A number of expressions of appreciation are in order, not only this quarter, but each quarter during which I have been your editor, for the wonderful assistance offered by various members. First and foremost, to Marjorie Radley, your former Editor (1984-85), who has continued to prepare the Acquisition Lists for publication, and thus has considerably lightened the load of preparing each quarterly; then also to Margaret Ann Thetford, who obtained approval of THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS for us to use their "Metro Past" publications of items from their back files as fillers, and to THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS for allowing that use. Thanks also to Jeanne Tabb, who consistently supplies interesting material, such as the early Tarrant County census material published in our December quarterly which had been found mixed on the reel with the Ellis County microfilmed census. Thanks to Pat Hatcher, who has helped by alphabetizing our Dallas County Marriages; and to Pat Hatcher and Robert Johnsey, who have helped your editor, a neophyte computer operator, a great deal with numerous problems which have arisen.

Our Quarterly has been carrying a good deal of material that will be valuable for future research use -- but I feel it would be of more general interest to our members if all of this excellent Courthouse material were interspersed with articles written by our members on "How I solved this or that problem!" "How I interested my family in genealogy," -- and when we have a particularly good speaker at our meetings, if a copy could be provided to the quarterly for reprint purposes, wouldn't that be of interest? This is your quarterly -- and if you can send in some interesting material for publication -- every member of our society can benefit by it.

In our September quarterly last year, I urged people to send in their family charts, feeling if there were sufficient interest we might be able to plan a new publication of our member's ancestors -- as Collin County has just done (see our Book Review Section). Perhaps you missed my request, but if you'd like to see this family information published, please send in your 5-generation chart for that purpose. I have received only three or four of them, and while I haven't begun working on them, I will be retiring from my working career as a legal secretary as of March 1st, and now, more than ever before, I can anticipate being able to work on your charts. Be sure they are dated, so that if you have sent any earlier on which you might now have updated information, we will be sure to use the most recent and complete. You will remember that we issued such a publication five years ago -- and there are many charts in our files that were not received in time to be included. We will need to determine how many of those charts are from our present members -- include any address changes -- and decide whether to include the charts of past members. It would probably not be advisable to use them, as earlier members may have moved to some other city or state, and the purpose of such a publication is to allow each of us to contact others researching the same family lines.

Our Dallas County Marriages will run for at least one more issue -- but those that are being published were excerpted from records at the Courthouse by a team headed by Clytes Cullar five years ago. They were later re-checked for accuracy at the Courthouse. Very shortly I will arrive at a place in the files where those records have not been re-checked, and unless another team is formed for that purpose, it may be deemed advisable to hold up on printing them until they are rechecked. On the other hand -- these are taken from handwritten records -- and sometimes I wonder if the first person who checked them might not be just as accurate as the second! It's often just a matter of interpretation!

If you have any genealogical material that would be interesting to include in the quarterly, please send it in! In the meantime, see you at the library!

JAMES AND RICHARD AYCOCK, THEIR DESCENDANTS, EARLIEST SETTLERS OF WILKES COUNTY, GEORGIA, Compiled by Jane Everline Aycock, Bill Winston Aycock, PARTS I AND II, and Frances Aycock Bednar, PART III, 1985. Records of the Aycock name begin in North Carolina as early as 1740 having originated in the 17th Century from Lichfield, Castle Bromwicke, Aldridge, Acock's Green, Brentwood and London, England. The interesting story is presented in Part One: William Aycock; Part Two: James Aycock; Part Three: Richard Aycock; Part Four: Winifred Aycock; Part Five: Aycock Soldiers of the Confederacy; and concludes with Chapter Notes, listing references for all entries, Aycock Surname Index, and Related Surname Index. This book is well done, and gives much information to those interested in the Aycock family.

This book is a history as well as a genealogy of the Brooks families who came from England to Virginia in the 1600's, soon after the first permanent settlement in America. Beginning with Peter Brooks, immigrant to America in 1638 and Richard Brooks, Sr., who was born in Virginia in the middle or late 1600's and made his Will in Essex County in 1703, there is a continuous record of the Brooks families for 350 years or more, down to the present time. Many branches are followed in detail, rather than a narrow line, giving broad coverage of all that has been learned about many families that is verifiable. The Index contains 1,746 names, of which 543 are Brooks. There is much detailed information about families who have intermarried with the Brooks or have directly affected their lives, including 76 Agees, 61 Garretts, 40 Nuckols, etc., even including names of 49 slaves of the many owned by Brooks families during the slavery period. All who are interested in the Brooks name will find this a good book for your library, your children and your grandchildren.

Four pages - A-Z. This sparkling current publication has been beautifully designed, planned and executed, and is ready for immediate delivery. You will want a copy for your own use. The Society has Volume II in preparation for Fall delivery.

**HISTORY OF COOS TURNPIKE**, by Harold S. Bryant. 8-1/2" x 10-3/4", 18 pp. with card stock, soft cover. Published for the author posthumously by Charles D. and Edna Townsend, 1985, it may be ordered from Aceto Bookmen, 5721 Antietam Drive, Sarasota, FLA 33581, at \$4.00 per copy.

The Coos Turnpike in Coos County, New Hampshire, on which work was begun in the Spring of 1807, was a toll road, a short but important link in a chain of incorporated highways planned to connect the upper valley of the Connecticut, Northern Vermont, and the Canadian Provinces with the seaport towns of Portsmouth, Newburyport, Salem and Boston. The Proprietors of Newbury, at a meeting held at Marshall's Inn in Plaistow on the last Tuesday of March, 1764, voted to assist Haverhill in clearing the road through Haverhill to meet the road from Portsmouth. This is understood to have been along the route over which the Turnpike was later built. The development of the Coos Turnpike as described in this 18-page article, makes for most interesting reading. You will want to add this to your collections on New England.

This book has the Family Chart of Neal Morris, husband of the compiler, born 29 July 1920, Grand Saline, Texas, used as end papers. It includes a Foreword, an Introduction, a Table of Contents, but does not include an index. It is illustrated with photographs and copies of documents, and moves from Texas back through time into Alabama, revealing the generations from 1. Neal Morris, through 2. Albert Neal Morris, 3. Isaac Morris, 4. John Morris, Sr., 5. Elijah Morris, 6. Benjamin Morris, plus the interesting possibility of 7. Ignatius Flowers (with possible roots from early Pasquotank and Symons Creek Quaker Meeting Minutes). 7. Joseph Morris, 8. Aaron Morris, 9. John Morris, 10. John Morris/Morrison, 11. Isaac Page, and 12. William Bailey, among others. An interesting volume about the captioned families which needs to be read very carefully to be absorbed.

**DEED ABSTRACTS OF WARREN COUNTY, KENTUCKY, 1797-1812**, compiled and edited by Joyce Martin Murray. Published by Henington Publishing Company, 1985. This most attractive book has a Foreword, an introduction, and an extensive index of 41 pages, with an interesting sketch of Warren County, Kentucky, 1797, on the frontispiece. The remaining 105 pages contain the carefully abstracted Deed Records of Warren County, Kentucky, compiled by Joyce Martin Murray from microfilm provided by the Kentucky State Library and Archives. These records were particularly meaningful to the compiler, who is the Newsletter Editor for the Dallas Genealogical Society, since she found her Virginia-born ancestors among the few early surviving records in the attic of the present Simpson County, Kentucky, Courthouse, and found a two-page abstract in the family files in the Kentucky Library at Western Kentucky University at Bowling Green, Kentucky. She has one more volume of the Warren County records in prospect. Mrs. Murray has rendered a valuable service by making these records available to other Kentucky researchers, of particular interest to all whose roots extend back to Warren County, Kentucky, during the time period of 1797 to 1812.

**OUR STIMSON CLAN AND KIN**, by Eula Abigail Stimson and Alexandra Vernelle Stimson. Published 1985, by Henington Publishing Company. 8-1/2" x 11", 482 pp. Hard cover. Order from Vernelle Stimson, 6415-B West Northwest Highway, Dallas, Texas 75225. \$25.00 postpaid.

This book is beautifully presented, and is a delight in its loving tribute to the family history and genealogy of the Stimson family, which the authors have lovingly dedicated to their parents, John Wesley Stimson

and Caroline Alexandra Neely Stimson and their descendants. The "stage" is carefully set for the book by the Preface, written by Eula A. Stimson, 1982, followed by the fascinating story, told in narrative style, in five parts, of John and Caroline Stimson and their lovely children. There is a two-page index. The inclusion of many family photographs, family records, pictures of tombstones and burial sites, newspaper clippings makes the book even more interesting. Of particular note is the photograph of "Our Ancestral Chisholm Castle" -- the "tumbled down" Ancestral Chisholm Castle in Chisholmshire on Loch Ness, near Inverness, Scotland. The many stories of the interesting events that filled the lives of these parents and their nine children -- three sons and six daughters -- plus all their relatives, are nostalgic, and especially interesting, delineating, as they do, the lives of this family in a unique and readable format. The Military Records of all in the family and among the relatives from the American Revolution through the Civil War are presented. Interestingly, the Civil War Record of John Leroy Neely may be obtained by calling Miss Vernelle Stimson at (214) 691-4730. Miss Stimson is a retired teacher from Armstrong School, in Highland Park, a most interesting person with whom to talk. The family record that she and her sister have compiled will provide a real "plus" experience for all by whom it is read.

As revealed in the Foreword, The Log is a story of those things that happened in the late 1830's and early 1840's. Myron Webb recorded history as he saw it develop, telling of his times in Indiana and Ohio, as well as his trip back East to his home in Connecticut. A most interesting block print of Myron Safford Webb precedes the Contents, which are as follows: 1. "Ancestry of Myron Safford Webb," developed by Charles D. and Edna Townsent, accompanied by a two-page chart. 2. "Notes on the Life of Myron Safford Webb," by George McK. Roberts. 3. "The Log Book of Myron Safford Webb, 1840," 25 pages transcribed by George McK. Roberts, 1956, from the original Log Book. 4. "Original Letters of Myron Safford Webb, written by him to his Family back East, Dec. 7, 1837, Mar. 12, 1837, June 23, 1837, and September 22, 1838, from Harrison and Elizabethtown. Supplied by Indiana Commission on Public Records (16 pages plus drawn copy of Whitewater Canal 1836-1847." 5. "Historical Data on Whitewater Canal," supplied by the Brookville Town - Township Library. 6. "Photocopy of the Original Log Book in Myron Safford Webb's handwriting from each transaction was taken, and enlarged from the original 12%." (43 pp.) followed by a four-page index. ## B I B L E   R E C O R D S

The following Bible Records are copied from the Vertical Files of the Genealogical Section, Dallas Public Library, a repository of interesting information which might be helpful to our members in their family research. The Bible carrying these records was published in 1817, being "The Holy Bible containing the Old and New Testaments: together with the Apocrypha. Translated out of the original tongues. With former translations diligently compared and revised. The entries contained are in varied hands, with some of the early recordings predating the publication date, done in a script reminiscent of calligraphy.

The owner of the establishment taunted a young buck with not being able to dance, and his friends took it up. Then there was a general fussing and screaming for a few minutes which terminated in one of the parties seizing a convenient shotgun and using it with horrible effect. The first shot only taking effect in the roof of the house, but the second lodged in the rear of a man named Champion Beasley, riddling his organs of generation."
