richard Aycock; Part Four: Winifred Aycock; Part Five: Aycock Soldiers of the Confederacy; and concludes with Chapter Notes, listing references for all entries, Aycock Surname Index, and Related Surname Index. This book is well done, and gives much information to those interested in the Aycock family.

THE BROOKS OF VINGINIA, by Bruce Montgomery Edwards, 1985, published by Gateway Press,Inc. 6-1/4" x 9-1/4", hard cover, 342 pp. May be ordered from Montgomery Publishing Company, P. O. Box 5503, Knoxville, TN 37918, \$19.50 each, tax and postage paid.

This book is a history as well as a genealogy of the Brooks families who came from England to Virginia in the 1600's, soon after the first permanent settlement in America. Beginning with Peter Brooks, immigrant to America in 1638 and Richard Brooks, Sr., who was born in Virginia in the middle or late 1600's and made his Will in Bssex County in 1703, there is a continuous record of the Brooks families for 350 years or more, down to the present time. Many branches are followed in detail, rather than a narrow line, giving broad coverage of all that has been learned about many families that is verifiable. The Index contains 1,746 names, of which 543 are Brooks. There is much detailed information about families who have intermarried with the Brooks or have directly affected their lives, including 76 Agees, 61 Garretts, 40 Nuckols, etc., even including names of 49 slaves of the many owned by Brooks families during the slavery period. All who are interested in the Brooks name will find this a good book for your library, your children and your grandchildren.

The Coos Turnpike in Coos County, New Hampshire, on which work was begun in the Spring of 1807, was a toll road, a short but important link in a chain of incorporated highways planned to connect the upper valley of the Connecticut, Northern Vermont, and the Canadian Provinces Will the set to the set of Putsmouth, Newburnt, and the Canadian Provinces Will the set in New York William of Putsmouth, Newburnt, Warshall's Imm in Plaistow on the last Tuesday of March, 1764, voted to assist Haverhill in clearing the road through Haverhill to meet the road from Portsmouth. This is understood to have been along the route over which the Turnpike was later built. The development of the Coos Turnpike as described in this 18-page article, makes for most interesting reading. You will want to add this to your collections on New England.

Isaac Page, and 12. William Bailey, among others. An interesting volume about the captioned families which needs to be read very carefully to be absorbed.

This most attractive book has a Foreword, an introduction, and an extensive index of 41 pages, with an interesting sketch of Warren County, Kentucky, 1797, on the frontispage. The remaining 105 pages contain the carefully abstracted beed Records of Warren County, Kentucky, compiled by Joyce Martin Murray from microfilm provided by the Kentucky, compiled by Joyce Martin Murray from microfilm provided by the Kentucky State Library and Archives. These records were particularly meaningful to the compiler, who is the Newsletter Editor for the Dallas Genealogical Society, since she found her Virginia-born ancestors among the few early surviving records in the attic of the present Simpson County, Kentucky, Courthouse, and found a two-page abstract in the family files in the Kentucky Library at Western Kentucky University at Bowling Green, Kentucky, She has one more volume of the Warren County records in prospect. Mrs. Murray has rendered a valuable service by making these records available to other Kentucky researchers, of particular interest to all whose roots extend back to Warren County, Kentucky, during the time period of 1797 to 1812.

This book is beautifully presented, and is a delight in its loving tribute to the family history and genealogy of the Stimson family, which the authors have lovingly dedicated to their parents, John Wesley Stimson

and Caroline Alexandra Neely Stimson and their descendants. The "Stage" is carefully set for the book by the Preface, written by Dula A. Stimson, 1982, followed by the fascinating story, told in narrative style, in five parts, of John and Caroline Stimson and their lovely children. There is a two-page index. The inclusion of many family photographs, family records, pictures of tombstones and burial sites, newspaper clippings makes the book even more interesting. Of particular note is the photograph of "Our Ancestral Chisholm Castle" — the "tumbled down" Ancestral Chisholm Castle in Chisholmshire on Loch Ness, near Inverness, Scotland. The many stories of the interesting events that filled the lives of these parents and their nine children — three sons and six daughters — plus all their relatives, are nostalgic, and especially interesting, delineating, as they do, the lives of this family r in a unique and readable format. The American Revolution through the Civil War are presented. Interestingly, the Civil War Record of John Ieroy Neely may be obtained by calling Miss Vernelle Stimson at (214) 691-4730. Miss Stimson is a retired teacher from Armstrong School, in Highland Park, a most interesting person with whom to talk. The family record that she and her sister have compiled will provide a real "plus" experience for all by whom it is read.

BIBLE RECORDS

The following Bible Records are copied from the Vertical Files of the Genealogical Section, Dallas Public Library, a repository of interesting information which might be helpful to our members in their family research. The Bible carrying these records was published in 1817, being "The Holy Bible containing the Old and New Testaments: together with the Apocrypha. Translated out of the original tongues. With former translations diligently compared and revised. By Command of His Majesty King James I. of England, with Marginal Notes and References. For Which are James 1. Or England, with Marginal Notes and Reterices...of which are Added, An Index, an Alphabetical Table of Names in the Old and New Testaments, with their Significations, Tables of Scripture Weights. and Coins——Philadelphia —— Printed and Published by Mathew Carey, Mar-ket Street, 1811." The entries contained are in varied hands, with some of the early recordings predating the publication date, done in a script reminiscent of calligraphy.

October 29, 1885

Tom Patton, who was jailed a few days ago on the charge of horse stealing in the Indian Territory, arrived clad in only a light vest, pants, shoes, shirt and hat. Gen. Cabell heretofore furnished clothing in such cases, but he has been warned from Washington not to do so again without the necessary red tape . . . (so that) the poor prisoner must expect to freeze to death if some kind friend does not come to the rescue.

Nov. 18, 1885

"A shooting affray occurred at 11 o'clock last night in a small house in East Dallas, owned by George Hawkins, in which the beauty and chivalry of the city folk were engaged in dancing. The owner of the establishment taunted a young buck with not being able to dance, and his friends took it up. Then there was a general fussing and screaming for a frew minutes which terminated in one of the parties seizing a convenient shotun and using it with horrible effect. the first shot only taking effect in the roof of the house, but the second lodged in the rear of a man named Champion Beasley, riddling his organs of generation."

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METRO PAST - From files of THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS

May 1, 1887 -

A feeling of sadness was experienced throughout the city yesterday on the announcement of the death of Col. John C. McCoy... Coming to Dallas in 1845, in connection with the Peters Colony movement, (he) acquired popularity, and on the breaking out of the Mexican war took an active part in forwarding troops to the front. His was the first frame house erected in Dallas, and it stood on the East side of the public source.
