

EDITORIAL POLICY

The editor of *The Dallas Quarterly* welcomes manuscripts of TEXAS material and material of an unusual but useful nature for proposed publication. All manuscripts should be sent to:

Editor, The Dallas Quarterly, P.O. Box 12648, Dallas, Texas 75225

Manuscripts should be typed on standard-sized paper with the author's name on each page, and each page should be numbered. Please include a cover letter giving permission of the author to publish the material in *The Dallas Quarterly*. When sending photocopies of original old manuscripts, such as handwritten Bible records, please include a typed transcript.

Some types of records suitable for publication include Bible records, Dallas and surrounding county court records (i.e. marriages, deed abstracts, naturalizations, will abstracts etc.), Texas cemetery inscriptions, "How-To" articles (the use of special collections, holdings of a particular repository, etc.), abstracts from Texas newspapers and brief family genealogies with Texas connections. The Editor makes the final decision on material to be published. Following publication, all original material is placed in the Genealogy Section of the J. Erik Jonsson Public Library, located on Young Street in Dallas. Every effort is made to present authentic material, but the Dallas Genealogical Society cannot be responsible for the accuracy or the publishing rights of the material furnished by contributors.

The Dallas Genealogical Society is a nonprofit, federally tax-exempt organization. Individuals, libraries, or societies may apply for membership. Annual dues are \$12.00 for the calendar year if paid by January 31, after January 31st they are \$14.00. All members receive the quarterly journal and the newsletter with membership.

QUERIES: Queries do not require a Texas connection and are free to the members of the Dallas Genealogical Society. Nonmembers should include \$3.00 for each query. To eliminate correspondence and delay, we reserve the right to abbreviate and condense. Queries will be printed in the DGS Newsletter.

BOOK REVIEWS: Upon receipt of a gratis copy donated to the Dallas Genealogical Society, books that are currently in print and available for sale will be noticed in *The Dallas Quarterly*. After review, the publication will be placed in the Genealogy Section of the J. Erik Jonsson Public Library. All books to be reviewed should be sent to the Dallas Genealogical Society along with complete ordering instructions.





BOOK REVIEWS

Upon receipt of a gratis copy donated to the Dallas Genealogical Society, books that are currently in print and available for sale will be noticed in THE DALLAS QUARTERLY. IRISH AND SCOTCH-IRISH ANCESTRAL RESEARCH. Margaret Dickson FALLEY. Originally published in 1962. Reprinted by Genealogical Publishing Company in 1981, 1984, and 1988. Hardbound, in two volumes, 6" x 9" each, 813 and 354 pages respectively. Indexed. \$60.00 + \$3.50 P&H. Order from Genealogical Publishing Company, Inc., 1001 North Calvert Street, Baltimore, Md. 21202.

This two volume set comprises an exhaustive and comprehensive guide to the genealogical records, methods of research, and information sources in Ireland, Ulster included. Volume I contains three parts: Preliminary Research in the United States, Repositories of Records, and the Records themselves (a clearly titled chapter is devoted to each of the twenty four kinds of records covered). Volume II is divided into bibliographies of Published Material, Unpublished Family Records, Genealogical Research Reference Material, Materials in the United States, and Microfilm.

With almost twelve hundred pages of printing, you can see there is a tremendous amount of material available here. I found it to be well organized and easy to find topics of interest. For those doing serious research anywhere in Ireland, here is an excellent reference work which should meet all your needs.

DESCENDANTS OF JAMES AND ELIZABETH FLEMING FER-GUSON, BEDFORD COUNTY (NOW MARSHALL), TENNESSEE. Herman W. FERGUSON. 1988. Softbound, 8 1/2" x 11", 135 pages, map, illustrations, full name and place index. \$16.00 + \$1.50 P&H. Order from the author, 600 Chad Drive, Rocky Mount, N.C. 27803.

In this book, James and Elizabeth FERGUSON are first seen in Iredell County, N.C., about 1800. They moved to what is now Marshall County, Tennessee, about 1807, and had eleven children. The first third of this book is devoted to in-depth biographical sketches of the two principals and four of their key descendants. The remainder is an eight generation descendant chart, briefly listing key dates, places, and events for a thousand or more family members. It is an attractive, well documented work.

The index is said to contain 2000 place and person names, with the most frequently occurring surnames being: ALFORD, ARNOLD, BRITTAIN, BROOKS, BROWN, BUCHANAN, COLE, CREIGHTON, DUDLEY, FLEMING, GILLESPIE, GILLIAM, HARRIS, HUGHES, IRELAND, JONES, LAWRENCE, LOVELL, MORGAN, MORRIS, POE, POWERS, REYNOLDS, STEPHENS, STEWART, THOMPSON, TUR-BEVILLE, WILLIAMS, YETZER, and ZIMMERLE. If you have Ferguson blood, or a Tennessee relative with one of the above surnames, this book could be a help to you.

MY FLOVILLA. Eugenia LINCH. 1988. Softback, 6" x 9", 105 pages. \$8.00 + \$2 P&H. Order from HaSk, 4306 Bretton Bay Lane, Dallas, Texas 75287.

Eugenia LINCH was born in Flovilla, Georgia in 1907. This delightful little book contains her recollections of small town life during the very early part of this century. It is organized in twenty four charming essays which have titles like "The Buggy Ride," "First Day at School," and "Miss Theresa's Hats." In the course of telling these stories, three generations of the Linch family are documented. However, you needn't have a Linch connection to enjoy a very pleasant trip three-quarters of a century back in time.

FURTHER UNDERTAKINGS OF A DEAD RELATIVE COLLECTOR. Laverne GALEENER-MOORE. Illus. by Randy CALHOUN. 1989. Softback, 5" x 8", 167 pages. \$9.95 + \$1.50 P&H. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, Md. 21202.

Written by the author of COLLECTING DEAD RELATIVES, this book is a similar compilation of whimsically amusing discourses on several aspects of genealogical research. Chapter titles include such themes (all most likely familiar to each one of us) as "Curses! An Unidentified Photograph!," "Oh, Granny, Where Can Your Ashes Be?," and "Scatter! It's a Computer!." I found the writing to be consistently humorous and occasionally downright outrageous. Here's the perfect gift for a genealogist who has everything, but $y \circ u'$ ll find if funny yourself.

JOHN HOOKS (1801-1859) AND HIS DESCENDENTS. Barbara Carlsson SAMUELS. 1988. Softback, 8 1/2" x 11", 196 pages + 19 pages of name index. \$25.00, incl. P&H. Order from the author, 7805 Linda LANE, Anchorage, Alaska 99518.

John HOOKS, born 13 October 1801, spent the first 38 years of his life in Georgia. He and his first wife, Elizabeth CULLIFER, had seven children before moving to Alabama in 1839. There Elizabeth died after giving birth to number eight. John next married Caroline DOWLING, by whom he had six more children. With fourteen offspring in the second generation, you can see we're off to a good start on one big family! Mrs. Samuels has done a beautiful job documenting and presenting John's first six generations. I was doubly impressed to realize that it's her husband who is the Hooks descendant.

This is a very easy book to follow. Each generation has its own chapter, with complete documentation at the end. Every individual's line of descent from John Hooks is shown with the first appearance of their name, e.g., Charles Bryant SAMUELS (Linnie 4, Emma 3, John F. 2, John 1), is the author's husband, and son of Linnie, a fourth generation descendant. Children are listed under their Hooks descendant parent with consecutive Roman numerals preceding each child's name. An Arabic number appearing before the Roman numeral identifies a written sketch about that child in the following chapter on the next generation. Over 500 surnames and 3300 individuals are listed in the Index. Some of the more frequently mentioned surnames are: DAVIS, DEHART, DOWLING, GREEN, HUTCHISON, MERCER, PASCHAL, PEACOCK, SAMUELS and WADE. The author's address attests to how far the family has scattered, but I noted a high proportion of Texans. A sprinkling of photos and copies of documents, plus lots of descendency diagrams, raised my interest level. All in all, I found this an excellent example of a family record. My only complaint was with some of printing; it looked like part of the index and some of the charts were done on a printer that needed a new ribbon.

This book begins with Matthew WATSON, who emigrated from Ireland to Leicester, Mass. in 1718. It covers nine generations of the family, bringing it to the present day. In addition, there is a section devoted to female ancestral lines. The early part of the book is based upon **HISTORY AND GENEALOGY OF THE WATSON FAMILY**, by Julia Draper Watson BEMIS, 1894. The current authors have added to the Bemis book as much as their documentation allows.

The same identification system is used as was described above in reviewing the HOOKS work. The generation of each individual is indicated by a superscript number, and the line of descent follows parenthetically. Children are numbered consecutively with small Roman numerals under their parents, and an Arabic number by a child's name leads to a biographical write-up of that child in the next generation. This certainly makes it easy to go up and down the lines of descent, and this is a nice book to work with.

About 800 surnames and 2500 individuals appear in the two indexes (one Watson, one for female ancestral lines). The place name index shows most of them in Massachusetts, Texas and California. The most frequently mentioned surnames include: ALLIBONE, ARMINGTON, BAGBY, BICKNELL, CONFER, DRAPER, KIMSEY, LATIMER, LIVER-MORE, and STEVENS. The book is nicely printed, has twelve quality reproductions of family portraits, and is obviously carefully documented. Unfortunately (for me, anyway), most of the references are inserted parenthetically in the biographical write-ups, a practice I find very distracting.

OUR FAMILY HISTORY: MAYES - KELLOGG (Also COLEMAN, HICKMAN, HIGHTOWER, ROBB, SHERRY). Madilyn L. (Coen) CRANE. 1989. Softback, 8.5" x 11", 332 pages. Indexed. \$42.50 + \$2.50 P&H. Texas residents add \$1.80 sales tax. Order from the author, 614 Copper Ridge Drive, Richardson, Texas 75080.

We have our Quarterly editor to thank for this fine example of a family history. MAYES and KELLOGG were the surnames of Madilyn Crane's maternal grandparents. In the book, the Mayes line is recorded for six generations, beginning with James and Mary Booth Mayes of Bath County, Va., in the late 1700's. The Kellogg story starts with Oliver and Judith Scratch Kellogg in New York and Canada during the early 1800's. Their descendants, is well as members of the other families mentioned in the title, made their way to Shelby County, Missouri, where they became interrelated. All families are well represented in that area to this day, and many of them made valuable contributions to Mrs. Crane's book.

Over 4,000 names are listed in the index. many of these individuals are described in fascinating narrative, or documented with extensive records. As a minimum, Family Group Sheet data is given for everyone,

and all sources or contributors are listed. 166 pictures of good quality complete a book that present day family members and other interested genealogists will cherish.

Since this is a history of several interrelated families, it neither descends nor ascends from a single individual. Normally I would have trouble keeping so many lines straight, especially since there are no charts or relationship-indicating numbering system. Mrs. Crane has eased this problem considerably with a Table of Contents much like a descendent chart for each family. Also, her own data base record numbers are available to help sort through people with the same name. The page layout is attractive and easy to read, and I thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to become acquainted with the author's family.

THE RIVAL LOVERS. William Ferguson SMITH. Edited by Harriet Stovall KELLEY. 1980. Hardbound, 6" x 9", 186 pages. \$10, ppd. Order from the editor, 4306 Bretton Bay lane, Dallas, Texas 75287.

W. F. SMITH, the editor's great-grandfather, was born in 1845. After service in the Confederate Army during the Civil War, he wrote his own history of that era in the form of a novel, THE RIVAL LOVERS. It was serialized in Mr. Smith's newspaper in 1877, and lay rolled in a bundle of newspaper clippings for nearly a century. Harriet Kelley has edited and annotated the manuscript for its publication.

This in not a genealogy book per se, but rather a Civil War history written from a first hand perspective. It is a good resource for someone interested in knowing what the everyday life of a Confederate soldier was really like, but I find the typical nineteenth century writing to be somewhat tedious.

Each book tells about a particular kind of record and where it can be found. They were all compiled and edited by Jeremy GIBSON, are softback, 5.5" x 8.5", and can be purchased from Genealogical Publishing Company, 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, Md. 21202. P&H for the first book is \$2.50; each additional book is \$1.00.

BISHOPS' TRANSCRIPTS AND MARRIAGE LICENCES, BONDS AND ALLEGATIONS. 1989 (2nd Edition). 32 pages. \$5.00 + P&H. Subtitled "A Guide to their Location and Indexes." After a brief introduction describes the records, there is a section for each shire, listing all record offices therein and what each contains.

PROBATE JURISDICTIONS: WHERE TO LOOK FOR WILLS. 1989 (3rd Edition). 62 pages. \$7.50 + P&H. Contains an explanation of probate documents and procedures, and a glossary. Each shire has a

write-up listing all record offices, what they contain, and including a simple locator map.

MARRIAGE, CENSUS, AND OTHER INDEXES FOR FAMILY HIS-TORIANS. 1989 (3rd Edition). 44 pages. \$6.50 + P&H. A brief explanation of how to use the indexes is followed by listings of which ones are available in each shire and where they are located.

QUARTER SESSIONS RECORDS FOR FAMILY HISTORIANS. 1989 (2nd Edition). 32 pages. \$5.00 + P&H. The Records of Quarter sessions (courts) are the oldest public records in England and Wales. This book gives the types of court records and their location for each shire.

LOCAL NEWSPAPERS 1750-1920 - ENGLAND AND WALES; CHAN-NEL ISLANDS; ISLE OF MAN. 1989. 64 pages. \$7.50 + P&H. A listing of all newspapers, how long they have been published, and where they are located. Arranged by shires.

CENSUS RETURNS 1841-1881 ON MICROFILM - A DIRECTOR TO LOCAL HOLDINGS IN GREAT BRITAIN, CHANNEL ISLANDS; ISLE OF MAN. 1989 (5th Edition). 56 pages. \$7.00 + P&H. Shows what is available in each shire. Scotland is included in the 4th Edition, even though it's not in the title.

UNPUBLISHED PERSONAL NAME INDEXES IN RECORD OF-FICES AND LIBRARIES. 1989 (2nd Edition). 40 pages. \$6.00 + P&H. Where to find indexes of names from marriage, probate, church, tax, etc., records in each shire.

RECORD OFFICES: HOW TO FIND THEM. Compiled with Pamela PESKETT. 1989 (4th Edition). 56 pages. \$7.00 + P&H. 97 maps designed to help the researcher find any record office. They show major thorough-fares, parking, railway stations and bus stops, museums, libraries, cathedrals, and other prominent landmarks.

All of these booklets appear to me to be very handy and worthwhile for serious researcher in Great Britain. They are light and small, which is good for carrying, but which makes the print unusually fine.

ABSTRACTS OF PARKER COUNTY TEXAS PRE-EMPTION LAND RECORDS, 1850 - 1858. Jerry Wright JORDAN. 1988. Softback, 5" x 8", xvii + 199 pages. Indexed. \$15.00 + \$2.50 P&H. Order from Heritage Books, 1540E Pointer Ridge P., Suite 300, Bowie, Md. 20716.

Parker County, just west of Ft. Worth was first settled in the 1840's and was created in 1855 from parts of Milam, Robertson, and Denton Land Districts. The Surveyors of each of those land districts made copies of all the surveys in their offices and sent them to the Parker County Surveyor who maintained the records thereafter. This book contains abstracts of these and subsequent surveys, which take on special sig-

nificance because of a fire in 1874 which destroyed all deed, probate, and other court records of the previous nineteen years. (The survey records were saved by a deputy surveyor who was sleeping in the building at the time.)

Beside genealogically detailed abstracts of 1850-1858 surveys, the book contains facts about Texas Land Grants and Parker County, and five historical maps of the area. Also included in a transcription of the petition requesting creation of the county, and a copy of the legislative act which did so. About 1500 individual names are listed in the index. Although the print is a little small, it is of excellent quality, and with slight breaks between each abstraction, the book is easily read. I particularly enjoyed the 1845 and 1850 maps of the area.

METRO PAST - DALLAS MORNING NEWS

8 November 1885

In the Mayor's Court yesterday Jim MADDOX and John FOX, for galloping through the city, were fined \$1 and costs each. Tom CHANEY suffered to the extent of \$3 for seeing the elephant double. Mike CAREY's name was called for a like offense but he was reported to be seeing blue lights and rusty razors...at the city hospital.

7 August 1886

The city underwent a shock yesterday upon the announcement, which an investigation proved to be true, that Rufus LINN, the 17-year-old son of W.C. LINN of East Dallas, had been accidentally and probably mortally wounded under the following circumstances: George N. BEACH, under whose house a cat supposed to be suffering from rabies was cutting up, invited Officer TALBOT to shoot the beast. The office declined to do so. Mr. BEACH then stooped down, and holding the pistol in both hands, fired at the cat. He missed the cat, but the ball struck a rock and glanced at an angle of about forty degrees and struck young LINN under the right shoulder blade.

28 August 1887

Allen TOE and H.A. HARBOR, who were arrested for obstructing the street by extracting telephonepole stumps, were discharged yesterday by the recorder.

13 February 1888

Mr. James SKELTON is reported to be the holder of a tenth of the ticket that drew \$20,000 in the Louisiana State Lottery last Tuesday.

23 May 1888

Seven or eight head of Spanish ponies were rounded up and impounded by Officers WAILER and Dick BEARD yesterday.

18 June 1888 Mrs. Juliana ENGERS was tried yesterday in the County Court on the MARCH, 1989

charge of lunacy and was adjudged sane. The history of this case is shaded with something of the romance of medieval barbarism.

27 August 1888 A.R. NELSON reports that his room at Mrs. CONNOLLY's house on Sycamore street was burglariously entered Saturday night, and his clothes relieved of \$20.

2 September 1888 Miss Rachel HAUSMAN was yesterday stung on the neck by a stinging lizard, which caused her great pain.

3 September 1888

An ice cream festival will be given Tuesday night by the chosen friends at the residence of Mrs. THOMAS, corner McKinney avenue and Pearl streets, the proceeds to go to the North Dallas Baptist Sunday school.

3 October 1888

Yesterday about 10 o'clock, as Mrs. W.A. KNOX, wife of secretary and treasurer of the Farm and Ranch publishing company, was walking on Elm Street, half of a brick fell from the third story of the new building that is in course of construction for Col. James B. SIMPSON and struck her on the back part of the head.

12 November 1888 Will BRITTON fell through the Houston and Texas Central bridge at the foot of Poydras street yesterday afternoon, fracturing his right thigh.

23 November 1888

The practical talk last night by Mr. W. M. CROW to the young men's christian association was attended by more than thirty young men and was an entirely satisfactory discussion of the question, "What is Success?"

8 September 1911

While attending a picnic at City Park yesterday, Everett ZUBER and J. T. EDWARDS, small boys, members of Miss Virginia ROGERS' Sunbeam class of the First Methodist Church, were robbed. The two boys mentioned and Frank SLAGEL, a comrade, went across Gano street from the park and to a pool of water. While in swimming, they claim, four boys rifled the clothing of the bathers. Everett ZUBER lost a stick pin and tie clasp and the EDWARDS boy lost a pair of automobile goggles. Each boy had a small amount of money.

29 June 1912

In a mood of melancholy because of the death of his betrothed, Fritze YANKE took his own life last night at 9 o'clock, firing three bullets from an automatic pistol into his heart. Death was instantaneous. Persons who heard the shots forced their way into his room at 2624 Commerce Street and found him seated in a rocking chair in front of the big mirror.

29 July 1912

Surrounded by his wife and children, Policeman Theodore Alonzo TED-FORD died at St. Paul's Sanitarium yesterday afternoon at 2:50 o'clock from the effects of three pistol bullets fired into his body Friday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock by Leonard POTTS, a young man who, since the hour of the shooting, has been the most vigorously sought person in the State of Texas.

25 November 1912

Clarence LOWERY, a 14-year-old boy, broke his ankle yesterday afternoon about 5 o'clock while playing with a crowd of youngsters in the City Park. The boy was swinging, and in some way caught his ankle so that the momentum of the swing broke the ankle joint. Charles F. WEL-LAND's ambulance carried him to his home at 1511 Nettle street, where he was attended by Dr. J.T. WELLS.

1 December 1912

George F. ROCKHOLD, assigned by President TAFT to the Dallas postoffice, is a native of Dallas County. He was born near Lawson, about eighteen miles from the city. He has been in Dallas ever since he was grown, working for most of the time for a big wholesale grocery establishment. For several years he has been interested in a retail grocery business. He lives at 313 First Avenue.

11 March 1913

Arrangements are being made through Dallas and Eastern capital for the erection of a vaudeville theater within the next few months at the northeast corner of Elm and St. Paul streets. The property is owned by Mrs. S.A. GIBBS of Dallas and a ninety-nine-year lease is being closed for the plot of ground, 100 by 200 feet, with frontage on Elm and St. Paul streets and Pacific avenue. The theater, it is announced, will cost \$250,000.

21 April 1913

Dallas County Woodman of the World executive camp met yesterday afternoon at Woodman Hall on north Harwood street. R.H. McDILL, county president, was chairman. In the absence of Secretary J.D. ALEXANDER the secretaryship was filled by appointment of Will A. HARRIS. There are some forty-eight camps in the county organization and pretty well all of them were represented.

29 August 1913

Riding a unique device of his own, which he calls bicycle skates, Hugh RATTAN reached Dallas last night on a "skating trip" from Fort Worth to Galveston. His "skates" consist of bicycle wheels, set in steel forks with flat foot plates, with the inner side of the fork strapped to his limbs. He claims to have originated the device himself.
