INTRODUCTION

These abstracts are from obituaries, death notices, marriages and biographical sketches published in the Southwestern Presbyterian, New Orleans, Louisiana, for the dates given herein.

The Southwestern Presbyterian began publication February 25, 1869 and continued through December 30, 1908, after which time it merged with The Central Presbyterian and The Southern Presbyterian to form The Presbyterian of the South.

Published weekly, these papers were four pages each. The marriages and obituaries were usually on page three, but not always. Biographical sketches, memorials and tributes were likely to be found on almost any page.

Although only a few, if any, obituaries and marriages were published in each issue, they were from a large area. Most were from Louisiana, Mississippi, Florida, Alabama, Arkansas and Texas, with a few from Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, South Carolina and elsewhere. While the majority of individuals, in the abstracts, were Presbyterian, some were of other denominations.

The microfilm used for these abstracts was filmed for the American Theological Library Association, Board of Microtex Project, 1971. Microfilm copies were obtained through The Historical Foundation of The Presbyterian and Reformed Churches, Montreat, North Carolina. Memorial for Mrs. L. E. Russell. The death of Mrs. Louisa Emily Russell, occurred at her father's residence in Hinds Co., Miss., on Saturday morning, Feb. 5, 1870 at the age of 36 years, 9 months and 21 days. At the early age of 12 she made public consecration. She became a member of "Old Bethesda" in which her venerable father is still a Ruling Elder. By bearing for a second time, the

loss of her husband, and by having the cares of a numerous and dependent family, this trial of her faith was much more precious than gold that perisheth, though it was tried with fire.

3 March 1870, Vol. II, No. 2

Rev. John McCulloch. Again has death invaded the Presbytery of Western Texas, and now we have to record the death of another beloved brother, Rev. John McCulloch. He expected, in a day or two, to resume the duties of his school, in Prairie Lea, and his ministerial duties to the Church; but on Sunday evening, Jan. 16th, he was taken with an attack of apoplexy, and in a few minutes expired. He was a native of Chester Co., Pa.; was born April 3d, 1805, and was at his death, nearly sixty-five years of age. He received his collegiate and theological education at Princeton, under the fathers of that school of the prophets, Alexander, Miller and Hodge. Early in his ministerial life he came to Texas. In 1835 he landed at Galveston, and spent some time there, and organized the First Presbyterian Church of that city. He then removed to Columbia, on the Brazos river, and preached and taught there for about five years. From thence he went to San Antonio, and organized the Church there, and labored at that place for some time. San Antonio, at that time, was the headquarters of a numerous band of black-legs and desperadoes. (NOTE by abstractor: Details of entering the San Antonio area given.) From San Antonio he went again to Galveston and founded a large female Seminary. He in connection with two sisters conducted it with success for five year; when the city was visited by a severe epidemic of Yellow fever. He family suffered very much from it. He lost his two sisters and a nephew and niece. And as a result his school was broken up, and he never resumed it. He went from Galveston to Ohio, and spent two years in preaching to two Churches in Muskingum county. He returned to Texas in 1859, and settled in Burnett Co., above Austin. He preached in that destitute region as he had opportunity, up to the time of his removal to Prairie Lea, in 1869. In 1808 he came to New Orleans, just five years after the cession of Louisiana to the United States, and just four years before she passed from a territorial condition into the Federal Union. The Dallas Genealogy Society is completing its 35th year as a society and the Dallas Quarterly is celebrating the completion of 35 years of publication.

In Volume I, Number 1, dated February 21, 1955 is a Statement of Purpose that is still valid and essentially the same as stated on the Society Page, page ii of this current issue. Library Acquisitions are also given; the first book mentioned is THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF'S GUARD: Carlos E. Godfrey. The society was organised as THE LOCAL HISTORY AND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY and the journal of the society named THE QUARTERLY.

In Volume X, Number 1 a listing of the heroes of the Alamo is given indicating their former residence. In Number 4, the society announced rules for the Annual Book Award, the first of which was to be presented May 22, 1965. Dues were \$6.00 a year in 1964.

By Volume XXV, Number 1, the acquisitions list has grown to eleven pages. In issue Number 4, Oak Cliff Cemetery Burials by William L. Crawford is started. By this year, 1979, the name of the Society has been changed to The Dallas Genealogical Society and the distinctive ancestral tree logo is on the cover of the Quarterly. Dues were \$10.00 a year in 1979.

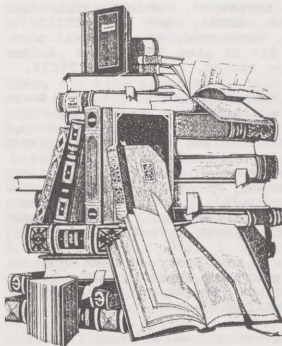

BOOK REVIEWS

THOMAS THOMPSON AND ANN FINNEY OF COLONIAL PENNSYLVANIA AND NORTH CAROLINA. Jane Gray Buchannan. 1987. Hardbound, 6" x 9", 416 pages. Name indexed. \$29.95 + \$1.50 P&H. Order from the author, 114 Berwick Drive, Oak Ridge, TN 37830.

This book is subtitled "Lawrence, Closs and John Thompson. Allied Lines of **FINNEY, MccALISTER, BUCHANAN, and HART**". It begins with Thomas and Ann Finney Thompson who were married in Lancaster County, PA around 1738. They moved to Orange County, NC in 1753. With eight children and fifty eight grandchildren, this quickly becomes a large family which the book traces with great diligence for up to six generations. The index contains over 8000 entries, with major surnames other than those previously mentioned being: **BIRD, JONES, LAWRENCE, ROUNDTREE, TINNIN, TURRENTINE, WALKER, WARREN, and WHITSETT**

This is a scholarly and thoroughly detailed book. It is nicely organized and printed, and is of good quality. My only problem was that there is so much information packed into four hundred pages that it is difficult to assimilate it all. Even use of the Henry numbering system (Thomas is 1, his children are 11, 12, 13, etc., his grandchildren are 111, 112, 113, etc.), didn't make it very easy for me to find my way through a monumental maze of Thompson and related family histories. My hat is off to the author for doing as good a job as she did in covering so much material.

ADAM MARTIN AND THOMAS ROY MUSICK--ST. LOUIS COUNTY MISSOURI PIONEERS (THEIR ANCESTORS, DESCENDANTS, AND RELATED FAMILIES--HILDEBRAND, PIERA, ROY AND NEVILLE). Michal Martin Farmer. 1989. Hardbound, 6" x 9", xii plus 678 pages. Name indexed. \$37.00 plus \$2.00 P&H. Order from Michal Farmer, P. O. Box 140880, Dallas, TX 75214.

Adam Martin (1755-1835) and Mary McMillan (1762-1850) were born in Pennsylvania, married in 1778 in Augusta County, Virginia, and later moved to St. Louis County, Missouri. They had 9 children, 77 grandchildren, and over 260 great grandchildren. Although their descendants are scattered across the entire nation now, most of them currently live in Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas. Several different up and down branches of Adam and Mary's family are covered in this book, but the main stream is the descent through their second son, David, who married Sarah Musick.

There are close to 8000 names in the index. In addition to those named in the title, the most frequently appearing surnames are: HAWKINS, JOHN, McBEE, MILLER, SMITH, STRAUSSER, TRUSTY, and WILLIAMS.

Because of the book's excellent organization, it didn't take me long to determine that no ancestors of mine were mentioned. But I would enjoy working with this volume. Many interesting stories accompany the names and dates, and the book is enlivened by quite a few pictures, documents, and maps. The numbering system is very easy to follow and quite helpful. Especially impressive were the handy three-generation charts inside the covers. They gave a clear, concise picture of Adam and Mary Martin's descent in the front, and David and Sarah Martin's issue at the back.

OUR YESTERDAYS (MAGEE HISTORICAL GENEALOGY). Mabel Magee Tompkins and Odelia Magee Walker. 1989 Hardbound, 6" x 9", 226 pages. \$25.00 plus \$1.50 P&H. Order from Veda Magee, 711 N. Mason, Bowie, TX 76230.

This family history begins with David Magee who was born in Scotland in the 1780's. He emigrated to America where one of his grandsons ultimately made his way to Montague County, Texas. OUR YESTERDAYS documents the descent of this grandson, W. H. Magee.

This book has lots of individual biographies, is well spiced with family stories and anecdotes, and has many good quality photographs. It is attractively printed and bound, and has the makings of a volume which family members will treasure. Unfortunately, the lack of an index seriously reduces the book's value for research purposes.

HARDIE, VINCENT, GAINES AND RELATED FAMILIES FROM VIRGINIA TO TEXAS. Robert M. Clark, Jr. 1989. Hardbound, 9" X 11", 377 pages. Name indexed. \$30.00, postpaid. Order from the author, 4627 North Central Expressway, Dallas, TX 75205.

There are nine sections in this book. The first three are devoted to the surnames appearing in the title. Next come five appendices: Ancestral Service Records, Hardie Bible Records, Ancestral Charts, Photographs, and Applications for Patriotic Organizations. Section nine is the index.

The Hardie story begins with John Hardy, who lived in Prince George County, VA in the early to mid 1700's. His issue is traced to Ambrose Gains Hardie (the author's maternal great grandfather), born in Chattanooga, Tennessee in 1867 and died in Dallas, TX in 1943. Not only does Section I cover this line, but it also contains sub-sections on the following maternal branches: ARCHER, COLEMAN, FEATHERSTONE, GURGANY, HANCOCK, HARGRAVE, HARRIS, JONES, LIGON, MARSHALL, MAYO, MOSELEY, MOSS, TANNER, WALTHALL, WORSHAM, and WYNNE. Each sub-section has a brief narrative description of family members with the particular surname. Sources are documented in footnotes at the end of each sub-section.

Vincent and Gaines were the surnames of A. G. Hardie's maternal grandparents. These names are handled in Sections II and III, including the following related branches: ACUFF, LEIGH, BOHANNON, DALTON, GREGORY, HURT, JOUETT, MOORE, PENDLETON, AND TAYLOR.

Appendix C, the six generation ancestor chart for A. G. Hardie, was very helpful in tying all these lines together. Close to half of the book (167 pages) is taken up with copies of applications for patriotic organizations which appear in Appendix E.

As you can tell, the layout of this book is unusual. For the most part, it comes off rather well. The narrative style is clear and easy to read. With double spaced lines of print and extra wide margins, page appearance is clean and uncluttered. Documentation is handy and looks to be quite thorough. Best of all for me, the author's Moseley line turned out to be the same as mine, and provided me with some new data. I was sorry that the redundancy of the applications in Appendix E detracted from my otherwise high opinion of the book.

BEGINNING YOUR FAMILY HISTORY IN GREAT BRITAIN. George Pelling. 1987 (4th Ed) Softback, 5½ x 8½", 64 pages. \$7.50.

The purpose of this little book is to provide the beginner with basic information needed to carry research back to the sixteenth century in Great Britain. Each record type is covered in a separate chapter which includes the names and addresses of the repositories where it can be found. If you are in the initial stages of launching an attack on your British ancestral records (or perhaps a previous assault has bogged down), having this small volume in your hip pocket could help create a winning strategy.

THE A - Z GUIDE TO TRACING ANCESTORS IN BRITAIN. F. C. Markwell and Pauline Saul. 1989 (3rd Edition). Softback, 5½" x 8½", 224 pages. \$14.95.

If you were checking family records in England, how would the "Poor Law" affect your research? And what are Chancery Proceedings? What's the PRO, and where is it located? The answer to these questions, plus everything else you ever wanted to know about these curious British terms (but did not know where to ask) can be found in this alphabetized genealogical glossary. For any researcher in Great Britain, it makes a perfect companion to the preceding reference.

FAMILY DISEASES--ARE YOU AT RISK? Myra Vanderpool Gormley. 1989. Hardback, 6" x 9", xii + 165 pages. \$14.95.

Here's an interesting twist to put on your family history effort. Let me quote from the advertising flyer: "While geneticists have long been interested in genealogy and genealogists in genetics, only recently have the two fields become linked in a way that promises dramatic advances in our understanding of the relationship between genetic disorders and ancestry. This book is an effort to explore the relationship, to alert you to things you and your family ought to know about both your family tree and genetic research, and to examine the scientific breakthroughs that have made possible much more effective control and treatment of inherited disease." There is a tremendous amount of medical and genetic information packed in this book, but it is easy to read and I found it to be an interesting dissertation.
