

# The McGowan Funeral Home - A Wonderful New Resource

Have you heard announcements about the progress in digitizing the records of the McGowan Funeral Home? Have you wondered where the McGowan Funeral Home was and who is involved in the project?

For several years the African American Genealogical Interest Group has been reviewing, cataloging, indexing, and now digitizing the records of this funeral home that served the Black Community of South Dallas from 1955-1994. These records were donated to the Dallas Public Library in 2007 when the building was sold. Each person has an individual file that contains information such as obituaries, photographs, funeral programs, birth certificates, lodge and insurance papers, newspaper articles, names of relatives, and employment information. This collection is a great resource for understanding African-American burial practices in the mid-to-late twentieth century and a treasure trove of genealogical information for individuals researching their family histories.

The final phase of the project of creating an online digital index of the collection is now in progress. To date, the index for over 3500 individuals, covering the years 1956-1976 has been uploaded to the DGS website where they can be searched and viewed by the public. AAGIG, along with DGS and the Dallas Public Library, is proud and excited to make this wonderful resource available to the public.
