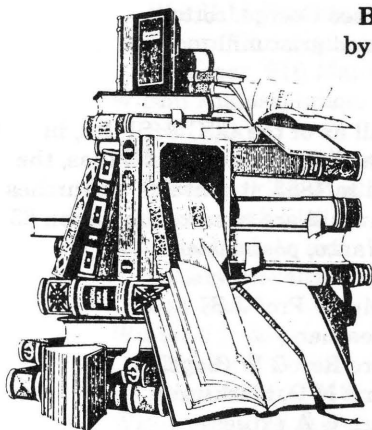

## BOOK REVIEWS

Any book donated to the Dallas Genealogical Society relating to family history or genealogy which is currently in print and available for sale will be reviewed in *The Dallas Quarterly*. The book will be placed in the Genealogy Section of the J. Erik Jonsson Central Library of the Dallas Public Library System. All publications to be reviewed should be sent to the Dallas Genealogical Society together with price and complete ordering information.

The Dallas Genealogical Society is delighted to review two of the winning entries in the 1992 Book Awards Competition. The following books were the best in the categories of Local History and Family History or Genealogy, respectively.

***PIONEERS OF CHICKASAW NATION, INDIAN TERRITORY.*** Nova A. Lemons. 1991. Hardback, 8.5" x 11", vi + 376 pages. Surname only indexed. \$55.00 plus \$3.00 P&H. Texas residents add 8.25% State Tax. Order from the author, 12206 Brisbane Avenue, Dallas, Tex. 75234.

This handsome text is divided into five sections. First comes an informative dissertation on the *History of Chickasaw Nation* in the days prior to Oklahoma statehood. It is followed by complete information on *Research in Chickasaw Nation*, a listing of what genealogical records are available and where they are located. In the section on *Counties*, there is a chapter on each of the thirteen present-day counties carved out of the original Chickasaw Nation. Beside statistical and historical information, these chapters include simple but very legible and informative hand-drawn maps of the counties, plus reflective personal narratives written by present county residents. Titles for these narratives include Tidbits About Life in Garvin County, The Maysville Story, The Chickasaw Capitol Bell, Life in Sulphur, I Remember, and The Story of Velma.

The *Families* section contains over 160 brief family histories in alpha order. These accounts feature whites and blacks as well as Indians. For the most part they were submitted by family members, but Ms. Lemons has written quite a few herself. Lots of family records and a generous display of wonderful old photos add immensely to these sometimes brief, sometimes extensive, but always interesting ancestral stories. Finally, the *Index* lists over 1100 surnames and the pages on which they appear.

It's easy to see why the judges in the 1992 Book Award Competition were impressed, and Ms. Lemons is to be congratulated on a splendid achievement.

She is already at work on Volume 2 which will encompass additional Chickasaw Nation family information currently being channeled to her. Maybe in it she will take pity on me and index by full name; the Chickasaw Nation person in whom I'm interested had the surname Smith!

**THOMAS POWELL IN CHESTER COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA, 1682.** Dawn Powell Cartwright. 1991. Hardback, 6" x 9", 314 pages. Name indexed. \$38.00 postpaid. Texas residents add \$2.96 sales tax. Order from the author, 5131 DeLoache, Dallas, Tex. 75220.

Thomas **POWELL** is the author's ninth great grandfather. He came to Pennsylvania with a group of Quakers in 1682. Almost all of the 6900 people whose names appear in the index are twelve generations of his descendants (a few pages of the book are devoted to other Powell lines). Collateral surnames mentioned frequently include **BAKER, CANFIELD, CORNELIUS, DUVALL, JOHNSON, JOHNSTON, MOORE, ROBERTS, SMITH,** and **WILSON.** During the last three centuries, they have spread through the Midwest and ultimately as far from Chester County as Texas and California.

This exceptional publication was compiled by D.G.S member Dawn Powell Cartwright. The organization of the material is nothing short of outstanding, and the writing is of comparable quality. How each person is numbered, and the display of each person's generation and descent from Thomas **POWELL,** provide an excellent example of the Register System. Use of varying fonts cleanly separates biography, children, and documentnation, and helps make an attractive layout. Working with this resource is easy and a pleasnat experience.

I certainly concur with the Book Awards judges that this is a surperb genealogy; it is one of the best I have had the pleasure of reviewing. ANyone who wants a model to use as they prepare their own genealogical publication can hardly do better than follow Dawn Cartwrights example.

What would you give for Texas denominational newspaper research going back to the 1850's which quickly reveals the mention of any ancestor of yours? Well, my friends, we're about to find out! The Dallas Genealogical Society is pleased and honored to publish **Helen Mason Lu's** superb abstractions of nineteenth century Texas church newspapers. The eight volumes currently available from the Society in **microfiche format only** are:

The abstracts in the above volumes are from marriage and death notices, obituaries, biographical notes, and miscellaneous items of information in Texas denominational newspapers, much of which was published nowhere else. The writing in these abridgments is crisp and lean, but never so terse as to obscure the meaning or flavor of the original material. In fact, I suspect the true essence of the originals is more easily discerned without the excess verbiage so dear to the typical nineteenth century writer. Each volume has its own name index, but the *Cumulative Index* contains more than 20,000 entries and lists all names mentioned in the four Methodist books.

These abstracts actually are fun to read. I had a good time browsing but was also quite impressed with the thoroughness of the work. For instance, items that relate to each other but which appear on different pages are cross referenced in an abstractor's note. Such notes are also used for explanatory comment.

In addition to facts and details, the abstractions are full of interesting insights on life and customs in 19th century Texas. One editor, reporting on the death of Brigham Young, couldn't resist taking one more shot at the evils of polygamy. A reporter writes an extensive and sentimental obituary, but fails to mention any name other than "My mother". As you might expect, the parson's credentials receive almost as much attention in marriage notices as do the bride and groom. For example, the ability of one reverend to speak Choctaw was covered in some detail while the two he was marrying had only their's and their parents' names mentioned.

Mrs. Lu is continuing this marvelous work, and expects to have at least two more Methodist volumes, along with additional Presbyterian and Baptist coverage of the 1880's and 90's, at some point in the not too distant future. Meanwhile I encourage your use of what has already been done.

**SEVIER FAMILY HISTORY.** Cora Bales Sevier and Nancy S. Madden. 1961; reprinted 1991. Hardbound, 8.5" x 11", 576 pages. Indexed.

The sub-title of this volume is "With the Letters of Gen. John Sevier and 28 Collateral Family Lineages". The letters by Sevier number 209; there are 46 he received and 29 written about him or events in which he figured. In addition to the letters, there are enough legends, anecdotes, illustrations, maps and diagrams to satisfy the most avid of readers. Items from the Draper Papers include 1844 interviews with three **SEVIER** sons and a niece. Family records, furnished by more than 500 correspondents, actually begin with Valentine **SEVIER**, John's father, who immigrated to Virginia by 1740. Also covered are the descendants of Valentine, Jr., John's brother (this is Ms. Madden's line). Over 3,000 names appear in the index.

It must be a heavy burden to write a family history that includes someone as famous as John **SEVIER**, Revolutionary War general and first governor of Tennessee. For sure it makes a heavy book! This is one big volume, and it's packed full of information. Unfortunately the information is hard to dig out. There are no charts or individual numbering system. The generation is given with a superscript number but that's not too helpful when most of **SEVIER**'s eighteen (count 'em!) children named sons John, James, and Valentine. Of course if you want to disappear for an extended period, this would be a wonderful book in which to do it.

**FAMILY TREE, 1979 - 1991.** Margaret Ann Thetford. 1991. Available on microfiche (set of 24 sheets) or microfilm (one 16 mm roll). \$25.00 postpaid in either format. Texas residents add 8.25% sales tax. Order from the author, 3725 Mockingbird Lane, Dallas, TX. 75205.

For over eleven years Mrs. Thetford was our harbinger of everything worth knowing in genealogy via her bi-weekly column, **FAMILY TREE**, which appeared in *The Dallas Morning News*. Research information, notices, book reviews, and queries were always informative and entertaining. The 1150 articles she wrote between 10 NOV 1972 and 30 MAY 1991 are now available in either microfilm or microfiche format **with full-name indexes**. Each year's columns are indexed separately, with the exception of the first two years which had been indexed and published jointly as **FAMILY TREE, Vol 1**. Topics and places are indexed in addition to names for seven of the years, and the indexes for all eleven years contain almost 35,000 entries.

What a gold mine! How many times did you see something in **FAMILY TREE** that you meant to keep, but let get away? Now all those illusive names, intriguing titles, and nuggets of information can be recovered! We're deeply indebted to Mrs. Thetford for both the splendid columns in the past and the means to re-access them today.

**WHATLEY GRANDFATHERS, REVISED.** Mary Elizabeth Whatley Jones.

Mrs. Jones states in the introduction that her objective for this book was to trace the descent of her fourth great grandfather, Shirley **WHATLEY** (ca. 1690 - 1779), to the present. Her efforts begin in Virginia and follow a typical migration pattern through the Carolinas and Georgia into Alabama, where she was born in 1914. Most of her attention focuses on the line of Shirley's son, Ornan, but records, presented in generational form, also cover other sons and collateral lines. There are several photos, a few charts, and some facsimiles of old wills. Brief biographies cover the **HEARD, CROOK, PRIOR** and **STRONG** connections. The names of over 700 people appear in the index, one third of which are **WHATLEY**'s.

In spite of its somewhat haphazard organization (e.g., excellent charts clarify a few of the relationships, but most lines do not get such beneficial treatment), it is possible to find one's way through this volume. Those with **WHATLEY** connections will enjoy it.

***GRIER OF SAN FRANCISCO: BUILDER IN THE WEST AND HIS FAMILY 1878 - 1988.*** William M. Grier, Jr. 1989. Hardback, 6" x 9", xxxi + 320 pages. Name and subject indexed. \$29.95 plus \$4.00 P&H. Order from the author, 825 East Speer Blvd., Suite 300, Denver, Col. 80218.

Quoting from the Preface, "My father, William Milton Grier, Sr., was an active participant in the development of the American West." What an understatement! That "active" participation during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries is told in fascinating detail in the first half of ***GRIER OF SAN FRANCISCO***. Woven into the tapestry of this story are the Spanish-American War, 1906 San Francisco earthquake, Hearst gold mines, several major Western construction projects, dealings with names like Giannini, Kaiser and Bechtel, and the 1929 Stock Market crash. The remainder of the book is devoted to biographies of the author and other **GRIER** kin. They involve much less flamboyant subjects, but are no less interestingly told.

**GRIER**, Senior died when his son, the author, was only seven years old. **GRIER**, Junior has done a remarkable job assembling and writing a massive amount of particulars about his father's life, as well as his own and several relatives. The book is essentially biographical, but there are salient genealogical features and information that should appeal to **GRIER** researchers. Among these are fourteen pages of splendid descendant charts covering seven generations of **GRIER, LANNON, FLANAGAN, MCDERMOTT**, and **KNAPP** families. Over 500 individual names and 250 subjects are thoroughly indexed. The genealogist will be able to quickly determine if this book is of interest, if only he or she can avoid becoming entranced by the story!

**LAWS OF TEXAS.** Laws Regulating Marital Rights. An important law under this caption was passed at the late adjourned Session, but not having a copy of it, we give its leading features as follows:

On the decease of either husband or wife, the community property continues as under the former law; the survivor is, however, not required to take out letters of administration; but, by furnishing the Chief Justice of the County with an inventory of the property, the surviving husband or wife may continue in the use and enjoyment of the property, with the full power of selling or otherwise disposing of it. Should the surviving widow, however, marry again, this privilege ceases, and she is compelled to administer or settle the estate as under the former law. Should any heir or creditor, or party interested, become dissatisfied with the management of the property, such party may, by application to the Chief Justice of the County, compel the surviving husband or wife (as the case may be) to give bond and security for the proper management of the estate, so as to protect such heir or creditor, &c., against any loss, or the property may be put into the hands of a Guardian for the benefit of the heirs.

**UNITED STATES CENSUS OF 1850.** Newspapers: Five tri-weekly and 29 weekly papers were printed, in Texas, in 1850 with an aggregated circulation of 771,524 copies, annually. Churches: There were 328 churches in Texas, in 1850, with an aggregate capacity for accommodating 64,000 persons. Of these churches, 70 were Baptist, 5 Christian, 5 Episcopal, 7 Free, 173 Methodist, 47 Presbyterian, 13 Roman Catholic, 2 Union, and 6 of other minor sects. The total value of church property was 206,930 dollars.

"The Dallas Morning News is published by the oldest business institution in Texas.

The history of the Dallas Morning News and its associated enterprises of today began April 11, 1942, in a one-room shack on the sands of Galveston Island. Here the first issue of **THE GALVETON NEWS** came from a hand press, with its four pages measuring 11 by 14 inches.

Dallas was selected as the place of publication and the **first issue of the Dallas Morning News** came from the press Oct. 1, 1885. Soon thereafter The Dallas Herald was absorbed by The News.
