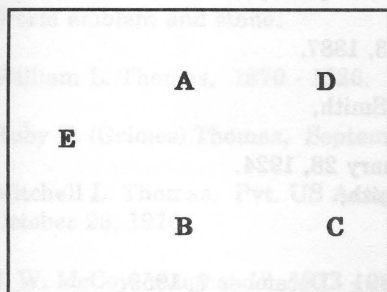
FURNEAUX CEMETERY (CEMETERY HILL) Part II Denton County

Furneaux Cemetery is in Carrollton, in south west Denton County about a mile and a half north of the Dallas County line, on Cemetery Hill Road between Rosemeade Parkway and Sandy Ridge Road. This is a small well kept cemetery that is still in active use after 107 years. The text of the historical marker was given in Volume XXXVII, Number 2.

Apparently, it is laid out in plots, rather than rows and we tried to record it plot by plot. We endeavored to record the stones in each plot together but the boundaries were not always obvious, so some groupings are arbitrary. Sections A, B & C were inventoried during May 1991, Sections D & E were transcribed September 21, 1991.

Abstractors' Note: The cemetery is divided as shown in the diagram, we assigned letters to designate the different parts of the cemetery.

Section D was copied from west to east starting at the southeast corner and moving toward Rosemeade Parkway. Section E has very few graves at this time and was copied from north to south.

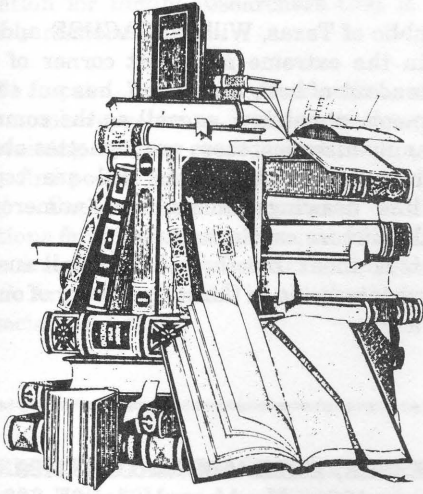

BOOK REVIEWS

SOME WATKINS FAMILIES OF VIRGINIA AND THEIR KIN: ABBOTT, ANDERSON, BASS, CLAY, COX, FARRAR, HANCOCK, HUNDLEY, MONTAGUE, MOSELEY, RANDOLPH, WALTHALL, WOOLDRIDGE. John Hale Stutesman. 1989. 6" x 9", hardback, 588 pages. Name indexed. \$30.00 postpaid. Order from the author, 305 Spruce Street, San Francisco, CA 94118.

Mr. Stutesman begins this treatise of his maternal grandmother's family with Henry WATKINS - "The Founder" - who was born about 1638 and who likely came to Henrico County, Virginia as an indentured servant around 1656. WATKINS sons in subsequent generations from whom the author is descended are titled the Patriarch, Planter, Revoluionist, Politician, Preacher, and Businessman. As WATKINS progeny marry into other families, they too are traced back to first settlers. The entire book is extensively documented from primary source material. Several genealogical charts and a simple numbering system help keep a rather tangled lineage in some semblance of order. Over 1500 names are indexed. Numerous maps and drawings add interest as well as clarity to what is already a very scholarly and enjoyable work.

What a marvelous genealogy! In addition to its technical excellence, the book is beautifully written. I loved the frequent outcropping of a sly humor (e.g., when defending an 18th Century case of WATKINS nepotism, the author comments that two centuries later Bobby Kennedy wasn't made U. S. Attorney General because of his legal prowess!). Please accept my disclaimer of influence by a distant relative (unknown to me prior to receiving this book), and see for yourself what an outstanding model it is for the ideal family history.

SACHSE REMEMBERED 1840 - 1940. Mary Allene Jones. 1990. 6" x 9", hardback, 66 pages. \$18.00 (not taxable), plus \$1.00 P&H. Order from the Sachse Public Library, 3033 Sixth Street, Sachse, TX 75048.

During the final years of the Republic of Texas, William SACHSE and David HERRING received land grants in the extreme northeast corner of Dallas County. Mary Allene Jones, a descendant of both these men, has put together a charming little book which commemorates them, as well as the community they founded. In addition to brief family histories, there are vignettes about old houses, schools, churches and business establishments. All are copiously illustrated with handsome ink line drawings, maps, and numerous old photographs. As a matter of fact, the picture captions provide much of the narrative. There is no index, but the book is small enough to make name searching easy. If you are interested in the early history of our area, give this fascinating little volume a try.

WILLIAMSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, DEED ABSTRACTS, 1799 - 1811. Abstracted by Joyce Martin Murray. 1991. Hard cover, 6" x 9", 202 pages. Name and place indexed. \$30.00 plus \$2.50 P&H. Order from the author, 2921 Daniel, Dallas, Tex. 75205. Texas residents add 8.25% sales tax.

Williamson County lies in central Tennessee, just south of the Nashville area. It was formed in 1799 and originally stretched all the way to the Alabama line, including present Maury and Giles Counties and part of Lawrence County. The county seat is Franklin, which was platted in the very early 1800's. Mrs. Murray's publication contains abstracts of Volumes A-1, A-2, and B of the Williamson County deed books, covering the years 1799 - 1811. The instruments which are summarized include indentures, wills, deeds of gift, land grants, mortgages and powers of attorney. The names of over 3,500 individuals appear in the index, while the abstractions show county of residence when it is other than Williamson.

In her usual manner of excellence, Mrs. Murray has produced a handsome little volume which is easy to read and a pleasure to use. It takes its place with the other fine deed abstractions she has done in Sumner County, Tenn., Warren County, Ky., and Red River, Austin, and Washington Counties in Texas. Researchers with early nineteenth century interests in central Tennessee should take note of this newest resource.

HOW TO LOCATE ANYONE WHO IS OR HAS BEEN IN THE MILITARY. Lt. Col. Richard S. Johnson. Fourth edition, 1991. Paperback, 5.5" x 8.5", 167 pages. \$16.00 postpaid. Order from Military Infor-

mation Enterprises, P.O. Box 5143, Burlington, N. C. 27216.

Also referred to as the Armed Forces Locator Directory, this book isn't exactly a genealogy or family history production. However, it has such helpful information for family researchers that it is well worth reviewing for DGS Quarterly readers.

"How To Locate..." chapters cover active military, reservists, National Guard, retired members, veterans, and deceased service personnel. Other sections deal with obtaining military records, unit rosters, casualty lists, and burial locations. Want to find people for a military reunion? There is even a chapter on locating anyone! Each section is crammed with addresses, telephone numbers, suggestions for letters, sample request forms, and precise instructions on how to use this material to make contact with someone who has been connected with the U. S. Armed Forces. All in all, this looks like a powerful little book with a very specialized usage.

THE CEMETERIES OF SOMERVELL COUNTY TEXAS 1836 - 1991. Surveyed by Dorothy Ketter, Mary Ann Million, and Angela Sanders. 1991. Paperback, 8.5" x 11", 179 pages. Indexed. \$18.00 postpaid. Order from Green Dog Press, 1311 Candlelight Ave., Duncanville, TX 75137.

Listed in this book are 5,036 inscriptions from 27 cemeteries in Somervell County. That's about the same as the current number of living residents of this third smallest county in Texas. It lies 50 miles southwest of Ft. Worth and Glen Rose is the county seat. Because the markers are recorded in the order in which they were found, relationships within families are preserved. As the title denotes, 150 year old interments are recorded.

A nice map is included which clearly locates each cemetery in the county. It appears that all of the information on each stone has been faithfully recorded and the three surveyors are to be commended for their efforts. A serious deficiency shows up in the Index, however, where reference is made only to the cemetery where a surname appears, rather than the page in the book where the name can be found. I had to go through all 26 pages of one of the cemeteries to find a name in which I was interested.

GARRETT: 1000 YEARS FROM NORMANDY. Edward R. Garrett. 1989. Hard cover, 6" x 9", vi plus 237 pages. Name indexed. \$34.00, tax and postage paid. Order from the author, 3731 Autumn Lane, Baytown, TX 77521.

Quoting from the preface, "The primary purpose of the author of this book was to develop a complete and accurate record of the descendants of William Garrett,

born 13 February 1794, and to establish by public record his ancestry." He has succeeded admirably in accomplishing that purpose. Part I deals with the ancestry, beginning with John and Mary Garrett in Leicestershire, England in the early 1600's. Their descendants were in Virginia later that century, but within a hundred years had relocated to Laurens County, S. C. That is where William Garrett, the focal point, was born, and where Part II of this book begins. William's children and grandchildren followed typical migration patterns to Tennessee, Alabama, and ultimately Texas. Part III is an appendix which touches on other Garrett lines, and mentions Pat Garrett, the famous New Mexico Sheriff. 900 Garretts appear in the index where 2200 individuals with other surnames are also listed.

The writing, the print and picture quality, and the binding for this book are all quite good. Although the volume is small, a tremendous amount of information is packed within its covers. Small print, a dense page format, and no line spacing in the index after individuals with the same surname contribute to this achievement. My major disappointment was with Mr. Garrett's unique coding system, which was more confusing to me than helpful in keeping track of lines of descent. Except for that feature, I believe this could be an excellent reference for anyone with Garrett connections, especially southern ones.

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From the Introduction: The earlier pages are devoted to a description of the State, lists of State and County Officers, Terms of Court, with names of Judges, etc., a Bankers' Directory of Texas, useful selections from the Statutes relating to Commercial Laws, lists of all State Institutions, with location and names of officers, and a register of all the Postoffices in the State, with Money Order Offices, County Seats, etc. plainly designated, as well as valuable statistics relating to the State at large. Following this will be found a Gazetteer and Directory of every city, town, village, and settlement in Texas, with descriptive sketches of each place and lists of persons engaged in business or the professions located there. This is supplemented by a complete classified Business Directory, printed in the most compact manner known to the art, and comprising lists of all trades, professions and pursuits, with names and postoffice addresses arranged under the various headings called for by their line of business." Listed in the General Index but not stated in the Introduction are: Planter's and Farmer's Directory, Railroads in Texas, Transportation Lines and State Institutions, with locations.

The Planter's and Farmer's Directory for Dallas County appears in the September 1991 issue. The following is a listing of towns as identified in The Business Directory - Dallas County towns only.

DALLAS COUNTY

Cities, villages and postoffices of Texas are arranged in alphabetical order, and a description is given of each place with an alphabetical list of persons doing business therein. In all the larger places the names have been procured by personal canvass, but in the smaller they have been furnished by the postmasters. Alphabetical list begins on page 105 of the directory. The number in () after the city's name is the page number of the directory.

Cedar Hill (p 202)

A village on the Dal. ex. G., C. & S. F. RY, in Dallas county, 214 miles northeast of Austin and 19 southwest of Dallas, the county seat and nearest banking point. Settled in 1852, it contains steam cotton gins and corn mills, Methodist and Baptist churches and a district school. Cotton, wheat, oats,

corn and poultry comprise the shipments. Population, 350. Tel. W. U., Exp., Texas and Pacific. Mail, daily. F. D. Pincham, postmaster.

Dallas (p 250)

This prosperous city, named in honor of Vice-President George M. Dallas, of Texas, is pleasantly located on the Trinity river, in the centre of county of the same name of which it is the judicial seat, 315 miles northwest of Galveston, 660 from St. Louis, 515 from New Orleans, and 223 from Austin. A more advantageous site for a city could not have been selected. It is on the east bank of the river in a timber belt reaching to the prairie a mile or more from the river bank; on rolling, hilly ground, supplying a natural drainage which makes the position a very healthy one. It has never had an epidemic of any kind, is far above the yellow fever level, and with its pure and bracing atmosphere, both summer and winter, is one of the most desirable residence cities in the Union. The first settlement was made by John Neely Bryan on the exact tract of land on which the city is now situated. Three years later emigrants from Kentucky, Tennessee, Missouri and Illinois came here to search for homes and found a river that knew not the sight of men save the red sons of the forest, who for long years had wandered by its margin, fished in its depths and laved in its limpid waters. In this magnificent wilderness of forest and prairie these adventurous pioneers set to work to make houses for themselves and to lay the foundations of fortune. How thoroughly they succeeded and to what an extent their anticipations have been fulfilled, is evidenced by the present prosperous condition of this "Emporium of Northern Texas." From 1846 up to 1860 its progress was dismally slow. In 1860 a disastrous fire laid waste the greater part of the city, and for the next few years during the civil war, the abomination of desolation brooded over the city. The general improvement in business consequent on the conclusion of the war, once more gave the city an upward boom, and the advent of the Houston and Texas Central Railway in 1872, marked the dawning of an era of prosperity and almost like magic, Dallas sprung from a village to a city of almost Metropolitan proportions; her population in less than a year increasing from 1,500 to over 7,000. Five railway corporations have already reached here, and have established substantial

freight and passenger depots; these roads are, the M. P. Ry (E Div & D. ex), the H & T. C. Ry, the D. Ex of the G., C. & S. F. Ry, and the T. T. R. R., all these lines centering here, and with their connections radiating to all points of the United States afford Dallas means of transportation unsurpassed by any city in the State, with the exception, perhaps, of Houston. The local government is vested in a mayor and board of aldermen. A board of trade is sustained by some of the best representative men of the city, and an enterprising company have now over 40 miles of telephone in operation. The city contains 3 incorporated and 3 private banks, 2 opera houses, 2 large flouring mills, 3 broom factories, cotton, compresses and grain elevators, a factory for the production of essences, syrups, etc. large marble works, the Howard Oil Company, employing 150 men, foundries and machine shops, agricultural implement works, an ice factory, planing mills and many more too numerous to mention, besides a very thorough representation of the learned professions, the minor trades and all other branches of commerce. Churches of the following denominations supply the religious needs of the city: 2 Episcopal, 2 Catholic, 3 Methodist Episcopal, 2 Presbyterian, 2 Christian, 2 Congregational, A Hebrew and 3 German, and there are in addition to these 8 churches for the colored people. The public school system of Dallas is a source of pride to its citizens, each ward having a separate building and an efficient staff of teachers. Besides the public schools, 8 colleges and private select schools are maintained and the African population owns 6 school buildings (3 common and 3 private). The various secret and benevolent societies have lodges here, the city is lighted with gas, has excellent water works, street railways, public parks, excellent hotels, efficient police and fire departments and in fact all the attributes of a first-class city. The possibilities of Dallas, in the way of future increase and prosperity, can be only partially anticipated from her marvelous advancement in the past brief period since her real progress began, but it is certain that she is as yet only on the threshold of a glorious career, which shall at no distant date astonish not only the inhabitants of Texas but the whole civilized world. The press is represented by the *Herald* (Daily, weekly and Sunday), *The Times*, an afternoon Paper, Norton's *Intelligencer*, the *Texas Volksblatt*, the *Texas Baptist*, *The Sunday Mercury*, *The Texas Observer*, *Texas Planter and Farmer*, the *Christian Preacher*, the *Christian Star*, *Veterinary and Live Stock Journal*, *Machinist's Journal* and the *Estray Record*. The shipments, which are very large consist of cotton, cattle, sheep, hogs, horses, lumber, shingles, grain, fruit, vegetables, etc. Exp., Pacific, Texas and W., F. & Co. Tel., W.U.
